Returning to the Peninsula for the fourth year, the Moreton Bay Caravan, Camping, Boating & 4x4 Expo will fill the Redcliffe Showgrounds with more than 200 displays of the very latest in caravans, camper trailers, boating, fishing and all things leisure.

Organiser Bob Carroll says the expo has seen an increase in exhibitor bookings this year, making it one of the biggest events in Queensland.

This increase is driven by the boom in the traditional family camping holiday, with people on the lookout for the ideal, caravan, camper trailer, boat or four-wheel-drive for their outdoor adventures.

"It is all about families, and families are looking for ways to get their kids to disconnect from technology and get active," Bob says.

"These sorts of holidays do that brilliantly, but they are also very affordable and let's face it, all kids, and lots of adults, love getting out and enjoying the great outdoors."

Last year's expo saw more than 18,000 people come through the gates, and this year promises to be bigger and better, Bob says.

"People will be spoilt for choice with more than 80 major leisure vehicle manufacturers showcasing the very latest offerings."

Other highlights include the Peninsula 4x4 and Outdoor 4x4 Off-road Skills Track shows daily, camp oven cooking demonstrations by Ranger Nick, hourly reptile shows, and free kids train and amusement rides.


Fishing enthusiast Dave 'Mossy' Moss is returning for his fishing and casting demonstrations throughout the day.

FACES of THE EXPO

As you wander around this year's Moreton Bay Caravan, Camping, Boating & 4x4 Expo, make sure you stop and meet the industry experts sharing their passion for the great outdoors. One of the many colourful characters is Aussie fisherman and presenter Dave 'Mossy' Moss, who is returning to the expo to share his love of all things fishing.

The popular show is held on the massive, 10-metre Shimano Fishing Tank, divided into two sections, one for Barramundi and the other for cold-water species.

Mossy has been fishing since he was six years old and loves including children in his show, often inviting them up on to the tank to fish.

"The younger members of the audience [ask] some of the best questions," Mossy says.

Mossy says lures are very popular at the moment, and so he will be showing off the very latest releases at the expo. He will also talk about where to catch the best fish locally.

Shows are at 10.30am, 12.30pm and 2.30pm daily.

Another character sharing his passion for the outdoors is Ranger Nick Small.

Aussie bush cook Ranger Nick keeps the crowds entertained with stories and poetry, but he's most famous for being the guru of camp oven cooking.

Ranger Nick grew up in western Queensland and enjoys passing on his knowledge of cooking over an open fire.

The popularity of camp oven cooking is increasing, and Ranger Nick believes anyone can learn to cook using a camp oven and there is nothing to fear.

His talks include taste testing, recipes and giveaways daily. Shows are at 10am, noon and 2pm each day.

If reptiles are your thing, you won't want to miss the show by Luke Cheyne from Luke's Reptile Kingdom.

Luke talks about snakes, crocodiles, lizards and all things creepy crawly.

There is a chance to meet the reptiles up close (including Cuddles, the three-metre olive python), learn about where they live, how they react to humans, and what to do if you are bitten.


Luke believes it is important people know how to deal with snakes, especially in the summer months.

RUGBY LEAGUE COMMONWEALTH CHAMPIONSHIP COMING TO REDCLIFFE

On February 23rd and 24th, Redcliffe's Dolphin Stadium will host the 2018 Rugby League Commonwealth Championship, featuring 17 teams from across ten different nations.

Played within the official Rugby League 9s format of nine-a-side, eight men's, six women's and three teams with physical disabilities from Australia, New Zealand, Britain, Canada and the Pacific Islands will compete in a pool phase on the Friday, followed by a cross-pool finals series on the Saturday, culminating in a gold medal match in each division.

