Halloween has evolved over the years. Originally a Celtic celebration, the homemade gifts of cookies and fruit of the 1950s morphed into chocolate and lollies for trick or treaters, and in the naughties Halloween crept into Australia.

In 2019, it's not unusual to find vampires, princesses and ghouls wandering the Peninsula streets on 31 October. You don't have to look too far to find locals signalling their involvement in Halloween festivities with signs or orange balloons on their mailbox.

Rack and Lexie Pirihiito are just one Redcliffe family, who have embraced the Halloween tradition by opening their home to the public, which they have done for the past six years.

With no more than a gold coin donation, raised for the Breakfast Club, you and your family can enjoy an evening full of frights and scares.

"When we first started trick or treating, our children hardly ended up with any candy. So first we decided to hold Halloween parties for all their school friends. Then the year after that, we decided to open our house to all trick or treaters and the rest is history," Rack and Lexie said.

This year's theme is 'Carnevil comes to Redcliffe', with their house in Meredith Street being decorated like a scary carnival. The decorations set the mood for the live scares, a 7D cinema, scary animatronics, and lucky door prizes.

There will be trick or treat sweets for children aged 16 and under, and we have been warned, "the clowns will be here to scare the visitors, but it's the littlest clown you have to be wary of."

Rack and Lexie have advised that 'Carnevil Comes to Redcliffe' will feature strobe lights, smoke machines and UV lights, and that children under 15 years of age must be under the supervision of an adult. While some parts of the Halloween house might be scary to younger children, it is a family-friendly event.

A FEAST FOR THE EARS

Self-described by drummer, Tim, as a 'bubble-blowing, mintie-throwing mix of punk rock and grunge', local band, Lunchtime, is sure to be a feast for your ears.

Lunchtime was founded in 2016 by identical twins, Constance Grafos (vocals/guitar) and Eden Grafos (vocals/bass/keyboards), along with high school classmate, Lachlan Quinn, on guitar. The band was joined by Tim Ward, on drums, last year.

Originally known as 'Upfall' – the opposite of downfall – they sought to change their moniker.

"[We] hated it and tried to brainstorm for weeks, then one night Eden said the only thing we have in common is food and school so she said 'What about Lunchtime?' and it just suited," Constance said.

With a long list of hard rock and punk influences, including Brisbane-based band, Violent Soho, and Blink 182, the band was always going to be high-energy.

"During the filming of our first music video, 'Hate is a Noun', we used our dad as an extra and accidentally set him on fire," Constance said.

Having played at many Brisbane and Moreton Bay locations, Lunchtime has many stories to tell.

"At Ric's Bar one night, Lachie jumped into the crowd to do a guitar solo and a drunk guy started licking the neck of his guitar," Constance said.

"At one of our biggest gigs to date, the Outmoshyama Festival, our drummer showed up five minutes before our set, so we missed sound-check and almost got booted from the line-up."

Featured on Triple J Unearthed, Lunchtime's single 'Show N Tell' was described by Unearthed's music director, Dave Ruby Howe, as a 'cracking mix of attitude and shreddery'.

Having released a number of singles, Lunchtime is now making plans to record an album.

"We are going into the studio in the next month to record an album, in the meantime our latest single, 'Deception Bay', is available," said Constance.

"Then we are planning to go on tour.

"Then take over the world."

With upcoming gigs in Fortitude Valley, world domination cannot be far away.

Vision for Redcliffe

The Moreton Maritime Alliance has some big ideas to revitalise the Peninsula and support its long-term growth, some of which featured at a recent exhibition.

The recent Moreton Bay Futures – Scarborough Harbour Design exhibition was organised by the alliance, in collaboration with the Redcliffe Peninsula Chamber of Commerce and the University of Queensland Architecture School master's students.

The exhibition featured elements of the alliance's plan for the region, as well as students' ideas for economic and tourism opportunities at Scarborough Harbour.

