



Executive Producer Dan Nebe says, "We are very proud of the fact that this event is the largest of its kind in the region, both in terms of the size and quality of the show and the amount of money raised for a great cause."

The event will be held at the Dolphins Leagues Club Redcliffe. "We are so happy to be back at the Leagues Club again. This time we are bringing The Radiators and Dave Evans (ex AC/DC) to co-headline our event. Last time the Radiators played at the venue it was standing room only," explained Mr Nebe.

The Radiators are an Australian pub rock band that formed in 1978. They are known for their metal-pop anthems. Dave Evans was AC/DC's original lead singer but left the band and went onto joining Newcastle band Rabbit. He has released three solo albums.

The show will feature state of the art sound and lighting. Over 30,000 watts of sound system and \$25,000 worth of lighting will be used across two stages.

Award Winning Singer Lined Up for Sails Festival

Carl Wockner set to play acoustic pop, rhythm & blues

If you are planning to visit the 'Sails Festival' at Suttons Beach, timing your visit for 1pm will have you encountering the voice and music of Carl Wockner.

An acoustic singer and songwriter, Carl was named the only Australian artist to ever win Top Honors at the International Acoustic Music Awards in the USA in 2015.

Carl describes his music in the genre of acoustic pop and rhythm and blues. His full time musical career sees him playing over two hundred gigs a year.

How it started

It all began with Carl's first EP 'Acoustic... ness' which he created in his own lounge room. When released in 2011 it received tremendous acclaim.

Then in 2014, he released his first album 'Crayon Days'. For this, came an ARIA nomination along with his producer Michael Flanders from Nashville, Tennessee.

Originally from Bundaberg, Carl grew up with some violin and piano lessons, but no formal musical training. He plays by ear and you would say music runs through his veins. "Traces of music are on both sides of the family," says Carl. His mother sang and played the piano and his paternal grandfather played the accordion.

Collaborative match

It was while playing at the 'Gympie Music Muster' in 2012 that he met with musical producer Michael Flanders. They have been collaborating ever since. Carl is to spend a month in Nashville this year recording his next album with Michael.

Carl has an aura of musicality. His original music is peaceful and emanates soul. Alongside these soulful creations are cover songs which Carl injects a playfulness that is fun and quirky. He transforms these songs onto another creative platform through his use of live looping and what he calls "coversmashup".

Being a musician Carl says is "awesome because it's doing something that you love but it also leaves you vulnerable. When you write lyrics about your life and sharing your views it exposes yourself which can lead to criticism from others." For Carl, like any artist this just goes with the territory.

Beachside jam

Carl enjoys the interaction received when playing at festivals and is looking forward to the 'Sails Festival'.

Carl says, "I love playing my music at the beachside and being part of a festival." He also adds how he gets a kick out of seeing kids enjoying his music. He feels kids these days don't get exposed to very much live music.

Racing through the Bay in Style

Brisbane To Gladstone

The Brisbane to Gladstone Yacht
Race is one of the most iconic races in
Queensland. This year marks the 68th
anniversary of the race, filling Moreton Bay
with numerous colourful yachts on their way
north in the highest profile Easter weekend
sporting event in Australia.

On Good Friday, 25 March at 11am, yachts will set sail while onlookers watch from Shorncliffe and along the shore of Bramble Bay including Suttons Beach during the Redcliffe Sails Festival. Competing for one of the oldest perpetual trophies in Australia, the Courier Mail Cup, entrants will race the 308 nautical miles in some of the country's finest racing vessels.

First raced in the Easter of 1949, Doug Perrins was the first person to finish the race on the yacht 'Hoana' in 47hrs 08min 25sec, which was a very creditable time and stood undefeated until 1955. The race record is 20hrs 24min 50sec and still stands to be beaten in 2016.

Last year, Queensland Racer Mark Bradford, skipper of Black Jack took an impressive double, winning both line honours and the Courier Mail Cup. With Moreton Island a beautiful backdrop for the event, families take advantage of the warm weather.

"Anywhere along the Margate and Redcliffe front is a great place to view the race from," says local Daryl Johns, "There's lots of free parking and you can watch the yachts go by the festival. Every year people line their chairs up along the front to watch the yachts sail through the Bay."

