

"For the little ones, the Little Grubs stage will provide the perfect introduction to gardening, cooking and craft, and for the adults, our other stages will feature many great shows."

Adults are sure to be particularly impressed with the presence of some famous faces.

"This year, we'll be joined by Australia's most famous gardener, Don Burke," Mayor Sutherland says.

Mayor Allan Sutherland says the event was designed to showcase cooking demonstrations, gardening speakers and workshops, as well as raising public awareness of the Botanic Gardens.

"Friends of the Gardens suggested a Green Wattle Day with native plants for sale, so we worked with them to develop it into an event that catered to a broad range of interests," he says.

"Once the planning was done, What's Cooking in the Gardens was born and it has proven to be a very popular community event ever since," he says.

The event is set to be even more popular this year with the inclusion of a Farmers Market, DIY Stage for crafts, and a free pot plant workshop, which will provide participants with seedlings that they can take home and plant.

Founded by Olive McKee in 1987, U3A Redcliffe Inc., now has many members enrolled throughout Northern Brisbane.

Situated in the first floor of The Sutton Centre in Redcliffe, U3A provide more than 75 different classes, some of which are held at outside venues. All of the tutors are volunteers and the cost of courses are kept to an absolute minimum to allow everyone access to classes.

Redcliffe will welcome spring in family-friendly style this month at the annual Redcliffe Festival from August 27 to September 11.

In its third successful year, the festival will once again showcase everything Redcliffe has to offer over three jam-packed weekends.

The festival features a mixture of free and ticketed events including Redcliffe KiteFest, the Bee Gees Way Dinner, Scarborough Sounds, the Jetty Fiesta and Redcliffe Remembers.

Moreton Bay Region Industry and Tourism CEO Shane Newcombe says this year's festival aims to showcase as much of the beautiful Redcliffe Peninsula as possible, and is perfect for the whole family.

"Every piece of entertainment and festival activity is there to wow people of all ages," he says.

Shane hopes patrons take away memorable moments from the festival and know you don't have to spend a large amount to show the family a great time.

"From Redcliffe's largest markets to the street performers and Moreton Bay Region's largest fireworks display, the Redcliffe Festival delivers all kinds of entertainment," he says.

"We are certain those who have not visited Redcliffe before, will definitely do so again after experiencing the festival."



KiteFest ready to pull all the strings

The Peninsula's eyes will turn to the sky come August 27-28 when the 21st annual Redcliffe KiteFest sees all manner of contraptions dip, dive, float and fly through the air above Moreton Bay.



With the celebration now in its 21st year, organisers expect Redcliffe KiteFest to attract close to 40,000 visitors to the Peninsula - all of them keen to see the awesome acrobatics going on above them

"Over the years, the event has grown both in size and popularity," says Moreton Bay Region Industry & Tourism chief executive Shane Newcombe.

"Now a ticketed event, the Redcliffe KiteFest boasts a massive program of international kite flyers (and Australia's best), stage entertainment, aerobatic displays, children character shows, amusement rides, kite-making workshops plus more."

KiteFest has a stack of new additions this year, with a global contingent heading to Redcliffe to join the festivities.

"This year we will be visited by international kite flyers from numerous countries around the world, including Malaysia, China and New Zealand. Our amazing kite flyers will also be



looking to involve the crowds for the first time," Shane says.

"In addition, the KiteFest will feature two live kids' shows, *Minions* and *Marvel*. The ocean zone will be activated with a jet ski stunt show, fly boarders, jet ski kite, paddle boarding and kite surfing.

Around the festival visitors can enjoy bubble soccer, Bubble Nation, the Big Science Show, laser tag, and the largest and most carnival rides we've ever had.

"There's also a kite-making workshop for \$5 that will allow the kids to learn how to build a kite and then fly it in the designated kite-flying area. There is also a huge range of kites for sale at the event."

Families don't have to expect KiteFest to be a drain on the wallet, as Shane says the festivities are designed to not break the bank.


