Welcoming the Whales

hale season is here again with these beautiful creatures appearing along our coastline from May to November. For the first time, Redcliffe KiteFest will include a Welcome to the Whales, as part of its celebrations.

This will incorporate a Whale Wishes ceremony and plenty of other activities for all ages.

The ceremony will greet the whales and wish them safe passage, while sharing interesting facts and information with attendees about these giants of the ocean. As part of the ceremony, KiteFest attendees can place pebbles on a magnificent whale sand sculpture that will be built on the Saturday of the event.

Renee Gusa, destination and event marketing manager for KiteFest, said there would be plenty of whale-related activities to occupy the whole family.

"There will be interactive, educational and reef awareness tools to engage people of all ages, including virtual reefs (different sizes) for activities, coral skeletons to touch and art clay corals to look at, reef checking and beach scavenger hunt."

Renee said that several activities "will have an environmental focus, not just celebrating whales that come to the region every year", with a spotlight on plastic reduction.

Plastic straws will not be provided by KiteFest vendors and people will be encouraged to take their part in reducing their use of plastic, particularly single-use plastics.

Spokesperson for Brisbane Whale Watching, Dessray Colledge, said the peninsula area was the perfect location for whale spotting as it "is literally a safe haven for them".


This year, approximately 25,000 whales are expected throughout the season.

"We know that it is estimated that one in 70 Australians is on the Autism spectrum," he said.

We are addressing outdated technology in those stores that require updating so that we attain our goal of offering Quiet Hour at every eligible Coles by 2023."


Although the earworm drives some parents crazy, the interactive pantomime performance is sure to be one of the highlights of Redcliffe KiteFest for the young and young at heart.



"We have worked closely with Workplace Health and Safety Queensland to put in place the [required] safety measures and have been given the all clear to continue racing," Bernie said.



More than \$5 million has been approved for the redevelopment of Council's Redcliffe Administration Centre, into a new home for the Redcliffe Art Gallery and office space for community groups. This funding boost is a win for senior groups and the arts' community. By creating a central location, to house the new gallery, customer service centre,

Redcliffe's University of the Third Age (U3A) and the Redcliffe Seniors Computer Club, we will bolster the area's reputation as a hub for community and culture.

The overhaul will convert the ground floor into a modern gallery with over 1000m2 of floor space for exhibitions, as well as a brand new foyer, courtyard, maker and curatorial space and storage. This project is about building community capacity at its core. Alongside U3A's commitment to life-long learning and Redcliffe Seniors' Computer Club's dedication to digital literacy education, the new gallery will exhibit the region's creativity, and also host travelling exhibitions to inspire locals and visitors alike. Residents can still keep in contact with staff and their divisional councillor while works are underway. If you need to speak to council staff, then head to the Redcliffe Library, where the customer service team has been temporarily relocated. During the renovations, one-on-one meetings with local councillors will be held at the Redcliffe Library. Building renovation works commenced in May and will take approximately 36 weeks to complete, weather permitting.

NEW SERVICES ON REDCLIFFE PENINSULA LINE.

Thirty-two extra weekly train services started in May, adding 14,000 seats to south east Queensland's rail network.

This includes a new 7:10 am service from Kippa-Ring to Central Station, Monday to Friday.

The new services come after 46,000 weekly seats were added to the rail network last year with the upgrades of 193 three-carriage services to six-carriage services.

Queensland Rail is on track to deliver further timetable improvements later this year, following the largest driver recruitment and training campaign in QR history.

It was kind of a metaphor for us. We are all so different, yet we work together - we blend, we harmonise; we're sisters," Kristina said.

Whereas they are influenced by many diverse artists and styles - everything from Fleetwood Mac and AC/DC to Miranda Lambert and I'm With Her – they consider themselves a country band.





Local App To Connect Those In Need

An innovative new web mapping application, being launched this month in Redcliffe, will connect community members to the key services they most need.

The brainchild of Patrick Burke from Scarborough-based Yellow Dot Geospatial, the tool will be available, following its official launch during the Youth, Community and Homelessness Conference on 27-28 June, via the website 'Whereis.Red'.

Patrick said he developed the tool with the support of the Rotary Club of Kippa-Ring – North Lakes, to show what local services are available for the homeless and other community members in need.

"'Whereis.Red' [will show] services from multiple service providers and indicates where free meals for the homeless are available, as well as other services like free counselling and haircuts," Patrick said.

"It also shows accommodation for youth and help for women in a dangerous domestic situation. It even has the location of public toilets and indicates if showers are available, which is important to homeless people. It also indicates if the toilets are suitable for wheelchairs and shows the location of community centres."

Patrick said the website covered rural areas, as well as the cities throughout Queensland, and he was "hoping to expand it, to cover the other states as well".

Redcliffe to host Youth, Community and Homelessness Conference

nhancing support for young people and the homeless in the community will come under the spotlight at a conference being held in Redcliffe this month.

The first of its kind to be held in the Moreton Bay region, the Youth, Community and Homelessness Conference will be hosted by Redcliffe not-forprofit homelessness service, Chameleon Housing on 27-28 June.

Spokesperson for Chameleon Housing, Diana Franchina, said the two-day event was an opportunity for people who work in the areas of homelessness, domestic violence, disability, youth mental health and alcohol/drug misuse, to come together to enhance knowledge between service providers.

"Some of the sessions and workshops will challenge current approaches to practice, including case management and youth services support and will educate on various processes and strategies to enhance service provider practice," she said.

