

Dolphin Wild Island Cruises are setting sail on their 15th annual Brisbane Riverfire Cruise!

Departing from Newport Marina, Redcliffe residents have a chance to see the Brisbane Riverfire Festival fireworks without the hassle of city parking.

"We have two load points for our Riverfire Cruise either Newport Marina Scarborough at 1.45pm or Mowbray Park Jetty in Brisbane," says Lisa Edwards from Dolphin Wild.

"We recommend the Newport Marina option as parking in the city on Riverfire night is a nightmare!"

Departing from Newport Marina, patrons will enjoy a relaxing cruise across Moreton Bay before heading down the Brisbane River and under the Gateway Bridge, with commentary along the way.

Tickets are limited and include a smorgasbord dinner and dessert. Dolphin Wild also has a licensed bar for on-board drink purchases.

alling all schools and early learning centres in the Peninsula that want to make a difference to the environment! There is still time to enter the 2018 Moreton Bay Regional Recycler Competition...

Between 2016-17 Moreton Bay Regional Council received over 300,000 tonnes of waste from households, public areas and commercial operators. Just under half of these materials were recycled; imagine how much more we could help the earth if we cut down the excessive use of materials that CAN'T be recycled.

The 2018 Regional Recycler Competition theme is 'Plastic Pollution Solution', and it's all about making a difference in your school by choosing one plastic item that takes up lots of space in your everyday waste bin, and coming up with an idea that would cut down or eliminate that product completely.

Council's Waste Services Spokesperson Councillor Adam Hain said the annual Regional Recycler Competition was about getting kids thinking outside the box when it came to recycling and reusing.

"Kids can reduce, recycle or reuse items at both school and at home, and the Regional Recycler Competition is a fantastic tool to encourage kids to think about sustainability in a fun and interactive way at a very young age," Cr Hain said. "As part of this 2018 challenge, students can come up with any solution they like in the form of avoidance behaviours, reducing or reusing schemes or recycling measures.

Plastic pollution is having a detrimental impact on Redcliffe's wildlife, land, waterways and in our oceans - education is key to preventing unnecessary waste.

With a \$2,500 award for the Winner and 3 Highly Commended awards of \$500 each, it's a fun way to learn about reducing waste, and possibly win some great prize money for sustainability programs and resources.

"It's all about using your imagination and having fun, while helping to create a sustainable culture in schools and Early Learning Childcare services across the region," Cr Hain said.

Council leases land for Junior Cricket Club

The Redcliffe City Junior Cricket Club Inc. has been granted a lease from council, giving the club the opportunity to build a storage shed to house cricket gear at Filmer Park in Woody Point.

Spokesperson for Parks, Recreation and Sport Councillor Koliana Winchester who made the announcement following council's coordination meeting on Tuesday 7 August said the club had been granted a suitable parcel of land for the construction of a storage shed.

"The Redcliffe City Junior Cricket Club Inc. is a club with more than 160 members and I know how important this shed will be for its young players and their coaches to house the equipment needed to deliver their sport to the local community," Cr Winchester said.

"At the moment the club utilises a small area of the Peninsula Cricket Club Inc shed for the storage of their equipment and uniforms but this lease will give them the chance to have their own space strengthening self-sufficiency within their club.

"We want our young cricketers to focus on the game thinking about hitting 6s and 4s and not worrying about where they can house their gear."

Redcliffe City Junior Cricket Club Inc president Barry Smith said he was thankful to council for giving the club access to land to build the storage shed.

"It will be fantastic to have this facility on site and it will provide safe vermin proof storage for all our cricket and training gear," Mr Smith said.

"We are thankful for council's support and I know our club members will be thrilled with this news."



etter known as Finlay Roberts in Home and Away, a role she held for several years, Tina originally moved to Australia from Denmark in 1982 at the age of seven. She fell into acting initially to simply communicate while attending school at Clontarf Primary and Clontarf High, due to her lack of English.

"I needed to use the toilet when I was at school and not speaking English made it difficult to get that across to new classmates.

"So I became a mime that day and am so grateful that not only did they understand my game of charades, but they didn't make me feel silly," Tina said.

After moving to Sydney in 1991 to pursue her acting career, Tina was offered the role as Finlay on Home and Away. She then worked on several other TV shows including All Saints, Shark Bay, Big Sky, GP and Farscape.

