Model, Rebecca Craven, enjoying life following her transplant.

26-year-old Rebecca Craven's life began to unravel the day she came down with a common cold.

"It got to the point where I could hardly walk," she remembers. "I would wake in the night breathless - it felt just like my body was filling up with fluid. I can still remember when the doctors told me my heart had failed." After unsuccessful treatment with medication, Rebecca was put on the heart transplant waiting list.

Just one year ago, Rebecca received her new heart and remarkably will soon participate in Queensland's premier annual cycling event, the Cycle of Giving, which raises funds for organ transplant research occurring at The Prince Charles Hospital. Rebecca will begin her ride at Pelican Park, Woody Point, one of the event's starting points.

Those taking part in the ride on Sunday 5 March will have the option to cycle 100km, 65km or 25km from Landsborough, Caboolture and Redcliffe, taking in some of South East Queensland's most beautiful scenery along the

way. Participants will also have the honour of riding beside inspiring people, like Rebecca, who have been the recipients of life-saving organ transplants.

The Cycle of Giving was first held in 2006 and had just 17 participants. As each year passes, numbers grow and with that, so is the money raised. "We raised more than \$134,000 for research into improving organ transplants in 2016 - this year we hope to increase that to \$200,000," says Laurelle Curtis from The Prince Charles Hospital Foundation.

These funds went towards supporting young researcher Kenneth Sinclair's project, looking at stem cell therapy for pre and post-operative lung transplant patients.



Cycle of Giving has continued to grow every year, and in 2017 we hope to have 1000 participants," says Laurelle.

With March being the month for madness, what better way to be entertained than by Redcliffe's Mousetrap Theatre's amazing new production, *Siren*.

Based on iconic Australian play-write David Williamson's same-named play, *Siren* is about three undercover cops executing a sting to catch a corrupt Mayor, all the while vying for the attention of a sexy siren, called Liz. With the Mayor allegedly taking bribes to push through dodgy property deals, the policemen go undercover, as well as under-the-covers, inadvertently revealing people's desire for power and status.

Director, June Tretheway, is thrilled to be able to offer this play at Mousetrap since first reading it in the late 90s whilst studying Drama at QUT.

“ This is a play full of depth, comedy and pathos with three-dimensional, relatable characters — Williamson's insights into Australian culture and class are spot on. And with this year marking the 30th anniversary of the Fitzgerald Inquiry, it's a timely reminder of our chequered history.”

The cast predominantly hails from all over the Peninsula and surrounds, such as Redcliffe, Margate, Brighton, Sandgate, and Deception Bay — many of whom have also been in other Mousetrap or larger productions, including Hollywood films.

Quota's International Women's Day Breakfast

A part of the Redcliffe community for 60 years, Quota International has been working tirelessly to support the community, empowering women through friendship and service. International Women's Day has been observed since the early 1900s and is a day when women are recognised for their achievements, regardless of divisions and celebrated by Quota International of Redcliffe since 1996.

This year, Quota International supports Share the Dignity, an idea that began just 18 months ago with Rochelle Courtenay. Rochelle often refers proudly to herself as resident "pad lady", an unusual name, but one that represents a simple idea that has turned into a National Charity and in her own words — "never in my wildest dreams, would I have believed the result." Share the Dignity has distributed over 450,000 pads and tampons to women in need, as well as over 125,000 #itsinthebag Christmas gifts Australia wide.

Kay Smallhorne, Quota International Redcliffe President, says, "We looked into supporting different causes, as we do each year, and we found the work of Rochelle Courtenay of Share the Dignity to be a great cause. What we didn't realise was that she was so close! She's one of our own local people who has started this great service. Quota supports women and children, and we thought this was an excellent opportunity to support women who are not able to buy these necessary items for themselves.

“ Women always put themselves last, and it's an essential part of looking after yourself as a [woman], so we're delighted to be supporting Share the Dignity and looking forward to hearing Ms Courtenay speak at the International Women's Day Breakfast.”

