REDCLIFFE COMMUNITY UNITES FOR HOMELESS

Rockin' 4 the Homeless Event

Club Shambles has announced that the Rockin' 4 the Homeless Community Fundraising Event is on again in 2015, and whilst the location is yet to be revealed, organisers Dan Nebe and Craig Miley have confirmed Rock Legends *Mental As Anything* as the lead act.

The event will be officially launched in February and local business owners, community leaders and members of parliament are strongly encouraged to attend along with the media.

"Residents say there has been a visible increase [in homelessness] and they want to find ways to help. About 150 people are registered as being homeless, but many are not registered or counted in Census statistics. The statistics don't tell the story of the temporarily affected families who need a helping hand for only a short time," stated Craig Miley, Communications Manager.

Last year, over one thousand people attended this family friendly fundraiser which raised over \$25,000. The 2015 event is scheduled for 9th May with the aim to double the amount raised last year.

"The purpose of the launch is to profile one of the biggest community days in Redcliffe,

and obtain sponsorship and donation support," said Dan Nebe, Executive Producer and Artistic Director.

"Rockin' 4 the Homeless raises money to support Chameleon House and The Breakfast Club, without whom many local homeless people would have even less. The abiding goal is to get a drop in centre for Redcliffe, to better service the needs of these people.

"Sponsorship of the 2015 Rockin' 4 the Homeless event will associate your organisation as one that is sympathetic to the needs of the Redcliffe community – and you will be seen as an organisation that supports those who provide the much needed help to Redcliffe's homeless community."

With 20 live bands, Club Shambles' Rockin' 4 the Homeless is set to be the community fundraiser of the year, entertaining all ages.

ROLL UP YOUR SLEEVES

Red Cross Blood Donor Centre

Redcliffe residents have been so generous that the Red Cross Blood Service's mobile donor centre will now visit every month instead of every three months.

The Redcliffe mobile blood donor centre will be at the Red Cross Centre in Portwood St, Redcliffe for three days each month and will be open for late night sessions until 7pm on two of those days.

"We want the community to consider it like a static centre just for Redcliffe," Red Cross Blood Service spokesperson Bernadette Dias said.

"Currently, we get about 32 donations each day that we visit, but we would like to see new donors book in as well," she said.

Scarborough man Colin Braybrooke, who has been a plasma donor since 1984, has booked in for next month's visit.

Mr Braybrooke, who will be giving his 420th donation, was recently recognised by the Australian Red Cross Blood Service for making an amazing difference to the lives of more than 1200 Australians.

The BP Health and Safety Advisor has been donating plasma at Chermside donor centre

every fortnight for many years, but said he would be happy to donate at the Redcliffe mobile donor centre as well because it was closer to home.

Mr Braybrooke said his mother received a blood transfusion in hospital recently when she had gastro-intestinal issues.

"There is a need for blood for many types of issues and illnesses so it's a good reason for me to spend a bit of time donating blood.

"It's an easy thing to do, I just get 40 minutes of rest when reclining on those comfortable chairs," Mr Braybrooke said.

Ms Dias said Mr Braybrooke's life-saving donations have potentially improved the lives of thousands of Australians, including new mothers, cancer patients and people undergoing emergency surgery.

"A donation of blood has a ripple effect, from the person receiving the blood, right through to their entire family and their friends.

"Colin Braybrooke is just one person but every donation he gives makes an amazing difference to the lives of countless others."

NEW LOOK OLD FIRE STATION OPENS ITS DOORS

Community Arts & Volunteer Hub

Recultifie's historic fire station is Respected to re-open its doors in late February following a \$2 million council redevelopment.

Moreton Bay Regional Council's Division Six Councillor, Koliana Winchester said the exciting and innovative project had breathed new life into the heritage listed building.

"Since closing its doors in 2008, the fire station had been sitting idle, however council took the view that this beautiful historic old building deserved a second lease on life," Cr Winchester said.

"I have been passionate about seeing this old

heritage listed building restored to its former glory and enjoyed by local generations for many years to come.

