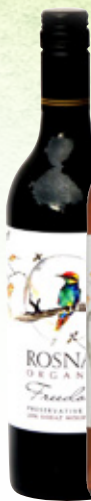

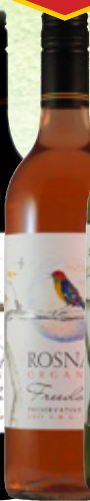

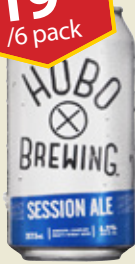

SAIL IN FOR A GREAT DAY OUT

Pull up the anchor, trim your jib and get ready to hit the water — the Redcliffe Festival of Sails is back on the Peninsula, and this year the event has hit an incredible milestone.

Arguably Redcliffe's biggest event, Festival of Sails is this year celebrating its 21st birthday with a huge lineup of events, activities, food and entertainment.

"The event first began in the mid-90s and encouraged visitors to experience Redcliffe with some of the best vantage points to view the Brisbane to Gladstone Yacht Race," says MBRT chief executive Shane Newcombe.

"Since this humble beginning, the festival has grown to become one of the largest Good Friday events in the country.

"Coupled with spectacular views from Suttons Beach of the Brisbane to Gladstone Yacht Race, it's no wonder the Festival of Sails attracts upwards of 40,000 visitors every year."

And this year, festival-goers are in for a regal treat thanks to the Queen's Baton Relay joining the festivities.

"Redcliffe is very proud to host the Queen's Baton Relay on Good Friday before it makes its way to the 2018 Commonwealth Games Opening Ceremony," Shane says.

"The QBR will travel along Redcliffe Parade before being presented at the Redcliffe Festival of Sails main stage around 8.50am.

To celebrate this momentous occasion, there will be daytime fireworks and additional live performances."

Shane says visitors can expect a family-friendly atmosphere with stacks to do that won't cost a fortune.

"When visitors aren't joining in the free activities, watching the skydiving Easter Bunny, jumping on some rides, or listening to some great live music, there are over 150 market stalls to browse and more," he says.

"Another brand new addition to the 2018 Redcliffe Festival of Sails program is the Ice Cream Fair. This will be a delectable treat for all those sweet teeth out there."

Sounds like there's a flavour for everybody.

Redcliffe Festival of Sails is on Good Friday, 30 March from 8am to 4pm, at Suttons Beach, Marine Parade, Redcliffe.

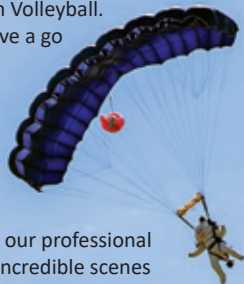

GET SET FOR A HULL OF A GOOD TIME

The Brisbane to Gladstone Yacht Race is an institution on the bayside, a tradition that has seen generations of families line up along the foreshore to watch as the magnificent vessels go by on Good Friday each year.

But this year marks a milestone for the event, with the race celebrating its 70th year of existence. And that calls for getting a little bit up close and personal.

It's with this in mind that the owners of whale watching vessel Eye Spy decided to take spectators out and amongst the action, and bookings are filling up fast.

"The event has been very popular, especially with the locals, and bookings are growing daily," says Dessray Colledge from the Eye Spy team.

"Our VIP lounge, located on the upper mid deck level of Eye Spy is almost booked out!"

Passengers who snap up the lucky last spots on board

can get amongst morning tea, a buffet lunch and onboard entertainment — not to mention a very special view of the Brisbane to Gladstone Yacht Race, which not many punters ever get to experience.

"The event includes a full day's cruise on the water," Dessray says.

"We will be boarding at 9am for a 9.30am departure from the Newport Marina in Newport and will have guests returning approximately 1:30pm-2pm.

"It's a great event for the local community as we have the opportunity to really show off what we have right here in our own backyard, Moreton Bay."

And for those wondering about the vessel herself, Eye Spy is a magnificent venue from which to view the big race.

