Picnic Hill is celebrating its 1st Birthday on July 14.

The Redcliffe Area Youth Space (aka RAYS) is extremely thankful and humbled by the continuing community support Picnic Hill has received over the last 12 months.

Picnic Hill is much more than a Family Friendly Food Truck Festival, with live entertainment and street art that comes to life on the second Friday of every month.

Picnic Hill has enabled RAYS to continue to provide support and assistance to vulnerable young people and their families.

It has kept Young People busy on a Friday night by providing them with an opportunity to gain skills and confidence. Picnic Hill has also been fantastic at giving our young people a sense of belonging, increasing their social inclusion and capital.

Over the past year, 31 trainees have participated in the State Government's Skilling Queenslanders for Work Initiative at BAYS.



It was these young people who created, built, worked and marketed Picnic Hill. Of the 31 young people enrolled, 29 have found employment due to the confidence, skills and networking that Picnic Hill has created.

We have raised over \$30,000 for our service to continue to support young people and their families at risk throughout Moreton Bay and North Brisbane.

The money that has been raised has gone towards crisis accommodation, emergency relief, domestic and family violence, school and sporting fees, counselling, AOD and mental health support, drivers licences and much more.

President of the club, David Begley, designed the event's two-day program, making it open to all sailing craft, yachts, trailer sailors, catamarans, and all classes of off the beach catamarans and dinghies.

"On the second day, we start the race close to shore, and we aim to let the public see the yachts under sail at Woody Point and Shorncliffe," David explains. "The yachts will have their spinnakers up either on the way up the Redcliffe Peninsula, or on the way back, and we keep them close to the shore."

Last year saw 58 competitors take part in the Winter Bash and, this year, Humpybong Yacht Club is hoping for even more. "I am hoping we get up to 80 this year," says David.

The club would love to see everyone come and support this premier all-classes sailing regatta.

WINTER BASH PROGRAM

DAY 1: A three lap race around three buoys that are set out in the bay with no recourse to the wind or weather. The winner is the best corrected time based on the yachts class rating/handicap.

DAY 2: A fixed point race which starts in Bramble Bay, runs up to the Woody Point Jetty, heads south to Shorncliffe Jetty, follows the coast up to the Redcliffe Light and returns to the finish at Woody Point Jetty. It is about 23 nautical miles and can be shortened or lengthened according to the weather forecast.

"I became involved with the organisation because of my daughter, so I have seen firsthand the effects of the condition," she says.

"Patients sit in a chair hooked up to a machine for up to five hours a day, three days per week.

"If they stop then they die, it is as simple as that. I like to think that we can make a difference to them."



Held at the QCWA Hall in Woody Point, the event will be a fun and affordable afternoon for the whole family.

Adriana says food and alcohol will be available on the day, as well as tea, coffee and other treats.

"We will have lucky board numbers with cash prizes of \$100 and \$50, as well as raffles, games and lucky door prizes," she says.

There will be something there for everybody as 'Fun Fun Fun' is the theme for the afternoon."

The Kidney Support Network is also looking for community members to become involved as volunteers, with opportunities including visiting renal patients, attending Kidney Health Awareness events, fundraising, dialysis patient relaxation massage and op shop sales.

MOTOR INTO THE CORVETTE CLASSIC

I love the pace of life in the area, which is really relaxed and laid back, the stunning scenery and most of all, the friendly locals," she says.







Budget empowers Redcliffe residents

Peninsula residents can get a bit of extra cash in their back pockets after the State Government's latest budget delivered a raft of concessions designed to help those in need, particularly when it comes to paying the power bill.

Among the budget offerings, Moreton Bay's seniors and pensioners can access an electricity bill rebate of up to \$330 a year and residents with a Commonwealth Health Care Card have an extra six months (to December 31) to apply for a backdated electricity rebate covering entitlements from January 1 this year.

But it's not only about electricity savings, says Redcliffe MP Yvette D'Ath. Mrs D'Ath says Redcliffe residents should visit the new Smart Savings website at www.qld.gov.au/smartsavings or phone 13 74 68 to discover the concessions for which they are eligible.

The Smart Savings website brings together all of the Government's many concessions and rebates into one location," she says.

"There are 16 categories that cover everything from the Spectacle Supply Scheme and Home Assist Secure, to Rental Bond Loans.

"There [is] a range of special discounted rates for seniors, people with health issues, young people going into training and many more."

The budget isn't only about concessions. Mrs D'Ath says Redcliffe students will benefit thanks to about \$11 million allocated to school infrastructure projects.

"This includes \$4.5 million for Redcliffe Special School to construct more classrooms as part of a project worth a total \$6.5 million," she says.

"\$4.6 million will also go to Redcliffe State High School to construct a new hall and administration building as part of a project worth \$6.1 million in total.

"Clontarf Beach State High School, Redcliffe State High School, Scarborough State School and Kippa-Ring State School will also receive funding under the School Infrastructure Enhancement Program.

"In Health, \$4.6 million is going to Redcliffe Hospital to refurbish the Day Procedure Unit, which will improve workflow at the hospital. This project is worth a total \$6.6 million.