The absolute best way to watch the race is to be in the water near the contestants. If you're lucky enough to own a vessel, you are allowed to spectate in nearby waters. However, event organisations are asking everyone to familiarise themselves with the Race Exclusion Zone in the water and follow the advice of officials on the day to stay safe and allow the race to begin. If there are spectators inside the Race Exclusion Zone, the start will be delayed.

Redcliffe is one of the best vantage points to view the race. Lots of people are attracted to the Sails Festival along Suttons Beach on Good Friday, and the steps to the water provide the best seats in the Bay for watching the race go by.



Tangalooma Wrecks

The rusting bones of old ship hulls have become one of Queensland's most iconic silhouettes, but their increasingly fast corrosion means the Tangalooma Wrecks may soon be a fond memory.

The 15 vessels were sunk in 1963 to provide safe anchorage to boaties on the western side of the island.

But late last year, State authorities cut down the Tangalooma Wrecks just above the waterline, as part of works to stabilise the structures.

Federal Member for Petrie Luke Howarth MP said while this was done with people's safety in mind, he was concerned that there was no plan to restore the wrecks.

"It's alarming to know the State Government is asleep on this issue when more than 10 per cent of people in the Moreton Bay Region are employed in tourism."

Luke Howarth MP's concerns have been echoed by thousands of people on social media, as well as by the local maritime and tourism industry.

Northside Marine owner Greg Nickerson said the result of removing this man-made cove

would be "boats upside down or on beaches, and lives at risk".

We can't fix what happened but we need a plan to renew the wrecks to what we had previously."

Moreton Island Adventures CEO Roz Shaw agreed: "It is imperative that there is a long term plan to ensure this attraction and safe harbour for boating is retained."

Luke Howarth MP is lobbying Defence Minister Marise Payne to get more decommissioned ships sunk off Moreton Island.


"This is as much about the boaties and snorkelers as it is about jobs, tourism and our small businesses," said Luke Howarth MP.

"I want to see Tangalooma Wrecks survive for generations to come."

This year marks the 26th year of Clean Up Australia Day. In 1989, Ian Kiernan, an average Australian bloke had an idea to clean up Sydney Harbour.


Local business Aeropower will be running a Clean Up Australia site in the mangrove area next to the Redcliffe Airfield involving company employees and several aviation students.

Salt Shop, located at 118 Sutton Street in Redcliffe, opened in late 2015 to equip those who are unemployed with vision and skills by

working together for the greater good of the community.

By making soaps, scrubs and candles and restoring and renewing furniture, people who have been left unemployed and have sought support through the Government initiative Job Active Program or Help Enterprises, are able to work in the community hub, learn new skills and support local not for profit organisations.

Furthermore, they are given the opportunity to be trained in customer service, barista skills and retail and marketing with the intention of helping each of them become job ready and come off unemployment lists.

After running an innovative sports clinic for people of all ages in a variety of sports, Tracey Lech from Salt No Limits Inc decided that

opening the cafe was an opportunity to branch out a new arm of the not for profit organisation.

"The products we make are sold or given

to other organisations and the profits go back into community sports programs and help to fund competitor's camps or state competitions," says Lech.

"The more support the public gives us, the more we can upskill and train those who really need it, while

Matt Lewer from Redcliffe Cycles on Oxley Avenue says bike riding is very popular with Redcliffe residents of all ages and maintenance should be a priority. "It is important to service bikes regularly. Chains need cleaning and re-oiling on a regular basis and spokes are under high tensions so they need regular checking," Matt says.

"If they look after their bike and get the regular service, it is a small cost for longevity of the bike"

It is also very important to pass on riding skills and road safety to the next generation, Matt says.

"Bike handling skills we get passed on down from our parents. They are passing on skills that are worthwhile and kids pay attention because it is fun. Riding a bike is fun," Matt says.

"It is important to make sure a child under a certain age doesn't ride on the road on their own and is guided by someone who knows the road rules."

An Historical Perspective

Marle Juster

REDCLIFFE ZOOS as recalled by Marle Juster, a retired patron of History Redcliffe (The Redcliffe Historical Society Inc.)

THE PALACE HOTEL'S PRIVATE ZOO

Mr Harold Filmer purchased the Palace Hotel in 1926 for £4000. At this time, Harold was a close friend of Mr Cavill, owner of Cavill's Hotel, Surfers Paradise. Mr Cavill had a zoo at the back of his hotel and probably had some influence on Mr Filmer establishing a zoo at the rear of his hotel at Woody Point in 1927.