"Our aim is to deliver a fun-filled event that will thrill and amaze, but won't leave families penniless," he says.

"After the small gate fee, the Redcliffe KiteFest is predominantly free. We can't think of another event where families will get this much value out of a small entry cost.

"The Redcliffe KiteFest is an event for everyone. We have children's stage shows for the little ones and water-based stunt shows for the older kids and parents. Mum and dad can also wander through the huge range of market stalls and enjoy plenty of food from the vendors."

KiteFest is held over Saturday, August 27 and Sunday, August 28, 9am-4pm each day. Tickets are available from the gates on the days of the event, adults \$8, children \$5 and family pass \$20.



Providing support to the local community is what the Queensland Country Women's Association is all about. Their upcoming Craft Fair is a means to make this happen.

The Queensland Country Women's Association (QCWA) in Clontarf is holding a Craft Fair on Saturday 3rd September.

This fair is one of three craft fairs the QCWA holds throughout the year. They usually coincide with Mother's Day, Father's Day and Christmas.

A selection of craft varying from knitting, sewing, crochet and patchwork will be available for purchase. Secondhand books, plants, bric-a-brac, home preserves and fresh home baking will also be for sale alongside refreshments.

One stallholder who has had a long association with the QCWA is textile artist, Alex Stogdale.



"I make pictures out of thread, I make a drawing onto fabric and then colour in using a sewing machine." Alex says.

Alex is passionate about sewing and the art of craft is never far from her mind. She even admits to having withdrawals if she hasn't been on her sewing machine in a while.

Alex has exhibited her textile art in the Pine River Gallery and plans to do so again in the future. She enjoys the art of eco dyeing where plants are used to create dyes and according to Alex, "No two leaves dye the same colour." She can use two eucalyptus leaves from the same tree and each will produce a different colour.

Alex joined the QCWA nine years ago and enjoys the friendship and culture of the organisation. The Clontarf branch meets every second and fourth Thursday of the month for a craft morning where ideas are shared over morning tea.

The Country Women's Association has a long history in Australia. It was originally established as an organisation to improve the conditions for country women and children. These days the association is still about helping women and families but it goes beyond this and helps the broader community. QCWA member Sandra Farrell commends the organisation as "giving women in Australia a voice when it comes to matters of women and children".

Having a successful Thai restaurant in Burpengary, Orawan and Ong-Art Runahirun decided to venture further afield and expand on their already successful and proven business.

When a lease in North Lakes fell over they looked at Redcliffe and decided to take over an existing Thai Restaurant.

It's taken a while to win them over according to Ong-Art but business is looking up. They have a very experienced chef employed in the kitchen who brings an authentic Thai cooking style to the restaurant.

We are very lucky to have her and her kitchen skills," says Ong-Art.

Raised in families that were passionate about food, "There is a spirituality about food," says Ong-Art. The couple have an intrinsic knowledge about food and growing food that enhances their business.

One of the stand out dishes on the menu is the Thai marinated grilled pork skewers. This is a

served with sticky rice, which is also a typical Thai cuisine - served in a bamboo dish. This is quite a different meal to your standard

"Australian Thai" says Ong-Art. The innovative couple now vacuum pack these pork skewers and sell them to Asian grocery stores.

Ong-Art and Orawan are constantly looking to improve the business whether it is researching new recipes on the Internet or taking courses to upskill.

Future plans are to provide an awning at the front of the shop to enable al fresco dining and to utilise the sea views, which many of the tourists and locals enjoy when dining out.

Orawan and Ong-Art are originally from Bangkok in Thailand and emigrated when they were in their twenties. Ong-Art came to Australia to study engineering, however upon moving to the Gold Coast he found work in Thai restaurants. Orawan was educated in political science in Bangkok and worked as a bank teller before moving to Australia. She also worked in Thai restaurants and has a culinary diploma. One day they would like to move back to Thailand to live the guiet life. but until then Australia provides a great place to live, raise and educate their children.



Local movie enthusiasts have created and produced a ten-minute short film right from the beginning using local actors, locations and crew.

