Moreton Bay Regional Council is currently working to finalise changes to the draftplanning scheme. These changes include feedback from the community as well as updated

information provided by the State Government. Timeframes are yet to be confirmed, but council hopes to bring the draft back out to the community in the near future. Once we have definitive timeframes for further consultation, these will be publicly advertised. Residents can also check the council website for updates and register their interest to receive email updates.

As part of our Shoreline Erosion Management Plan (SEMP) a temporary coastal fence has been erected at Queens Beach North to assist in stabilization and regeneration of the sand dunes and to assist in the replenishment of the sand beach. The fence is only temporary and the results will be monitored to evaluate its effectiveness in keeping our shorelines pristine.

SCARBOROUGH LIGHTS UP REDCLIFFE

For many years, the Redcliffe Peninsula had been lacking a major Christmas event, so in 2006 Beth Reid and Glyn Davies decided to "bring back that old-fashioned Christmas Spirit." After speaking to the Redcliffe Peninsula business community, Beth and Glyn were thrilled with the support they received to fund their dream. With sponsorship pledges in hand, a lot of enthusiasm and Christmas Spirit, and a handful of volunteers, the inaugural 'Christmas comes to Scarborough' event was held. The program for that year included a Christmas Street Parade,

Carols by Candlelight, Market Stalls, Fireworks, and a spectacular street lighting display throughout the whole month of December.

The following year, the group contracted a promotional company to supply ten huge 3-metre tall Christmas trees to add to the Christmas lighting display. These trees were subsequently purchased by the group and are now taken out of storage every year and placed along Landsborough Avenue by volunteers.

In 2008, local business owners Danny and Sue White took the reins and incorporated this not-for-profit group which is now called Scarborough Lights up Redcliffe Inc. The group received an Australia Day Award and medal in 2010 for 'Community Event of the Year'.

In 2009, the then newly-formed Moreton Bay Regional Council approached the group to offer their support, and the annual Christmas Event became known as 'Christmas by the Sea'. The council now organise the Carols by Candlelight section of this event.

Depending on Sponsorships, Scarborough Lights provides midnight fireworks on New Year's Eve (weather permitting). This year, there will be two firework displays over two nights - one on Saturday 6th December at 8pm and the other at midnight on New Year's Eve.

Scarborough Lights also provides the opportunity for community groups and charities to run sausage sizzles and food outlets and to hold raffles at their events as another way to support the local community and to 'Bring Back that Old-Fashioned Christmas Spirit'.

The Redcliffe Peninsula Santa Sleigh has been a fixture of the local Christmas scene for decades.

Each year between mid November to a few days before Christmas, Santa visits almost every street through Rothwell, Kippa-Ring, Newport, Scarborough, Redcliffe, Margate, Clontarf and Woody Point.

It's a big job carried out by volunteers with big hearts.

In its current form, the sleigh is managed by the Rotary Club of Redcliffe City on behalf of the Moreton Bay Regional Council, who provide support through funding and provision of the towing and safety vehicles.

Last year police gave their support with an escort for Santa provided by a patrol car which added an extra thrill.

To be a part of a nightly run with Santa is a great privilege as you get to see the absolute joy of the local children as they wave and get to meet Santa. Parents often

share funny stories with us as sometimes the kids will have launched out of the bath on to the street with just a towel when they hear Santa calling out on the microphone.

The sleigh in Redcliffe actually kicked off as part of a neighbourhood watch, which started in Scarborough and has grown from there. In those days, Noel Powell was the lone Santa every night. As the operation has grown, it now takes a significant amount of manpower and commitment - but what an effect it has.

During the sleigh program in 2014, the convoy will set out each night around 5:30pm to cover a different part of the Peninsula. 





INTEREST-ONLY LOANS

Popularity for interest-only home loans appears to be increasing among both investors and owner-occupiers.

Interest-only loans accounted for 43.2% of all new mortgages in June 2014, up from 38.6% a year ago as recorded by the Australian Prudential Regulation Authority.

The proportion of investment property loans also rose to 37.9% from 35.2% during the same period.

The rise however was not as prominent as that seen in the interest-only loan growth, suggesting that more homeowners are opting for interest-only loans.

According to the RBA, an increasing number of owner-occupiers are opting for interest-only loans to increase repayment flexibility.