The conference comes at a time when Chameleon Housing, a specialist homelessness service on the Peninsula that supports young people aged 16-25 years, is receiving an increasing number of enquiries for housing, particularly from single young men aged 25 – 40 years.

"Last year, Chameleon House provided over 5,500 bed nights to young people who were homeless." she said.

"We have also noticed recently an increased number of enquiries for housing from single young men in the 25 to 40 age group due to adverse life events and lack of affordable housing. It is also to be noted that due to marriage and relationship breakdown, women over 55 years are now the fastest growing group of homeless people in Australia.

"Since 2007, the youth shelter, one of six properties we manage, has provided accommodation support to over 10,194 young people."

Keynote speakers for the conference include Father Chris Riley, Founder of Youth Off the Streets, and Karni Liddell, Queensland NDIS Ambassador and Paralympian. Father Riley has worked with disadvantaged youth for more than 40 years and Karni is an internationally acclaimed and sought after speaker, and recently delivered a TED Talk.







Redcliffe Bites

REDCLIFFE COMMUNITY GARDENS

The Uniting Church of Redcliffe has recently established a community garden initiative and although they are still in the early stages of development, they are open to the public. There are three garden plots currently running, with room for more to be created and tended. The gardens cater to gardeners of all ages, including a section of beds suitable for children to learn how to garden and grow their own food. They are located at 1 Richens Street, Redcliffe. The organisers recommend that the best time to catch up at the garden is mornings when there is usually someone around or you can enquire at the church office for more information.

THE DRAW OF THE REDCLIFFE PENINSULA

The Redcliffe Peninsula is a great place to live, but there are a few things any new resident might want to consider. A discussion on a community social media page did a good job of identifying some of the great things about Redcliffe, such as a variety of cafes and restaurants, a sense of community, closeness to Brisbane, beautiful beaches and parks, and spectacular sunrises and sunsets. The same discussion thread identified a few less appealing things to consider when thinking about making Redcliffe your permanent home, such as a

lack of late trading, some flood zoning issues concerning insurance for homeowners, the quality of the national broadband network (NBN) and mosquitoes. Overall, however the Peninsula is given a big thumbs up. One local commented, "Doesn't matter where you are – from Woody Point to Scarborough is all fantastic." Another local said, "If you are kind, thoughtful and helpful, you will fit right in. I think the sense of community outweighs any negative thing".

NEW FISHING RULES FOR MOLLUSCS AND JEWFISH

There are new fishing rules to be aware of in the Moreton Bay Region. A complete ban on fishing or collecting molluscs and the number of Black Jewfish a fisherman can have in his possession has dropped from two to one. This ban on molluscs is the final step in the Fisheries Department's ongoing efforts to limit the overfishing of gastropods and bivalve molluscs. This is because they don't travel from one area and are more susceptible to decreases in population. Overfishing of Black Jewfish has previously been a problem in Queensland and this, coupled with an increase in demand for Black Jewfish swim bladders, means Fisheries Queensland has seen a growing black market springing up in the past 12 to 18 months. Many locals made their opinions about the new rules known on social media, with one comment summing up the general feeling, "Fantastic! Real Ecosystem Management well done, Fisheries". LEARN TO FISH

Many Redcliffe locals love to fish, but what can you do if you don't know how to fish and would like to learn? A recent social media post asked just that question. Many in the local fishing community were quick to chime in with helpful suggestions and tips. The local council often runs beginner fishing classes as part of their healthy active program (www.moretonbay.qld.gov.au). There are also commercially run fishing schools for all ages. Those who want a more casual and personal approach could go to a fishing spot where there are other fishermen and strike up a conversation, which is a good starting point. Alternatively, you could approach your local fishing-related businesses for general information on good fishing spots and a few basic pointers.



nstances of suburban robberies, carjacking and assaults, many with violence. are being increasingly highlighted in the media. It is reported that children as young as ten years of age are being held in watch-houses for indefinite periods, not only because our existing youth detention centres are overcrowded, but because they are not safe in their own homes. However, we as a community, can individually and collectively play our part in helping to narrow that gap. For example, making ourselves aware of those in our community, who are in need of support. It can start by simply saying hello over the garden fence. Making our politicians and the media aware of community problems that are not always publicly visible, is important too. How often do we hear people say 'It's better to mind my own business?' In some instances it is, but not all the time! What about referring to homeless people as 'No-hopers or bums?' Do we know why they are homeless? If it's a neighbourhood problem, then it's everyones problem and we should help in solving it. Equally saddening is the news that some Neighbourhood Watch groups have closed or are about to close, because of diminished attendance. That group is all about keeping the community safe and together. We can solve many of these problems, if we stay together.

If you're looking for somewhere a little cooler than Brisbane this winter, take a drive to the wonderfully picturesque and often chilly area of The Granite Belt, with Stanthorpe at its heart.

Leeanne Puglisi-Gangemi was born and raised in Stanthorpe, and believes that the mountain climate is a big drawcard for visitors from the coast. However, even if you are a tee-totaller, there are good reasons to visit the area.

"Our national parks are so spectacular; Girraween particularly, because of the granite pyramids which visitors are always amazed by; they're gigantic, beautiful and unique. They're a very special part of the region, and then we have the added bonus of the great food and wine culture!" Leeanne told us.

Take your palate on a weekend of discovery, just a few hours drive away in the Granite Belt, your taste buds will thank you!




