aitangi Day may be a Māori commemorative event but it's something everyone can get involved in at an upcoming community family fun day in Redcliffe.

Waitangi Day is officially held on 6 February every year to commemorate the signing of New Zealand's founding document, the Treaty of Waitangi in 1840. This document was signed by representatives of the British Crown and Māori chiefs (rangatira) from the North Island of New Zealand. It has been an official public holiday in New Zealand since 1960.

Akoako Ki Piripane Inc and MBR Community will host Waitangi Day Redcliffe 2019 — a family fun day at the Redcliffe Showgrounds on Saturday, 9 February.

Wiremu and Harata Simeon set up the Akoako program for expat Māori in the Brisbane area. It focuses on language, customs and protocols, as well as sharing learnings and insights into their culture with the wider community.

Due to increasing demand and a growing Māori population, the program evolved into Akoako Ki Piripane Inc, a not-for-profit organisation. 'Akoako' means learning together, 'Ki Piripane' means based in Brisbane.

Wiremu said the Redcliffe Waitangi Day event was open to everyone in the Redcliffe community.

"Although it's showcasing Māori culture, the event is open to all ethnicities. (Anyone can) be part of the day, whether it be entertainers, stallholders, or (attendees), we welcome everyone," he said.

The day will start with the Pohiri – the traditional Māori welcome beginning at 7am. Entry is by donation. Families can enjoy bouncy castles, face painting and pony rides from 8am to 5pm.

This event will feature entertainment for the whole family such as Kapa Haka performing art, solo singers, dancers, bands and Kaumātua group performers.

Indulge yourself at the many food stalls, specialising in hangi, raw fish, kina, and fry bread to name but a few. Then, when your stomach is full, you can browse the stalls showcasing pounamu, taonga, bone carvings and Māori design clothing.

Bring along a picnic blanket or chair and enjoy this multicultural day at the Redcliffe Showgrounds. You can find event information on Waitangi Day, Redcliffe, via Facebook.



itting around the campfire, sharing stories and food with family and friends is a favourite pastime for most people.

If you love the taste of food cooked in a camp oven, you won't want to miss Kingbrown's cooking demonstrations at this year's Moreton Bay Expo.

One of Australia's most experienced camp oven cooks, Ron Wilson, aka 'Kingbrown', learned from the best outback cooks when he was young.

These days he travels the country as a camp oven caterer, cooking for hundreds and sharing his extensive knowledge at festivals and shows.

The camp oven is big part of cooking in Australia's history. There is just something magical about the little black pot," Kingbrown said.

"I feel very lucky, now, to be able to share my passion and knowledge of the craft, which I have learned and practised for most of my life."

At the Expo, he will be demonstrating how a camp oven can be used with heat beads and not just over a campfire.

"A lot of people own a camp oven, but they only get them out when they go camping and by then they are all rusty. I show people how to use it in their backyard all the time," he said.

"You can make the most amazing food in a camp oven — it beats every other way of cooking."

Kingbrown's most famous dishes, cooked in the humble black pot, include damper, bread rolls and lamb shanks and desserts such as apple pie and bread and butter pudding.

Over the years, Kingbrown has collected many vintage camp ovens, some more than 200-yearsold. The pride of his collection is a 24-inch oven one of the largest ever made in the world.

"They inspire me to challenge and express myself. They create precious memories with friends and loved ones."

He encourages Expo visitors to come and say hello and to bring along any camp oven cooking problems for him to help solve. He is also happy to pass on oven cleaning and maintenance tips.

Kingbrown will be holding demonstrations three times a day, throughout the expo.

Work Begins on New Art Gallery and Community Space

he Redcliffe community is a big winner in the Moreton Bay Regional Council's Art Gallery and Community Space development of their Administration Centre in Irene Street. The \$2 million project starts this month and is expected to be completed by early 2020.

The major overhaul will convert the ground floor into a modern gallery with more than 1000m2 of floor space for displays, as well as a new front counter, courtyard, studio space, storage, and curatorial space

Redcliffe's University of the Third Age (U3A) and the Redcliffe Seniors Computer Club have been granted leases to take up tenancies alongside the new art gallery once the project is complete.

Division 6 Councillor Koliana Winchester said it was a great result for the local community and for both clubs.

"From the redeveloped administration centre, both groups will be able to deliver classes, workshops and events for members of the public, particularly our senior community," Cr Winchester said.

Computer Club President Kerrie Noyes said the works couldn't start or finish soon enough.

"We've been looking for a new home for more than eight years to properly deliver digital literacy programs for seniors and this space is perfect for our members," she said.