Hailed a coup for the Redcliffe area due to the successful bidding of the Dolphins, Moreton Bay Regional Council and MBRIT, and supported by Embracing 2018, the Queensland Government's Gold Coast Commonwealth Games Legacy Program, this international competition initially became a success as part of the 2014 Glasgow Commonwealth Games. It will include for the first time a women's competition and a division for people with a physical disability. There will also be a number of local community engagements involving the participating teams during their stay in Moreton Bay, including a schools' clinic on the Friday and a junior clinic on

the Saturday. On the Friday, there will also be a sportsman's lunch with Mal Meninga as the feature speaker.

Dolphin's Marketing Manager, Tomara Spreadborough says, "We are very excited about hosting a variety of players for the first time from around the world at our Stadium for this fast-paced tournament. Since the opening of Stage 1 of Dolphin Stadium in 2016, we've already hosted a number of major sporting tournaments, which have proved a success, and we've seen more visitors from outside our region as the stadium is an easy walk from the Kippa Ring train station. This particular Rugby League Championship will sure to be a popular event, so I encourage any rugby fan to get tickets soon as they will likely to sell out fast."

Tickets are \$10 for adults each day, and free for children between 0-15yrs of age. Concessional adults are \$5. Two-day tickets can also be purchased for \$15 adults and \$10 concession. Purchase online by visiting www.rugbyleague9smoretonbay.com.au.

From verdant mountains to crashing waves, Moreton Bay is spoilt with natural beauty. This Valentine's Day you can use that beauty to spoil your special other and forge some timeless memories along the way. You don't have to spend Valentine's Day inside a cliché; Moreton Bay can cover every spectrum of romance within a 40-minute drive.

Rather than getting tangled up in gifts and formalities, explore the region with your Valentine. The lesser-known Zillman's Crossing, located near Upper Caboolture, is a beautiful place to take your date (and your dogs). Enjoy the country drive and take a dip in the freshwater, while surrounded by smooth sculpted stones and the cool forest canopy. Don't forget to pack a picnic to woo your betrothed through an array of sandwiches and cheeses, but most importantly, don't forget to take your rubbish with you.

For those who prefer nature behind a glass, head to White Brick Brewing at North Lakes. At this micro-brewery, you can enjoy Moreton Bay's own local brew, buy 'the paddle' and sip down on the delicious range of local beer, each named after local landmarks, while the White Brick brewers concoct more before your eyes. Perhaps then you can hold onto the paddle and head on over to the North Lakes Library for some Kama Sutra-style inspiration.

A little way down the road at Murrumba Downs lays Acacia Park. The park offers a lovely outlook of the North Pine River, and it's a perfect place for lunch, a fish and lounge on the beach. This hidden gem is also scattered with walking tracks that lead along the riverbank and through a dry eucalypt forest. If you're a thrill seeker, these tracks have proven to be exciting on the back of a mountain bike. You'll need speed and agility to master the trails of Acacia Park.

If it's sunshine that you seek, head to Redcliffe, hire stand-up paddleboards and float around the point. Marvel at the views of Moreton Island in the distance and your Valentine in their swimsuit. Make sure you equip yourself with a hat, sunscreen, drinking water and some charm. For nourishment, you cannot go past the classic chip sandwich. Redcliffe has more to offer than just scenic coastline, post-paddling you should head to the Redcliffe Botanic Garden. Laze under the shade of the native trees and admire the soap opera of wildlife. You can revel in the fact that though the local wildlife may dance a similar mating ritual to us, they don't nearly get as much chocolate and adoration as you do on Valentine's Day.

WHERE ANCIENT AND MODERN MEET

For thousands of years, Aboriginal people have been treating pain, sickness and disease with bush medicine. Using trees, plants, herbs, seeds, and animal products, they've had great success healing many conditions and diseases.

Each clan had their particular remedies, and despite the fact that none were written down, they have passed down from generation to generation. Aboriginal bush medicine is still used to treat sickness, and it's now gaining in popularity as an alternative to Western Medicine.

