

FIRST VICTORIA CROSS IN QUEENSLAND

on the centenary of Anzac Day, learn about the story of Queensland's first Victoria Cross recipient and how his heroic efforts earned him the Commonwealth's highest military honour when the Redcliffe Museum hosts a special presentation on April 22.

Moreton Bay Regional Council Division Six Councillor Koliana Winchester said from 10.30am, the peninsula's museum would commemorate the ANZAC tradition with a talk by the State Library of Queensland's senior librarian, Stephanie Ryan, looking into the life of Private John Leak VC.

"Private John Leak was one of many heroic Australians who fought in the trenches of the First World War – this presentation looks into his time on the front line and his more mysterious back story," Cr Winchester said.

Stephanie will also discuss the history of the Enoggera army camp, which was once widely known as White City.

During her talk, visitors will also have the chance to ask questions about the State Library of Queensland's special World War I resources.

"Stephanie Ryan will help you navigate the library's historical databases to find information on your family and Australia's military past."

The talk is free but booking are essential and must be made before April 20 by calling 3883 1898.

WORLD WAR I FAMILY HISTORY PROJECT

Our Project owes it origins to the Genealogical Society of Queensland. They were aiming to locate all the WWI memorials, erected to honour those who enlisted for duty in the Great War throughout Queensland.

The Redcliffe & District Family History Group Inc agreed to try and assist them and found just the two Honour Boards in our area. These are located at Redcliffe RSL and at the Woody Point Memorial School of Arts.

So we started work on an ambitious project, which targets all those persons who are mentioned on those two Honour Boards.

There are 95 separate names between the two boards, plus 3 war workers.

However, as we worked, we discovered that there were a number of other persons who fought in the conflict and who at the time lived in, or had very close ties with Redcliffe, who are not mentioned on these boards. These additional names are still being discovered as a result

of public appeals, general publicity, from our researchers and even from our own members.

To date, we have about 120 names on our database.

So, we are hoping to trace as many as possible of their living descendants, or people that knew them, who we trust will be willing to be interviewed by us.

Over the years, much has been written about the exploits of the generals, officers and heroes of the Great War, but there has been little written about the "ordinary" men and women.

In doing so, we hope also to make an important local contribution to the World War I Centenary commemorations, helping to keep alive the memory of these unsung service men and women and giving the wider public a deeper understanding of how much we owe to them.



Step into the Seaside Carnival for plenty of nautical activities alongside amusement rides and more!


There's also plenty of opportunities to trade bounty and other wares for new threads, toys and some delicious carnival food.

43RD ANNUAL REDCLIFFE GEM SHOW

In late 1964, Mr Ossie Rippingale came to the Redcliffe Peninsula and opened a rock and shell shop - Margate Gemcraft & Gifts. Ossie had trained as a sewing machine mechanic and travelled throughout the state developing an interest in shells and painting before arriving on the peninsula.

Whilst talking to customer Jean Steptoe, the idea of forming a lapidary club was conceived as both felt that it could succeed.

An advertisement placed in the local newspaper inviting expressions of interest from the general public resulted in an inaugural meeting. In January 1965, thirty-one people attended the meeting, and the Redcliffe Peninsula Lapidary Club was formed.

Current member, Peter Garwood tells us how he came to be a part of the Lapidary Club.

"Having spent many years traveling around

Australia and collecting rocks, about 6 years ago I decided to do something with them, hence I joined the lapidary club."

The Redcliffe Gem Show, run by the Redcliffe Peninsula Lapidary Club, caters to everyone. There will be gem displays and sales, sales of lapidary equipment and materials, jewellery and raw material, door prizes drawn every hour, gem cutting demonstrations and children's activities including thunder egg cutting.

"The show has approximately 180 tables under cover and 75 sites outdoors. The estimated value of what's on show exceeds \$15 million."


The highlight of the show for Peter is, "cutting open thunder eggs and showing them to children to see what was made millions of years ago." R



THE MARKET IS CONTINUING TO RUN HOT!