U3A president Tony Nobbs said the work on the new space was very exciting.

"Bigger premises mean more classes can be offered to our 1300 members." he said.

"It has the added benefit of being at ground level, making access easier and it will provide an ideal venue for older people to learn and socialise here on the Peninsula."

Cr Winchester said Redcliffe's vibrant arts community would also benefit.

"For decades, Redcliffe's streetscapes, seaside vistas and coastal vibe have been a source of inspiration for artists and many artists now call the Peninsula home," she said.

"The new art gallery will have the capacity to host bigger and more complex touring exhibitions which will give locals a unique chance to see world-class showcases here in Redcliffe.

"Having the clubs, new gallery and the customer service centre in one building, close to the library and cultural centre, will bolster the area's reputation as a hub for community and culture."



RCC Gets Redeliffe Entertainment **Centre Rebrand**

hat's in a name? When it comes to the Redcliffe Cultural Centre, its new name paves the way for bigger and better entertainment.

Division 6 councillor, Koliana Winchester, says that as the rebranded Redcliffe Entertainment Centre, the new name reflects the recent improvements made to the centre and the broader range of attractions being hosted there.

"The refurbished centre is perfect for a wide range of events, from an Australian Army Band Gala spectacular to bringing the raw energy, fun and emotion of one of Australia's best-loved stories — The Sapphires (in March)," Cr Winchester said.

"There's no shortage of entertainment to captivate audiences of all ages."

The improvements to the centre include new carpets throughout the venue and a refurbished box office, as well as a revitalised foyer featuring the installation of digital TVs.

Cr Winchester says the centre had gone from strength to strength, selling more than 40,000 tickets in 2017/18, with "ticket sales and revenues nearly doubling in the past two vears alone".

Division 5 councillor, James Houghton, says he expects the Centre will more than double those figures again, in the next financial year.

"It's an ambitious target, but we are an ambitious and growing region," Cr Houghton said.

MoretonAlert is a free SMS, email and voice notification system to provide severe weather warnings, Queensland Fire and Emergency Services' bushfire warning messages, Council prescribed burn notifications, potential flash flooding incidents and planned dam releases within our region. Council has recently updated MoretonAlert messaging to provide location-specific flood warning alerts.

Up to three levels of flood warning alerts can be issued, with each alert featuring the following information: The current water level at the gauge; A "flood totem pole" which shows the related possible risk of road flooding and damage to low-lying property in the flood warning area; a map identifying nearby areas of higher ground; and a link to the Bureau of Meteorology website to access further information. hat happens when you cross croquet with elements of 20/20 cricket, but design it so anyone can play? The answer is 'gateball' and it's a whole lot of fun, with local clubs operating in Redcliffe and Deception Bay.

Gateball is a mallet-based sport that originated from Japan. Games only last 30 minutes, which has led to its being described as the 20/20 of croquet. It has also been compared to putt-putt golf or snooker on grass.

Redcliffe Gateball Club president, Geoff Morris, sais the club was established in 2014 and its members are among more than 10 million gateball players worldwide.

Members of the club began representing Australia at international gateball events as far back as 2010.

"Our team recently qualified first in Australia and competed in the World Gateball Championships in Brazil in September 2018," Mr Morris said.

"While there are ample opportunities to compete locally, nationally and overseas, it is also a great social sport for those seeking fitness and fun.

"It is suitable for all levels of fitness and abilities." We love the inclusive nature of gateball and want to make it accessible to as many people as we can."

The sport has been growing in popularity locally, leading to the establishment of the Deception Bay Gateball Club in January 2018.

Deception Bay Gateball president, Ros Crowe, agrees that gateball is a fantastic sport for all ages "from 6 to 96".



We play in mixed teams and sometimes there can be two generations of people from the same family playing together," Ms Crowe said

"It is easy to learn and is limited to 30-minute games. In Japan, they even have intergenerational competitions with up to three generations playing together."

The Deception Bay Gateball Club will host the Sunshine Coast Regional Croquet Clubs Tournament Gateball event in April.

he star of one of Australia's most iconic films, and a former member of the Bee Gees, Colin Petersen credits his mother for much of his success.

Colin's extraordinary life and career is celebrated in the 'Smiley Comes Home' exhibition at Redcliffe Museum, realised by curator Ron Kelly.

I give my heartfelt thanks to Ron for all his effort in organising this exhibition and I am humbled that I should warrant the recognition I have received," Colin 'Smiley' Petersen said.

