'Between the Tides' at Scarborough

he aim of Between the Tides is to raise awareness of the artistic potential and adaptability of recycled materials. This free community art event will be held on the Redcliffe Peninsula in July.

The event was created with inclusivity in mind. Carte Blanche, a group of contemporary artists based in the Redcliffe region, work with the local community to produce Between the Tides each year. They seek out contributions from community groups, individuals and school students, aided by Carte Blanche's work as Artists in Residence at Redcliffe High School.

Carte Blanche member, Trudy Stephens, said the event welcomed all members of the community.

"Producing Between the Tides, each year, is a wonderful way to bring ephemeral art to the community, extending and developing exciting artworks from recycled materials," Trudy said.

Between the Tides was inspired by a similar art event in Auckland. It leaves the gallery behind and focuses on bringing artwork into a very different environment – right onto the Scarborough foreshore. Artworks will include



large-scale interactive installations that will be placed along the tidal sand bar to be appreciated by all members of the local community, as well as visitors to the area.

Event attendees are encouraged to meet local artists to view the creative ingenuity of the artworks and to enjoy the relaxed atmosphere along the foreshore.

"We hope that everyone will benefit by enjoying a picturesque environment and being part of a different type of art experience," Trudy said.

After five years at Deception Bay, Between the Tides has moved to the Redcliffe Peninsula this year. This will allow better access for Redcliffe locals and for the community to attend.

Trudy said one of the highlights of Between the Tides was watching the surprised responses from people as they viewed or interacted with the artworks.

"We encourage any community members to come along and to make some art for the event," Trudy said.

LOCAL AUTHOR LIFTS THE LID ON ROCK 'N' ROLL LEGENDS

eith Williams may be a longtime resident of Redcliffe, but he draws on his Welsh upbringing to share his stories about rock 'n' roll legends.

Keith grew up in Wales during the 60s - a time when the Beatles topped the charts and Led Zeppelin was emerging as part of a whole new era of music. As a huge fan of live rock



music, Keith created opportunities to meet the musicians, many of whom are now true rock legends. With so many fascinating stories to tell, Keith said he was encouraged to write a book.

I would talk about rare gigs I've been to and encounters with famous rock stars and colourful characters along the way. People would say 'you must write a book and I will buy it' – thus, Rock Reflections was born," Keith said.

The book has been described as a musical odyssey through the 60s, 70s and 80s that chronicles Keith's adventures, from the moshpits and travelling all over the UK for rock gigs, to sleeping on station platforms and sneaking backstage to meet his heroes.

Way before they were famous, Keith was going to gigs by bands such as Guns N' Roses. He encountered rock stars such as Randy Rhoads and Phil Lynott (Thin Lizzy), Lars Ulrich (Metallica) and Ritchie Blackmore (Deep Purple/Rainbow).

He said one of his favourite memories was of Bon Jovi in London in 1985.

"Bon Jovi is on their first headline tour of Europe and Jon is prancing about, trying too hard. After a few songs the PA keeps cutting out, frustrating everybody.

"Jon then shouts 'Don't worry about it – we'll do it on our own.' He plays acoustic guitar and sings, interacting brilliantly with the audience, providing time for techs to fix the sound problem.

"It was a blessing in disguise for Jon Bon Jovi – that was the moment the rock press deemed him a world-class performer and not just a pretty boy."

Keith will be at the Redcliffe Markets on 7 and 28 July, where you can buy his book and get it signed. Rock Reflections is also available to buy via Facebook – search for 'rockreflectionsbook'.

Chopper Dave Soars to New Heights on Local Radio

ave you ever wondered who is giving ave you ever wondered who the man behind the traffic reports you hear on 99.7 Bridge FM, while you're driving to and from work? Well, it's Dave Andrews, better known as 'Chopper Dave', flying high above in a helicopter.

'Chopper Dave' is more than just a familiar voice. You may also recognise his face, as he regularly gives the traffic reports on TV as well, including Channel 7's 'Sunrise' and Channel 10's 'News First'.

Brought up on the Sunshine Coast and now a Redcliffe resident, Dave always wanted to be involved in radio.

"When I was 15-years-old, my mother contacted 4SS on the Sunshine Coast (now Mix FM) and I was given a job which included making tea and general office duties, but my foot was in the door," Dave said.

Then, aged 19, Dave moved on to 2LM (Lismore) as a radio announcer, with later gigs at various

radio stations in Brisbane and the Gold Coast including 4GGG (now Gold FM) Stereo 10, Sea FM, Triple M and River FM. He was also music director during his time at Hot 100 Darwin.