Moreton Maritime Alliance director and Chamber president, Brad Flynn, said feedback from the exhibition had been "tremendously positive".

The students' ideas included marine research facilities, museums, restaurants and more.

Mr Flynn said the students' designs acted as "a conversation starter" for the alliance's strategic plan for Moreton Bay to become a world-class maritime precinct.

The plan incorporates marine-driven tourism, infrastructure, industry, education, environment, culture, management and employment. One proposal is for a Great Sand Island Trek, to attract global hikers to Bribie Island, Moreton Island and Stradbroke Island with a fast ferry network connecting major hubs such as Scarborough.

Local Boxer's Unfinished Business

Peninsula-based boxer, Billy Limov, has unfinished business with Adrian Rodriguez, and will fight over 10 rounds for the vacant Australian Super Welterweight Title at Redcliffe Leagues Club, in early October.

Billy said he'd usually have to go interstate for a fight of this magnitude, so to have the opportunity to fight in his hometown for an Australian Title was incredible. "I've cut my work hours back to concentrate purely on my preparation with up to 12 training sessions a week to make sure I'm primed," Billy said.

Deception Bay Boxing Club trainer, Damian Smith, said Billy and Adrian fought out a draw for the Queensland title last October at the Exhibition Centre. "This will be both boxers' first attempt at an Australian title with Adrian more experienced, but Billy's trained well and will leave no stone unturned to secure the belt," Damian said.

On the undercard, anti-bullying ambassador, Charlie 'CTH' Hall, will stand toe-to-toe with former World Champion, Joel Camilleri. Matthew 'Damage' Hartmann will defend his Queensland middleweight title against Brent Moore in the curtain-raiser.

The event will also be streamed live via Deception Bay Boxing Club's Facebook page.

Convoy Rolls Into Town

Don some blue clothes, wave some streamers and welcome the vehicles participating in this year's Brisbane Convoy for Kids.

The 10th anniversary promises to be a special event, as always, raising much-needed funds for Hummingbird House, Queensland's only children's hospice.

Leanne Dinning, treasurer of Brisbane Convoy for Kids, is excited about their 10th anniversary event.

"We had our first run in 2010 with 112 trucks and utes making [their] way to Redcliffe Showgrounds," Leanne said.

"Last year saw a massive 547 trucks plus utes, buses, bikes, and even a couple of campervans joined in.

"This year we are expecting a significant increase in the convoy numbers to help us celebrate our 10th anniversary."

Convoy for Kids began in Australia over 30 years ago, with the first-ever convoy being held in Brisbane.

The event has since spread to all Australian states as well as overseas.

"The basic concept of convoy for kids has not changed – it is still a group of truckies and transport-related people getting together to raise funds for kids who are less fortunate," Leanne said.

This truly spectacular sight will pass along the Redcliffe foreshore and into the Redcliffe Showgrounds.

Members of the public are encouraged to find a spot along the foreshore or Oxley Avenue to watch the convoy go past.

"The drivers particularly love the signs along the way," Leanne said.

"Their only payment is seeing the spectators along the way waving and cheering. This year's colour is royal blue, for those spectators who want to dress up or make a sign."

Once the convoy has completed its route, the party will kick on at Redcliffe Showgrounds and families are encouraged to attend and take part in the entertainment on offer.

"[You can] inspect the trucks more closely as well as enjoy the free rides, animal petting zoo and entertainment," Leanne said.

Putting Redcliffe First



Construction Starts on Redcliffe Hospital Multi-level Carpark.

We have met a significant milestone for the Redcliffe Hospital Carpark with the building contract awarded and the project entering the construction phase.

Woollam Construction has begun work at the site. Construction will take around a year to build, with completion expected during the second half of 2020.

When the multi-storey car park is complete, there will be around 1,100 car parks available to patients, visitors, and staff on the hospital campus. This is an increase of more than 50% on what's available now.



A temporary car park has been established at the Redcliffe Showgrounds and is being utilised by staff. Free parking is available on the hospital campus, and there are around 300 car spaces available for patients and visitors to use.