The exhibition explains how Colin's mother encouraged him to take dance lessons as a child and after moving to Margate, he went to Humpybong State School where he joined the Humpybong School Marching Band as a



drummer. His uncle, Billy, bought him a new drum kit and arranged for him to have lessons in Brisbane with Harry Lebler, who taught him that "playing an instrument is a conversation, listen to what the other musicians are saying, music is exactly the same". This set him up for later life as a drummer with the Bee Gees.

In 1956, after seeing a notice in the Courier Mail, his mother took Colin, all smart and in his best clothes, to the Astor Cinema in Brunswick Street for an audition for 'Smiley'. He was rejected at first, but Colin went back later, barefoot and in old clothes and was given the role. His mother gave him the hat he wore in 'Smiley' and "was always there encouraging him to respect others and work hard at whatever he did".

At the opening of the 'Smiley Comes Home' exhibition at Redcliffe Museum, the Humpybong School Choir, performed 'A Little Boy Called Smiley'.

Colin said he felt very emotional and sensed his late mother Edna's presence by his side, saying to him "LISTEN, BOY! You have to put your emotions away and step up to the microphone now".

lato once said 'Music gives a soul to the universe, wings to the mind, flight to the imagination and life to everything'.

This quote speaks to what 'From East to West - Music for the Bamboo Cafe, Nepal'

will deliver at the upcoming musical event at Mueller College.

A special feature of the evening will be the Australian premiere performance of 'A Himalaya Concerto', a concerto for clarinet, written for and performed by renowned Queensland-based clarinetist, Idris Harries. The work was composed by English composer Stuart Brown in response to the disastrous earthquake that devastated parts of Nepal on 25 April, 2015.

Idris said that while the piece was in standard concerto format, there was nothing standard about it.

"It accompanies a video, so it works as a kind of soundtrack. The music is filmic, written for an orchestra, but performed using a computer instead of an orchestra." Idris said.

"Performing this beautiful music brings home how lucky we all are here... not to have to live

in fear of avalanche or earthquake. Despite this, the local (Nepali) people are joyful and full of hope. They just need a hand up to get onto the next stage of their country's development."

This event will help raise funds to build a chain of Bamboo Cafes in Nepal — to provide employment for marginalised girls and women, hospitality training, and great coffee and food for local Nepali people and tourists. The whole of the proceeds of this concert, after paying only the costs of its staging, will go directly to Transform the Nations' Bamboo Cafe project.

People can expect an interesting evening of music from around the world. Idris will be joined by Uzbeki-born Renat and Hila Yusupov — renowned performers (cellist and pianist respectively) who are based in Queensland.

"We have selected a wonderful variety of many beautiful pieces. We like to share the stories of the music, so we will be taking time to introduce the music so that audiences have an opportunity to get into the message and character of each piece," Idris said.

"Our kitchen is open and right in the middle of the restaurant so customers can hear us speaking in Italian and see the chef preparing their meals.

"We're very proud of what we do here because it's exactly how you would find it in Italy."



ack when the Moreton Island barge departed from the Scarborough Boat Harbour, my mates and I would push a wheelbarrow laden with camping gear onto the hulking vessel, then off onto a pristine beach a short time later.

Moreton Island has always been a blessing for bayside locals; it's the sort of place that people travel from afar to experience, and it's right on our doorstep.

The Quandamooka people of Moreton Bay, who are the islands traditional custodians call this special place Moorgumpin meaning 'place of Sandhills'.

Leanne Siebuhr knows Moreton well; she is Brisbane born and bred and has been a ranger with Queensland Parks and Wildlife Service for 23 years, 13 of those helping to look after Moreton Island.

"Visitors to the Island used to be mainly fishermen and families and it was pretty low-key. Now we see a lot more young people heading over with 4WD's to go camping, but it's still very family friendly." Leanne said. "You can pitch your tent in an established campground or along the many beachfront campsites. Some cater [to] groups of campers while other sites can really give you the remote camping experience."

From Kooringal in the south to Comboyuro Point, North Point and Yellow Patch at the north end of the island, there are literally dozens of options for camping on Moreton.





There are heaps of heritage sites on the island too; the lighthouse at Cape Moreton was built in the late 1800s by convict labour: it was one of the first sandstone lighthouses in Queensland and is still an active lighthouse." Leanne said.



Black SWans

wans have been part of the stories and beliefs of many cultures for centuries. In fact, before the Black Swan was discovered by Dutchman Willem de Vlamingh, whose party was exploring the Swan River in Perth in 1697, black swans were considered an impossibility, or at best a foreboding mythical creature. Apparently, his crew was well and truly spooked.

