For two decades, Redcliffe High music programs have celebrated this and on Saturday 17 August, the school will host a special Alumni Bands 20th Anniversary wine and cheese night to showcase the school's musical alumni and to raise money for various school departments and projects.

Emma Nicolopoulos, Redcliffe State High School's multi instrumental teacher, is organising the evening's entertainment.

"We've been holding the event every year, since 1999, to showcase the talents of the students, so with the 20th anniversary this year, I decided to put a couple of alumni bands together," Emma said.

"We have around 25 past students involved. Some graduated as far back as 2002, several have families and children now and some are travelling quite a way to be involved; as far

away as Doomadgee in North Queensland and Newcastle in NSW."

The alumni musicians will be performing in a concert band and a stage band on the night.

"The concert band will be doing several pieces, including some nostalgic works that they performed at school, as well as a couple of quite challenging classical works," Emma said. "The stage band will be playing a range of material, from 60s and 70s funk and soul, including Stevie Wonder and Aretha Franklin, through to some more modern artists like Bruno Mars. There will definitely be a party vibe!"

All of the musicians have been rehearsing for the event since February, including Chrislyn Hamilton, a former Redcliffe High student who was a contestant on both Australian Idol and The Voice

Money raised from the event will go towards supporting several school causes, including The Respect Project, the music department and the hospitality department, which will be providing food and beverages for the night.

he Soweto Gospel Choir is bringing their acclaimed Freedom tour to Australia this year, with a concert at Redcliffe in August.

The group is renowned around the world and has shared the stage with big names in music, including U2, Ben Harper, Red Hot Chilli Peppers, Beyoncè and Celine Dion. They have also picked up multiple Grammy Awards, including their latest win (Best World Music) for their album 'Freedom'.

Soweto Gospel Choir general manager and bass singer, Mulalo Mulovhedzi, said the group was looking forward to the Australian leg of the tour.

"We adore Australia as it is special to the choir. It is the first country we ever toured in 2003 and has special memories. Australia broke us internationally," Mulalo said.

Taking their culture to all corners of the globe is important to the group, and the Australian tour

will cover 48 venues across cities and regional areas of Australia. One of the tour stops is Redcliffe Entertainment Centre where Mulalo and the group are looking forward to spending some time near the water.

"We love the beaches. Soweto is a very long way from the sea, so it's a treat to be able to go to the beach," Mulalo said.

Concert-goers are in for a treat as well, with the first half of the 90-minute show dedicated to performing 'Songs of Fire', celebrating the centenary of the birth of Nelson Mandela. For the second half of the concert, the performers will share international gospel classics, which might inspire the crowd to get up on their feet.

Mulalo believes the Soweto Gospel Choir's music has an international appeal that touches the hearts of everyone, no matter their beliefs. The show will include vibrant costumes and uplifting songs performed in six of South Africa's 11 official languages.

"Even though some songs are not in English, the audience feel and understand what we are conveying. It's a magical connection for us with the audience," Mulalo said.



INTERVIEW WITH THE SUPERJESUS & YOU AM I

ustralian rock and roll royalty will join with our finest local bands for Rockin' 4 the Homeless this month.

The Superjesus' frontwoman, Sarah McLeod, and You Am I's bassist, Andy Kent, sat down to answer some questions about their bands and the upcoming event.

How did you come up with your band name?

Sarah: We were called Hell's Kitchen first, then on the eve of our first big gig at the Big Day Out, we changed it to The Superjesus. We basically chucked two buzz words together to make a band name.

Andy: No idea. It sounds like a Japanese horror film to me – should have been changed years ago!

What are your favourite types of gigs to play?

Sarah: I like the intimate ones the best, they suit my style more. I'm a chatter, I like to converse with the crowd and stuff around a bit.

Andy: I love huge gigs – 20 000+ and also tiny clubs where you can feel the breath of the crowd on your leg.



How did you get involved in Rockin' 4 the Homeless?

Sarah: One of the organisers was working with the Hoodoo Gurus on the Under The Southern Stars Tour that we were playing on. He asked us if we would be interested and it's such a good cause we jumped at it.

Andy: Dan [Nebe] asked and we just said 'Where do we need to be and when, Dan?'

What does the cause mean to you?

Sarah: I can't even imagine being homeless, especially in this weather. But not having a place to lay your bags, that endless feeling of loneliness and feeling lost, it breaks my heart.

Andy: Homelessness should not be happening in such a civilised country as our own, for whatever reason – financial, domestic violence, mental illness. People deserve society in general to be there for them. For one hour onstage we will be with them.