"Another \$7 million has also been allocated to Redcliffe Hospital to add more acute beds.

'Our Languages Matter' is the extremely poignant theme at the heart of NAIDOC Week celebrations this year, and there are plenty of ways to get involved in events both in our region and throughout Brisbane.

NAIDOC Week, from 2-9 July, celebrates the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, and Michael Connolly of Dreamtime Kullilla Art at Clontarf says this year's theme is a vital one.

"Some 250 distinct indigenous language groups covered the continent at first (and significant) European contact in the late 18th century," he says.

"Most of these languages would have had several dialects so that the total number of named varieties would have run to many hundreds.

Today, only around 120 of those languages are still spoken, and many are at risk of being lost as Elders pass on. The preservation and revitalisation of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander languages the original languages of this nation — is the preservation of priceless treasure, not just for Indigenous peoples, but for everyone."

Michael says NAIDOC Week is an important part of the fabric of Australian culture, and while it is designated a week, the event sees Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures celebrated for the full month of July.

"It's very important, especially to Aboriginal people to share and have their culture respected," he says.

"NAIDOC is really strong and basically stretches the whole of July. It has introduced Black History Month during which some Aboriginal person or event is recognised each day of July as part of a Black History Lesson.

"Make sure you check local council websites to see events on in your area."

As always, Dreamtime Kullilla Art will be deeply involved.

"We are taking part in the big Musgrave Park Family Fun Day in South Brisbane on Friday, July 7," Michael says.





Council recently brought down its 2017/18 budget, which set an average rate rise of just over \$1 per week throughout the region. Residents often say

to me that any rises should be in line with CPI increases. However, CPI deals with increases in the cost of meat, eggs, fruit and vegetables, etc. Council, on the other hand, does not deal in those commodities. Instead, we purchase steel, bitumen, asphalt, concrete, fuel and machinery and wage rises, which are not in the general CPI category, hence the minor difference when referring to percentage figures.

I am pleased to announce that one of my great aims that I have been pursuing ever since I was elected to Council now looks like becoming a reality. That aim is to protect the red cliffs of Scarborough, which have been gradually eroding for many years. \$1.2 million will initially be spent to stabilise this iconic landmark and provide added safety along Landsborough Avenue. Work will commence at the end of this year.

Moreton Bay locals can unearth their inner artist this July at Redcliffe's new Drawing and Perception course for over-50s, where potential Picassos can express themselves through art.

Internationally renowned local artist Daniele Lamarche-Sarvia is behind the creative concept, which came from a desire to offer visual art to a more mature audience in the area.

"I have always taught the art of drawing wherever I have lived, but now being in the over-50s group myself, I saw there was very little offered in the region for that age group in terms of basic general information that would open on other arenas of visual arts such as painting or photography," she says.

"Many people choose work over the arts and have their own families, but then there comes a time when they have more time for themselves to do their art and explore their passion.

"Drawing is also a fantastic way to keep your mind sharp and active."

Daniele has a long history with visual art, which began when she was 15 years old.

"I started to draw from life models at as a teenager and then majored in the arts in high school," she says. I continued my journey in fine arts through further study, and at Beaux Arts, I majored in sculpture and graphic arts, before spending many years exploring and living throughout many continents around the world.

"I remember my tutors telling me to forget all my training in my final year to discover my style and explore; so I did, and continued to draw and sculpt, as well as teaching art."

Daniele says the Drawing and Perception course takes place over six weeks, allowing participants to experience a sequence of exercises challenging perceptions to enhance their drawing skills.


"The course is challenging, enjoyable and gives fast, permanent results," she says.

The Redcliffe Rollerdrome





For many years the Redcliffe Rollerdrome provided year round entertainment for visitors and locals alike.

The skating rink was situated just north of the Redcliffe Jetty on the sea front. It had roll-up canvas sides to allow for fresh air and for spectators to view skating demonstrations.

In September 1938, the Redcliffe Town Council voted to grant a ten-year lease at a rental of fifty pounds a year to Southport Golf Recreations Ltd., for the erection of a skating rink on land opposite the council chambers and the northern side of the Redcliffe Jetty. The council thought that the rink would be an attraction for those who holidayed at Redcliffe.

In November 1938, the Lands Department notified the Redcliffe Town Council that 24 perches of the beach opposite the Council Chambers had been gazetted a reserve under the council's control, which meant that construction could go ahead. It was agreed that the skating rink, which would be 100 feet long by 50 feet wide, would become council property at the end of the lease. Architects of the building

were Messrs Hall and Phillips, of Brisbane, and it was built by local builder Alec Smith.

Opened on Saturday 10 December 1938 by the Mayor, Alderman A. H. Langdon, guests were treated to excellent exhibitions of skating by Miss Billie Goldbraith of New Zealand, Miss J. Harrington, and Mr J. Stapleton of Brisbane.

As well as being a wonderful form of entertainment for children and adults alike for many years, the Rollerdrome also produced several world champion skaters. The Rollerdrome closed in 1985 to allow for the expansion of the Anzac Park picnic ground.


