

The Redcliffe Leagues Club will be hosting Australian music royalty in October when Russell Morris rolls into town!

It was 1966 when Russell Morris first showed up on the Australian music scene, and he quickly took it by storm. After a career spanning more than 50 years, Morris is still going strong.

Redcliffe Leagues Club Marketing Manager Tomara Spreadborough is understandably excited.

"The Redcliffe Leagues Club provides over half a million dollars in free entertainment each year for our members and guests. Russell Morris is an Australian music icon, and we are very proud to be bringing him to the club absolutely free."

In 1969 Morris released his debut solo single 'The Real Thing', a swirling piece of pop psychedelia that reached number one and became the biggest selling Australian single of the year, and a series of top ten hits soon followed including 'Sweet, Sweet Love'.

This legend of Australian music is showing no signs of slowing down; in recent years carving a place for himself in the blues and roots scene with a series of amazing albums. In 2012 'Sharkmouth' went platinum and reached number six on the ARIA charts.

With the success of Sharkmouth, it really let me off my leash so to speak," said Morris. "It showed me that people want music that tells them a story and moves them."

Sharkmouth was followed by 'Van Diemen's Land' in 2014, which was certified gold, and 'Red Dirt — Red Heart' (2015) which won an ARIA for Best Blues and Roots Album.

"These albums are about looking back at the characters that deserve to be remembered and then doing that in the best way I know how – through song. It's about leaving a legacy," Russell says. His career has seen a series of highlights, and he was inducted into the ARIA Hall of Fame in 2008.

"When the first two rows of the crowd know all the words and sing them with me, it's quite surreal, to say the least. Having two beautiful ladies as my rhythm section has added an energy and dynamic to the band. Amanda Emblem plays Bass from Diva Demolition with Sue Kennet from Chick Flick/Her Way To Hell on drums. Such a powerful lineup now, and I have to pinch myself all the time to assure myself I'm not dreaming."

ARIA Hall of Fame inductee Bob Spencer (ex-Angels and Skyhooks) joined the band in May this year, and has added his myriad of experience to the already cult following the band has gained. We spoke to Bob on the phone this week and got some insights as to how his role in Team Utopia works. This five-star market experience is an inspiring local success story with founder Kirsty Saurin building the markets with no experience and the unwavering support of best friend Katrina Bray.



"All our tour shenanigans are on YouTube," Craig says.


"It's great for people to belong to a club, particularly children," Dianna says.





Summer is nearly here!

From late September onwards through the hot season, you can expect to be seeing this distinctive bird in our area. Travelling from Papua New Guinea and Indonesia where it spends the cooler months, this bird times its arrival with the ripening fruits of various trees.

CHANNEL-BILLED CUCKOOS

cythrops novaehollandiae is the world's largest cuckoo. Heralding the approach of summer, they have gathered many common names including Rainbird and Stormbird. Unique in both appearance and voice, it really makes you take notice.

Measuring up to 66cm in length, with a wingspan up to one metre and a large thick curved bill, they create an unusual silhouette both perched and in flight.

The call is loud and far travelling. It is often one of the first to be heard of a morning, and even through the night in the breeding season. Many different variations of "kwark" sounds are made from drawn-out plaintive ones to excitable and raucous outbursts.

Though shy, these birds are often seen (and heard) feeding in groups, mainly on fruit, especially figs and mistletoes. Also eaten are insects, eggs and fledgelings.

As is the habit of brood parasites, the channelbilled cuckoo requires the assistance of other species to raise their young. When laying their eggs, the cuckoo pair often works as a team to distract or drive a prospective host from its nest. Several eggs are laid in the nests of crows, currawongs, magpies or butcherbirds. Once hatched the cuckoos are then raised by their hosts. With voracious appetites and demanding behaviour, the young cuckoos thrive at the expense of the original chicks.

Leaving the nest before being able to fully fly, and perching on a nearby branch, they continue to clamour for feeding. It is quite a sight to witness usually crafty crows compliantly feeding these rowdy youngsters, who are now bigger than them.

Look out for these birds now and through the warmer months. They can be found anywhere figs are fruiting, either in parks or suburban backyards, and are commonly seen at the Clontarf Environmental Reserve.