The Real Estate Institute of Queensland (REIQ) has released fresh data showing Southeast Queensland, Toowoomba and Cairns as the State's real performers in 2014. They also state, "Local REIQ agents are reporting that confidence is on the rise in key Queensland real estate markets, which augers well for the rest of the year."

The strength in sales is starting to reflect in the increasing market prices and the number of days on the market is on the decline. With statistics showing days on market have come down on average by 20 days, this means our local and the Brisbane area are the quickest selling regions.

REIQ has also stated that, according to local agents, investors are taking advantage of the good selling conditions and putting their investment properties up for sale, with many being sold to owner-occupiers. And while there are investors also actively buying at the moment, the net effect appears to be a shortage of rental supply in some regions. OLD FIRE STATION REOPENS

undreds of residents, including former fire fighters, rediscovered the Old Redcliffe Fire Station at a community open day on Saturday, February 28.

Moreton Bay Regional Council Mayor Allan Sutherland unveiled an extensive \$2 million transformation of the heritage listed building, from disused fire station to a vibrant community arts and volunteer hub.

"This is an iconic landmark building that our community wanted to see retained for use by the community, and we've achieved that," the Mayor said.

Division Six Councillor Koliana Winchester said the renovation was a new-lease-on-life for the Old Redcliffe Fire Station on Oxley Avenue.

"The Old Fire Station's appliance garage, fire fighters' recreation and dormitory areas, and the fire chief's residence have been transformed into a community art gallery, extensive workshop space and meeting facilities for local volunteer groups," Cr Winchester said.

"Redcliffe's Art Society and the Redcliffe Potters have moved in to their new home in this much loved building that council is returning to the community."

All of the original features of the heritage listed building have been retained, including the original training and hose drying tower, to the delight of Vince Clarke, the station's deputy fire chief from 1986 to 1990.

"I'm pretty impressed with the way they've redone the buildings, given it a big face lift and put it to good use," Mr Clarke said.

Moreton Bay Regional Council acquired the building on behalf of the community in 2011.

During the 70s, 80s and 90s, the Old Fire Station's wishing well and its gardens were a favourite wedding photo destination for brides and grooms and have been retained as part of the building's renovation.

"The reopening of the Old Redcliffe Fire Station has reacquainted our community with an iconic landmark building and our region's heritage," Mayor Sutherland said. R

NBN PILOT ROLLOUT

The National Broadband Network Co will conduct a construction pilot in Redcliffe to ensure that no one misses out once the company starts offering services in the area in 2016.

Under agreements signed with Telstra and Optus, the NBN Co will progressively take over the Pay TV – or hybrid fibre-coaxial (HFC) networks – which cover more than 3 million premises nationally to deliver superfast broadband.

Federal Member for Petrie Luke Howarth MP said the construction pilot will affect

6,000 premises in Redcliffe where it is active but doesn't currently reach every home and business.

"When we came into office, our pledge was to get the NBN rolled out sooner, at less cost to taxpayers and therefore more affordable for consumers," Luke Howarth MP said.

"This announcement shows that we are getting on with the job. These networks will be upgraded so that they are among the most advanced in the world by 2016."

Apart from ensuring every premise in Redcliffe will be able to connect to the networks once they are integrated into the NBN, there will also be upgrades to ensure they can deliver NBN-grade products.

That means homes and businesses will have access to download speeds of 100 megabits per second and upload speeds of 40 megabits per second

Communications Minister Malcolm Turnbull said, "Everywhere in the world, these networks are some of the most competitive in terms of offering superfast broadband at the lowest speeds", he said.

"Even for customers currently on the network, the upgrades of the network will mean that the services available in the future will be almost unrecognisable – similar to the way 3G mobile services seem inadequate once you have switched to 4G."

Across the country, the NBN's fibre network now passes 667,000 premises, up from 261,000 premises as of the election. Its fixed wireless network now passes 169,000 premises, up from 39,000 as of the election.





GUIDE DOG REHOMING PROJECT

Ms Cahill said the charity was also on the lookout for temporary boarding homes.

"For those who can't take on a dog full-time but would love to help us by caring for one of our dogs in their homes on a short-term basis, our boarding program would be perfect for you," she said.