With growth in wages slowing, it appears homeowners are less willing to borrow, further contributing to the attraction of interest-only loans.

Structured much like any other mortgage, the main difference with interest-only loans is that borrowers repay only the interest instead of paying back both a principal and interest loan amount.

Typically, interest-only loans are a strategy used by investors to help them balance their property portfolio, however borrowers are increasingly using this type

of loan for their own homes.

Interest-only loans are attractive to investors because you can increase and manage your cash flow more effectively by minimising monthly mortgage repayments.

Each loan payment may also be a tax deduction to investors.

Beware of the risks however of relying too much on the value of a property increasing whilst paying interest only. You may find it hard to repay the full principal loan amount and cover your costs without a solid capital gain at the time you decide to sell.

Owner-occupiers are increasingly choosing home loans with an initial interestonly period because of the increased flexibility of monthly repayments, which can ease the strain on personal finances. particularly if you know you have some heavy expenses in the first couple of years.

For homeowners, interest-only loans are best used as a short term solution to meet your immediate commitments or at a time when you need maximum cash flow, but beware of your limits.

Don't take on a loan if you have no hope of paying back both principal and interest amounts, especially when interest rates rise or your interest-only period ends.

Also be mindful that by not paying back any of the overall mortgage, you aren't building any equity in your home.

The interest-only payment period is usually set from one to five or ten years.

A longer interest-only period may place greater pressure on borrowers, as the principal loan must be repaid within the remaining loan term. R



CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS

Have you ever wondered why we place a tree inside our house and adorn it with jewels to celebrate the birth of Christ? Or why a large jolly man wears a red and white suit, generously giving gifts? If ever there is a time of year teeming with tradition, it's certainly Christmas. Let's take a closer look at when and how these traditions came about.

The humble Christmas tree - There are many theories behind the origin of the Christmas tree but a common belief is that in medieval Europe, people used to have evergreen branches in their homes during the dark days of winter as a symbol of rebirth of vegetation. It's purported that the Germans decorated their trees with apples at Christmas time in celebration of Adam & Eve. and the trees were referred to as 'Paradise Trees'.

Later, in many other nations, other edible adornments were added to the tree, which fast became a symbol of Christmas celebrations. In 1848, "The Queen's Christmas tree at Windsor Castle" was published in the illustrated London news, making the Christmas tree ubiquitous.

Mistletoe – One of the saucier traditions that come with this time of year, this tradition is one of the stranger ones. Once again, we revisit the idea of having evergreens in your home as symbolic reminders of rebirth of vegetation. Christmas time in Europe (and the top half of the planet) is cold and dreary and a reminder of good things to come was necessary.

Taking it a step further, the Druids believed the plant to harbour mystical supernatural powers and a healer of all ailments, including a boost to fertility. Which may be where the kissing started.

Another theory dates back to Norse mythology. It is said that Baldur, son of Frigga, was blessed when he was born by his goddess mother. She made all plants, creatures and inanimate objects

promise not to bring harm to her son. She neglected to ask the mistletoe. Loki, the mischievous god, fashioned a barb made from mistletoe to kill Baldur. So when two people are to pass under mistletoe, a kiss is exchanged to remember Baldur.

Now is a good time to mention that mistletoe is in fact a parasite that grows on and feeds off other trees.

Santa Claus - St Nicholas was a bishop in the third century in what is now known as Turkey. He received a large inheritance from his family and generously donated his wealth to those less fortunate. In one case, it came to his attention that a girl in the village was being sold in marriage. He threw gold coins through her window in the hope of changing her fate, which landed in a stocking hung by the fire. Upon hearing this, other children in the town later hung stockings by the fire in the hope that they would wake up to gold coins.

Long after St Nicholas died, he was canonised and remembered on Saint's day, celebrated in most European countries on 6th December. In honour of his memory people exchanged gifts.

The Dutch called him Sinterklass and when the Dutch settlers arrived in the United States, he became Santa Claus.

In 1823. Dr Clement Clarke Moore wrote 'Twas the Night Before Christmas'. It was Moore's depiction of a plump. jolly old man smoking a pipe with rosy red cheeks, which quickly became the recognised imagery of Santa Claus for many years to come. R






