

"The thing I like the most about this place is there's no pretention. It's exciting to cater for such a varied demographic. People don't have to go to Brisbane or the Sunshine Coast for a good meal. There's great food right here," Hangan says.

After six months in his new role, Hangan has revamped all menus throughout the hotel, adding flavours from his worldwide experience.



Building Industry," Manuel Richard Hornibrook was born in Brisbane in 1893. He received little formal education, attending four primary schools from Obi Obi to South Brisbane.

Manuel's first full time work was with H W Fooks Building and Joinery Works in Adelaide Street. At 13 years of age he became an apprentice with the firm.

When his employer was absent with illness, Manuel at the age of 17 worked out a price to restore fire damage to a building in Rothwell. He then assembled a workforce and did the job for less than half the contract price.

Soon after, he left the firm and went into a building business partnership for the next two years.

Having succeeded as a house builder, M R Hornibrook expanded the business to include civil engineering construction and did a home study course in quantity surveying with International Correspondence Schools.

MR's bridge building career began in 1925-6, when his firm built an eight span reinforced concrete structure for the Queensland Main Roads Board at Howard in the Burrum Shire.

Eventually he constructed more than 100 bridges including the Indooroopilly Bridge, the William Jolly Bridge, the Victoria Bridge, the Story Bridge (with Evans Deakin Ltd) and the Hornibrook Highway.

It was in seeking a solution to find work for his men during the depression years that he began the most ambitious venture of his career, building Australia's longest bridge, the Hornibrook Highway. Construction began in June 1932 and the opening took place on 4th October 1935...70 years ago.

Sydney provided the setting for the most spectacular job in MRH's long and varied career – the world famous Sydney Opera House. Apart from being the most glamorous project, the structure was also the most complex. It was unique and was the 'brain-child' of Mr Jorn Utzon of Denmark, winner of the world-wide Sydney Opera House Design Competition in 1957. This was the type of challenge to bring joy to Manuel Hornibrook's heart and he took an intense and active interest in every phase of the work.

Sir Manuel died on 30th May 1970 aged 76.



# BOOK APPEAL FOR DISADVANTAGED CHILDREN

The Moreton Bay Region Libraries, including the Redcliffe Library, is in partnership with The Smith Family, a well-known children's charity helping disadvantaged Australian children make the most of their education and create better futures.

"To date, residents in the Moreton Bay Region have helped donate more than 6,380 books and generously raised more than \$8,700, and I'm again encouraging residents to support this fantastic cause," Moreton Bay Regional Council Mayor Allan Sutherland says.

Donations can be made at any Moreton Bay Region Library and proceeds will go directly to disadvantaged families throughout the region.

## **HISTORY IS MADE ON BEE GEES WAY**

t's not every community that can boast of being the hometown of some of the world's best-selling music artists of all time. Well, Redcliffe can and they are clearly proud of the fact. This was evident at the opening of the second stage of the Bee Gees Way during the Redcliffe Festival in September.



Barry Gibb was there for the poignant and historic occasion that saw him unveil a glass structure that holds a replica of the Bee Gee's first contract that they signed with Bill Goode and Bill Gates at Redcliffe in 1959.

Moreton Bay Regional Council Mayor Allan Sutherland said thousands of music fans made the pilgrimage to Redcliffe to witness the official unveiling of Stage Two of Bee Gees Way.

"Barry Gibb has been heavily involved in the creative and artistic aspects of the Stage Two upgrade of Bee Gees Way and has been keen to share even more Bee Gees material with his home town of Redcliffe," Mayor Sutherland said.

New elements to the walkway include new Bee Gees memorabilia personally curated by Barry Gibb, murals of each of the brothers and a bronze statue. The statue was designed and sculpted by Brendale sculptor Phillip Piperides and depicts the Bee Gees as men at the height of their musical career. Phillip Piperides also sculpted the original statue of the young Bee Gees that stands in the walkway.

A shelter extending the full length of the walkway is a new addition, along with a large outdoor audio-visual screen displaying the history and music of the Bee Gees.

The opening of Stage Two of Bee Gees Way enabled Barry Gibb to reconnect with the place he so fondly remembered as a child.

"My memories of my time in Redcliffe are as vivid today as when I was running around barefoot with my brothers exploring its many treasures," said Barry.

"Moreton Bay Regional Council has allowed me to share even more memories of my time in Redcliffe, stories from different eras of our lives and career, and honour my brothers Robin, Maurice and Andy."

As Mayor Sutherland says, "Bee Gees Way tells the story of the Gibb brothers' incredible journey from the Redcliffe Speedway to the top of the world music charts." Mayor Sutherland added, "In many respects it has been a way of saying thanks to the fans for their support and to Redcliffe as the place where it all started for the Bee Gees more than five decades ago.

The upgrade to the walkway has been formally recognised by the State Government as a Queensland Place name. During the opening Queensland Deputy Premier Jackie Trad announced the walkway was officially gazetted.

Bee Gees Way is open 24 hours- a-day, seven days- a-week with access via Redcliffe Parade and Sutton Street. ••

## GATEWAY UPGRADE DESIGN AT FINAL STAGE

Work on designing the Gateway North upgrade has progressed to the final stage following community feedback and further technical and environmental investigations.

Federal Member for Petrie Luke Howarth said the project will deliver a much needed capacity and safety upgrade for Redcliffe locals who join more than 80,000 motorists on the Gateway each day.

"Major construction is expected to start early next year, and will involve widening an 11.3-kilometre section from four to six lanes between Nudgee and Bracken Ridge, upgrading the Nudgee Road interchange and widening the Deagon Deviation to two lanes in both directions." Mr Howarth said.

Motorists travelling north will be able to exit the motorway just before Depot Road and continue on a new overpass over the motorway for a seamless connection to Redcliffe.

"The on-ramp at Boondall will be permanently closed as part of the upgrade, however this won't happen until the new overpass is complete, to allow time for motorists to get used to the new route."

The Nudgee interchange upgrade will involve lengthening the on and off-ramps significantly to provide safer merging and exiting opportunities for motorists. Pedestrians and cyclists will also benefit from a new shared path along the entire length of the upgrade.

The project will support more than 1,000 direct jobs during its lifespan.

The Australian Government has committed \$929.6 million and the Queensland Government \$232.4 million to the Gateway Upgrade North project.


