

'HATING ALISON ASHLEY' TRIBUTE TO MOUSETRAP'S OWN

Hating Alison Ashley is a tribute to one of Mousetrap's top directors, Sandra Hines, who passed away suddenly early this year.

At the time she was working on a youth-only production of a 'Midsummer's Night Dream'. This play carries on her love of work with the theatre's youth with Tanja Stanley doing the honours in the director's chair.

It is definitely a coming of age play with a grade 9 girl, Erica Yurken (Emma Hutt) nicknamed "Yuk" by those who love and loathe her. Erica feels as though she is stuck in a family that doesn't appreciate her talent and excellence. Her school life is lacking severely as well, until a new teacher arrives. Erica sees Miss Belmont as someone who will recognize her for the great talent that she is.

This is until Alison Ashley (Tyallah Bullock) enters the picture. As a transfer student, the tall, skinny, blond, siren-like Alison is switched into Erica's class. Erica tries to make Alison her best friend but goes a little too far and ends up scaring Alison into staying away from her. To this, Erica decides that she actually hates Alison Ashley and goes on a rampage to outshine her at every opportunity that presents itself.

Erica's class goes on a week-long camping trip where they will also be performing a play at the end of the week for all of their family and loved ones. Seeing this as her big chance, Erica not only writes the play but she decides that she will be the lead character. It's not until she starts her first line in the first day of rehearsal that she learns she has a paralysing case of stage fright and cannot perform, and has Alison act as her stand-in until the big night when she plans to steal the show. Erica's perfect image of Alison is broken when she finds out that Alison's family is too busy for her and will not be attending the play. Erica then goes from hating Alison, to feeling bad for her and trying to help her.

Erica's stage fright is found out and after a humiliating rehearsal and she tries to run away only to be found by Miss Belmont and taken back to camp. Erica is banned from her own play because of her attempt at running away, the play goes off without a hitch, with Alison as the leading character. Just as the play concludes, Erica sneaks into the auditorium and is about to be reprimanded by Miss Belmont while the cast of her play are taking their bows, when Alison calls for applause for the director and writer, which happens to be Erica. Both Alison and Erica are recognized for their talents, the tension with Miss Belmont is sidestepped, and everyone leaves happy and fulfilled.

NEW SKILLS WITH KAYAK CLUB

Learn new skills and get fit with the Queensland Sea Kayak Club's basic skills sea kayaking course!

For many of us, sea kayaking sounds adventurous and challenging, but trip leader and event organiser Martin Purvins of the Queensland Sea Kayak Club says it's fun!

Welcoming all sea kayakers from 18 years old who are interested in participating in organised trips and events, the Queensland Sea Kayak Club provides training, education and organised recreational events for its members. There are 90 members in the Club, with a basic skills session run each month from different locations.

I wish I'd discovered sea kayaking years ago," says Purvins, "It's a fun and supportive environment with the Queensland Sea Kayak Club. We all help one another and enjoy one another's company."

During the course participants will learn about kayaking and safety. Participants learn how to present their craft and equipment for inspection, swim 50 metres in canoeing clothes, show a full

understanding of the basic safety requirements for paddlers and how to launch the craft and paddle away from the launching point.

"We pride ourselves on the safety side of things," says Purvins.

Participants will also learn paddling and emergency stops, turning the craft, and using the paddle as support on the water among other important kayaking skills.

To join the course, you must have your own sea kayak including spray skirt and life jacket. However, if you don't have your own equipment, please contact the trip leader who may be able to lend a kayak for a small fee.

To join the club costs \$90 per year and includes the free basic skills training. Otherwise, nonmembers can participate in the course for \$10.

"We'd love to see new faces at the Club for the basic skills training," says Purvins, "If you love the outdoors, come along!"

When 17-year-old Jessica Alback performs her last dance at this year's Queensland CSTD Dance Festival, it will be with a sense of pride and nostalgia.

Since the age of two, performing has become a way of life for this Grade 12 Southern Cross College student who aims to pursue a dancing career overseas or complete a Performing Studies degree at university next year.

I adore dancing and music as it allows me to tell a story and to express myself. I also love acting and singing, so musical theatre is where I want to be," says Jess.