Members of the community and school students alike are invited, with representatives from local schools in Grades six and 12. As this is a catered function, it is essential that you book your spot at Quota's International Women's Day Breakfast. 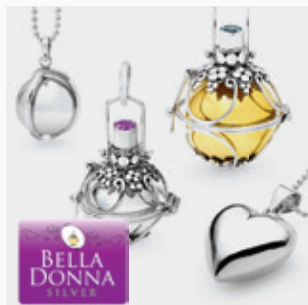

Parents and Citizens' Vice President, Anita Virgo has worked as the coordinator of the Mango Hill Mud Run for the last two years and looks forward to working on the committee for the event this year.

“ We were working out a different way to raise funds, preferring something other than a school fete.

We wanted something new, encouraging the kids to get out and be active and enjoy the world. I had been researching the adult mud runs online while my children looked on with envy, so that's how it all began!” Says Virgo, “The school's administration has been extremely supportive, and this will be our third year. We have a committee dedicated to the Mud Run.”

“Raffle tickets are sold at each event through volunteers to help fund the event, with prizes donated by local businesses.

“Business sponsors are also crucial at the event, providing cross-promotional marketing opportunities for traders.”

The first public meeting drew in 30 people, Kimberly says, but organisers would still like to hear from volunteers keen to help out.

“We have a handful of people who are going to help get this event off the ground, but we need more people to jump on board to assist in the running of the events,” she says.

“Whether they can help for an hour setting up or packing down on the day or even if they can assist through services or sponsorship donations, everything helps.”

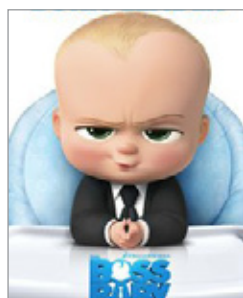

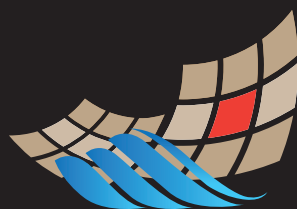

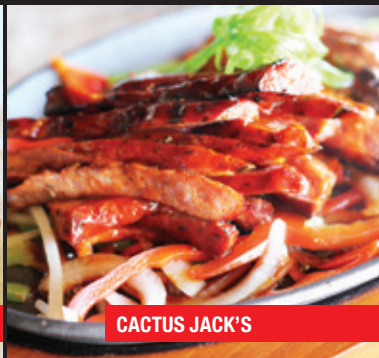

10 BARBEQUE MYTHS EXPLAINED



Despina Sierra, product manager, BeefEater Barbecues uncovers 10 common myths about barbeque cooking:

1 Should meat be at room temperature before cooking on the barbeque? Yes says Despina. Bring the meat out of the fridge and bring it to room temperature before you place it on the grill. Even better, buy meat directly from your local butcher and start cooking straight away. Keeping meat at room temperature enables the fibres to stay relaxed during the cooking process, keeping the meat tender. On the other hand, if you leave meat out too long you are at risk of bacteria.

2 Does closing the lid heat up the hotplate quicker? No. Lids are used for roasting, slow cooking meat and keeping the barbeque food warm. If you prefer to cook with the roasting hood down, never cook with the burners on high. Best results can be achieved by keeping the burners on low to medium heat within the desired cooking area.

3 Vegetables should be cooked separately before grilling on the barbeque. Thicker vegetables should be parboiled first. Boil potatoes and sweet potatoes for 15 to 20 minutes before grilling on the barbeque. Small vegetables or bite-sized portions are best placed on skewers or placing on a grill tray. Corn on the cob grills quicker if the silk and husk are removed. Turn them frequently and grill for 8 to 12 minutes.

4 Are more expensive barbeques better quality than cheaper ones or are they all the same? Many cheaper barbeques are made with poor grade materials that can rust over time.

An expensive barbeque will have higher grade materials such as top-grade stainless steel and porcelain coated enamel that can withstand intense heat and will stand up to an onslaught of grease and flames. Expensive barbeques should have robust iron burners, a larger number of gas jets and have thicker better quality hotplates.

5 Should we oil the grill before cooking on the barbeque? Even on the cleanest of grills, lean foods can often stick when placed directly on the rack. Reduce the risk of sticking by oiling your hot grill with a vegetable oil-soaked paper towel using tongs. Do not use cooking spray on a hot grill. A trade secret used by many professional chefs are Teflon liners. They prevent marinades from drying out and sticking and give a professional finish to a marinated barbeque meal. BeefEater BUGG® Teflon liners, RRP \$19.95 per pack of two.