Thanks to an arrangement with the Redcliffe Harness Racing Club, hospital staff can also park at the club each day for a gold coin donation.

The Old Fire Station will be 'ablaze' with action in November to celebrate its 70th birthday.

Kathy Collier from Redcliffe Art Society shared some interesting history of the notable structure.

"The construction of this building responded to the growing population's interdependence on the land, once seen only as a tourist destination," Kathy said.

"Post WWII, the community was in need of its own fire station to protect the needs of the local community."

The construction of the red brick building was completed in 1949 at a cost of 11,000 pounds.



This iconic building stands proud, tall, and midway on the highpoint of the Peninsula's earliest main road between Scarborough and Woody Point," Kathy said.

Redcliffe Art Society [RAS] moved into the Old Fire Station Art Hub in February 2015, and has continued to breathe new life into the old space, with over 400 members and 17 weekly studio art classes.

RAS also manages the Old Fire Station Art Gallery and Gallery Shop in the refurbished Redcliffe Fire Station.

On the same site, the Redcliffe Pottery Group has pottery studios, kiln, and display space.

The Redcliffe Art Society, with the support of the Redcliffe Pottery Group and Moreton Bay Regional Council will be welcoming residents and visitors to the 70th birthday event.

"There will be a barbecue providing food, and drinks will be available too," Kathy said.

"Members of both the art and pottery groups will provide demonstrations during the event and the Gallery and Gallery Shop will be open.

"Fire Station themed art from local primary school children will also be on display."

A fire engine and firemen from Kippa-Ring Fire Station will visit during the afternoon and evening, as well as the SES and volunteer Marine Rescue.

Fire Station memorabilia and historic photos will be on display, with some historic costumes available for photographic opportunities.

Bring the whole family down for this celebration of one of the Peninsula's most iconic landmarks!

Experience The World Of Ceramics

Delve into the world of ceramics at the 'Entwinement' solo art exhibition, which showcases a local ceramicist's artwork until late October.

Ceramic artist, Melissa Prendergast, said the exhibition was inspired by different features of some of her artwork, which is comprised of experimental blends and techniques.

"The 'Entwinement' exhibition ended up coming together as I wanted to work with porcelain in a variety of different ways. The exhibition is also made up of a blend of experimental works as well as artworks that I am more familiar with creating," Melissa said.

She also said her work was heavily inspired by the local area. "I love living on the Peninsula and as my studio is close to the water, my colours

and many of the forms are inspired by my surroundings, which is reflected in this show."

Redcliffe locals can expect to see a diverse range of colour combined with contemporary and classical art forms.

Melissa said some of the showcased pieces were created with porcelain and crystalline glaze and were suitable for wall features and decorations in the home.

"There will be stylised pieces, some featuring coloured porcelain, while others highlight the crystalline glaze. The spotlight shines on the crystalline glaze with my decorative bowls, vases, and bottles," Melissa said.

With a career in ceramic art that spans over 20 years, Melissa enjoys the monumental process of creating a ceramic piece, from her first sketches to the pottery wheel, to mold her creation.

"I love making works on the wheel and I enjoy the movement and the beautiful clean lines that can be achieved. I find the action of throwing a pot absolutely mesmerising, where a variety of tools help me to create an elegant form that holds the shape of the piece."

Development Pays Homage to Local History

A revised design for the Woody Point residential apartment development, to be built on the corner of Lilla Street and Gayundah Esplanade, pays tribute to historical structures from Queensland's past.

The residential development by Traders in Purple will incorporate a 10m replica model of Queensland's historic wartime ship, HMQS Gayundah, on the most prominent corner of the site.

Charles Daoud, a director of Traders in Purple, said the modified design also included a café that would be built adjacent to the historic replica so visitors could easily view the maritime memorial.

"There will be a café adjacent to the civic space that will contain the memorial and interestingly, we have designed the outdoor deck of the café to be in the exact same location as the previous one at the former Filmers Hotel," Mr Daoud said.