Member of Brisbane Junior Theatre and winner of last year's Street Tap category at the Redcliffe Dance Festival, Jess will also be performing routines in the Cabaret, Contemporary and Slow Modern sections at this year's festival. Usually training 5-6 days a week, 3-4 hours per day, Jess is no stranger to hard work.

"I have competed in numerous dancing competitions all over the state since a child, but my favourite is the one closest to home," says Jess. "I have attended this festival every year since I was five, so it will be bittersweet as this could very well be my last one."

This year's festival is expected to attract at least 2,000 participants and 6,000 attendees.

Organiser of the event, Sharon Alback, says, "This is an immensely popular competition, catering for dancers all the way from Bundaberg and Gympie to Toowoomba, Lismore and the Gold Coast. It allows talented performers to showcase their skills and accomplishments, picking up prizes, trophies and scholarships along the way."

Running from 22nd June – 6th July at Mueller College's Performing Arts Auditorium on Morris Road, Rothwell, the 12 day festival has three sessions per day with categories of Classical, Ballet, Contemporary, Jazz, Hip Hop, Song and Dance, Acrobatics, Cabaret, Novelty, and a Mature and Motivated section catering for mums. Both females and males of all ages will be performing solos, duos, trios, groups, troupes and school groups, all the way from novices through to the very proficient.

"I still get that buzz performing," says Jess.
"On stage, I'm in my own little world where time stops, and I can't wait to experience it again at my old stomping ground — the QLD Dance Festival."

Complementary paintings by members of the Redcliffe Art Society, including Marie Walker, Jocelyn Polly and the late Sandra Hines, will grace the walls, with pieces from the Redcliffe Pottery Group also echoing the sentiments of the installations.

Young art enthusiasts will be kept entertained interacting with displays dedicated to the Redcliffe Dolphins rugby league team and the peninsula's abundant fauna.

"We've got some rugby memorabilia that kids can dress up in, and we've got some Australian animal soft toys that they can play with in the kiddy corner."

On days one and two of the festival, visitors can enjoy \$5.00 Devonshire teas and mini concerts on the back deck, with local musical identity Joan Wilkie performing from 2pm to 3pm on the Friday, and Robert Holt playing the parish's treasured Collins organ from midday on the Saturday.

"There's only two of these organs in the whole of Australia and we've got one of them. It's a very special organ," says Liz.



"The Adelaide Royal Show called me to say they needed some action, so we put together a show and the phone has been off the hook ever since," said Gary.


Show goers will be able to meet Gary and Graham for Trackskill posters, information and photos after their performances.

WHALES Ahoy!

Slapping tails and raised pectoral fins will once again break the waters of Moreton Bay when the annual humpback whale migration reaches our coastline.

Every year between June and November, humpback whales migrate north along Australia's east coast to mate and give birth. Along the humpback highway lies Moreton Bay Marine Park, a sheltered inlet where the humpbacks stop to rest, feed and play.

Kerry Lopez, Owner and Captain of Redcliffe's Brisbane Whale Watching for the past 22 years, has noticed a new trend forming in recent years. Protected by Moreton Island, and with shallow waters that offer sanctuary from predators, Moreton Bay Marine Park is becoming an attractive calving area and nursery ground for the humpbacks.

"Historically they've always gone as far up as the Whitsundays to give birth and then they've come down into Hervey Bay [to nurse]," explains Kerry.

"Because water temperatures have increased over the last ten years, what we're finding is

that they're staying around in Moreton Bay a lot longer. Pods can stay for two to three days."

Only half a century ago, the east coast population of humpbacks was almost decimated by whaling. Now protected in Australian waters, the whales have made a spectacular comeback, with an estimated 18,000 visiting the Moreton Bay coastline last year.

"The amount of pods we were seeing last year was just extraordinary. Some days, everywhere you looked there were whales. We're expecting 20,000 to 22,000 this year, so near on back to full recovery which is one of Australia's hugest success stories."

With only two commercial whale watching permit holders operating in Moreton Bay, spectators on board the vessels are guaranteed close encounters with these gentle giants of the deep.

When they come up close and lift their big four metre pectoral fin up and roll over and look at you, it's just one of those things that you can't explain. And seeing the mums and the babies play is fantastic."