"Ideally, we're looking for someone who will be at home most of the time, but this can be flexible depending on the specific situation.

"It's a really rewarding experience and I'd encourage those with the time to get involved.

THERE IS STILL HONOUR IN THE HONOUR BOX SYSTEM

In the early 1860s, the new Queensland Government began resuming land to create agricultural reserves to attract emigrant farmers to the new colony. The portions on the Pine River proved very popular, but there was no rush at Humpybong. By the early 20th century, farming (including grains, vegetables, poultry, flowers and fruits) abounded on the Peninsula.

The Morris family started farming at Rothwell, formerly known as The Five Mile, between Redcliffe and Deception Bay, in 1938. They now have 90 acres of small crops, and for 10 months of the year, they sell tomatoes only by the honour system.

People are just as honest today as they were 35 years ago according to farming twins Peter and Paul Morris. Their authority is an honour box the Morris family has had at a roadside stall outside their Rothwell farm since 1940.

The twins' father George Morris first put it there. "We have found if you trust people they will honour that trust. You'd be amazed at the number of people who leave notes thanking us for trusting them." The twins said they had a secret system of detecting anyone who persistently took tomatoes without paying. "Recently I fronted a man we suspected of helping himself to some free tomatoes and he became very apologetic," said Peter. "He said he had struck hard times. Before he left, he handed me \$6 he said he owed for tomatoes he hadn't paid for." Peter said their regular customers were many and varied. "We have a hearse and an ambulance that call regularly, as well as police, a high-ranking court official and big businessmen," he said.

But the most unusual was 12 months ago when Brisbane Real Estate man Ken Duncombe called in a helicopter. "He was flying over our farm when he told his pilot to drop in and get a couple of cases of tomatoes. Paul and I got a hell of a shock to see this 'copter descending towards our tomato trailer. We thought it was crashing. He landed right alongside the trailer, put the money in the box, grabbed two cases of tomatoes and took off again."

Each member is a free spirit 'Ambassador' helping promote understanding and awareness by action and words. There are no membership fees, no committees and no unnecessary meetings. This is a not-for-profit entity with a dedication and passion for only doing good while there is still time.

The Dugong Collective's core membership is very local, but they are as diverse as the creatures in the Bay; entertainers, scientists, bus drivers,

students, business executives, housewives, teachers, politicians, trades people. You name it, there's probably one in the Collective; even a few environmentalists. Their overseas membership is growing too, from the US, the UK and Japan.

The 2004 Redcliffe Jetty Dugong event was the beginning of a serious Moreton Bay/Dugong focused group, which has evolved into the local community based proactive awareness 'fraternity' called The Dugong Collective.

"We hope it is the first in a series depicting all Moreton Bay creatures living above, below and on the water. TACKLING MORETON BAY

The cooler months are approaching and with it we see more species like Squid and Snapper become more readily available along the shore areas of Moreton Bay.

Chasing Squid is an activity for the whole family to get involved with and you generally don't need to upgrade your gear to get them.

We use either spin reels or even an Alvey reel on a reasonably light rod and light line (typically a good Bream rod and reel is all you need). We have seen people using a Hand line off the jetty to catch them!

The best time to hunt squid is at night, so you should make sure you rug up a bit. Some nights are bitterly cold out there when you have a light breeze blowing.

Squid Jigs are most commonly used to get a feed, and they can cost as little as \$5. Some of the more top shelf jigs sell for \$40. We generally start with the cheaper model and as the season progresses and the larger squid come through, we step up to a \$12-\$14 jig.

There is a Squid Club that meets in late April. If you would like to learn how to catch squid, just let us know and we can give you the details or look up on Facebook for "Moreton Bay Squid Club".

Although Snapper are in Moreton Bay all year round we will start to see better numbers and sizes move in to the shallows reef areas around Scarborough. You generally don't need to travel far to find them but before you get geared up to chase them, take a minute or two and check your gear.

A lot of people will drag their gear out from last season to find rods damaged and reels in need of a service. If you find yourself in this boat drop your gear into us for a service.