Dave enjoys his work in traffic reporting because "everyday is different".

"You can observe whales, dugongs or sharks, one day – the next there's a house fire or [incidents] on the road," Dave said.

Now a volunteer at 99.7 Bridge FM, Dave is responsible for music and content, a role that he's very comfortable in. He explains what goes into delivering on 99.7 Bridge FM's commitment to 'Great Rock Variety'.

Constructing a music log is like making a cake – you need lots of ingredients. You have to make a clock, positioning songs from the 60s, late 80s, early 70s, then 90s."

Station manager, Ray Kerr, said 99.7 Bridge FM was very pleased to have Chopper Dave as part of the team.

"He brings [so] much media experience to the group and we as volunteers are excited about the journey going forward," Ray said.

So next time you listen to music or a traffic report on 99.7 Bridge FM, you can put a face to 'Chopper Dave'.

Water Quality To Get A Boost

oreton Bay Regional Council has awarded a \$609,000 tender to Evolve Environmental Solutions Pty Ltd to plant more than 140,000 plants and trees around a new wetland at Nathan Road, to improve water quality.

Councillor for Division 5, James Houghton, said the works would be carried out adjacent to the Nathan Road AFL sporting precinct in Rothwell.

"We've built this new wetland to manage stormwater run-off from surrounding residential properties and the sporting precinct, which is under construction, and now we are adding the final touches by planting many different species of grasses, sedges and trees," he said.

"It's vital we continue to build quality infrastructure like sporting fields for our community, but it's equally important that we invest in protecting and enhancing our natural environment as well.

"It's about balancing our growth and working to protect what we love about where we live."

Cr Houghton said it was important for everyone to do their part in protecting local catchments and waterways.

"Often, it's the little steps we take — like washing the car on the lawn or being conscious of how much plastic we use and where it goes — which make the biggest difference in the end."

Waterways Spokesperson, Councillor Adam Hain, said a three hectare wetland was constructed last August to manage water quality and stormwater runoff in the area.

"The wetland was initially turfed to enable ongoing reed management and ensure the reeds were eradicated prior to planting," he said.



COLOUR YOUR LIFE HAPPY. — THE PSYCHOLOGY OF COLOUR

ave you ever noticed how colour can dramatically affect your moods and feelings? Have you experienced feeling calmer when surrounded by blue? Does green make you think of looking after the environment? Do you feel like snacking when you see red? Wouldn't it be great to be able to enhance your well-being and happiness by understanding and applying some colour psychology? Advertising agencies use the psychology of colour, all the time, to influence your feelings. Think of the fast food restaurant logos that feature red to stimulate hunger and the financial institutions and many insurance companies that use blue to appear trustworthy.

Your reactions and responses are subconsciously directed by colour, so what if you chose colours for their beneficial effects?

Redcliffe colour psychologist, speaker and author, Debourah Borg, loves to help people lead a happier, healthier life with some simple steps around colour.

"It's a scientific fact that colours can affect you physically, as well as emotionally and mentally," Debourah said.

"I'm known as 'The Colour Lady' as I encourage people to wear orange underpants to destress and use a green wallet for wealth and abundance."

Debourah founded a colour consultancy business in the early 90s and wrote a book about how colour can be the secret weapon in your life. Further research led to Debourah's adding of essential oils to look after the mind, body and spirit better, and she has developed a set of cards showing how to use colour and oils together.

An example Debourah gives is of using lemon oil (for focus) and the colour yellow to help you study.

"Colour is a vibration frequency and the oils are also vibrational frequency," Debourah said.

"I use my colour cards as a guide to listen to my body... wearing the colour, saying the affirmation and now putting on the essential oil that is a vibrational match puts me back in the driver seat of my life," Debourah said.

The times they are a changin'- so go the catchy lyrics of the 1960s Bob Dylan ballad. Whilst times have changed in Redcliffe, so too have the driving habits of some of our drivers. Respect for the road rules, consideration for other road users and even themselves, seem not to feature on these crazy drivers' radars.

Over the last three decades, the population of Redcliffe has increased substantially. Many peninsula families now boast two and three cars per household and with these increases, our roads have become considerably busier. During morning and afternoon peak hours, traffic from as far away as Caboolture, use the handy Anzac Avenue bypass to Brisbane and back, which creates gridlock on our roads.