Research into some of the plants and herbs has revealed that they contain many known antibacterial and anti-inflammatory properties that are widely used and recognised in western medicine. One example is tea-tree (*Melaleuca alternifolia*) used extensively as an antiseptic, skin and acne treatment, inhalant for colds, and a tea for sore throats. It has proven to be antiviral, antibacterial and anti-fungal. Aboriginal people have been using tea tree for thousands of years, having recognised its incredible healing properties. Eucalyptus and Gumby Gumby are other plants that feature heavily in Aboriginal

Bush Medicine, and especially Eucalyptus can be found in a variety of medicinal forms in almost every home in Australia.

Lee Doherty of The Traditional Bush Medicine Company has opened Australia's first traditional bush medicine retail outlet, located in Redcliffe's Jetty Arcade, and she sells a variety of products.

"Aboriginal Bush Medicine is the oldest form of [pharmacological] medicine on the planet. Some people claim that the knowledge has been lost, but it hasn't; this knowledge belongs to the Aboriginal people," Lee says.

Lee is passionate about bush medicine and the integration of ancient knowledge with modern research. She describes it as a bringing together of the old and the new.

The Aboriginal people know which plants work, and which do not. Now, thanks to Lee and her desire to share her learning of this extensive traditional native Australian medicine, we have Aboriginal Bush Medicine available to us right here in Redcliffe.

THE LAW AND YOU: GRANDPARENTS' RIGHTS

The birth of a grandchild brings much joy and happiness to many grandparents. But with the subsequent babysitting, family get-togethers, and fun-filled activities that help create that all-too-important grandparent-to-grandchild bond, it can be incredibly heartbreaking for grandparents when the family unit fractures because of separating or divorced adult children. Many grandparents become aggrieved and feel at a loss when contact with their grandchildren decreases or completely stops.

Reduced contact or access can occur for a number of reasons, including the nature of the custody arrangements, the custodial parent and children moving away to a new location, pre-existing or consequent-created relationships between the custodial parent and grandparent, financial factors, or the unfortunate situation where the grandchildren are used as leverage against the ex-partner or grandparent.

So, as a grandparent, what are your rights when it comes to access to your grandchildren after an adult child's relationship breaks down?

Moreton Bay Regional Council Libraries are hosting a free one-hour seminar titled 'The Law and

You: Grandparents' Rights' for library members interested in knowing where they stand when it comes to access to grandchildren.

The seminar will take place during the months of February, March and May of this year and will be hosted by a range of libraries across the Moreton Bay region. Qualified and experienced lawyers from Caboolture Law will present the information and help to throw light on this critical, emotional, and changing aspect of Family Law.

They will endeavour to help explain how people can get assistance when seeking access to grandchildren when their rights have been deterred or with the possibility of being blocked, and what can and can't be done regarding the grandchildren. Attendees may have the opportunity to ask general, group-based questions at the end of the presentation.

WHOSE BEAK CAN HOLD MORE THAN THEIR BELLY CAN?

Funny how we get so familiar with something, perhaps because we see it nearly every day, that we forget how amazing it is.

Pelicans!!!

The Australian Pelican (*Pelecanus conspicillatus*) is truly legendary, having the longest bill of any living bird with the record length at 50cm.

It seems it's not possible to enter the Houghton Highway from the north without seeing numerous pelicans perched — resting or grooming, or tussling for a prime position — on the overhead street lights. They are also easily spotted all along the foreshore from Clontarf to Scarborough, and even in the canals of Newport. If you were to choose an avian emblem for the area, it would have to be the pelican.

They are a highly mobile bird, searching for places with adequate food. Though favouring coastal areas in drier periods, vast numbers flock to inland bodies of water, such as Lake Eyre, when they fill after flooding rains. Nobody knows what signals them to make this trip.

Although not capable of sustained flapping, they soar on thermals, sometimes as high as 3000m, enabling them to travel long distances with minimal effort.