"This allows new patrons and those from years gone-by to visit and enjoy the spectacular view,

while reminiscing fondly about the ship that saved Queensland from an invasion.

"There is a lot of history attached to the site. Having the Gayundah wreck in front of it, for the past 60 years as well as having the Bee Gees first play there, I think we can lay homage to that and do something special as part of this project."

Traders in Purple has existing council approval for 174 apartments to be constructed on the site, however the recent design change, submitted to council in mid-September, has reduced the density to 150 apartments and eight townhouses. The plans also detail a drop in the development's height.

Mr Daoud said the Gayundah replica concept was first proposed to Traders In Purple by the Gayundah Preservation Society.

After five years of unsuccessfully lobbying government to save the Gayundah shipwreck, the president of the Gayundah Preservation Society, Richard Lancaster, said he was "absolutely over the moon" to have support from the development group.

Richard said the Gayundah replica would be approximately one quarter of its original size. Weld Werx, a metals' fabrication company, will be managing the build of the replica, which is hoped to be completed by 2022.

Street Smart and Effective Business Strategies

- Focus on solving your customer's problems, not on your own products or services.
- Be clear on why your customers choose to do business with you; not what you think, but what they actually tell you, which means you have to ask them.
- Have a compelling story that inspires people to choose you.

Business Tip: Why knowing your numbers in business is critical

Would you get into a helicopter where the pilot wasn't 100% certain if his dials were telling him the right information or even worse, some of the dials were missing or broken?

- For every 10 quotes or queries you get, how many do you convert into a sale, that is, your sales conversion rate
- Your average dollar sale.

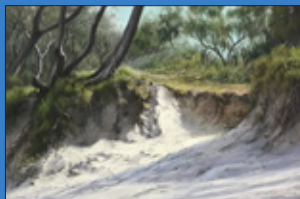
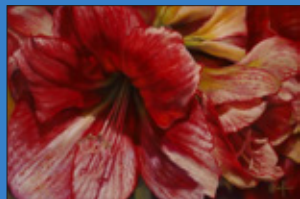

So should we be worried? It's true that a couple of cities in the world have put a hold on making 5G available to its citizens pending further research. This includes Brussels, after protests from people who have concerns about the use of ultra high radio frequencies.

Here's a snapshot summary of the science: 5G uses ultra high frequency radio waves to transmit data. The higher frequency means more data can be carried, but the technology has less ability to pass through objects such as buildings, which is why a greater number of transmitters is required around our neighbourhoods.

People's concerns are around the fear of a type of electromagnetic radiation, which can damage atoms and create ions. This is called 'ionising radiation', and is known to cause cancer.

Scientists believe that the 5G radio frequencies exist on the spectrum of electromagnetic radiation that is 'non-ionising', meaning that, in theory, it does not damage atoms. Other frequencies in this range are already used in microwaves, TV's, FM radio and all existing mobile phones.

The people, who are worried about 5G, believe that this level of radiation may still be harmful to humans, and that a cautious approach may be more prudent in the implementation of large-scale projects that use the new technology. They worry about elements of the technology, which may affect children and old people particularly, such as cancer.

Some concerns also exist about the overall thermal impact of the large-scale use of 5G radio waves on the environment.

While the science community continues to research and develop the use of electromagnetic radiation in communication technologies, it's always a good idea to do your own research and draw your own conclusions on how these new technologies may affect you.

Future Waves

Our communication platforms are expanding again and we are about to receive access to the latest 5G network, which promises download speeds of up to 1 gigabyte per second.

5G is currently rolling out across the country and many regions of Brisbane already have access to the super-fast network, with plans to have Sandgate online soon. Still, many people are worried about the possible effects on humans.

