After successful events at Mary Nairn Fields and the Pine Rivers Showgrounds in 2016, Cancer Council Queensland has combined the two events to form one Relay For Life for the entire region that will be held in Redcliffe.

Teams will relay for 18 hours overnight to raise vital funds and awareness for Cancer Council Queensland's work in cancer control, taking part in inspirational ceremonies, fundraising activities and team challenges, supporting each other and sharing stories of hope.

"Cancer Council Queensland provides support for locals affected by cancer, investing in ongoing research and support programs for those in need," says McMillan, "Participating in Relay For Life is a great way to support the endeavours of Cancer Council and help make a vital difference right here in our local community."

There are currently 130 participants registered for Redcliffe's Relay For Life, but more participants are needed to get involved and show they care. So, don't miss out! Get your friends, family and colleagues together and register now to receive an early-bird discount.

TURBO-CHARGED JET SKI SHOW

A high-powered, fast-actioned, jet ski and fly boarding show will sure to wow crowds at this year's Redcliffe KiteFest on 26 & 27 August at Pelican Park, Hornibrook Esplanade, Clontarf.

Having performed at last year's festival, this popular event will once again dazzle audiences with their turbocharged jet ski, fly boarding, and kite bonanza on the foreshore.

ith 12 professional skiers and flyers zooming around the bay performing stunts and flying through the air with kites attached, this promises to be a visual feast of energy and colour.

Jack Ellison, show producer and owner of H2O Events, the entertainment company behind the show, says he's excited about coming back to KiteFest because of both the show he's got planned and the crowd he's anticipating.

"Fly boarding has been around for about four years and is a fast growing extreme water sport. The flyer is propelled into the sky with a 23-metre hose that is connected to a high powered turbo-charged jet ski. The water thrust allows the flyer to fly freely in the air and perform back flips and other stunts. We have also designed a system to tow multiple-stacked kites with the jet skis to choreographed routines to music, and with Redcliffe offering a

perfect water stage to display these high-speed manoeuvres, the crowd is able to get up close to the entertainment."


Mr Ellison, a world record holder for Freestyle water ski jumping and former 10-time Australian Champion, will also be one of the performers in the twice-a-day show, alongside some of his family members. Being a seasoned international coach, and film and TV marine coordinator, Mr Ellison has also worked on the James Bond movie, Quantum of Solace, training all the Bond girls in water stunts.

That was a lot of fun," admits Jack, "and yes, I probably do have the best job in the world — performing shows and playing with the latest and fastest show equipment."

With the event promising to be one filled with sun, spectacle, and sea, Mr Ellison urges all to visit the KiteFest foreshore for this electrifying, live action display so he and his team can, "entertain the family and make them smile."





From 4pm on Sunday, September 3, you can catch a host of great bands, kick back and relax around the bonfire, and soak up the seaside surrounds at Scarborough Beach Park on Landsborough Avenue.

"For the past two Christmas holidays, we have offered visitors a small, yet delicious selection of scoop ice creams," she says.


"This was so popular over the summer period, that I decided by the following Christmas we would be a full ice creamery.



If you've ever wandered past the Vast homewares store on Redcliffe Parade or any number of locations around the bayside for that matter, you may have been drawn in by the unique talents and almost addictive voice of musician and busker Cohen Anderson.

ohen is almost impossible to miss — thin, tall, extremely cool afro springing from his head, guitar strapped around his shoulders and his eyes clenched shut as he hits notes with the kind of deepened soul that even seasoned musicians wish they could sing.

The quietly spoken Cohen says his musical journey began when he was 10 with the arrival of his first instrument.

It's something the Peninsula locals would love to hear more of, according to Vast Redcliffe manager Donna Mackey. She says Cohen's busking sessions in front of the store have captivated people as they stop and get lost in his incredible voice.

People walk into the store and just say how wonderful he is. We all think he is just awesome," Donna says.

"They constantly come in and comment on his beautiful music, and everyone loves his vibe. He is so laid back.

"We love it so much we turn the music off in the store so we can hear him play."

His voice is equal parts Amos Lee and Jack Johnson, with a smooth guitar sound that would make Matt Corby swoon. But what does Cohen think of his admirers? "Busking here has been good, people are lovely and give me a lot of positive feedback, which has been awesome," he says.

"I just think I'm very lucky to be able to do something I love and live off it."

Now that sounds like a life in perfect harmony.

REDCLIFFE COMMUNITY JOINING THE FIGHT AGAINST ELDER ABUSE

With new figures revealing a spike in the number of reported cases of elder abuse, there is an increasing focus within the Redcliffe community on raising awareness and encouraging people to report abuse.

hile the increase is a positive sign more people are reporting, there are still many more who are too afraid or ashamed to come forward, or who simply don't realise what they are experiencing is abuse.