We've made crabs out of plastic plates, we've got hundreds of corks on straws and coloured tags on sticks that will be like gardens, we have stakes that are all coloured that will be put out, and we have people made up from things," explains Carte Blanche member. Karin Hart.

Schools, community groups, art groups and recreational artists are all welcome, and with Deception Bay District Girl Guides, Cascade Place, and students from Redcliffe State High School just some of the contributors, the sandscape will be a celebration of creativity and diversity.

"We want people to realise that anybody can do art, and this is an ephemeral type of art really, more than anything."

Set in the great outdoors and interactive by design, 'Between the Tides' fosters a connection between art, play and nature.

"We have different interactive things for the children to do, and unlike most exhibitions, they can touch everything and run within it all. Different families that have come over the years come back because of that. It's also nice for little children to see that art can be anything. It's not just painting or just sculpture."

With the foreshore a popular dog off-leash area, art connoisseurs of the canine variety are also welcome, and with a coffee vendor on site, one has everything one needs for an immersive stroll between the tides.

Moreton Bay Regional Council Mayor Allan Sutherland said while a fence and locked gate partition the rest of the school, the innovative pilot project's new playground is accessible to ages including climbing structures, spinning tops, slides and swings, and is a fantastic outcome for all young people in this area."

Councillor for Division 6, Koliana Winchester, said the pilot project is a great example of what is achievable when a local community band together.

"The new shared playground will be a fantastic new asset for our community, which both school students and all young families in our community can enjoy," Cr Winchester said.

"The playground delivers more than 150 different activities including a large timber



the broader community outside of school hours through a gate from Margate Parade.

"The Margate community has been telling council they'd love to see new spaces for children to play along the Margate foreshore, but it had proven difficult to locate a new site large enough," Mayor Sutherland said.

"In a first for our region, council has joined forces with Humpybong State School to deliver a new \$180,000 playground on the school's existing foreshore area which will not only benefit their students but can be opened up to the whole community outside of school times.

"The playground delivers exciting and challenging play equipment for children of all

climbing frame, forts, slides, spinning tops, swings, hopscotch and undercover seating areas.

"A big thank you to Humpybong State School's P&C Association for partnering with council to deliver a project which will not only benefit their students but our entire community.

"This is a great example of the fantastic community outcomes we can achieve when we work together."

The Humpybong Shared Playground has been delivered in partnership between Moreton Bay Regional Council (\$160,000) and the Humpybong State School P&C Association (\$20,000).

Big Change, 'Small' Business.

Big tax change becomes law (Definition of small business now up-to- 10 million in turnover, instant asset write-off still there for another 12 months)

The government's hard-fought change to the corporate tax rate for small businesses has also altered the definition of "small business" to now include companies with up to \$10 million in annual turnover, meaning budget pledges to extend a number of tax concessions to more Australian companies will be realised.

When it unveiled its Ten Year Enterprise Tax Plan in the 2016 federal budget, the government promised to "put small business first" by extending the turnover threshold for a number of tax benefits previously on offer for companies with up to \$2 million in annual turnover.

These include access to the immediate asset write-off scheme when investing in items worth up to \$20,000, simplified rules around stock takes, the option of accounting for GST on a cash basis, and the opportunity to take up more simplified PAYG processes.

While the changes do not change eligibility for capital gains tax concessions for small businesses, which currently apply to those with a turnover of \$2 million or less, they were projected at the time of last year's budget to extend benefits to 90,000 more Australian businesses.

Small businesses are the engine room of our economy. The changes will mean businesses of up to \$10 million in turnover will be able to immediately start claiming the concessions;

the government's tax bill that has recently passed on Friday essentially shifted the definition of small businesses to those with up to \$10 million in annual turnover.

The tax rate for eligible companies has reduced from 30% to now 27.5% from 01/07/2016 and if you operate your business through an entity other than a company the threshold for 8% tax discount (up to \$1,000) is for businesses turning over up to \$5 million.

Businesses can buy office equipment, install fit-outs, new tables, chairs, photocopiers, and 3D printers [through that write-off] ...

The notion of going out and replacing old equipment with the new has become a lot more attractive. It's a really good example of how things should work.

The Budget handed down on 09/05/2017 has indicated the \$20,000 instant asset write-offs are for companies turning over up to \$10 million and now runs until 30th June 2018.