REDCLIFFE'S THURSDAY MARKET STALLS COME TO AN END

Members of the community were upset to see them moving on and many people posted on Facebook about how long they had frequented the little market. One person said, "I've been buying off that plant lady for over 3 years now! What a shame!" If you were a regular of either you will find the plant lady at the markets in Lawnton on Saturdays and in Caboolture on Sundays, and the veggie man will be trying out a new location at the Redcliffe indoor markets.

COULD THERE BE A BEE GEE'S MOVIE?

There has been a rumour floating around that Redcliffe might end up being a starring location in a Bee Gee's biopic. Nothing has been decided or announced, but the locals were excited enough by the idea that social media was aflutter. Many people reminisced about when they had known, lived near or went to school with the Gibb brothers. One savvy commenter pointed out, "I think the Bee Gees actually grew up at Cribb Island which is now Brisbane International Airport and moved to Redcliffe later." This didn't seem to slow down the swell of people suggesting and offering to be extras in the biopic if it ever eventuated. Many others talked about what a tourist attraction shooting a movie in Redcliffe would be, and how it could only boost local businesses, if we were ever to see some of that movie magic on the Peninsula. GUIDELINES FOR VERGE GARDENS

Peninsula residents will be able to plant gardens on road verges with help from the Moreton Bay Regional Council's checklist. The council defines the verge as, "the road reserve between the kerb and the front property boundary, or where no kerb exists, between the table-drain and the front property boundary and is controlled and managed by Council". On the council website, you will find a copy of the guidelines and a checklist for you to complete and submit before you can plant anything on the road verge. Search for 'Road Verge Planting' via www.moretonbay.qld.gov.au to find more information as well as copies of the guidelines and checklist.

FINDING COMMUNITY

Some people can feel a sense of isolation and loneliness or simply a yearning to be part of a group or to give back to the local community. This topic was recently raised on social media with some local groups sharing information about available services. There is 'Tribe Social Belonging' aka Tribe – a group for young and old that provides opportunities for employment, skills development and new experiences. 'Encircle', the local neighbourhood centre has a community

barbecue on the last Friday of every month. 'Young Veterans North Brisbane' have a weekly meal for veterans of all ages and their family every Tuesday at The Point Cafe Bar Restaurant at the RSL. 'Tuckerbox Ministry' works with the homeless and disadvantaged local community and welcome volunteers to help serve or prepare meals at Clontarf Beach Baptist Church. You can find more information on any of these groups via Facebook.

DOLPHINS AFIRE WITH FOOTY FEVER

Footy fever is running high on the peninsula with some massive events scheduled at Dolphins Stadium, and much talk of Redcliffe being a serious contender for an NRL licence.

Moreton Bay Regional Council publically backed the Dolphins as the logical frontrunner for an NRL licence in Queensland, if the opportunity arises.

It has also been announced that Dolphins Stadium will host an NRL trial game – Broncos V Titans – on 29 February, next year.

The Hyundai A-League has also confirmed three Brisbane Roar games for the upcoming season at Dolphins Stadium, in November, February, and April.

Under the sea is a teeming, colourful world and Redcliffe children can find out how to capture its beauty in an underwater photography course.

Using only a digital camera, participants in the AquaMission workshop will learn how to take images of the amazing world beneath the waves.

Aquaventures began as a school teaching young swimmers scuba diving. They help children as young as eight to achieve a PADI (Professional Association of Diving Instructors) Seals qualification, the minimum required to take part in this early learner underwater photography course.

Carrie said they had a lot of rep players from juniors through to seniors, due mainly to their coaches including Helen Maree Butler (Bree-Anna Butler's mum).

“We are lucky to have some very talented coaches, who just for the pure love of the game continue to turn up and coach every year,” Carrie said.

Dolphins

The Bay's Spirited Seafarers

Moreton Bay is home to a number of dolphin species, with two residing within its waters all year round—The Australian Humpback Dolphin (*Sousa sahalensis*), and the Indo-Pacific Bottlenose Dolphin (*Tursiops aduncus*). They are similar in length and weight, but quite different in their behaviour.