What are you looking forward to at R4TH?

Sarah: Hanging out with You Am I because I adore them.

Andy: Raising money.

Eco-path Provides A New Outlook

he opening of a new eco-path at Hays Inlet will help enhance access and educational opportunities for community members and visitors to the area.

Vice president of Redcliffe Environmental Forum (REF), Geoffrey Redman, said the peninsula community was invited to the official opening of the first stage of an ecopath on Sunday 4 August.

"Visitors will be able to access the area from Silcock Street and use the pathway to observe one of the last remaining areas of Melaleuca forest on the Redcliffe Peninsula." Geoffrey said.

The project aims to create a 650m path and a boardwalk leading to a viewing platform overlooking the Hays Inlet – with the overall goal of safeguarding local flora and fauna habitats.

The first stage of the eco-path is a 250m stretch, leading from a council-constructed concrete path along Silcock Street.

The project is being carried out by the Redcliffe Environmental Forum and volunteers, in conjunction with the Federal Government and Moreton Bay Regional

The eco-path opening event will feature guided walks, information stalls, refreshments and a free sausage sizzle.



Attendees will enjoy a cooked breakfast provided by Redcliffe High School students, while listening to guest speaker, former professional rugby league footballer and Channel 7 reporter, Shane Webcke.

Chamber of Commerce president, Brad Flynn, said the breakfast was an opportunity for students to gain some realworld experience in hospitality and also to boost the profile of the 'Respect Project' – a program aimed at creating respect within the community.

"The principal and deputy principal started the respect project as a way to approach scenarios involving irate parents attending the front desk of the school." Brad said. The program has since grown, involving a number of primary and secondary schools and Sesame Lane Childcare and Kindergarten centres across the Redcliffe Peninsula region and surrounds.

Mr Flynn said the program had seen a reduction in displays of aggression, and had built stronger relationships not just within schools, but within the business community and society in general.

"It's about making connections," he said.

This topic will be expanded on by Shane Webcke, who will speak to the importance of respect in high-level sport and personal performance - the importance of being a good sport.

That's why we wanted to get a high-profile sportsperson involved, it's just another layer in building a culture and community of respect," Mr Flynn said.

Mr Flynn said he aimed to boost engagement with sports clubs with the support of The Redcliffe Chamber of Commerce. The chamber supports the event as part of an ongoing networking initiative, held at quarteryearly intervals.

"This topic remains taboo, despite being a natural part of life," Maretti said.



CCTV to Boost **Pathway Safety** & Accessibility

new project to install closed-circuit television cameras along a pathway linking Kippa-Ring to Petrie railway stations aims to boost safety and accessibility for users.

Moreton Bay Regional Council secured \$1 million from the Australian Government's Safer Communities Fund to install CCTV and lighting along the 12.6km pathway which is popular with cyclists, joggers, skaters, commuters and families.

The shared path provides access to seven train stations and features an array of colourfully painted murals, showcasing Australian native wildlife, special Anzac tributes and historical commemorations.

Tenders closed recently for the installation of 44 closed-circuit television cameras along the pathway, with the cameras expected to be operational by early 2020.

Council spokesperson for asset maintenance and construction, Adam Hain, said the project would help address crime and anti-social behaviour." Mr Hain said.

"This is a big win for residents using the Redcliffe Peninsula and south-bound railway lines, as well as the students at the new University of the Sunshine Coast Moreton Bay campus," Cr Hain said.

Council spokesperson for smart innovation, Darren Grimwade, said the cameras would be linked via a chain of fibre-optic and radio-link connections, feeding back into council's CCTV network.

"We're laying the foundations of smart, multifunction poles which have the potential to feature smart lighting that can dim and brighten as required, wildlife-sensitive lighting as well as emergency call points," Mr Grimwade said.

"These are all potential future projects and we want to make sure that if they do go ahead, we already have the fibre-optic network infrastructure to support them."

SOCIAL MEDIA FOR TEENS

What age is the right age for your teen to have a social media account? This has been a hot topic of local discussion lately. The legal age to register for an account on platforms like Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, SnapChat, Twitter and WhatsApp is 13 years old in Australia. A recent social media conversation offered comments that suggested parental focus is best spent on being diligent in monitoring their teens' social media activity at whatever age they get a social media account. One commenter suggested, "You should also be aware the world is different to when you were a child. If you don't let your child communicate and interact the way all of their friends do, then you may well be causing more harm than good. Encourage them to be a part of their social groups but also let them know and show them that they can talk to you about anything."