6 Does frequent flipping or poking steak help? Avoid turning and handling steaks too many times when cooking. Preheat the barbeque and cook the steak on medium to high heat for 2 to 3 minutes each side until it is cooked to your liking.

7 Does tipping beer on onions stop them from burning? Yes. Not only does it stop them from burning, it produces a delicious tasty flavour. Add only a little beer to golden brown onions with a dash of mustard and reduce the heat until they are thick and rich.

8 Does adding salt to meat stop it from drying out? Yes says Despina. For best results and flavour, season meat just before cooking to prevent any salt drying out the juices.

9 Should we let our meat rest after barbeque cooking or get stuck into it straight away? Let finished meats rest on a clean platter, tented with foil for about 10 minutes before carving to allow juices to redistribute evenly.

10 Does spraying oil after cooking help clean the barbeque? Despina recommends removing all food off the barbeque and turning the burners on high to carbonise all food remains. Once this is done, turn off the barbeque and remove all the scraps and spray olive oil with a wire or scrubbing brush.

and Shower service is a non-profit organisation which fulfils an important function for Australia's homeless community.

The service saw its beginnings in Redcliffe in late 2014, and founders Lucas Patchett and Nicholas Marchesi are excited about its expansion.

Volunteers are still very active in Redcliffe, taking shower and laundry vans to the QCWA Hall on Redcliffe Parade every Wednesday morning. "This was the first spot in Brisbane that we took our laundry van to. From the beginning, the community [was] very responsive," Lucas explains.

As well as laundry, recently Orange Sky began offering a shower service and has been a natural step in helping to restore respect to those who are struggling.

“ We are constantly challenging ourselves to find more ways to connect with our homeless friends in the community,” Lucas describes. “It’s good to be able to offer our friends access to a hot shower and clean clothes,” he says. Orange Sky operates the two vehicles separately. “This way we can be responsive to specific demands and needs,” Lucas clarifies.

However, the service is about much more than just showers and laundry. "It's so important for our homeless friends to find ways to connect back into the community. The main job of our volunteers is to provide empathy and conversation to people who are disconnected from life," Lucas describes.

Orange Sky has some innovative plans for the future. As well as looking at having more vans in all areas across Australia, the team are working with disaster recovery, helping those people who suddenly find themselves without a home. "For people who suddenly become homeless, the service is needed," explains Lucas.

The organisation is also expanding through looking at ways they can train and employ their homeless friends. "This can create a huge impact in communities through helping people reintegrate and reconnect with society. We are happy to be the conduit to help people do this," says Lucas.

BOOYAH!

POSITIVE PROGRAMS FOR YOUTH

Project Booyah is an important early intervention program which began in the Redcliffe area in February 2016 and will be run again in 2017.

The initiative has been led by the Queensland Police Service and is strongly supported by the Police-Citizens Youth Welfare Association, as well as the state government. Recently, the government has announced they will contribute more than \$7 million in funding for Project Booyah. "This is a highly successful initiative which is creating sustainable positive changes for at-risk young people in our communities," said Queensland's Police Commissioner Ian Stewart.

Aligned with evidence-based best practice, the program's aspiration is to holistically address a young person's disengagement from their family, community and education to ultimately reduce and prevent involvement in anti-social behaviour, substance misuse, self-harm and crime. This outcome is achieved through the incorporation of adventure based learning principles, social and skill development training, community interventions, mentoring, case management, education and vocational scholarships to support young people and their families.

"Since its local inception, two Project Booyah programs have been run in the Redcliffe and Caboolture areas leading to the graduation of 18 participants," explains Moreton District Officer Superintendent Michael Brady.

Broken into two terms of 10 weeks, participants commit to two days per week: one TAFE day where the young person completes a Certificate I in Hospitality and one Mentor day that involves a combination of social and skill development training, functional literacy and numeracy education and mentoring. Throughout the period, there is also a leadership day, adventure-based camp, Cultural Day, work readiness and a variety of motivational guest speakers. The program finishes with a graduation ceremony where participants receive a certificate for completing the Certificate I in Hospitality and also the Booyah program.

Constable Amy Gauci who coordinated the program at Redcliffe said she had seen many changes in participants.