"Our beautiful vessel Eye Spy was built and commissioned right here in Brisbane," she says.

Let your soul seek some magic through the symphony of sounds that will be presented this St Patrick's Day by the Brisbane City Pops Orchestra!

The Redcliffe Cultural Centre hosts this special event, a performance that will be conducted by the wonderful Chen Yang and will feature the heavenly voices of the 7 Sopranos to accompany the orchestra.

Rita West is Events Coordinator for the BCPO; she has been playing violin in the group for... wait for it... 42 years (!) and has been instrumental in bringing the orchestra to our region to perform Magical Melodies.

"We have performed at QPAC (Queensland Performing Art Centre) and there are many venues we perform at every year; it's been a bit of a dream of mine to get the orchestra to the Redcliffe Cultural Centre, its such a beautiful venue," Rita says. "We're always very busy, but I knew that the time had come to make it happen. It's a very cultural and artistic area which has great shows, and I thought, well, we could be one of these."

The performance will take you on an exciting musical journey, and feature a collection of some best-loved

and famous melodies, from light classics to jazz and show favourites. Conductor Chen Yang is renowned for his years in the Queensland Symphony Orchestra and currently serves as the leader and conductor of the Corda Spiritus Orchestra of Brisbane and the Sinfonia of St Andrews Orchestra.

"Chen is wonderful," Rita says. "We love performing with him; he is so good to work with. He is also a violinist so we always give him a solo to perform; this year he's doing Meditation, which is an absolutely beautiful piece. He plays so superbly."

Accompanying the orchestra will be the 7 Sopranos, formed by acclaimed opera singer Tarita Botsman in 2009. Bringing a commanding stage presence and beautiful voices, these women debuted at No 2 on the Aria charts and have clocked up hundreds of appearances around the globe in recent years.

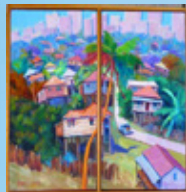

"I've been there for nine wonderful months now and have recently started announcing every Tuesday from noon until 3pm. It's lots of fun!"

Rosie says the station is fuelled by the community and its volunteers, and that connection is what

we all need more of. "Our station keeps people connected," she says.

"We churn out some great music, and we are supported by local businesses, and provide an avenue to connect people with what's local.

"We need to connect with each other, to have conversations about the places we love."

TRADITIONAL TREATMENTS

Do you suffer from chronic headaches or migraines? Persistent lower back pain? You may benefit from treatments in the ancient practice of traditional Chinese medicine.

"The origin of the practice is lost in history as the written word was not invented. Only Egyptian and Babylonian predates it, making it the third oldest form of medicine," explains Kristen Shinnie, owner of Koi Acupuncture and Chinese Medicine.

"The idea of traditional Chinese medicine is to balance a person's yin and yang qualities. It is a holistic form of natural medicine with many factors of a person's life taken into consideration."

Modern medicine sometimes dismisses alternative therapies as a lesser form of treatment. However, there are conditions now rated as having evidence of a positive effect when being treated with acupuncture. These include chronic complaints such as migraines, chronic headaches, lower back pain, and knee osteoarthritis pain, but many other conditions can benefit from treatments.

A typical initial consultation session takes around 1 to 1 ½ hours. This includes a diagnostic assessment consisting of a series of questions

related to the patient's health and lifestyle. If necessary, the patient's temperature, tongue, and pulse may be checked to diagnose internal concerns.

"All sessions are individually tailored to the client, and a treatment plan is made so the client is aware of the time frame needed to potentially ease or even reverse the issue," Kristen says.

"The longer a condition is suffered, the longer it would take to correct. The usual rule is for one year of suffering, one month of treatment, or four to eight sessions, would be required."

In addition to the consultations and treatments, Kristen also offers fire cupping therapy, a treatment where glass cups are suctioned onto the body. When the cups are removed, sometimes a superficial ring is left behind which quickly disappears.

"I affectionately call them 'Octopus rings,'" Kristen says.

"Fire cupping therapy is an excellent treatment for athletes to improve workout recovery, and for those who wish to relax, de-stress, relieve pain and improve circulation.