"Council purchased the building from the former Queensland Fire and Rescue Service so that it could be repurposed and reused as a modern new community arts and volunteer hub well into the future."

Cr Winchester said the fire station, which opened in 1948 was a truly unique local building and one of only a few brick double storey fire stations built around the State.

"That's why it has been so important for us to retain as many of the building's original characteristics from the outset," she said.

"We undertook significant research, and engaged with former fire station staff and nearby neighbours to help protect and promote the building's features including the grand old garage which has become a statement feature of the building."

Internal renovation work was funded through a \$400,000 grant from the State Government to help retain as much of the original floor plan as possible.

Council prepared a master plan for the site in 2013 to guide the redevelopment project including a public consultation phase and expressions of interest process to hear from interested local residents and community groups.

The old Redcliffe fire station community arts and volunteer hub includes a new art gallery and art workshop space, a volunteer hub and meeting space for local groups, car park and lift, and residency for the Redcliffe Arts Society and Redcliffe Pottery Group.

Local volunteer and community groups will be able to book space in the building for local meetings and events.

Other local residents wishing to use the outside of the building as the backdrop for wedding photos and other special events can also make booking through council's community facilities team.



ACE OF CLUBS THE TOP OF REDCLIFFE

Excerpt from story by Rex Borradale

n the summer of 1946, returned serviceman Bob Borradale, his wife May and good friends the Jordans had a bright idea that Redcliffe needed a top nightclub. The enthusiastic Bob approached Arthur Comino with his embryonic idea, and persuaded Arthur that the top floor of Comino's Arcade was the ideal venue for this exciting enterprise. Arthur Comino always had a grand vision for his gigantic building in Redcliffe Parade. Among these ideas was a palatial ballroom to be called the 'Panorama Ballroom'. The idea presented by Bob Borradale appealed to Arthur and the majestic nightclub called the 'Ace of Clubs' was formed.

Much hard work saw the finishing touches to the club completed in time for the grand opening night in December 1946, which was a fully booked out affair. At the switching on of the lights, the whole of Redcliffe was blacked out, because no one had bothered to test out the lighting in the club. However, Joe Allen and his dance band kept the revellers amused and ensured that the rest of the night went off without a hitch. (The Ace of Clubs dance band led by Joe Allen went on in 1947 to become the ABC Dance Band and was acclaimed world wide as one of the leading dance bands of the period.) The clientele was predominantly from Brisbane (90%) with the remainder from the Peninsula.

During the next couple of years, the club built up a great rapport with the Cremorne Theatre and with 4BH and many local people had their 21st birthday or wedding receptions in the Ballroom. Singers of great repute such as Gloria Dawn sang in the club. Radio Station 4BH had regular one hour broadcasts from the 'Ace of Clubs' during 1947.

Although the club was one of the most respected nightclubs in Australia at the time, it would appear to have been before its time when the sleepy hollow of Redcliffe had a fledgling population of about 15,000. It was placed on the market in late 1948 in the Sydney papers but due to lack of response, closed in early 1949, with Arthur Comino taking over what was left of the club in return for moneys owed for rent. He turned the top floor area into several serviced rooms and conducted the "Rendezvous" which was a basic continuation of the 'Ace of Clubs' with entertainment on Friday and Saturday nights with host Ray Goldner (late of Princes) and Joe Allen's ABC Band.

A Redcliffe local is one of 69 Australian undergraduate students to have been awarded a New Colombo Plan scholarship to live, study and work overseas.

Joel will study at BINUS International University in Indonesia for six months, before undertaking a five-month internship with international infrastructure and environmental services company Cardno Emerging Markets.

The announcement follows the New Colombo Plan 2015 mobility round outcomes announced on 24th November supporting around 3150 students from across Australia to study in 32 Indo-Pacific locations.

Fitness Through The Ages

Regardless of your age, getting fit and being healthy is essential for longevity and a better quality of life, both physically and emotionally. Here is a guide to achieving fitness suited to your age group.