The State Government has launched the second phase of its awareness and prevention campaign, "There's no excuse for elder abuse", which focuses on the two most common forms of abuse — financial and emotional. From now, until the end of August, the campaign will be promoted in shopping centres, licensed venues and medical centres, on buses, and on social media — to ensure everyone sees the message.

The State Member for Redcliffe, Yvette D'Ath MP is championing a local campaign to raise community awareness of what elder abuse is, how people can recognise the signs and how seniors can seek help for themselves or people they know.

We have stepped up the fight, providing a \$2.7 million Budget boost over three years to expand elder abuse prevention and seniors legal and support services across the State," Ms D'Ath said. "This also includes additional funding and an expanded Seniors Enquiry line, enabling a strong focus on consumer protection and scams."


Ms D'Ath is hosting a free Seniors' Afternoon Tea at the Redcliffe CWA hall on 18 August where speakers from the Office of the Public Trustee and the aged and disability advocacy service, ADA Australia, will discuss topics including protection of seniors' rights, elder abuse, wills, enduring power of attorney and advocacy services for seniors.

Stand Up, Step Out is a new homeless outreach service operating daily in north Brisbane from a modified bus.

The free service will provide homeless people including families, older people and younger people with access to hot showers and laundry facilities as well as professional housing and mental health workers to help people get back on their feet.

This project is a partnership between three community organisations; SANDBAG, Footprints in Brisbane and One Voice.

SANDBAG chief executive officer Alisa Hall says the bus is funded through the Queensland Government's Dignity First Funding Grant and will be an enormous benefit to people in our community.

"The partners in the project identified that people who are homeless have limited options to access laundry and showering facilities within local areas," Alisa says.

Ensuring that all individuals are able to access the basic supports to enable them to participate and engage in community life is absolutely critical."

The full-sized bus has been modified to include two showers and one laundry (washer and dryer). The bus also includes a space for individual consultations with housing and health staff.

Alisa says volunteer drivers are needed to ensure the success of the project.

"This is a vital role for the project. The funding received supported the purchase and fit out of the bus and establishment costs but does not provide for other operational costs," she says.


"This is a wonderful opportunity for those who might already have a heavy or medium rigid licence to use their skills to give back and support others in the local area."



Redcliffe Museum

For many years during the month of September, Redcliffe has celebrated the establishment of the first British settlement at Redcliffe Point in 1824. A constant of these celebrations over the years has been the re-enactment of Oxley's landing, but how and why did this all begin?

Redcliffe Town Council was constituted in May 1921, heralding a new phase in Redcliffe's development. The opening of two new jetties in 1922, together with the completion of Anzac Avenue, meant an increase of traffic by sea and by road. This meant an influx of visitors at holiday times, providing an additional source of income for local people and businesses, and motivating Redcliffe Town Council and local Progress Associations to provide accommodation, entertainment and refreshments in the hope of encouraging return visits.

In March 1923, a general committee was formed to arrange centenary celebrations for John Oxley's landing at Redcliffe in 1823. Centenary proceedings began with a procession from McDonnell Road, along the Esplanade, to the Recreation Reserve

adjoining the Council office. At Humpybong Creek, Master Mervyn Jefferies from the local scout group represented Lieutenant Oxley and read the proclamation. The Mayor, Alderman Bailey, also delivered an address, expressing the hope that the day's celebrations were only the forerunner of similar gatherings in future. A program of sports followed the formalities. Finally, a fancy dress ball, featuring music supplied by the Humpybong Philharmonic Orchestra, took place in the Picture Pavilion at night and was a great success.

In September 1924, a public meeting was held to draw up a program of events for the centenary celebrations of the settlement at Redcliffe, and a public holiday was gazetted for 24th September. The program commenced with the unfurling of the Union Jack at the rocks near the end of Suttons Beach, where it was supposed that Oxley and the settlement party landed. The Mayor, Alderman J B Dunn, followed by other dignitaries, addressed the crowd and centenary medals were presented to the school children.

A pioneer lunch was followed by a tree planting ceremony in an area designated as Centenary Park, with a ball held in the evening at the Redcliffe picture theatre. These celebrations were the forerunner of the festival and reenactment that continues to this day.





Bill says the event is a great event for Sandgate and its surrounds as it showcases the local area and celebrates the community.


"We have such a beautiful spot on the northern shores of Moreton Bay, but most importantly, the profits from the concert go back into promoting this community," he says.