The move back to the Peninsula to raise a family was always the dream, and Tina loves being back in the area.

"It's incredible to see how much change and development there has been since the 80s...we still have the natural beauty of the waterfront but now there are so many great cafes, restaurants and community events as well - it's paradise," Tina said.

Tina was inspired to set up Zip Studios to give students of all ages and levels of experience an opportunity to practice acting for TV and movies.

"When I was dreaming of being on TV, there was no one providing lessons focused purely on screen acting," Tina said.

"I know a lot of young actors don't have any interest in performing on stage or in musicals but that is often all that's available.

"All work is filmed as if you are on set so you get experience in front of the camera and start building up a body of work right from day one.

We really are focused on fast-tracking actors, regardless of experience, through honing their screen skills, building a great showreel, securing an agent and eventually into professional work," Tina said.

Tina and her family are very happy to be settled back on the Peninsula, reliving her old childhood memories and making a whole host of new ones.

pring has sprung and what better way to celebrate than by joining the Redcliffe Steptember team!

Step outside and get moving alongside Redcliffe locals and raise funds for Cerebral Palsy while discovering the beauty of the Redcliffe Peninsula by foot.

The Peninsula Explorers Steptember group is encouraging local residents to join their team or create their own to raise funds for Cerebral Palsy and walk at least 10,000 steps each day from September 4-30.

Lucy Jacka, General Manager of Fundraising Steptember says money raised is used to assist babies until they are formally diagnosed.

"Cerebral Palsy is a physical disability that affects movement and posture due to damage to the developing brain either before or shortly after birth, and is a common physical disability in childhood".

"Some babies at risk might not necessarily end up having cerebral palsy, but if they are showing early signs, it's really important that they receive intervention and therapies just in case, she says.

"As well as early intervention, the Cerebral Palsy Alliance also helps provide families with the equipment that a child or adult living with cerebral palsy needs".

Students to Sit & Wait for Class

A growing trend in state primary schools to curtail physical activity before morning class has caused consternation among some local parents.

relatively new procedures implemented in several Peninsula state schools require students who arrive earlier than the commencement of class to sit calmly, rather than engage in any running games, handball or other physical activities.

The key issues appear to be supervision and the allocation of teacher aide time. Several local state schools and most private primary schools still provide a window of supervised playtime before school for kids to exercise, however a number of local principals have decided to reallocate the use of this expense to increase the teacher aide time in class.

In a statement regarding the matter, a spokesperson for the Department of Education stated "Principals, in consultation with the school community, make decisions about the most appropriate safety protocols to meet the needs of their students."

A document released by the Australian Government Department of Health states that the benefits of physical activity include reducing anti-social behaviour including aggressive and disruptive actions, developing skills such as cooperation and teamwork, and improving a child's ability to concentrate.

Parenting expert, author and educator Maggie Dent has discussed this trend in primary school education, and suggests that these approaches reflect a growing concern within educational systems around schools' accountability and liability for children's safety.


If a child slips or collides with another child unintentionally, many adults see that as grounds for the school being sued for negligence."

Ms Dent continues; "It is not only unhealthy for children who are already more passive than any other previous generation, it is plain sad. Unfortunately, duty of care and the interpretation of the laws that govern managing risk have made accidents something to be shamed and avoided. That is a sad outcome from our highly litigious society."

Do you have questions about this practice adopted by your child's school? The Department of Education spokesperson advises parents to contact their school directly, "If parents have concerns about issues at their children's schools, they are encouraged to speak directly to the principal."





We are a Sporty lot!

We Redcliffians have always been a sporty lot. It must be the sea air!

cricket club was started in Humpybong [the early name for Redcliffe] in 1884. Games were initially played on a field owned by Mr Snook. The club progressed, and after five years many of Redcliffe's leading citizens were at the helm, with the Reverend John Sutton as President. Many years later, the Redcliffe Cricket Club amalgamated with its Sandgate bayside neighbours to become the Sandgate Redcliffe Cricket Club. But Redcliffians never say die. Another club, The Peninsula Cricket Club was formed and now members play at their Woody Point home ground.