“

As a mother of five children, I can see the value in the program. It is so these children can have a better future," she said.

Council is investing \$91.3 million towards the region's road network during 2016/17. \$2.7 million is being allocated towards roads across Division 5, with \$1.5 million in road resurfacing projects.

Much of the work has already commenced including: Griffith Road, Scarborough Road, Ashmole Road roundabout and Prince Edward Parade as well as Maine Terrace and Parsons Boulevard, Deception Bay. Complete street-scraping has commenced in Gynther Road, Rothwell and the new access road to Rothwell station via Stubbins Street have just been opened. Council is committed to long-term maintenance of our road system rather than see them deteriorate to a point where they need to be completely reconstructed.

In conjunction with my Division 6 colleague, Cr Winchester we are hosting two new events in Redcliffe in the next few months. First will be a Movie in the Park, which will be held at Redcliffe Area Youth Space on Saturday, 1 April, followed by a Teddy Bears Picnic on Wednesday, 17 May at Scarborough Beach Park. These types of events have proved extremely popular in other parts of our region.

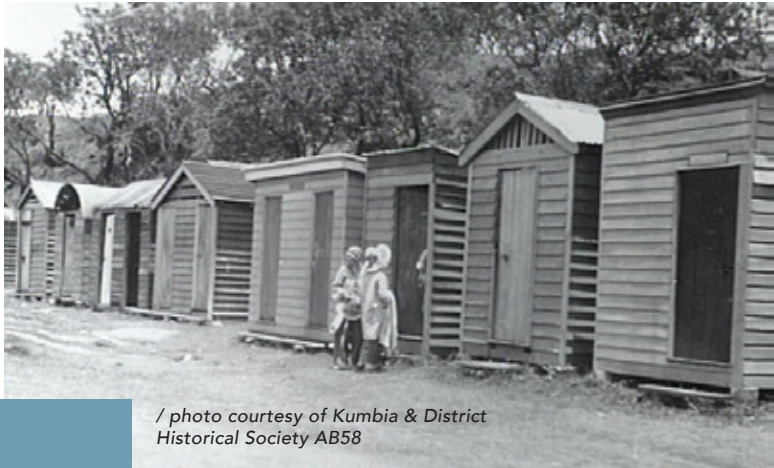

It might surprise some people to know that in times past bathing boxes were erected on Redcliffe's beaches.



BATHING BOXES

Facilities erected on the Peninsula in 1933.

The idea of bathing boxes originated in the late 1800s when mixed bathing on popular beaches became fashionable. Victorian society dictated a modest approach to public bathing where areas of public beaches were set aside, one for women and children and the other for men.

In 1873 the residents of Sandgate passed a resolution at a public meeting to provide separate bathing places at Sandgate for each sex. It was about this time that the excursion boats were just beginning to venture to the Redcliffe Peninsula with people eager to enjoy a beach outing and by 1888, separate bathing areas had been allocated at Redcliffe for men and women.

While the local hotels and boarding houses had erected bathing sheds for their visitors, and many private bathing sheds had been erected on most of the beaches, by 1912 there were still no public bathing houses on the peninsula. A letter to the Brisbane Courier from a visitor about that time suggested that council should erect a bathing booth which would serve as both a changing room and kiosk. A later letter in 1918 shows that some attempt had been

made by council advising that a small building resembling a stable had been erected for the ladies.

Repeated attempts by local progress associations to lobby for improved conveniences in the 1920s resulted in the Mayor himself, James Johnston, investigating the situation and discovering that there were 251 sheds along the beach from Clontarf to Scarborough, many of which were in poor repair.

It wasn't until Christmas 1933 that the Courier Mail reported that Sutton's Beach had undergone a wonderful change. Two large concrete bathing boxes have been erected. The whole of the beach had been levelled and turfed.

However private bathing sheds were still in use and remained so for many years with about 25 cluttering up the beach, according to the then Town Clerk, J C Pearson, in December 1950. Bathing boxes had finally disappeared by the 1960s.

If you don't know what a Hang is, or how to pronounce the word, join over five million viewers who have checked out Delago playing the idiophone class, UFO-shaped instrument on YouTube.

An idiophone, by the way, is an instrument that creates sound primarily by the instrument vibrating, as a whole, without the use of strings or membranes.