The Australian Humpback Dolphin is listed as a vulnerable species by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), and is more restricted in its distribution. Numbers are estimated at only a few thousand individuals in total. Despite high human population densities nearby, in booming South East Queensland, Moreton Bay remains a stronghold for them, relatively speaking.

They are considered an 'inshore' species, preferring shallow water such as bays and river mouths. This preference puts them at greater risk of human activities. Shy and elusive by nature, their main threats are habitat loss and degradation, boating accidents and becoming entrapped in commercial fishing nets.

The Indo-Pacific Bottlenose Dolphin has a much wider distribution, right up into South East Asia, and the coast of east Africa, although insufficient

data is available to determine their conservation status. This is the species most frequently seen in captivity because of their ability to form bonds with humans and to be trained. They're also the ones you've probably seen riding the waves on surf beaches.

Not nearly as shy, and instinctively curious, they can be quite bold. They may come to investigate swimmers, kayakers and paddlers, or swim alongside boats, and are regularly spotted near the Redcliffe Pier and around Scarborough.

They are a delight to watch: relaxed yet nimble in their movements, aware of our presence, yet trusting in their safety, and instantly capable of bursts of speed to escape danger or to catch their prey.

Dolphin/human interactions have taken various forms throughout history, and in different parts of the world. In certain places they had an almost mythical status, and have captured our imaginations for millennia. Elsewhere they have been, and to some extent still are, an important part of the diets of many cultures.

They are undoubtedly intelligent, inquisitive, playful and complex creatures. Although they are quite well-researched, we still have so much to learn about them.

The Bard Comes to the Bay

Something might be rotten in the state of Denmark (or so they say in Hamlet), but local theatre fans are certainly rejoicing as the Brisbane Shakespeare Festival returns to Sandgate this month.

Festival founder, Gary Thorpe, said this year's production, Hamlet, was regarded as the greatest of William Shakespeare's dramas, and was relevant to today's world of political upheaval.

"Hamlet has a strong message about the love of power and the destruction it can bring," he said.

"It is a message that is just as relevant today as it was 400 years ago.

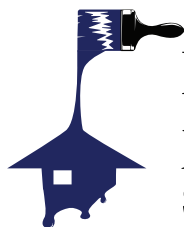

Wax, dirt and moisture: These are the leading causes for hearing aid malfunctions. Wipe your hearing aids with alcohol wipes or clean tissues. If your hearing aids are fitted with wax filters, replace or clean the filters according to instructions. Ensure the microphone and receiver (speaker) sound bores are clean. When using the hearing aid brushes, be careful not to push the dirt into the sound bores. For hearing aids fitted with an earmould and tubing, an air blower is a very effective tool to dislodge any blockage inside the tubing. Investing in a hearing aid dryer will help to keep your hearing aids functioning longer.

Things that you can't do at home: A well-equipped hearing clinic can provide a deep cleaning of your hearing aids by removing the wax and dirt that clog inside the aids and the housing. Replacing the earmould tubing can make a significant difference to sound quality. A hearing aid vacuum chamber can remove moisture from hidden places inside the aids. Also an audio listening check by an experienced audiologist can determine if the hearing aid quality is degraded.

"I still can't hear my family. The background noise is too much. I can't hear clearly": Once possible common faults have been ruled out, a further investigation will help pinpoint a solution to enhance your hearing aid's performance, such as measuring your hearing aid's performance in quiet situations and with speech stimulus, realising and improving your hearing aid's limitations, measuring the nature of your hearing loss and the severity of any hearing distortion.

A hearing aid is a great tool to make your life easier. Studies show that individuals with a hearing loss who wear hearing aids have less incidents of depression, anxiety and social withdrawal than those who do not.

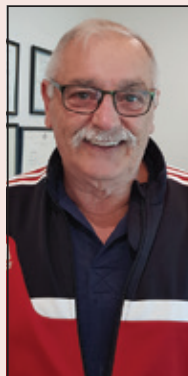