The Humpybong ladies were certainly not to be outdone. In 1884, the ladies discussed the formation of a tennis club. which was subsequently established. Nowadays, the Redcliffe **Tennis** Association, at its modern tennis facility with 12 courts on Oxley Avenue, has a

membership of over 800. All of Australia's tennis greats including Rod Laver, Roy Emerson and Tony Roche have played

Humpybong women were again at the sporting fore with Mary Nairn [nee Brown] being asked to form a hockey club in 1931. The following year the Redcliffe Hockey Club was born

In 1919, The Redcliffe Bowling Club's secretary, Percy Adams asked the then Shire Council for permission to establish a bowling green at Margate's sports reserve. It was granted. The game of Lawn Bowls will next year celebrate its 100th birthday on the Peninsula

All forms of football took a deal longer to arrive on the Peninsula. Rugby League was first with the Redcliffe Dolphins kicking off in 1947. By far the most successful sporting code on the Peninsula, this club has produced an outstanding record of achievement over the last 71 years, and boasts a home ground that is the envy of any international sporting club.

Rugby Union was slower to gain traction. However, the Redcliffe Rugby Union Club set its first scrum in 1969. It merged with the Teachers Norths Rugby Club in 1991. However, Union still holds sway at Clontarf's Frawley Fields with a revitalised Redcliffe Rugby Club holding its Sea Snakes banner high.

Soccer (or Football) first saw the light of day with the formation of the Redcliffe Soccer Club in 1948. A name change to Redcliffe City, saw it merge with Margate Soccer Club in 2000, creating the present Peninsula Power, which successfully competes in the Brisbane Premier League.

Australian Rules Football took to the field in 1974. Now in its forty-fourth year, the Redcliffe Peninsula AFC, nicknamed the Tigers, play at Rothwell's McGahey's Field. AFL Touch Football or Rec Footy is also played on the Peninsula.

The Peninsula Country Golf Club created a magnificent hole in one, by teeing off with 250 playing members from its beginning in 1935. The club, now renamed The Redcliffe Golf Club was established near the Hornibrook Bridge at Clontarf and has an 18-hole picturesque Championship course, which is the envy of many a Brisbane based club

Baseball first swung a bat on the Peninsula in 1948 when a US ex-serviceman founded a club initially known as the Redcliffe Whitesox. Several location changes and an important name change resulted in the 1982 formed and renamed Redcliffe Padres with their home run at Talobilla Park

The ancient game of croquet had been played on the Peninsula informally since WW1. In 1928, the Redcliffe Croquet Club was formed and 28 years later at Woody Point, it was renamed Eildon Croquet Club in honour of the club's first patron's home.

Other major Peninsula sporting clubs include Squash, Swimming, Netball, Cycling, Sailing, Fishing, Kayaking, Softball, Little Athletics, Martial Arts. Basketball, Darts, Table tennis, Rowing, Shooting, Gymnastics, Horse riding and Harness Racing.

In fact, there are very few sports that Redcliffe doesn't cater for!

Club CEO Stephen White expects a good turnout. "The event has been running for six years now, and last year was one of the biggest," Stephen says. "It's a day when we open our facilities to the general public and to people who may be interested in learning to fly."

Vintage aircraft and cars will be on display, a free jumping castle for the kids, and a display from the '212' (City of Redcliffe) Squadron Air Cadets. The adventure flights will be on-board a vintage Tiger Moth and a T34 Mentor, which is a military training type aircraft.

Stephen is also one of the club's instructors, and says that the event provides a closer look at the aircraft for anyone considering flying lessons. "We've got instructors on hand to answer questions and tell people more about the aircraft, what it takes to fly them, and to give them the opportunity to arrange a trial instructional flight."

Potential pilots come in all ages and for various reasons. "We get a cross-section; from people in high school to people in their sixties, and everything in between," Stephen says.

You can start training at pretty much any age, but you can't go solo until you're 15. You can get recreational license at 16, a private pilots license at 17, and a commercial license at 18."

"Many people are attracted to flying simply for the views; for some it provides a means to get to their favourite fishing spot and for others it's a way to have great family holidays flying around Australia," Stephen tells us. "Then there are those who want to go down the path of commercial flying; this is a good place to start."

The open Day will offer a BBQ, an ice-cream van and a coffee van onsite, but the day's highlight must be getting up in the air! If a joy-flight or an adventure flight sounds like fun, make sure to book ahead as flights and places will be limited.