"Everyone's body has the ability to heal itself; it may just need a little help to do so."

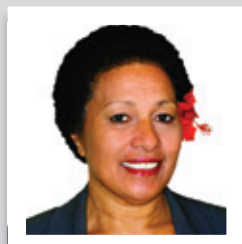

I am pleased to advise local residents that our business case, investigating a potential landing site for a Moreton Island barge service, shows that Scarborough Boat Harbour is a feasible location. The Palaszczuk government will invest

\$4 million in the development of a landing site. The Northern Arm, which forms a large breakwater around the northern part of the harbour will be activated for the project.

The investment will also fund the construction of a rock wall which will serve as a breakwater and a new road to the landing site. Surveying work has already commenced. Interested studies have shown that the area just west of the harbour has been identified for unexploded ordinances on the seabed. This will be investigated as part of the preparation work. Enquiries are underway to find an historical link to this discovery.

Overall, this is a great step forward, with the Queensland Government seeking expressions of interest mid-year to operate the service.

lobbying all levels of government to secure artificial reefs at Moreton Island by securing patrol ships or new artificial reefs.

The government will also be working on a number of reforms this year to improve the safety of our children online.

Recently in Parliament, I spoke on the importance of rolling out the cashless debit card to two more trial sites and the success of the PaTH Program which helps 18-24-year-olds gain work experience in the private sector and then land a full-time job. Last year 403,000 jobs were created with 75% being full-time. This is the strongest year-to-date result in job creation in 40 years.

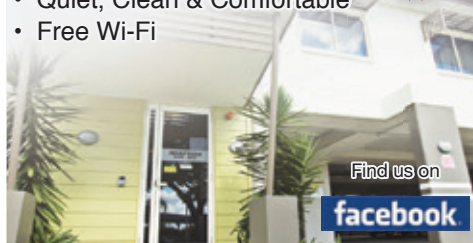

A now-retired, Malaysian-Chinese Australian GP who has travelled to Nepal every year since 1999 with her husband to help the poor and young Tibetans, Betty's charity work has supported many of those marginalised by poverty and culture.

We aim to give them one."

COME FLY WITH ME

You hear a buzzing above your head. Years of evolution prepare your hand to raise and swipe the air in self-defence, until you notice the propeller, wait, propellers! Four of them whirring in unison; holding aloft a tiny craft as it rises into the suburban sky.

Drones, or Remotely Piloted Aircraft (RPA's), have become a favourite of hobbyists in recent years, and while drones are fabulous fun to fly for some, the perception of many people is that they can be intrusive, invasive or hazardous.

Besides recreational use, drones are finding a firm foothold in commercial airspace. Jake Milburn, of Fly UAS, a training organisation for commercial RPA pilots based in Redcliffe, says that many students come from a background of flying drones for fun, and the opportunities are growing.

"We've seen it grow from use in film and videography; RPA's are now used by surveyors, police, fire and emergency departments, surf lifesaving, and in agriculture. We're really seeing it spread into a lot of different industries," Jake said.

Whether being used recreationally or commercially, the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) sets the guidelines that govern the use of drones, and there

are quite a few. Essentially, they stem from the core rule that you must not operate your drone in a way that creates a hazard for another aircraft, person or property. The detailed regulations can be found at CASA's website, listed below.

"Quite a few councils now have drone flying policies or recommendations," Jake says. "They all recommend following CASA's regulations, but also most of them will provide permits for flying drones for various other reasons, and have designated areas where clubs operate as well."

Moreton Bay Regional Council has approved drone operation at Ray Frawley Fields in Clontarf, and at clubs in Dakabin and Griffin. Currently, if operating within the guidelines, drones up to 500 grams can be used without consent; larger RPA's require a license or permit.

The main message for aspiring recreational or commercial drone pilots is to do your research, know the rules that govern your activity, and have fun in the Drone Zone!

He will explore future tenants and partners, help us refine the concept and oversee the development of a Master Plan for the vacant land.”

