Picnic Hill has been created to give Redcliffe a family friendly festival to bring the community together. It has arisen due to an initiative by the Redcliffe Area Youth Space and will be up and running and ready to be launched on July 8th.

Picnic Hill will be a monthly community event on the second Friday of each month. The location is on the corner of Oxley and Anzac Ave and the area will be fully fenced to make this a family friendly event.

Brisbane's favourite food trucks will feature vendors such as 'Bone Lorry' who specialise in meat on the bone style meals, Ruby – The Little Red Ice-cream Van that specialise in old school ice cream delights of freshly-made soft serve ice cream and gelato deserts, and Redcliffe born and bred business 'Jaffle Shmaffle' with their reinvented modern take on the old school jaffle.

For all beer lovers, there will be craft beer by the All Inn Brewing Co. from Banyo with their range of full flavoured ales.

The idea for the festival came about as a result of a program run out of the Redcliffe Youth Space Centre 'Skilling Queenslanders for Work Program'. This program educated young people in business skills and out of that came the idea to run a community festival.

Kelly Raedler, Coordinator of the Skilling Queenslanders for Work Program from the Redcliffe Area Youth Space says, "It's about



exhaling from the working week and enjoying a chilled out, family-vibe festival."

Entry to the festival will be by gold coin donation. "Any profits from the festival will be going directly to support at risk Moreton Bay youth," says Kelly.

For entertainment, there will be live acoustic music, old-fashioned lawn games and live street art on offer. Situated around the park will be bongo drums, hula-hoops, croquet, and a giant size connect four game. The aim is to soak up



"Often members will assist the public in getting great pictures of themselves with the cars that catch their eye, and we all are available to answer questions. We also have food and drink facilities, and Corvette memorabilia for sale."



# Iconic jetty preserved in council budget

The Redcliffe Jetty as well as a number of parks, recreational facilities and roads across Division 6 will receive a significant boost as part of Moreton Bay Regional Council's 2016/17 Budget.

Division 6 Councillor Koliana Winchester said the latest Budget would capitalise on the thousands of people who visited the Redcliffe Jetty each year and the growing popularity of Division 6's parks, open spaces and community facilities, with a \$430,000 investment to help preserve the landmark jetty and a further \$300,000 towards upgrading the Redcliffe Showgrounds.

"Council has this year already begun works to construct finger pontoons for the Redcliffe Jetty that will allow visitors to



moor off the dock. This Budget will continue council's investment by designing and constructing new handrails, making them sturdier and returning it to its original blue colour." Cr Winchester said.

"The Redcliffe Showgrounds upgrade will transform the ground's existing fields into multi-purpose fields with new lighting, irrigation systems and multi-purpose goal posts.

"I'm pleased to announce that council will this year allocate \$380,000 to construct a new park along the Hornibrook Esplanade Foreshore, \$170,000 for new amenities at Corscadden Park and \$90,000 for new playground equipment at Suttons Beach Park.

Once complete, the Hornibrook Esplanade Foreshore Park will include new playground spaces, picnic nodes, amenities, pathways, park furniture, landscaping and a community event space.

"Together with these upgrades, council has also committed to investing \$40,000 in new playground equipment at Kirami Park, Kippa-Ring, \$50,000 towards upgrading Robert Dalton Park and \$50,000 for garden enhancements at the Redcliffe Botanical Gardens

"Tourism already generates more than \$659.7 million for the Moreton Bay Region, and by enhancing our popular parks and recreation spaces, it will encourage even more residents and visitors to explore our region.

As part of the Budget, Charlish Park will receive a \$50,000 boost to upgrade the facility's seawall.

Cr Winchester said in keeping with its commitment to community facilities, council would also allocate \$300,000 to create a new exhibition space at the Redcliffe Museum.

Cr Winchester said continuing to invest in roads was also a focus for Division 6 in the 2016/17 with more than \$1.7 million. allocated to upgrade Victoria Avenue at Woody Point and \$1.485 million going towards council's ongoing road resurfacing program in Division 6.