Catherine Cox filmed the various scenes and her biggest challenge was capturing a busy

scene at Mon Komo Hotel. "It was a big room with about twenty extras and I had to maintain all the camera functions including manual focus as well as learning to move the camera on tracks," says Catherine. A demanding scene to film, but Catherine was pleased with the results in post-production.

Local actors were cast in the film and they brought to life the characters in the play with authenticity. The protagonist 'Edith' in the story was performed by Angela Witcher. Angela comes from a theatrical background with over thirty years experience in the performing arts. This was her first venture into the art of filmmaking.

It was a great experience, good fun and the crew were helpful and made me feel comfortable," says Angela. "The biggest challenge was adapting to the requirement of film as opposed to stage. Stage performance requires a much larger and bigger performance than film," she says.

Thrilled with their movie production the group now plans to enter the film into the 'Heart of Gold' Gympie Film Festival, which showcases well-crafted and uplifting short films from around the world.

The old building on Suttons Beach, which is the Redcliffe Surf Life Saving clubhouse, may soon be but a memory for long-time Peninsula locals.

The Redcliffe Surf Life Saving Club was born in 1991 and was initially based in a shipping container.

A year later, the club relocated to the greenroofed building that now rests on the edge of Moreton Bay.

With the help of local Federal Member Luke Howarth MP, the club has now secured Federal Government funding to redevelop their building. "The Surf Lifesaving Club does an amazing job in our area," said Luke Howarth MP.

"They look after swimmers at Suttons Beach and teach local children water safety and how to swim in open water, all while helping our community become more active and cohesive."

The clubhouse expansion would provide a training area and a function area, available for hire, as well as the potential for a coffee shop that would be open for breakfast.

Club Administrator Edith Ralston-Bailey said club membership had increased 200 per cent in the past three years, with "our main focus on the active nippers and senior patrolling members".

"This should assure users of Suttons Beach that they are in safe hands.



Suttons Beach is listed, as per the Courier Mail, as one of the top 10 most popular family beaches, so it will not come as a surprise that over 400 preventative actions took place last season."

Ms Ralston-Bailey said the club was moving "onwards and upwards", and was looking forward to a new building that could better serve the membership and wider community.



Teachers of the style also see increased flexibility and improved mood, along with increased cardiovascular health and muscle tone.

"We ensure that students can learn at their own pace in a safe and supportive environment," says 6th Dan International ITF Taekwon-Do Instructor at the ITF Taekwon-Do school.

Rothwell Intersection Upgrade

Construction has commenced to convert the existing roundabout at Deception Bay Road and Anzac Avenue to a signalised intersection including signalised pedestrian crossings, shared user path and designated cyclist lanes.

The State Member for Redcliffe, Yvette D'Ath said the Deception Bay Road and Anzac Avenue are major urban arterial roads with over 50,000 vehicles travelling through the intersection daily.

The upgrade will bring many benefits to local residents and those travelling through to the wider region, including decreased travel times for motorists by easing congestion and increasing capacity, providing safe access to Rothwell station precinct and increased safety and reliability for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians."

Detailed design has been finalised after community consultation was conducted in April 2016. The design and construction of the Rothwell Intersection Upgrade (RIU) is estimated to cost \$37.5 million with the Queensland Government contributing \$22.6 million, the Moreton Bay Regional Council \$3.2 million and the Australian Government up to \$11.7 million.

The RIU will allow safe access to Rothwell station through Stubbins Street for motorists driving from Deception Bay Road. The Stubbins Street access road (the Gynther Road/Anzac Avenue intersection) is due to open in late 2016 with the overall project scheduled to take approximately 12 months to complete, weather and construction conditions permitting. Standard construction work will occur between 6.30am and 6.30pm, Monday to Saturday. Work will include day and night activities to deliver the upgrade on time and minimise the impacts during peak travel periods. When night works are required, the upgrade team will inform nearby residents in advance.

Our budget has been adopted with some iconic Redcliffe tourist draw cards coming up the big winners.