The Last Straw For Moreton Bay

In a move applauded by environmentalists, Moreton Bay Regional Council has decided to ban the use of plastic straws from all council operated events and venues.

Council's Economic Development and Tourism Spokesperson, Councillor Peter Flannery, says, "It's a simple measure, which will hopefully make a huge difference on the overall amount of non-biodegradable plastics ending up in landfill or in our waterways."

The damage caused by single use plastic items, including bags, straws and packaging has long been acknowledged as harmful, particularly to marine environments and the fauna that exists within them.

The decision was inspired by Queensland schoolgirl Molly Steers, who started the 'Straw No More' campaign in early 2017. Molly's campaign was quickly implemented in many schools across the state, and is now being taken up by a growing number of schools, councils and businesses around the country.

"Our name is a nod to one of the country's most important coastal resources: Moreton Bay, and we have a responsibility to make sure rubbish like single-use straws doesn't end up harming local marine life," Cr Flannery says.

"Already a number of businesses and cafes in Moreton Bay are taking up the push for greater sustainability through re-usable cups and biodegradable cutlery; I hope this move encourages them to also ditch the single-use plastic straw from their menus."

TRAVELLING THE **UPGRADED**MOTORWAY

here have been some major changes to the local road network in the past months, with the opening of the new Deagon Interchange at the end of June 2018, as part of the Gateway Upgrade North project.



The interchange opening included the opening of two new northbound lanes on the Deagon Deviation for those travelling to Redcliffe, and the permanent closure of the Sandgate Road on-ramp to the motorway.

Motorists are now using new ways to access the motorway, including continuing along Sandgate Road/Braun Street to access the upgraded Depot Road onramp, or accessing the motorway earlier at Boondall (near the Brisbane Entertainment Centre) and at Nudgee.

Local works are also continuing to upgrade several intersections along Sandgate Road/Braun Street, and the project is closely monitoring the traffic flow along this stretch to optimise these signals as they are upgraded.

Motorists on the Gateway Motorway between Nudgee and Deagon, may have noticed the motorway corridor is now constructed to its final width, with the project approaching completion in late 2018. Prior to opening all six lanes of the upgraded motorway in the coming months, the project team will be installing the final layer of asphalt along the project's length, and installing ITS systems, lighting and guardrail. To complete these finishing works, extended nightwork hours, increased weekend works and temporary short-term closures of the adjacent motorway on and off-ramps will be required between now and November 2018.

The project team appreciates the community's ongoing patience as they work towards construction completion later in 2018 and continue to encourage motorists to drive carefully and considerately, particularly when travelling under new and changed conditions.

A collaboration between Redcliffe, Deception Bay and Clontarf Beach State High Schools, the project has completed a range of activities throughout the first semester of the year. "In Term 1, we led the National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence, whereby the whole school shared messages about what they most respected about Redcliffe State High School.

"They also wore wrist bands and pledged their commitment to saying no to bullying and [to] value diversity within our school," Fiona said.

"In Term 2, we commenced Respectful Relationships lessons in buddy classes. Some senior students were buddied with the Year 7 and 8 classes to deliver short lesson content to promote healthy relationships once a week, which is planned to continue for the remainder of 2018.

A mural visible from Oxley Avenue was also designed and created by students and staff at the school. A range of events were planned including a BBQ, fundraising and musical entertainment, which added a festive atmosphere to the creation of the mural.

"[It] was facilitated over four days and was a mass participation event, with huge staff and student involvement," Fiona said.

Fiona's aim is to harness local organisations to promote the project with local businesses and throughout the community.

It is our aim, that through our collective efforts, people learn and value the importance of respect, and embrace it to live peacefully within our beautiful Moreton Bay Peninsula."

he last Tasmanian Tiger died in Hobart Zoo in 1936. Sixty years later in 1996, Threatened Species Day was declared. It's a time to reflect on what happened in the past, and recognise that a similar fate may await many species if action is not taken to protect them, and their habitats.

In our region the Dugong (Dugong dugon) is one such creature. Its closest modern relative was Steller's Sea Cow from the Northern Hemisphere; discovered by Europeans in 1741 and hunted to extinction by around 1770! Another sorry tale of the disappearance of a species caused by human activity.