To the early European settlers, they were yet another example of the reversal of the natural order encountered in this strange antipodean world. However, as the newcomers began to find comfort within these odd surroundings, and developed an appreciation for their otherness, our native species quickly made their way more fondly into our hearts and souls.

Black Swans are known for their monogamous pairings, generally mating for life. Their courtship rituals involve exquisite movements with both birds bowing, dipping and arching their necks in synchronicity.

What is less well-known is that about onequarter of these bonds are with the same sex, mostly two males. In these instances, the pair usually steals a nest of eggs and proceeds to hatch and care for the young, as if they were their own. Cygnets raised in this way actually have a greater chance of reaching adulthood! The evolutionary basis for this is not entirely understood.

Black swans can live sedentary lives if there are suitable conditions in one locality, but more often they are nomadic, engaging in

erratic migration patterns as a response to rainfall. Seeking out fresh, brackish or salty bodies of water, they are found over most of Australia. Submerging their heads they harvest aquatic plants, pulling them out by the roots.

Undeniably graceful in form and movement (not taking into account their rather clumsy efforts at walking) they truly are a joy to behold. On the peninsula, they can most easily be spotted at the Nathan Road Wetlands Reserve, or occasionally as visitors to smaller bodies of water. They are most often seen grazing, generally "swanning about", or snoozing artfully on one leg with their head tucked into the feathers of their back. Take a moment next time you get the chance, to enjoy these graceful creatures living alongside us.

Crimsonspotted Rainbowfish, Melanotaenia duboulayi

ur little Aussie Rainbowfish, Blue Eyes, Empire Gudgeons and other fish are loved around the world and kept in aquariums, not only here in Australia but in many countries including Germany, the Netherlands, Austria and the USA. Being easy to keep and breed, most of them do very well in fish tanks and outdoor ponds where they are perfect for eating mosquito larvae and (most) are even tadpole-friendly.

Many people think they look guite dull in an aquarium shop, but they look much better in a planted tank, and after a little while being left to settle, they show their 'true colours'.

In fact, in my opinion, our local Rainbowfish species is one of the prettiest. The Crimsonspotted Rainbowfish or Pink Ear (Melanotaenia duboulayi) is also widely thought to be the reason "Rainbowfish" got their name. Empire Gudgeons (Hypseleotris compressa) can rival


many marine or reef fish for colour, and then there are the iridescent blue eyes in the Pacific Blue Eye (Pseudomuail signifer).

You might know of or heard about Tilapia and Gambusia (mosquito fish) and how destructive these feral fish are to our native fish, waterways and ecosystems. It's such a shame that most of the creeks and lagoons around Redcliffe are full of them, which makes it difficult to find any natives at all. It's hard enough for our little Aussies as it is with habitat destruction and pollution!

Please remember: protecting our waterways begins at home, don't let chemicals, poisons or fertilisers run into the gutter. Additionally, the release of any fish into our waterways is not only detrimental to the native fish population but is also illegal.






From NASA to Your Roof

t's hard to imagine how something from a space shuttle ending up on the roof of your home could be a good thing — most people immediately think of shiny items falling from a great height!

However, Matt and Rachael Newberry have recently stumbled across a space shuttle success story and they want to see it on everybody's rooftops.

Matt and Rachael set up and managed Mon Komo in Redcliffe for six years, before deciding to look for a new business venture. In their search, they heard of a paint product, developed by NASA, which was used to protect against the heat generated during a shuttle launch.

We found this product that, when added to paint, has an insulating capacity for roofs and walls. We wanted to be part of bringing it to Australia," Matt said.

"It's made up of ceramic microspheres, cork resin and a number of other elements.

"The paint's value is in its reflective abilities. Instead of the sun's heat hitting your house and penetrating it, the paint actually reflects the sun's rays. It can take around 40% of the heat load out of your average building."

The product is 'Insuladd', and Matt and Rachael's new business is called Powersave Coatings. The paint is already used internationally, by the US Department of Defense, the US Navy and Coast Guard and the South Korean Ministry of National Defence, as well as many commercial ventures including the poultry industry, who use it regulate the climate inside hatcheries.

"US-based tests have shown that the paint can save up to 20% on electricity use, but we don't sell it as an energy saving product. It's more about the comfort factor in people's lives. It doesn't cost much more than using regular paint, so we think it's a no-brainer to use it." Matt said.

"We're doing some trials at the moment with Moreton Bay Regional Council — we have provided some samples and we hope it will end up on all of their buildings."

Anything that can help take the heat out of a Queensland summer has got to be worth a try!