They feed either alone or in groups, often cooperating to herd fish into the shallows for easy catching. With sensitive bills, they can locate prey in murky water. Once a fish is detected, they project their beak at it, with the massive elastic throat pouch acting as a kind of net. Water drains from the bill, and the fish is manipulated by small tossing actions until the head is facing towards the throat. They hold the beak upright, and the catch slides down.


At 10am daily at the Clontarf Visitor Information Centre, volunteers check the health of, and feed, the local transient pelican population. The Australian Seabird Rescue Team treat any that are found to be sick or injured. Everyone is welcome to watch, and it's a great way to see these majestic birds at close range and learn more about their habits.

Look out for them and do your bit to ensure their wellbeing by disposing of fishing hooks and lines properly.



Left Turn on Red (LTOR) is an emerging traffic signal facility designed to reduce delays and congestion. The facility allows drivers to turn left against a red signal after stopping and giving ways to approaching vehicles, pedestrians

and cyclists. This type of facility is provided through North America and Europe as well as select locations in New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia. Brisbane initially trailed five sites, but this has now expanded to forty-nine sites having low pedestrian conflict potential. MBRC has assessed this facility and is proceeding with a trial of LTOR at nine locations within the region. LTOR is implemented through the installation of signs which provide a legally recognised message to drivers that they may turn left on a red signal after they have stopped and given way to all vehicles. I have suggested that as part of the trial, LTOR be installed on Anzac Avenue at Chelsea Street, Gynther Road and Stubbins Street. The trial will last twelve months when a further workshop will be held to examine the benefits and impacts of such a facility.

An eclectic exhibition of mixed media artworks by artists Ngapo and Maika will be on display at the Redcliffe Cultural Centre in February.

The contemporary art exhibition, entitled Tūrangawaewae, the Māori word meaning 'A place to stand, is all about developing cultural works that talk to people about places we call home, places where our feet rest. Within this theme the artists' works explore community and connectivity. Artist Nina Maika, specialises in multicultural artworks and paintings, and she believes the exhibition will have meaning for everyone.

"The simplicity of the message in the Māori art is the community connection, and this can be appreciated whatever culture you are apart of," she says.

Nina says her creative process often involves allowing her artwork form organically without always having a concept for it in mind when she begins.

"For this exhibition, I drew on anything and everything," she says. "Sometimes the best art is the most unplanned art."

One of Nina's favourite pieces that will be featured is a door with a Goddess painted on it. The meaning behind this is that the Goddess connects us to our connectivity, which is symbolised through the door.

Nina says she has always known she had a passion for art. "I have always been creative, I knew since the age of 6 or 7," she says.

When she decided to take art seriously, she studied art in Sydney for two years. She started out doing lots of community-based art projects of varying sizes, then moved on to work for the city council, just as they were developing a city logo. After this, she painted murals for New South Wales railway stations, before coming to Brisbane. She has now lived in Redcliffe for 15 years.

Delwyn Ngapo, whose work will be exhibited alongside Nina's, also resides in Redcliffe. "I would describe Ngapo's work as earthy and warm, like she has recorded the vibrations of the earth," says Nina.

The exhibition will run from the 1st to the 26th February, from 9am to 4pm daily in the Redcliffe Cultural Centre. The art will be free to view and will be for sale as marked.







UPGRADE TO BEGIN ON REDCLIFFE JETTY PONTOONS

Moreton Bay Regional Council will begin works in the coming weeks on the \$2.4 million Redcliffe Jetty pontoon upgrade, improving accessibility for the thousands of patrons who visit the Queensland icon and gateway to Moreton Bay each year.

Division 6 Councillor Koliana Winchester said from early January, crews would begin the process of replacing the jetty's existing pontoon system.

"The jetty is one of the Peninsula's most recognisable attractions, and serves as one of the northside's only access points to places like Moreton Island," Cr Winchester said.