To familiarise yourself with their call, go online. Listening to birdcalls is a great way to feel more connected to nature.



A Reminder *for* Life

In 2016 Georgia Dee, who has been in and around the Redeliffe community for over two decades, learnt that she had cancer in her left breast, and after a difficult journey Georgia now has an important message for women everywhere.

eorgia had a career that built her skills in marketing, finance, and project coordination, as well as spending time managing a cattle property in Far North Queensland. She had raised two kids and had two beautiful grandchildren, and she had spent much of her recent years caring for loved ones suffering from - ironically - cancer. She was a busy woman.

"I kept putting off mammograms, pap smears and other health checks... I kept falling off my own to-do list" Georgia says.

After feeling some pain in September 2016, Georgia visited her GP, who sent her for ultrasound and mammogram tests on both breasts. These tests and a subsequent MRI and biopsies indicated that Georgia had a total of four cancerous tumours in her body.

"That changed everything! It was then that I realised that I could be in serious trouble. I now believe that an MRI is absolutely essential for suspected cancer patients."

Georgia explains it as 'life before cancer' and 'life since cancer'.

"From that point, there seemed to be a constant roller coaster ride of medical appointments, tests, hospital visits and so on. Everyone I met was caring and supportive and did their utmost to encourage me. However, I went from one emotion to another in record time. One moment — I was being pragmatic about it all and telling myself one day/thing at a time, the next moment I was an emotional mess."

Surgery to remove my left breast occurred in December 2016. I came home only two days before Christmas. As I play the role of Santa in our family, I was busy preparing, wrapping and hiding gifts right up until I went into hospital. Our family's 2016 Christmas happened in my bedroom so that I could both participate and rest as I needed. It was certainly a different Christmas." I am still working through health issues as a result of breast cancer. Before cancer, I had two speeds — full on and 'splat'. I am now endeavouring to bring more balance into my life".

Adjusting to life after cancer can be challenging for many people, and is often influenced by the specific type of cancer, and its treatment. An individual's personality and support network can also affect the range of responses cancer survivors have to the disease, and a common response is to seek out the positive elements of the experience. Some choose to start ticking items off their bucket list with renewed drive, take up a new hobby or to travel, or make bigger efforts to spend time with friends, family and loved ones.

Like Georgia, many people take the opportunity to make positive lifestyle changes and also to advocate for increased awareness of the disease in their local community.

Georgia's message is a simple one; make the time for health checks. "My purpose in sharing my story is as a warning to others... It is easy to look at national advertising for cancer warnings and have them seem so distant. Cancer is as local as you and me. If in sharing my story, I can prevent even just one person from leaving it too late — then my experience of cancer has been turned into a story that's worthwhile. Above all else, I want to make some good come from my cancer experience."

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month and a good time to take some action to help prevent the disease in your own life or your family's as well as in the broader community.

Make an appointment for a mammogram or talk to the women in your world and encourage them to do so, find out more about breast cancer and share this information with your friends and family.

Redcliffe can look forward to cleaner parks, beaches and public areas with the passing of a Bill in State Parliament to introduce a container refund scheme and a ban on plastic shopping bags

from 1 July 2018. These initiatives reflect the overwhelming support of the community and particularly our young people. It will stop the scourge of plastic shopping bags and put a price on beverage containers, so they get recycled.

By passing this Bill, we say to our young people that we value our wildlife, especially our marine creatures like turtles, seabirds and dugongs. We say that we want our parks, our waterways, Moreton Bay and the Great Barrier Reef to be litter free.

The container refund scheme will see most drink containers between 150ml and 3 litres eligible for a 10 cent refund, although some containers are exempt, such as containers for plain milk.

Refunds will be available when empty eligible containers are returned to designated container refund points. Reverse vending machines are also likely to play a significant role in people's ability to access the refund.



just 24, Bev left Australia with her sights set on living in Papua New Guinea. After arriving in Port Moresby in 1964, Bev taught at an Indigenous school, before eventually moving to a teacher's college in the Highlands. Bev remained in Papua New Guinea for 12 years, and it was this period that inspired her current work.

After leaving Papua New Guinea, Bev went on to have many more adventures all over the world. She is the author of several books, and her last two, 'Adventures in Queensland' and 'The Rise and Fall of the Australian Democrats', follow a similar structure to 'Lively Tales from Papua New Guinea'.