Add to this mix, the traffic terrorists! This growing number of drivers who seem to believe that our roads are there to be used as their own personal speed tracks. The telltale signs of these hellions on wheels are their dangerously weaving through traffic without indicating, speeding, drink and drug driving, tailgating, road raging and ignoring traffic signals. "All motorcycles, cars, buses and trucks will travel no faster than 15mph [24 kph]. All horse-drawn vehicles, mounted horsemen and push-bikes no faster than 8mph [13 kph]. And when turning into a corner the maximum speed will be 4 mph [6 kph]."

So what's the answer? It's not just speed. It's also selfishness. If you are a traffic terrorist, reading this, please spare a thought. Try and think of other road users first when you're behind the wheel so it won't possibly be your or their last thought.



Budget Boost for Peninsula Infrastructure and Environment

The Peninsula community is set to receive a multi-million dollar boost for infrastructure and the environment as part of Moreton Bay Regional Council's 2019/20 budget.

The recent budget announcement includes significant allocations for roads, wetlands, playgrounds, community groups and major developments, such as the Redcliffe Administration Centre Art Gallery and Community Space and Nathan Road Sporting Precinct in Rothwell.

Community Facilities

Division 6 Councillor, Koliana Winchester, said several community groups and their facilities would benefit from funding.

The Redcliffe SES Depot will receive \$150,000 for new air-conditioning, bathroom fixtures and fittings, and additional functional space for activities such as operational response and training.

"Our SES crews do a fantastic job assisting the community as first responders during times of disaster, and this funding will help the local SES group coordinate more activities and exercises in better facilities," Cr Winchester said.

More than \$17,000 has also been allocated for the purchase, installation, and storage of beach access matting and wheelchairs in partnership with the Redcliffe Surf Lifesaving Club as part of Council's Disability Access and Inclusion Plan.

Infrastructure Improvements

Around \$900,000 has been allocated for road re-surfacing across the peninsula with more than \$2 million dedicated to local road upgrades.

Councillor for Division 5, James Houghton, said more than \$200,000 had been allocated to revitalise the shopping precinct along Landsborough Avenue between Bunton Street and Rock Street.

Environmental Enhancements

High again on council's priority list is protecting Scarborough's Red Cliffs from erosion, with \$1.5 million allocated in the Budget 2019/20.

"Now that we have all of the relevant approvals from the State Government, I hope that we can go out to market soon for the stabilisation of Scarborough's iconic Red Cliffs," Cr Houghton said.

Council has also set aside \$800,000 to construct a wetland within the Bells Creek Catchment to improve the creek's water quality.

Other Budget Highlights

\$2.82 million for drainage upgrades in the Cox Street catchment including at Duffield Road, Cox Street, Oxley Avenue, Mabel Street and Margate Parade.

\$775,000 for stage 2 of the car park construction at Talobilla Park.

\$200,000 to upgrade six bus stops, including on Deception Bay Road, Klinger Road, Oxley Avenue and Scarborough Road.

\$182,000 for pedestrian safety upgrades to Sutton Street.

\$92,000 for upgrades to the Victoria Avenue, Redbank Road and Crawford Street intersection to address blackspot issues.



Since Council's planning scheme commenced on 1 February 2016, Council has been working on amendments to ensure it remains a living document that supports growth and maintains the region's unique characteristics. Council previously consulted with the community on proposed

amendments and is now seeking community feedback on these new proposed amendments and planning scheme policies. The proposed changes generally aim to improve functionality and address issues which have been identified since the scheme first came into effect.

Some key matters include, but are not limited to: improvements, to cater for carports in residential areas and sheds in rural residential areas; changes to encourage sufficient use of land within walking distance of commercial centres and train stations and to further clarify the design and location of service stations; and enhancements to fourteen planning scheme policies, to improve their usability and ensure they are up-to-date and fit for purpose.

Some amendments do not include the proposed changes previously advertised in 2017. These matters continue to be considered by Council. I'm pleased to report that the Palaszczuk government's budget this year will support new infrastructure for our schools, hospital and TAFE.

We're investing \$2.5 million in infrastructure

projects across state schools on the Peninsula. \$750,000 is being allocated to Woody Point Special School to undertake the refurbishment of Block H and E, while Redcliffe Special School will receive \$250,000 for the installation of an outdoor learning area.

Humpybong State School and Clontarf Beach State School will each benefit from the refurbishment of a school block while \$240,000 will be allocated for minor works projects at all state schools across the Redcliffe Peninsula.

