# CHRISTMAS CHEER IN SCARBOROUGH

ach year, during December, the Scarborough Seaside Village is adorned with lights, tinsel and other decorations to celebrate Christmas. It's hard to miss the 10 3-metre tall Christmas trees that line Landsborough Avenue alongside coffee and boutique shops.

Scarborough Lights Up Redcliffe Inc is a not-forprofit group of volunteers that has been bringing old fashioned Christmas cheer to the streets of Redcliffe since 2006. And it couldn't be done without the sponsorships and in-kind support provide by the local business.

The Scarborough Lights Christmas event has attracted around 100,000 people to Scarborough during the Christmas school holidays since it began.

Partnering with the Moreton Bay Regional Council, Scarborough Lights works to provide Redcliffe Peninsula's premier Christmas event Christmas by the Sea, which is always held on the first Saturday in December.

Division Five Councillor James Houghton said Scarborough would be transformed into a magical Christmas village.

"Throughout December, the Scarborough precinct will be lit up by 10 huge Christmas trees, which will provide a wonderful light display," Councillor Houghton said.

"Coming along to Christmas by the Sea at Scarborough Beach Parklands on Saturday, December 5, is a great opportunity to see these 10 sparkling Christmas trees! It will be a Christmas event to remember, so I encourage residents from across the region to come and help us celebrate."

The Christmas by the Sea street party will feature markets and roving entertainment, while Scarborough Beach Park will showcase Santa's Village, rides, an animal farm, fireworks and festive performances by the Redcliffe City Choir, the Multitude Choir, and country music group DOZZI.



When Alan and Cathy Bray decided to open a fish and chip shop of their own, they knew they wanted to bring their passion into the workplace, and make it more than a simple take away shop.

"My husband's a mad Beatles fan, and always has been," explains Cathy. "His first record was The Beatles."

It made sense, then, that the musical icons played a part in the business. Alan and Cathy created Yabbey Road; a traditional English fish and chippery decked out in Beatles regalia and situated right near iconic Bee Gees Way.

"The Beatles and the Bee Gees were friends, they knew each other. So it's got that sort of link to Bee Gees Way." Given that the Bee Gees often mentioned the Beatles as a source of inspiration, it seems a fitting tribute.

Quality and value for money are important to Alan. "Everything's made fresh, right down to the battering and the crumbing of the fish. All the ingredients that can be made, we make. It's all to-order."

This isn't your typical, basic burger and chips so much as a gourmet indulgence for under \$10. Chef Joel is so passionate about his work at Yabbey Road that he left a job at the Sheraton to focus on creating succulent burgers you won't find anywhere else.

Though Yabbey Road is a new addition to Redcliffe, the eatery is already building up a loyal following of regulars, and it isn't just because the venue is licensed. Though the food is amazing, atmosphere is just as important to Alan and Cathy.

While there is memorabilia to covet and themed food names to amuse, the true magic rests in the family's warmth and humour. Combine friendly service with some of the best burgers and calamari you'll ever taste, and it's no surprise people keep coming back.

Yabbey Road is open from 10am Monday through Saturday, and serves a traditional English breakfast from 7am on Sundays. For some great music, and a little piece of England on the Redcliffe waterfront, be sure to head in to Yabbey Road. ••





## "DUGONGS" DEFEND THE REEF

The Mavis Filmer award, given to honour environmental efforts in the Moreton Bay region, hasn't been endowed to anyone for at least ten years.

But this year, things have changed!

Local environmental group, the Dugong Collective, are the Mavis Filmer Award winners for 2015 and have been recognised for an outstanding contribution to the environment.

The group were awarded the honour at Redcliffe Seaside Artists gallery on 4th November.

The Mavis Filmer award was originally created to honour the late owner of the Filmer Palace Hotel by the original dugong group the Redcliffe Dugongs. This troupe was the brain child of Richard Lancaster and started in 1998 out of concern for a small heard of dugongs in Moreton Bay. The group grew enormously in popularity, inducting prominent members Peter Beattie and Steve Irwin. When they disbanded there was a void left within the environmental community.

Richard Lancaster, the chairman for the Mavis Filmer Awards, says the Dugong Collective filled this need to give a voice to the marine life in Moreton Bay.

"This year because of the tremendous work of Ray, Angie and Malaika Gannon in the dugong

collective, we decided we would award them the Mavis Filmer Award". he said.

"They literally picked up what the Redcliffe Dugongs were doing. They have built on what we did in the 1990s and early 2000s. The Mavis Filmer award is given by our little committee, which are all ex-Redcliffe Dugongs, to people who have done great work in relation to looking after the environment and indeed the wild creatures of the Moreton region."

Angie Gannon, who started the Dugong Collective with her husband Ray, says they are just a group of people who love marine life and want to make a difference.