"In addition to the Victoria Avenue road upgrade, important waterway infrastructure on Victoria Avenue will also receive a boost with \$1.9 million allocated for upgrades.

Cr Winchester said this was a strong and sustainable Budget, and that she was also continuing to work with the Mayor and her fellow councillors to secure funding from both the State and Federal governments for the Moreton Bay Region University Precinct.

job-creating, region-building infrastructure projects, the 16/17 budget includes a Redcliffe Jetty upgrade; intersection improvements at Victoria Avenue and King Street, Woody Point; corridor improvement works at Marine Parade, Redcliffe; storm water infrastructure renewal and upgrade program; Hornibrook Esplanade Foreshore Clontarf Park Construction 1; Kirami Park Kippa-Ring playground renewal; Redcliffe Showgrounds - multi-use fields development; Oxley Avenue - feature lighting installation vicinity of Joseph and Hale Streets, Margate.

Parks, open spaces and recreation facilities in Division 6 are hugely popular with both local residents and visitors, so it's good to see council continue to invest in these spaces and well as continuing its commitment to investing in roads and making it safer for all users, as well as upgrades for important waterway infrastructure.

Redcliffe residents with also benefit from \$7.1m in 2016-17 out of a \$8.1m total spend to increase inpatient capacity by relocating cancer care and renal services to the Moreton Bay Integrated Care Centre.



The perfect mix of an innovative vision and a sight-saving product has made eye safety a focus for one Redcliffe entrepreneur.

As founder of The New Eye Company, Andreas Mehringer has revolutionised safety glasses in the workplace with its award-winning optical products.

The Safety Eyewear System reduces the cost of optical RX safety glasses, which are used by workers to protect their eyes from injuries, and eliminates the need for replacement lenses.

The glasses have also attracted significant media attention over the years.

The New Eye Company won the ABC's New Inventors in 2011, followed last year by the Telstra Innovation Awards and, most recently, Shark Tank.

Andreas says he was following the English version of Shark Tank, Dragons Den, before deciding to apply for the show.

"It was recorded last November, and aired last month," he says.

"The only awkward situation was when I stood in front of the Sharks for the recording and you face each other off for the first couple of minutes till the producer gives the go ahead for the pledge."

Andreas has vast experience in the area of optics, having trained as an optician in Germany in 1987 and working in the industry since.

He says the idea for the business came when he cut a piece of paper to put behind a safety frame to use as a blindfold for his girlfriend to show her her Christmas present.

"I realized if I used a material that is flexible and cut some holes in it, I could fit it with optical lenses and protect them behind a normal generic safety frame," he says.

"It was quite a challenge to set up the company and source the right materials to go forward, but determination and hard work brought us through the first difficult years.

"We all have setbacks, but there was nothing we could not deal with, and it made us stronger."

# Titanic Memories will live on

Local Bray Park resident Robert Martin has a passion to preserve the stories of the historic ill-fated Titanic.

This devotion to the Titanic has seen him spend over a decade researching and producing a film about the Titanic's fatal maiden voyage. He is now presenting lectures in the Moreton Bay area to share his stories.

Robert believes the most important stories in life are true stories.

They are the most powerful. I love history and capturing history on film and in music," he says.

Robert's interest in the Titanic began when he was just a boy, but it wasn't until 1985 when he read a newspaper article about the discovery of the Titanic wreck that his interest was ignited. Some years later, he attended a Titanic exhibition in Brisbane. It was there he met the youngest son of Titanic survivor Edith Haisman, who was selling a book he had written on his mother's survival. Robert, a musician, decided to write a song about this and later the idea of a film was conceived, and so too Robert's journey of discovery into the Titanic story.

Robert's dedication to preserving the history of the Titanic has seen him travel to Belfast, Ireland to the shipyard Harland and Wolff, where the Titanic was built. He researched stories of the remaining survivors and interviewed Millvina Dean who was only two months old when she was placed on a lifeboat and was rescued. Her story of survival was to become quite well known. Robert's research also took him to Southampton to visit the dock where the passengers began their journey on the Titanic.