It had emus, wallabies and big aviaries of parrots. Mr Filmer would feed the birds and animals every day and it was a sight to see the birds swarming over him.

The zoo was situated where the garages were later located and next to the woodshed where they cut and stored the wood for use in the kitchen.

The zoo closed about 1954 to make room for the extensions behind the hotel.


MR AND MRS PERCY FROST'S PRIVATE ZOO

This zoo was located on the corner of Joseph Street and Dover Road, Margate. It was behind their home and occupied about 16 perches of land in Dover Road. The zoo had emus, wallabies, ponies and hundreds of birds. It was probably started during the 1920s and closed about 1964.

THE REDCLIFFE ZOO

This zoo was owned by the Reid brothers and was situated approximately where the Redcliffe High School is today. It operated during the 1930s and early 1940s when it was closed as the brothers joined the armed forces for WWII.

One of the attractions at this zoo was a large carpet snake and the visitors loved to have their photo taken with the snake around their body.



It was a popular zoo that attracted locals and visitors alike having a large sign in Oxley Avenue proclaiming REDCLIFFE ZOO.

SCARBOROUGH ZOO

This zoo was established after WWII at the southern end of where the Southern Cross College is today. It was relocated in the middle 1950s from Cavill's Hotel in Surfers Paradise. It was simply referred to as the Scarborough Zoo and its main feature was the magnificent butterfly collection. It was mainly snakes, birds and Australian animals. Mr Filmer of Woody Point could have influenced Mr Cavill to move his zoo to Redcliffe. It is not known if the star attraction at Surfers Paradise came to Scarborough. It was a six legged cow!







Property prices double every decade?

CoreLogic RP Data

It is often commented that in Australia property values double every 10 (some say 7) years. This week we look at whether this has been the case over the past 10 years across the capital cities.

Most people who are interested in residential property would have heard of the notion that property values double each decade. This week we are looking at whether or not that has been true over the past 10 years.

Over the 10 years to January 2016, home values across the combined capital cities have increased by a total 72.0% which is well short of values doubling over the decade. If we look at the split between houses and units, house values are 73.1% higher compared to a 64.3% increase in unit values.

Although combined capital city home values haven't doubled over the past decade, the previous decade was quite a different story.


Between January 1996 and January 2006 combined capital city home values increased by 151.7% with house values up 159.6% and unit values 110.1% higher. Based on this data, the most recent decade of capital city home value growth has been half that of the previous decade.

The combined capital city index is weighted so it is heavily influenced by the performance of the larger capital cities. Taking a look at value growth over the past decade across individual capital cities shows a diversity in results.

Melbourne is the only capital city housing market in which home values have doubled over the past decade. In fact, many cities are a long way from having doubled with values in Brisbane, Adelaide, Perth, Hobart and Canberra having all increased by less than 50% over the past decade. Home values in Sydney and Darwin have each recorded increases of more than 75% over the past decade however, they too fell well short of seeing values double over the decade.


Over the previous decade (10 years to January 2006) home values more than doubled across each capital city (note that Hobart values are for houses only and data is not available for Darwin). In fact, value growth over the previous decade was more than three times greater than over the most recent decade in Brisbane, Adelaide, Perth, Hobart and Canberra while nationally it was more than double the


Cumulative change in capital city home values, 10 years to Jan-06

rate of value growth over the past 10 years. Even Sydney and Melbourne recorded much stronger home value growth over the previous decade compared to the past decade.

If we look at value growth over the five years to January 2016, it looks unlikely that by the time January 2021 rolls around that home values would have doubled over the decade in any of the capital cities. Over the past five years, Sydney and Melbourne are the only capital cities in which home values have increased by more than 10% with values lower in Hobart and Darwin.

While there was a time when home values doubled over a 10 year period the data suggests that the days of such rapid value rises are behind us. Of course remember that in recent times we have had record low mortgage rates yet that has failed to spark any substantial home value growth outside of Sydney and Melbourne. With little wage growth and ongoing economic uncertainty it is clear that in most areas of the country there are limits to what people can pay for housing. Subsequently there has been little impetus for any significant value growth outside of the two largest capital cities. Even in Sydney and Melbourne value growth has been substantially lower over the past decade than over the previous decade.