"With the popularity of whale watching on Moreton Bay and the new express ferry to Moreton Island, we're upgrading the jetty's pontoon infrastructure so more people can access and enjoy what we love about Redcliffe, Moreton Bay and its surrounding islands.

The upgrade follows the completion of jetty's new handrails.

"Council has worked with businesses who operate from the jetty so they can find alternative

arrangements and continue to operate while works are underway and so that works don't disrupt seasonal attractions like whale watching.

During the upgrade, the Redcliffe2Moreton Express Ferry Service will operate from the Newport Marina at 158 Griffith Road, Newport. For more information on the ferry service during this time, visit: www.visitmoretonbayregion.com.au/business-directory/redcliffe-2-moreton-express.

Cr Winchester said the majority of the jetty would remain accessible to the public during the upgrade, including the rotunda, however the jetty head would be temporarily closed.

Additionally, from time-to-time the jetty will be closed for short periods to allow construction vehicles access to the worksite.

"I want to thank the public for their patience as works get underway, and for importantly heeding the safety advice of crews as they work to improve this popular attraction and gateway to Moreton Bay."

Works are expected to be complete mid-2018, weather permitting.

HISTORIC HUMPYBONG REACHES NEW HEIGHTS

The history of Humpybong State School dates back 142 years to 1876. ‘Umpie Bong’ was the moniker given to the area by the local Indigenous traditional landowners, the Ningy Ningy people, and translates to ‘empty shelter’. The phrase refers to the abandoned camps left by the first white settlers when they relocated their original settlement from Moreton Bay to Brisbane.

While proud of their history, the committed team at Humpybong State School led by principal Catherine Waldron has its focus on preparing students for the future.

From the construction of a shared community playground on school grounds to recent awards received, the school is increasingly being recognised for its pioneering practices. In 2016, the school was named one of 250 ‘Independent’ public schools in Queensland, which involves a commitment to share innovative practices and make suggestions to help improve schools across Queensland.

“Humpybong’s particular area of innovation is in implementing the new digital technologies curriculum being rolled out through the Australian Curriculum. We have used some of the extra funds received from being an Independent Public School to employ a full-time Digital Technologies Coach, supporting our teachers’ skill and knowledge base to teach the new curriculum,” Ms Waldron said.

Humpybong State School has also been invited to attend and present at an international conference in Vancouver in April this year, after participating in a world-wide project trialed in classrooms in 2017. Through the initiative, students are taught specific skills to equip them for life in the 21st century.

“This achievement and the opportunity to learn from practitioners around the world is very exciting,” Ms Waldron said.

In the future, the school is looking to enhance the community mentoring program started in 2017 with the Redcliffe PCYC.

“The vision is to engage people in the community who would willingly give up one hour of their time to become a friend of a child at school who needs an adult role model, where both the child and adult can learn from each other and trust each other,” Ms Waldron said. Any adults interested in being considered for this program can contact the school for further information.

With an illustrious list of alumni including the Gibb brothers, William McInnes, and Petero Cioniceva; Humpybong State School is sure to continue adding to its list of high achievers in the future. We are excited to see what they accomplish in 2018 and beyond.

GOOD FOOD FROM THE GROUND UP

A food workshop is set to put veggies in your belly and health on your mind this month thanks to a couple of plant-loving locals.

Held at Margate's popular Soul Harvest Wholefoods Kitchen, We Eat Plants workshop is back by popular demand, following a sold-out session in 2017.

Owner Stacey Taylor is also the director of Taylormade Bootcamps and says the idea to expand the fitness business into food came when she and co-owner Sam Taylor were trying to live a more plant-based lifestyle.

"We really struggled with ideas and inspiration when creating plant-based meals," she says.

"The only guide we had was the internet, which was great, but we were overwhelmed by so much information.

"The first year or so was a lot of getting things wrong and learning, so we created the classes as a way for us to pass on what we've learnt — we've made the mistakes, so you don't have to."

Stacey says the workshops are geared towards all ability levels and look at recipes that have become staples in day-to-day life.