NEW WASTE LEVY

If you are not already aware, the Queensland waste levy legislation came into effect on 1 July 2019. Due to this, new procedures have been implemented at the local dump located on

Duffield Road. These new rules now require you use the weighbridge on entry and exit, for each section you have to discard. This has increased the time needed for many people to complete their use of dump and has increased the amount of traffic going in and out because of delays. Personal waste loads of up to 500kg per load are still free to dump, but costs may be incurred for commercial loads. Whereas more staff has been allocated to the waste management facilities to help smooth the transition, please keep in mind there may be delays and heavier traffic in the area than usual. KEEPING FIT ON THE PENINSULA



Tennis Aces on Show

alling all tennis fans. Tennis players from as far as Melbourne and North Queensland are expected to descend on Redcliffe, joining hopeful local players in the 2019 Redcliffe Tennis Open.

Hosted by Focus Tennis Academy and Redcliffe Tennis Association, the tournament will be played at Redcliffe Tennis Centre over the last two weekends in August, and will be free for spectators.

Focus Tennis Academy's head coach and manager of the Redcliffe Tennis Centre, Chris Novic, said the Redcliffe Open was an AMT Bronze Level Tournament.

We have the mens and womens' singles and doubles, and generally get more than 150 players come and play in this tournament," Chris said.

Since the first Redcliffe Tennis Open was played in 1953, there have been some big name winners, such as Roy Emerson and Mal Anderson. But none is larger than Rod Laver, who hoisted the trophy in 1957 and 58.

The new Redcliffe Tennis Centre was built in October 2010 with 12 courts – six hard surface and six made of synthetic grass. Singles' winners since then have included Lizette Cabrera, who has been an Australian Federation Cup training squad member. The 2018 Women and Mens' singles' winners, Andie Dikosavljevic and Mitchell Robbins respectively, have each won multiple times. Andie also teamed up to win the 2018 mixed doubles.

David Herbener, a Tennis Australia official and spokesperson for the Redcliffe Tennis Association, said this event was a great opportunity for the Redcliffe Tennis Centre to show off the modern facilities they had available.

"With undercover space provided, spectators will be able to view in comfort the high-quality tennis being played over the four days," David said.

The Herbener name is well-known, having been associated with Redcliffe tennis since the 1960s. To honour their commitment to tennis, the Womens and Mens' singles' trophies are called the Herbener Cup.

You will soon be able to send the kids down to the beach, with a brand new Hornibrook Esplanade playground and picnic facilities opening along the beautiful Clontarf foreshore. Kids won't be able to resist the type of play equipment this overhaul will bring to our foreshore. The project will include picnic

setting, a double barbecue, play equipment, shade sail structure, a feature seating wall, pre-cast concrete 'twig' bench seat, a public outdoor ping-pong table, 240L bin enclosures and a drinking fountain.

An additional key feature of this stage of the project is that the toddlers' play equipment is located immediately adjacent the picnic shelter so that parents do not have to move too far from their picnic table while keeping an eye on the little ones. Pathway upgrades will also be incorporated to complement the existing parkour park, which already boasts 12 different challenges, including angled walls, vault bars and boulders.

I'm hoping the weather holds out so that we can have this playground open in time for the September school holidays. It is always fantastic to see kids getting active outdoors, away from screens, and enjoying the amenities along our incredible foreshore. Redcliffe's playgrounds are already massively popular with local families on weekends and even more so over the holiday period, so this is a very worthwhile investment that will bring even more people and vibrancy to Redcliffe's waterfront.

Road safety is a top priority and it is great news that \$3.7 million is being invested into road safety upgrades at identified crash hotspots across the Redcliffe Peninsula, to boost road safety.

The funding includes \$1.17 million to fully control right-turn movements at the Oxley Avenue and MacDonnell Road intersection, by upgrading existing traffic signals and extending right-turn lanes.

Further along Oxley Avenue, \$1.55 million is being invested in new traffic signals at the Sydney Street intersection, creating safer pedestrian crossings and controlled turning movements. Drivers exiting Sydney Street into Oxley Avenue often have difficulty turning across lanes to head north.

Further upgrades will also be made at the intersection of Oxley Avenue at the Portwood Road and Manley Street intersection. Similar upgrades will be undertaken to reduce crashes between cars turning right from Silvyn Street, with eastbound vehicles on Anzac Avenue.