Classified as vulnerable by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN). the main threats to their survival are habitat degradation, fishing and boating related accidents, and hunting.

Dugongs are found scattered throughout the coastal waters of the northern half of Australia. Southeast Asia and the eastern side of Africa. Areas that provide suitable conditions are declining. The populations of Moreton Bay in Queensland, and Shark Bay in Western Australia, are their last remaining strongholds.

In Moreton Bay, they mainly inhabit the eastern side, where the seagrasses grow that form their diet. Although not usually seen near the mainland they are still very much a part of our local identity and consciousness. Prized for their rich meat, they were traditionally hunted by Indigenous Australians.

More closely related to elephants than to dolphins or whales, dugongs can live for up to 70 years; growing up to 3m in length and weighing up to 400kg.

Queensland leads the way in research, and Australia has the only data collected over a long enough period of time to be able to analyse population trends. Dugongs have disappeared from the shores of many countries, and some nations have insufficient resources to fund surveys.

Spend a little time giving thought to our threatened species and engage in ways that give them a chance to continue to live alongside us. While boating, observe the "GO SLOW" zone rules, be on the lookout, and maintain a safe distance from all marine life.



Mary Nairn's hockey legacy lives on in Redcliffe

he name Mary Nairn is synonymous with hockey in Redcliffe, with an arched gate welcoming all to the Mary Nairn Hockey Fields on Oxley Avenue.

In 1959, Redcliffe Mayor Alderman JE Houghton named the area the Mary Nairn Hockey Fields, handing over the Mary Nairn hockey gates erected at the entrance to the fields as a tribute to Mary's decades of service to hockey.



HISTORY

Mary formed the Humpybong Girls' Sports Club in 1931, and sought approval to clear an area of the show grounds for the purpose of a hockey

After much hard work, the first game of hockey was played there in September 1932.

Then in 1939, a number of men became interested in hockey. A team was formed, but with the outbreak of WWII, many players went off to war. Though this didn't stop Mary. She coached a number of teams of Australian servicemen encamped at the show grounds and American naval personnel from the Seabrae Guest House. The American soldiers gave her a dog in appreciation.

The same year, Mary was selected to play for Queensland. An international match was played at the Redcliffe field against an American women's team. Although Mary's team lost, it was a big day for the whole peninsula.

Mary also approached the three schools on the peninsula to start hockey at school level, and soon this school sport flourished.

In 1948, the Redcliffe school boys' team travelled to Warwick to participate in the Queensland State Primary School Hockey Association championships, accompanied by team captain Roderick Buchanan's father Harold

On their return home, Harold approached Mary and together they organised the club to enable boys to continue with the sport after their schooling. The Redcliffe Men's Hockey Club was formed and Redcliffe Council granted a further area in the show grounds for a second hockey field.

Mary's decades of coaching achievements include junior and senior men's and women's teams at club and school level, coaching the Queensland women's hockey team and becoming the first woman in Australia to coach an A grade men's hockey team.

Mary retired from coaching in 1963 and was named Ouota Woman of the Year in 1971

Snapper

fish of the MONTH







ound from Southern Australia up to around Central Queensland, this is a great time of year to target Snapper in the Great Southeast.

Growing to well over a metre long, most specimens I've seen caught in the bay are 25-50cm. Being fantastic to eat, they are a prized angling species and have a very fatty, sweet white flesh.

Most people target them with baits such as prawns, squid and fish flesh, although there is a growing number of people starting to sportfish for them with soft plastic lures.

Redcliffe and Scarborough are great local spots to chase them in a boat or kayak, or even off the shore or jetty at night as they come in quite close to feed.

Snapper have a minimum catch size of 35cm with a possession limit of 4, with no more than 1 over 70cm.

I'll never say no to a fresh feed of Snapper!





HOW DOES EARWAX BUILD-UP AFFECT YOU?

t is one of the most common ear problems. The presence of earwax can not only reduce your hearing, but also cause itchiness, a blocked ear sensation and can cause your hearing aids to work inefficiently. We perform a microsuction procedure to remove soft earwax. If your earwax is hard, eardrops are required for a week or two to soften the wax. This procedure is performed safely using a microscope to magnify the ear canal. No water is used in this procedure.