DUANE DELVES INTO LOCAL HISTORY

Duane Hart has a passion for pictures. A Redcliffe local for the past 20 years, he owns and operates Peninsula Framing in Comino's Arcade. He has collated an archive of historical images from the local area in an attempt to piece together a more comprehensive picture of the visual history of the Peninsula.

As well as collecting land sale maps and old postcards, Duane has also actively searched to find local images from the past.

"I went through the State Archives obtaining high-resolution images of all the paintings and photos taken of Redcliffe from the late 1880s and early 1900s.

"My main business is restoring old photos for local customers, so I've also had a number of local families bring their old family history scrapbooks in," he says.

His biggest challenge so far has been to piece together a 1918 panorama of the Redcliffe Jetty.

"It took three months to colourise. I studied the colour of the cliffs and vegetation along the Redcliffe foreshore and slowly pieced it together, colouring all the buildings along from the old Seaview Boarding house to Oyster Point at Scarborough," he says.

To colour the images, Duane researches old museum photos of the fashion worn at the time, and the colours used in building and brickwork to ensure his work is accurate.

"A lot of the early postcards were heavily colourised and many were printed in Prussia in the early 1920s so they guessed a lot of the colours back then," he says.

It was a natural progression to publish a book of historical images. While the first print run has all but sold out, Duane hopes to reprint a second edition of the book with some new (old) additions in the coming months. A slideshow of images from the book is also available to view online for free at www.redcliffebook.com.

"I will be doing another soft cover second edition in the next few months, and they will be available at a few select locations including the Old Fire Station Gallery and the Redcliffe Museum," he says.

Duane's restored images can be viewed throughout Comino's Arcade, and at the Redcliffe Emporium market hall, where he also screens a 30-minute movie about the history of Redcliffe.

If you have historical images to contribute to Duane's archive, Peninsula Framing is open Monday to Saturday.

BARGE CLOSER TO REALITY

A regular barge service from Scarborough Boat Harbour to Moreton Island is one step closer, with Member for Redcliffe Yvette D’Ath announcing today that the project will now proceed to the expressions of interest stage after the business case showed Scarborough as a feasible site for a barge landing.

“This is something the community has wanted for a long time, and I’m so pleased the Palaszczuk Government is helping to deliver this vital service for the people of Redcliffe,” Mrs D’Ath said.

“Ultimately, this will be a commercial decision for any interested proponent to ensure a viable barge operation, however, the Palaszczuk Government is the first government to invest in the marine infrastructure needed to deliver this service from the Redcliffe Peninsula.”

The State Government has committed \$4 million to the project that will go towards an access road along the northern arm of the Scarborough Boat Harbour, which will provide access to a barge landing site.

WHAT IS A MEDIAN HOUSE PRICE?

While median house price is a commonly used term when it comes to property market statistics, there are some things you need to understand before drawing conclusions from changes to the median prices:

1. How Is It Calculated?

The median house price is essentially the sale price of the middle home in a list of sales where the sales are arranged in order from lowest to highest price. So in a list of eleven sales, it would be the sale price of house number six, which has five lower priced sales below it and five higher priced sales above it. This is different to the average, which would be the total value of all the house sales, divided by the number of homes sold. Technically speaking, the median is more accurate than the average because it is less affected by a few unusually high or low sale prices. Median prices in property are based on the homes that have recently transacted and are most often divided into units and houses.

2. A Change Isn't Always A Change

While median prices are a useful tool for understanding the price changes of properties that have transacted in a market, a 10% increase does not necessarily mean that your property is worth 10% more. In fact, your property could have dropped in value during this time. What it does reflect, however, is activity in the market. Let me put it this way... If a number of million dollar homes came onto the market and all sold the last month this would raise the median price — however, the value of a more moderately priced home may not have changed at all. Similarly, a falling median price in an area could just indicate that there were more sales occurring at the cheaper end of the market than there are at the expensive end and not that values have dropped.