It uses some of the same basic principals as a steelpan, but is modified in such a way as to act as a Helmholtz resonator.



Just recently, BBC Radio 4 featured a documentary on the Hang.

It's certainly out there. Experimental Icelandic singer and actor Bjork has invited Delago to record and perform the instrument with her on-stage.

He also co-wrote Anoushka's 'Land of Gold' LP, and is a key band member on her world tours.

LOCAL ARTIST BRINGS DREAMTIME STORIES TO LIFE

The Aborigines, like the Christians, had their own stories that explained the origin of the world, themselves and all that make up the world that provided Aboriginal people with a strong and close association with the land for thousands of years.

These stories gave unity and purpose to Aboriginal societies in the past and are important today in maintaining their identity. Michael Connolly's works of art are his interpretation of these lovely Dreaming stories and he is able to combine modern art materials and techniques with traditional patterns, styles and subject matter.

The Whale's Awakening

Long before there were men or animals in Australia, the only living things that had eyes to see the vast continent were the flocks of migratory birds. When they returned to their homeland they told the animals of the endless plains, the tree covered mountains, the wide long rivers and the abundant vegetation of this delectable land. This created such excitement, so they all gathered from near and far and held a corroboree after which it was decided that they would all go to this new place to live.

The problem was that the only vessel that was strong enough to hold them all at once was the one that belonged to the Whale and he would not lend his canoe to the animals. The animals decided to take the Whale's canoe by force and

enlisted the help of Starfish, the Whale's closest friend, to divert Whale's attention from his canoe.

When the sun was low, Whale woke up and noticed that his canoe was gone. He turned fiercely on Starfish and attacked him. His descendants hide amongst the rocks as Starfish did but their bodies still bear the marks that Whale inflicted on their ancestor the day the animals came to Australia.

After several days and nights, the animals reached their land of promise and jumped ashore. Brolga broke up the canoe and sank it under the waves turning it to stone so that Whale could not find them.

Whale swam up and down the coast searching for his canoe but could never find it. To this day, Whale's descendants still search for their ancestor's canoe as they swim up and down the coast of Australia each year.

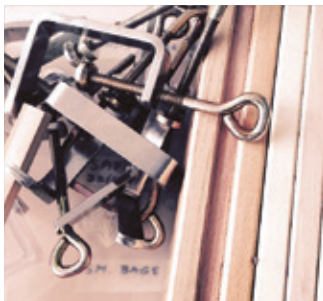

SILVERSMITHING BASICS With Award-Winning Jeweller

Whether you like art and craft, need a new pair of earrings, or you just want to be able to call yourself an amateur silversmith, Renata Fojtikova's upcoming workshop won't disappoint.

The Brisbane-based jeweller will be facilitating her renowned silversmith session at St Baker Studio on Sunday 12 March.

Workshop attendees will be able to follow the techniques that Renata has mastered over years of study and practice — after all, it is through such hands-on instruction that the tools and methods of silversmithing have been transmitted for centuries, from generation to generation.

Renata's workshop caters for beginners and focuses

on key jewellery design concepts and the basic techniques for hand working in silver.

All those who attend will leave with greater knowledge about the silversmithing process, and — perhaps more excitingly — their own pair of gorgeous, sterling silver earrings.

An accomplished and multi-award-winning silversmith, Renata Fojtikova has more than ten years of experience in the craft.

Reflecting on what drew her to this particular form of art, Renata says it was a quite unexpected run of events.

"I wanted to do a degree in fine arts and I was going to do a course in drawing, but then the course was cancelled," she says.

"So I looked for other courses on offer and I came across silversmithing — which I thought would flow on quite well from my fashion design studies."

Since graduating from the Queensland College of Art (QCA) with a Masters in Visual Arts, Renata has taught at professional institutions, such as QCA, TAFE, Brisbane Institute of Art and Flying Arts Alliance.

At work in her studio, she explores both the traditional metals and techniques of precious jewellery, alongside unexpected and up-cycled materials.

Renata's boundary-defying work is elegant and urbane, and her vision for her bespoke skills is that learning should be accessible to everyone.



"I love running these workshops because it's about connecting with one another and bringing the community together," Renata says.

Market Report: Local Trends for 2017