"There will be lots of food to try, tips and tricks with meal prepping plant-based food, and also how to replace meat, dairy and eggs in recipes with other plant-based alternatives," she says.

"But most of all the workshops will focus on how to create great tasting food that everyone can enjoy.

"All the recipes are easy to follow and most of the ingredients you'll probably already have in the kitchen at home."

Stacey says the workshop is an important event for the community as it gives the opportunity for like-minded local people to meet others with similar interests and values.

"Cooking and plant-based eating is something we are both really passionate about — eating is something we do every day, so why not be passionate about what we eat and the effects it has on us and the environment around us," she says.

"Only one out of 10 Australian adults consume the minimum required amount of fruit and vegetables per day according to CSIRO, so if we can educate and encourage people to eat more plant-based meals, we hope we can help change this statistic.

"Also you get to try some pretty awesome food."





ROBERTSON'S JETTY AT MARGATE

In the mid-1880s, Thomas and Maria Robertson built a large home at Margate named Ferny Lawn. The property fronted the beach at Margate, so the Robertsons built a small jetty jutting out from the water's edge. There were several such jetties along the seafront at Redcliffe at that time used by family and visitors for fishing or small boats.

As their two previous jetties had been destroyed in storms, Mrs Robertson wrote to the Redcliffe Divisional Board in December 1889 requesting permission to build a new jetty — Thomas died earlier in 1889. The Board decided that permission was outside their province to interfere and so Mrs Robertson approached the Marine Board and was granted permission to build her jetty with the stipulation that it was not in any way to interfere with traffic along the beach nor the navigation of boats. The Divisional Board then decided that they thought this jetty would interfere with traffic along the beach and requested that sixteen feet from the shore end should be removed.

Mrs Robertson hired architect Mr Hall to build a substantial jetty that would withstand violent

storms. The new jetty did withstand many storms and although almost derelict, was still something of a landmark at Margate till the early 1930s. In 1932 the Margate Progress Association requested that Redcliffe Town Council construct slippery slides on the beach using the piles from Robertson's jetty, and so perpetuate the memory of the jetty. Council agreed to this request, provided the cost not exceed £7 for the two slides and by the next holiday season the slippery slides had become a popular visitor attraction.

PIGEON NESTS A PEST FOR PANELS

Pigeons may not always rule the roost, but when it comes to solar panels, their nests become the ultimate pest.

Pure Sunshine Solar Cleaning owner Luke Vervoorn says pigeons nesting in solar panels are a big problem in the local area.

"We can't be sure where the problem started, but the bird numbers are constantly going up," he says.

"The boom of the solar industry has provided hundreds of new nesting areas for the birds, and they breed constantly — the homing nature of the bird means they stay local.

"We have completed more than 200 bird proofing jobs the Moreton Bay region alone and close to 500 in total."

Luke says the reason behind the rising numbers is the solar panels sit on rails above the roof to allow air to flow underneath and to prevent them overheating, but this space is a perfect nesting and roosting area for pigeons.

"These birds can cause thousands of dollars worth of damage, and if ignored, the problem gets worse with time," he says.

"Once new birds have been hatched at the property, they consider it home, and it is then harder to move them on, and the numbers grow rapidly.

"The amount of poo these birds make is incredible, and it is not only smelly but can corrode metal roofs and gutters in time, block gutters and downpipes that cause water to spill during storms.

"Bird poo on solar panels also dramatically drops the efficiency and causes hot spots, which can burn out the panels."

Luke says a solution is to get a pest proofing system, which extends to other pests including possums.

"Clips fix to the underside of the solar panels and are attached to a heavy-duty, outdoor plastic mesh to keep the pigeons from getting under," he says.

"The mesh is plastic to prevent any metal-on-metal reactions and can be clipped on and off easily, so it doesn't interfere with the system.

"People should get the problem sorted straight away as it only gets worse and more costly as time goes on."