Redcliffe continues to grow and we've seen increased residential and commercial density at some of these locations. It's important we monitor road safety and make changes to reduce risk.

Extra Queensland Rail Services







ecently, while sitting in the winter sun and enjoying a cup of coffee, a mate Steve and I engaged in discussing books and authors we had enjoyed in the past. But, they hadn't and I set about contemplating my sad fate, courtesy of Miss Jane Austen. She didn't disappoint either. True to her cruel, unforgiving Victorian nature, she gave me a C!

So when Steve expressed his rhapsodic enthusiasm for 'Pride and Prejudice', I grimaced guietly, remembering my private agony with Jane!

The Frilled Neck Lizard (Chlamydosaurus kingii) will be the subject of a free workshop presented by Moreton Bay Regional Council this month.

Councillor for Division 5, James Houghton, said the workshop would be an interactive and informative presentation by a local expert "with plenty of time for questions and discussions about the species, their habits and how to conserve them".

"Keeping native vegetation within our properties that supports the ecosystems that frilled neck lizards live in can help to protect their natural environment, " Cr Houghton said.

"We can also join with community programs that are aimed at protecting and improving natural areas such as the Land for Wildlife program and the Community Bush Care Program."

The workshop will look at various threats to the frilled neck lizard, including loss of habitat, pesticides and domestic animals, and it will be followed by a guided walk through the type of dry sclerophyll forest that the lizards dwell in.



t's a great old town! Gympie grew on the back of a gold rush that started in the 1860s. At that time, it saved the struggling Queensland economy through the waves of fortune that were unearthed by the madkeen miners who inundated the area.



These days, Gympie is still thriving, and Andrew Saunders loves seeing it grow. Andrew is the tourism development manager for the Gympie Regional Council, so he knows why people love to visit the region. "Lots of people come to Gympie to visit Rainbow Beach, which is the gateway to Fraser Island," Andrew said. "But, we're also seeing great interest, particularly at this time of the year, in people coming to check out the Mary Valley."

"In the cooler months people start to think more about the hinterland; they think about fireplaces, rich food and cosy environments, and these are things that many of our boutique and bed-and-breakfast style tourism operators have to offer in the valley," Andrew said. "You can even take a ride on the 'Mary Valley Rattler', a heritage steam train that will take you down through the valley, with wonderful views and lots of interesting history to learn on the way."

Gympie's history is a worth exploring for visitors, and different elements of its rich pioneering heritage are on display in attractions that include the Gold Museum and the Woodworks Museum.

HISTORY

Movie Theatres on the Peninsula

ave you ever walked past a row of shops and noticed the façade of an old building and wondered what it was used for?

Next time you are in Redcliffe Parade, take a closer look at the building almost opposite the Redcliffe Pier. It's unmistakably a former picture theatre, The Pier Theatre in fact.

Redcliffe's first open air 'Picture Pavilion' was opened and operated by Messrs Eckard and Davies on the same site as the Pier Theatre in 1918/1919. In 1921, the theatre was purchased by Mr and Mrs Jack Beedham and the following year was given a roof and re-named The Pier Theatre. Moving pictures were shown for the first time in 1928; perhaps, even showing the first talkie, 'The Jazz Singer' with Al Jolson.

Tragedy struck on 15 March 1943, when the theatre was destroyed by fire. After building

restrictions were overcome, a new Pier Theatre re-opened nine months later, in December 1943, to a packed house. It is speculated that an Alfred Hitchcock thriller or 'The Song of Bernadette' with Jennifer Jones was shown.

The final screening at the Pier Theatre was on 3 May 1969, and new shops were built to front Redcliffe Parade leaving just the old façade.

However, Redcliffe was not the only place to have a theatre on the Peninsula. Margate Theatre, built by Alex Smith, operated from 1940 to 1971 on the corner of Ernest and Albert Streets, Margate. What a night it would have been when 'Smiley' was shown, featuring a boy from the nearby Humpybong School.

Let's not forget the Drive-In Theatre in Elizabeth Avenue, Kippa-Ring, which opened in 1965. Who can ever forget watching films such as 'The Sound of Music', while eating popcorn on a warm summer evening with the one you love. Maybe you took the children, snuggled in the back seat in their pyjamas and who probably didn't stay awake till the end!

Unfortunately, the Drive-In, which was operated by the Sourris Brothers, closed in 1986 and is now the site of a retirement village.

It certainly goes without saying that the Peninsula has a rich history when it comes to picture theatres.