Division 5 will see the first stage of the Rothwell Tigers' new Nathan Road home coming to fruition

with \$3 million being allocated, as well as a \$2.3 million upgrade of Scarborough Beach Park and a continued focus on roads and road safety.

Of particular interest, is the first stage of ensuring the preservation of Scarborough's red cliffs, with \$150,000 earmarked to begin construction on infrastructure to stabilise the iconic landmarks and provide added safety along Landsborough Avenue. An additional \$1.5 million is allocated for the following year.

In Division 6 the Redcliffe jetty receives \$430,000 for upgrading, while foreshore parks including new playground spaces, picnic nodes, amenities, pathways, park furniture and landscaping will also be done. \$300,000 will create a new exhibition space at the Redcliffe Museum, where in 2015 alone more than 16,500 people visited.

By investing in these and other important community projects, Council continues to make Redcliffe and the Moreton Bay Region an even better place to live, work and play.

Scarborough Hotel

The Scarborough Hotel was originally called the Bay View Hotel with Sir Samuel Walker Griffith (later premier of Queensland) as one of the original shareholders.

Built in 1878 with 150 feet (45.67m) of verandahs at the front and sides, the hotel was the first one to be built on the Peninsula. The building sat on a gentle grassy slope facing Moreton Island at the narrow northerly end of the Peninsula.

This was 3 years ahead of the land boom of the 1880s so the Hotel helped the economy for 130 years until a mini tornado hit in c2008.

It was a brave decision to build on such an isolated and fairly inaccessible site without the attraction of a jetty to support its viability. *Bay View Hotel* was built 3 years before the jetty at Woody Point (1881) and the Redcliffe Jetty was built in 1885.

It was enlarged by licensee William Walsh in 1884 after 6 years of trading... A dining room 90 feet long "of magnificent dimensions" was added; also a smaller dining room and several other rooms. It is recorded that William had a

wagonette waiting to meet customers arriving at Redcliffe Jetty on the *Emerald* c1900. The distance to be travelled was 3.3km over a dusty track.

Bay View was rebuilt in 1926... probably when the name changed to the Scarborough Hotel.


Renovations began in the 1930s by Mr Fortune and his son Jim. Local resident Alma Shaw recalls that the Hotel became her home from 1930 to 1941 when her parents and other relatives ran it. The family had horses, cows, ducks, fowls and geese on the property and the beer was delivered by Alex Brazier in his truck. Freshly cooked crabs in baskets covered with a starched white cloth were sold outside the hotel by Viv Ridgway. Viv's son David said crabs sold for 4 to 6 for a shilling. Fresh fish was brought to the Hotel by Sam and Keith Buckley.

The Australian Comforts Fund offered hospitality and concerts there and The American Red Cross leased the Hotel in 1943 for Army personnel. The Hotel was demolished in November 2014.





Consumer Housing Market Sentiment Survey

The latest quarterly housing market sentiment survey by CoreLogic and TEG rewards revealed that almost two thirds of Australian's think now is a good time to be purchasing residential property while roughly the same proportion believed the housing market is vulnerable to a significant correction.



According to CoreLogic research head Tim Lawless, the latest CoreLogic and TEG Rewards Housing Market Sentiment Survey highlights the paradox in housing market attitudes, with the large majority of survey respondents indicating that it's a good time to buy a home at a time when the market may be vulnerable to a significant downturn.

Of the 2,432 Australian residents who participated in the June quarter CoreLogic TEG Rewards Housing Market Sentiment Survey, 64% of respondents thought it was a good time to buy a dwelling, up from 60% of respondents a year ago.

The survey also explored attitudes toward foreign investment.

It found 94% of survey respondents believe that foreign buying activity is placing some degree of upwards pressure on Australian home values, while 17% of those surveyed believe foreign buying is placing 'extreme' upwards pressure on home values. However more than half of those surveyed felt that any upwards pressure on dwelling values caused by foreign demand was modest, slight or non-existent.