The Redcliffe Hospital is a major focus of the budget with \$16 million to purchase and install an MRI machine at Redcliffe. \$41.1 million is allocated to ongoing projects, including the new multi-storey Redcliffe Hospital carpark, refurbished day procedure unit and redesigned special care nursery, birth suite and paediatrics unit.

Redcliffe TAFE is gaining over \$1 million in training infrastructure investment, including the creation of a nursing ward at the campus.

Hannah Mason said the course looked in immaculate condition, and she had never seen any course around Brisbane looking greener.

"These course conditions along with some challenging holes being set could make for some entertaining golf being played," Hannah said.

Gayundah Push To Preserve Maritime Hero Continues

Despite yet another setback, the Gayundah Preservation Society has vowed to continue its mission to keep the memory of Queensland's iconic 19th century warship HMQS Gayundah alive.

fter four years of trying, without luck, to persuade the Queensland Government to preserve the remains of the rusting Gayundah, located at the cliffs at Woody Point, the Society decided to embark on a new strategy.

This new plan involved a week-long 'Gayundah Festival' that would have opened in Redcliffe, April 2021. The centrepiece of the festival was planned to be a metal replica of the HMQS Gayundah ship, built to a third of the size of the actual vessel. The society proposed to locate it in the Humpybong Creek near the Redcliffe Museum.

"The replica would become a beacon representing a celebration of Queensland's and Australia's rich maritime history as well as a major tourist attraction, to assist an already struggling local economy," Gayundah Preservation Society president, Richard Lancaster, said. On 14 May the society made a presentation to the Moreton Bay Regional Council about the festival and sought permission from council for the new replica to be housed at the proposed Humpybong Creek location.

However, following their presentation, the Society received a letter from the council's CEO informing the group that Council would not support the replica project, because of 'environmental and other issues' related to the proposed site.

Mr Lancaster said the Society was disappointed with the council's response after they had received such a positive reaction on the day of their presentation. He added that the Society could also comfortably address all of the concerns the council had raised about the proposed location.

"The Gayundah warship is extremely important to Queensland's history ... you and I probably wouldn't be here if the Gayundah and the Paluma warships had not been commissioned," he said.

"Most Queenslanders don't know the history of this ship and it's sad. We should know all this history. That is why our members are so passionate about keeping the story of the Gayundah alive."

Mr Lancaster said the society had not given up and was now talking to private entities about funding for the replica and the festival.

Gayundah and her sister ship, Paluma, were the first vessels to be commissioned by the Queensland government for the Colony's defence force. The ships were acquired to deal with a perceived threat of invasion from the Russian Pacific fleet. Arriving in Brisbane, 28 March 1885, the Gayundah was built with a flat-iron design and mounted a 'formidable armament for its size'.

HISTORY

ORIGINS OF THE NAME **HUMPYBONG**

Humpybong is thought to be derived from the local indigenous Ningy Ningy people's word, ngumpin. It was anglicised to oompie-bong.

he word is said to mean empty houses or dead houses and refers to the remains of the convict settlement at Redcliffe Point.

On 14 September 1824, the brig, 'Amity', brought a party of officials, soldiers, their wives and children, and 29 convicts to the area. They landed on the beach near the mouth of Humpybong Creek to form a convict settlement. The original settlement at Redcliffe was established between Humpybong Creek, Anzac Avenue and the beachfront.

The settlement progressed and temporary huts were initially built for the group. Later,

other buildings were constructed, including a store, kitchen, a well, a brick kiln, prisoners and soldiers' barracks, a gaol, a guardroom and a commandant's house. The stores and main landing place were located near Redcliffe Jetty.

What is now called Humpybong Creek was by far the largest water course on the Redcliffe Peninsula, and was the main supply of fresh water for the convict settlement at Redcliffe. It was even navigable by small boats.

However, because of the excess of mosquitoes and the challenges of maintaining a safe anchorage, the settlement only existed for about eight months. In 1825, the settlement was moved to the banks of the Brisbane River.

A few buildings were left standing at Redcliffe and the derelict remains gave rise to the name 'oompie bong'.

German missionaries visiting the area, in the early 1840s, came to refer to the Redcliffe Peninsula by the variation, Umpibong. The name stuck and the Redcliffe Peninsula was later called Humpybong. In the early pioneer days, Humpybong referred to the whole of the peninsula and for many years, up until the time of the second World War, the names Redcliffe and Humpybong were in common use.

The name Humpybong still lives on today. There is a creek, a school, a café, an esplanade, a car park, and a yacht club, and there was even a pop band named after it.