'Adventures in Queensland' documents Bev's own travels around the state, visiting countless towns, meeting the people who live there, learning their history, and taking photographs.

As a foundation member of The Australian Democrats, 'The Rise and Fall of the Australian Democrats' is based on the eight years Bev spent working to ensure the survival of the movement as a modern and progressive political party. Among the many adventures she recounts in her book, Bev fondly recalls nerve-wracking journeys in a tiny, precarious aeroplane during a storm, crawling through bushes and climbing steep mountains on the Kokoda track, and a near capsize in a narrow canoe, when it collided with a reef along the coast. "It's wonderfully adventurous, I absolutely adored being up there," she says.

ouncillor for Division Five, James Houghton said the multi-million dollar council upgrade would help to ensure Scarborough Beach Park remained one of South East Queensland's most family-friendly beach and parkland areas.

"Home to the iconic pirate playground and the title of Queensland's friendliest beach in 2003, Scarborough Beach Park has always been immensely popular among local residents and visitors, and the new additions to the park will add even greater accessibility and more spaces for families to have a picnic at the park," Cr Houghton said.

"Another great feature of this important upgrade is the work undertaken to widen the shared pathways at the park, providing more space for the many cyclists and pedestrians who use this park every day to walk their dogs, enjoy the view and improve their personal fitness."

Cr Houghton encourages locals to make the most of the beautiful weather at this time of year, head outdoors and check out the newly re-opened Scarborough Beach Park.

"We have taken this park to a whole new level with 16 new picnic settings, new decks and viewing areas, and of course the new jumping pillow," Cr Houghton said.

"For park patrons who use wheelchairs and other accessibility aides, a new plaza area has been constructed underneath the southern fig tree with unique wheelchair-accessible tables as well as additional handrail and ramp access from Landsborough Avenue to make this space even more accessible to park users.

"We have also planted eight large trees to the park; these Norfolk Island Pine trees were grown on a tree farm and then transplanted to the site to reinforce the existing avenue of trees.

"For those who enjoy entertaining outdoors and picnics, there will be plenty to rave about with new picnic furniture on the southern end of Scarborough Beach Park that will overlook the beach.

"Much of the existing off-street parking has been retained, and extra on-street parking has been installed on Kennedy Esplanade, while a new concrete pathway has been constructed from the parking bays to the centre of Landsborough Avenue to meet up with the pirate-themed playground."

Designed in consultation with local residents, community groups and business owners,

Councillor Houghton said the existing basketball half-court near Kennedy Esplanade had also been reconstructed to allow for the foreshore shared path to be widened.

Scarborough Beach Park is located at 52 Landsborough Avenue, Scarborough.

ficially launched on 6 December 1935, the Queensland Bush Children's Health Scheme quickly established homes at Scarborough (7 November 1936, the original home was donated by Mr AS Huybers), then at Hervey Bay, Yeppoon and Townsville. Sir Leslie said, "The scheme is not just a charity, it is an investment in the future."

Successive Governors became Patrons and took an active interest in the initiative to care for the children. Redcliffe's close proximity to dental, optical and medical services in Brisbane ensured the youngsters had a great 'holiday' by the sea on the edge of Queen's Beach.

Recollections from two former staff members mention that "There were lots of kids who came to the Home with serious eye problems and a lot had cleft palates and harelips that needed sorting out at the hospital. Usually, the children stayed for six weeks at a time, but some medical cases would require accommodation for a year or more. They went to Scarborough State School while they were at the Home, so they didn't get behind. When the children were with us for a long time, you couldn't help but get attached to them, and it was upsetting when they went back home. Most of them didn't want to leave; we were so good to them, and they had such a lovely time here."

The Redcliffe home closed in 2001, and the facility was moved to 12-18 Haysmouth Parade, Clontarf. In 2005, the Redcliffe Centre at Clontarf was closed, and the Queensland Bush Children's Health Scheme left the Redcliffe Peninsula entirely. The sale of the original property (\$2.9 million) at Scarborough allowed some of the organization's resources to be allocated to rural areas like Warwick. A change in focus of the organization brought wider emphasis on personal development and social skills for families as medical care became more accessible.