3. Not All Areas Are Equal

Changes in median price statistics are more meaningful in determining property price growth in some areas than others. For instance, suburbs where the properties are largely the same and therefore of similar pricing are likely to see the median price as a more accurate reflection of true value changes. And suburbs, where many properties sell on a more regular basis, will also be more statistically meaningful than in areas where homes are tightly held, sell infrequently and are significantly different from one another.

4. More Reliable Over The Long Term

Homeowners and Investors should pay less attention to short-term trends and understand that median prices (as with all statistics) are more useful when viewed as a change in trend over a longer time frame and not at over a month-to-month period. This helps you get a better understanding of an area's performance.

In summary, median prices are best used as an indication of the composition of sales rather than a good indicator of changing property values. That's why we also look at data such as sales volumes as well as investigating 'like for like' recent sales evidence to estimate current property values and do not rely solely on broad statistical changes like the median price data.

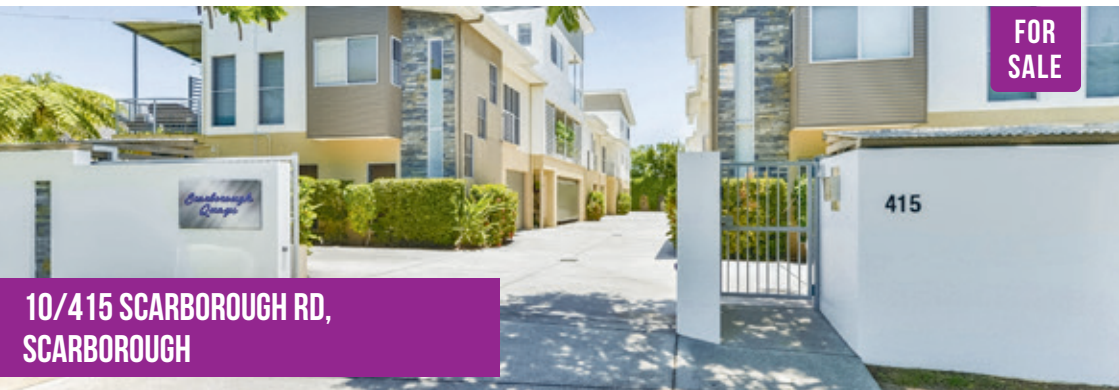

VISITORS PIGGING OUT BEFORE HEADING HOME

Our northern hemisphere tourists are busy stuffing themselves before their long journey home.

Not as obvious as our iconic Pelicans but just as remarkable in their own way are the migratory shorebirds. They breed in Siberia and Alaska in the northern summer and then head south to avoid the northern winter.

Many of these birds call our Redcliffe foreshores home during summer. They arrive in September (some still with a little of their bright coloured breeding plumage).

These shorebirds or “waders” are medium to small birds, often not noticed on our foreshores due to their mostly subtle brown/grey colours.

In March these amazing birds are busy trying to gain as much weight as possible to provide sufficient fuel for the long journey home. They will then return south again in September (usually to the same beach each year), followed a little later by any young they have raised in the northern summer.

You can find these birds on our mudflats at low tide and on many of our rocky foreshores from Deception Bay to Hays Inlet. The smallest of them (Red-necked

Stint), weighing in at around 25 grams can be seen on the Hays Inlet/Deception Bay mudflats, and at high tide, they often roost on the rock wall at the Scarborough Harbour entrance.

A bit bigger are the Pacific Golden Plovers which can be found between Woody Point boat ramp and Bells Creek hanging out near the rocks and also on the rocky areas around Queens Beach North and Scarborough Beach.

We also have Tattlers, Sand-plovers, Godwits and Whimbrels visiting Redcliffe each summer and if you’re really lucky you might spot an Eastern Curlew (the largest of the waders and critically endangered), with a long curved bill like an Ibis. Each species has a different sized and shaped bill, matched to its preferred food source. That way they don’t compete for resources.

So next time you are down at the foreshore, have a look for these camouflaged birds. But don’t get too close and keep dogs well clear as each time they are disturbed it means they put on less fat and may not survive their long journey 13,000 km north in April.