The film is an eighty-minute documentary style film called 'Titanic 100 Years Then and Now'. It tells various stories and includes re-enactments. These were shot in Redcliffe



and in Bray Park as well as Belfast and Southampton.

Robert has been giving his lectures on the Titanic history in the Moreton Bay area and is continuing to do so. He gives a very detailed power point presentation, tells stories of survivors and shows artefacts from the Titanic's sister ship RMS Olympic, which was virtually identical. Robert even has a guitar made from wood of the RMS Olympic, which he has on show. Robert's presentations will be taking place at libraries, museums and a variety of social clubs.

Robert describes his research and making of the film as "the most interesting and fulfilling journey of his life – researching one of life's most unique and historic events."

# Surprising Teasure IN MORETON BAY

The Redcliffe Museum is a treasure-trove of information, artefacts and intrigue. Situated in the heart of Redcliffe at 75 Anzac Avenue, the Museum is showing its latest exhibit Surprising Stories About Ordinary Things from 13 May to 31 July.

Through its many exhibits, the Redcliffe Museum's collections show the history of Redcliffe, which expand the knowledge of anyone who visits. Showcasing Redcliffe and how it has evolved, the Redcliffe Museum allows us to reflect on past projects in the region and speculate on what's to come.

The Surprising Stories About Ordinary Things exhibit is made up of a huge range of everyday objects, such as bottles that were originally discarded as rubbish to treasured heirlooms that have been handed-down from generation to generation, each with an interesting story to share.

"I got to see the old-fashioned bath and a really big car," says seven year old Nicola Phoenix after a recent excursion from Humpybong State School.

We even got to see the old school hats worn by previous students who went to my school! My favourite part was using a magnifying glass to find landmarks on an old map of Redcliffe!"

Some of the objects in the exhibition reveal stories of invention, discovery and history through what would otherwise be commonplace objects.



# JETTIES... landmarks of the Peninsula's heritage

As shipping was the only practical means of transport to and from Redcliffe from the 1860s onwards, the Caboolture Divisional Board bowed to community and visitor demands by approving the construction of the first public Jetty on the Peninsula which was at Woody Point. 1881-1882. The cost was approximately £800.

Three years later, the first Redcliffe Jetty was opened in 1885 at a cost to the Divisional Board of £1357. In 1889, it was extended to a length of 700 feet (213.7m). A second Redcliffe Jetty was necessary owing to the deterioration of the original one. It opened in Jan 1922, one chain to the North.

In 1938, an amusement arcade was established in the Halfway House. Its first proprietor was Harry Pearson, whose son-in-law and daughter Almoro and Vera Woodhead took over in 1952, remaining there for 21 years. A quote from Almoro in the Redcliffe Herald of 2 January 1974 states, "in those days all the machines (32 of them) operated on pennies and during the war years pennies were in short supply, but

American GIs were not! They were everywhere. For the want of something to do, they would bet each other who could roll a penny down the pier the furthest before it fell down a crack which nearly made Harry shed tears of blood seeing his 'stock in trade' disappear."

Ships that called at the Woody Point and Redcliffe Jetties from the early 1880s included Arakoon, Boko, Francis Cadell, Norseman, Kate, Natone, Beaver, Pearl and Emerald. The best remembered ship of all is the Koopa. Many of these ships are remembered in the names of streets in the western part of the suburb of Rothwell.

Meanwhile a second Woody Point Jetty had also been constructed and opened in 1922. It was demolished in 2007, and the third jetty had replaced it by early 2009.

Foot bridges across Bells Creek and Humpybong Creek were utilized from the 1998 demolition of the second Redcliffe Jetty. Mayor Alan Boulton and Redcliffe City Councillors opened the third Redcliffe Jetty on 27 November 1999.