"We're just very passionate about the dugongs, turtles and dolphins in the bay," Angie said.

Their enthusiasm for the reef has certainly attracted a lot of attention with over 5,000 people signing up to be members of the Dugong Collective. Their latest campaign is concentrated on trying to prevent littering in the bay.

"We have a lot of followers who go along picking up rubbish, fishing line, hooks and plastic from the shore. We're also trying to get the council to have a patrol sweep along the rocks where the rubbish gets caught. I know the Redcliffe council have a tractor that cleans the beach to get rid of all of the bits, but nothing gets up on to the rocks. When it's high tide or it has been stormy all the rubbish gets stuck up there."

The group are also currently trying to raise money to install a life-size dugong statue featuring a Mother and her calf in the Redcliffe CBD area.

"There are tourist signs with the dugongs on and everybody always drives around and says well, where are they?" Angie says.

"We don't want people to actually go out there looking for the dugongs because they are very shy creatures and very important too. We thought why not have a designated spot in Redcliffe so that people can come and see it. They can sit and have a coffee and admire the statue. They don't have to go out there to disturb the dugongs."

The Dugong Collective have a stall at the Redcliffe markets every Sunday with all of the proceeds going towards conservation efforts.

Next year the Mavis Filmer awards will be back with another deserving recipient. ●●













### **MUTINY ON THE GAYUNDAH**

Mutiny on the Gayundah is the title of a visual depiction of a major historic Queensland event, few know about. It has all the elements of a good story, so drama, intrigue, fantasy, betrayal, love and above all, fun all play their part. The presentation is also Monty Pythonesque, but with a twist. Mutiny is the first in a series called Queensland's History Mysteries and is produced by Redcliffe based High Time TV under the direction of Lancaster McShea Productions.

Costumes have been supplied by Have a Fun Time Fancy Dress and Party Supplies, adding to the crazy aspects of the feature. Richard Lancaster is responsible for the research, script and direction of the movie, while Ben McShea is in charge of technical direction. Musical direction is by Lachlan Stewart. More features in the series are planned for 2016/17.





## THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN WORK FORCE AND HOUSING MARKET


#### We investigate the linkage between growth in employment and growth in home values across the capital city housing markets.

Being employed is often a key determinant to owning a home. Yes it is an obvious statement but it is a fact that is often forgotten about. It is common belief that low interest rates have been the key driver of the recent growth in home values however, growth in values has been narrowly based whereas

interest rates are the same across the country. Given this there is clearly more to current housing conditions than low interest rates and employment is a key driver.


During 2008, combined capital city home values fell by -6.1% from March to December. Spurred by aggressive cuts to interest rates and stimulus in the form of the First Home Owners Grant Boost, combined capital city home values started to rise thereafter. While values increased. Sydney and Melbourne


have consistently recorded the strongest value growth while for brief periods Perth, Canberra and Darwin have also seen guite strong levels of value growth. Given the dramatically different capital growth performances it is clear that it is not all due to low interest rates.

Hobart

Between December 2008 and September 2015, the majority of employment growth has taken place in Sydney and Melbourne. If we look at employment growth across the capital cities and territories, more than two thirds (66.9%) of employment growth has taken place in Sydney and Melbourne. Importantly a larger proportion of total full-time jobs growth (74.2%) has taken place in Sydney and Melbourne than part-time jobs growth at 61.8%.

Total change in employment, 12 months to Sep-15



Since 2008, the NT was the only region in which the rate of growth for full-time employment has been greater than growth in part-time employment. Although the rate of full-time jobs growth was lower in Sydney, it along with the NT have been the only two regions that have recorded a greater

total increase in full-time employment than part-time employment since the end of 2008. It is an obvious statement but full-time employment growth would seem to be more important than part-time as it means the employee is working more and in most cases earning more money which is in-turn more conducive to home ownership.

Over the 12 months to September 2015, Sydney and Melbourne have continued to create the greatest proportion of jobs. There has also been somewhat of a reversal of fortunes for the remaining regions. Fulltime employment growth has more recently ramped up in Brisbane and Hobart, while Adelaide has continued to shed full-time jobs while there were also fewer full-time jobs available in Perth and the ACT. Over the past vear, 24,713 full-time jobs have been created in Brisbane compared to 26,036 since 2008. Similarly in Hobart there has been 3,331 full-time jobs created over the past year compared to full-time job losses of -4,347 since 2008.

While job creation isn't necessarily the be all and end all of housing demand it is an important component to consider. It certainly goes some way to explaining why home value growth has been much stronger in Sydney and Melbourne over recent years than in other cities. The recent relative strength in job creation in Brisbane and Hobart may signal increasing housing demand in those cities over the coming year. ••