Teens Bodyweight and Fun. Teenagers will generally be interested in team or individual sports. Their regime needs to be more about fun rather than fitness. Training techniques are best focussed on bodyweight – eg. squats, push-ups, crunches.

Top Tip Get on the Moreton Bay Council website for free events and sporting groups.

20s Power and Speed. Try plyometric training (squat jumps, power push-ups, exercises with fast explosive muscle movements). Interval training using calisthenics (skipping, squat jumps, mountain climbers, burpees, plank thrusts, surfer get-ups, star jumps). Proper form and core stability are paramount while performing these exercises to prevent injury.

Top Tip Check out youtube, instagram, etc. to keep training fun, fast and fresh.

NEW YOU IN 2015

We spoke with some local fitness and wellness professionals to give us some tips on how to make this year different and to help you along with your wellness & fitness goals.

May 2015 be your year to shine.

.

30s – 40s Strength and Stability. Invest in some dumbbells or resistance tubes to gain the benefits of resistance training. Target all major muscle groups through basic exercises (squats, chest press, deadlift, rows, crunches, planks). Refrain from high impact cardio to protect the joints.

Top Tip Invest in tried and true equipment, not fads like the ab-doer, and seek expert advice on form.

50s – 60s Flexibility and Functionality. Continue resistance training for bone density, use bodyweight exercises to maintain mobility (squats, push ups or modified versions such as a push-up off a wall or a squat to sit on a chair). Spend more time on static stretching, but only after the muscles have been warmed up. Use tools like a hill, stairs or swimming to add intensity to low-impact cardio exercise.

Top Tip Maintain an active and social fitness regime for a healthy lifestyle, strong mind and a happy soul.

So what are you waiting for?



NOW IS A GOOD TIME TO REVIEW YOUR FINANCES

The nation's official unemployment rate fell unexpectedly in December 2014 to 6.1 per cent.

The better than expected results will ease pressure on the Reserve Bank of Australia to cut rates this year.

Before the unemployment data was released, traders were expecting a more than twenty-five per cent chance of a 0.25 percentage point rate cut at the next RBA meeting in February, which then fell to a nine per cent chance of a February rate cut according to Credit Suisse.

The market still expects at least one rate cut in 2015, but the likelihood of two rate cuts this year has dropped to forty-four per cent.

In these times of historically low interest rates, competition amongst lenders within the home loan market is fierce.

The average life of a loan back in 2009 was approximately seven years, but more recent data suggests customers are refinancing their loans every three to four years.


It will be a diverse fleet of yachts including the super quick sports boats, impressive multihulls, classic yachts and many well renowned Brisbane to Gladstone race yachts.

TACKLING MORETON BAY



Mark Templeton

Well Christmas has been and gone and the kids are back at school.

We hope that everybody had a great break and everyone kept themselves safe.

We found that over the holidays quite a number of families came in store wanting information about getting into fishing for the first time, and families that had not been for a while and wanted to get back into it.

Good news is that the basics of fishing really have not changed at all and getting set up really does not cost all that much.

Once you have a basic rod and reel, basic tackle selection and then a bit of bait you are almost set. A very important item, which is just about always overlooked, is the Law regarding fish sizes and bag limits.

Most Specialist Tackle Stores can give you all the information that you need to make your fishing experience more memorable and help ensure that we all do the right thing.

If you have younger children it could be well worthwhile introducing them to the art of "plastics" fishing. This is where we use artificial bait with a jig head. There are so many to choose from and it can really be daunting when you first investigate the huge range of plastics and jig heads available.

The easiest way is to drop in and ask for some guidance. We are here to make sure you get the best start and get the gear we know works well for beginners. I would suggest that you limit your purchase to no more than 2 - 3 different types. After all, if plastic fishing is not for you, we do not want a big expense weighing you down.

Plastics fishing is not exactly the easiest style to learn but if you give it a fair trial period you may just find that it can be rewarding and just a bit exciting when you master the basics. I was a bit sceptical at first, but after my first fish (a 15cm Flathead), I knew it was going to be worth the effort. It is better to try and fail than to not try at all!
