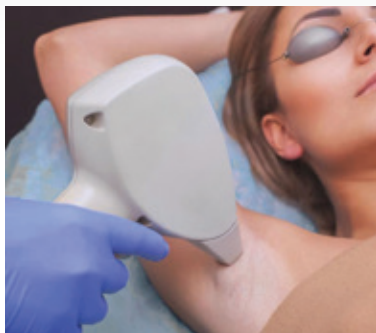

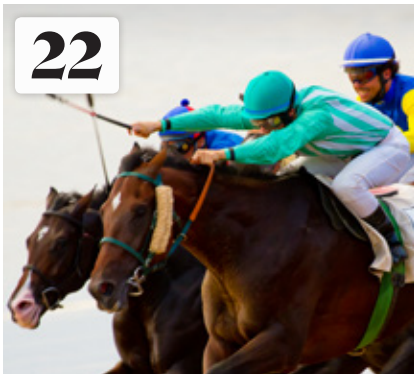

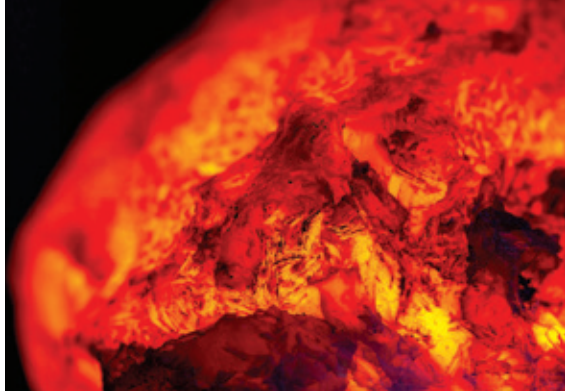
On 11 November we will take a moment to remember those who served our country. Read our article, for details of the local Remembrance Day service. We will remember them. Lest we forget.

A 'GEM' OF A Christmas Show

You can put gems on your Christmas shopping list this year, with the annual Redcliffe Christmas Gem Show just around the corner.

One of the largest gem shows in south-east Queensland, the event saw around 3000 people attend last year.

Redcliffe Gem Club president, Graeme Dick, said the format of the event would be relatively unchanged; however, Hercules Road State School will be the new venue for this year.

"Last year it was very hot, and everyone melted, so this year those in the main hall will have air-conditioning and those outside can come in and cool down when they need to," Graeme said.

The new venue also brings space for outdoor traders, quality food providers and eating spaces, as well as some "superb kids' facilities".

"There are two big areas of climbing frames and we will have a lot of kids' activities, all set up in the general kids' area," Graeme said.

You can get your Christmas presents sorted, with a range of jewellery and gem displays inside the main hall, and an outside trading area, which will include uncut stones and second-hand lapidary equipment.

Don't forget to bring some change along for the major raffle, which offers five main prizes with a retail value in excess of \$5000.

"We're a not-for-profit and the cost of running the club is getting more and more expensive. These shows are our main fundraiser for the year," Graeme said.

If you're thinking of heading to the gem show for the first time, Graeme said there's more to see than you think. It's not uncommon to spend hours at the event, but be careful you don't spend all of your money too quickly!

"Have a good look around, before you buy anything, but for those who don't [have cash on hand], we'll have two ATMs on-site," he said.

KITERS TAKE TO THE Skies

Last year's Brissie Big Air trial event was such a success, Brisbane kilters are lining up to do it again this year at Scarborough. The kiteboarding event will include Big Air, Biggest Crash and Most impressive trick, as well as performances from Redcliffe kiteboarder and current national under-18 champion, Leo Verrecchia.

Kiteboarding Queensland's Brisbane area manager and event organiser, Michael Gill-Bailey, said he expected more than 300 people to attend the event in November.

"We have a bigger wireless PA and music system this year and hopefully, over time, it will become an international event," Michael said.

As the name suggests, Brissie Big Air requires the right conditions to be a success, so it has no firm date; rather it takes place on the first windy weekend in November. Attendees are encouraged to stay updated via Facebook where the dates will be posted once confirmed.

Michael said Queens Beach North was the ideal kiteboarding location because of its deep water, south-east to north-easterly winds and its "long stretch of grass for spectator viewing."

For Michael the event should be equally exciting for spectators as well as competitors.

"People coming to the event should bring sunscreen, a hat and be ready to see some spectacular kiting and entertainment," he said.

The Brissie Big Air event raises opportunities for new and existing kilters, offers fun watching for spectators in the local community, and provides some inspiration for those who might be thinking of taking up kiting for the first time. However, if you are keen to give it a go, Michael has some words of warning for you.

"My best advice to someone taking up kiteboarding is to have professional lessons, as most accidents or injuries are from self-taught people," he said.

We Will Remember Them

This Remembrance Day the Redcliffe RSL will honour those who served and fought for our country, and will also highlight another key anniversary in Australia's military history.



This year marks 20 years since Australia's involvement in the peacekeeping forces in Timor Leste. Members of 20 EOD (Explosive Ordnance Disposal Unit) will mount the flag and form the guard for this important milestone at this year's service on the Peninsula.

During this year's service, Warrant Officer Andrew Pitt will speak about INTERFET, The International Forces in East Timor. This multinational non-United Nations peacekeeping taskforce was led by Australia, under Major General Peter Cosgrove.

INTERFET was made up of 22 contributing countries, set up to address the humanitarian and security crisis that took place in East Timor, from 1999-2000 until the arrival of UN peacekeepers. Following a vote for self-determination, in August of 1999, trained Indonesian militia mounted a series of attacks throughout Timor, centred mainly in the capital, Dili.

Redcliffe RSL vice-president, Cheryl Barrett, said this year's service would be conducted by an officer from the Salvation Army and that, similar to Anzac Day, David Taylor would sing along with Ye Olde Brass Band.

While the Redcliffe RSL is focusing on the East Timor conflict this Remembrance Day, president and advocate of the Redcliffe RSL, Neville Cullen, gave a reminder of the significance of the day.

"On Remembrance Day each year, at the 11th hour on the 11th day of the 11th month we pause to remember all servicemen and women who have paid the supreme sacrifice for their country, or who have fought in all wars, conflicts and peacekeeping activities that Australia has been involved with," he said.

The Redcliffe service will take place at Anzac Place, beginning at 10.50am. Attendees are to be seated by 10.45am. There will be a minute's silence at 11am. Please be aware that bike paths in the vicinity will be closed from 6.30am.

We will remember them.

PETE CULLEN AND THE HURT

Local boy, Pete Cullen, never expected to be performing music on stages in front of 5000 people, when he was playing with his mates as a teenager, on the beaches at Scarborough.

"I was born and bred in Redcliffe – I still go for the Dolphins!" Pete said.

"I grew up in Scarborough and went to school at De La Salle and my parents live in Scarborough.

"I love Scarborough beach; I like taking my dog for a walk along the water."

Pete describes his music genre as 'Americana', encompassing old school musical influences, such as Hank Williams, Bo Diddley and Mississippi John Hurt.

"I don't really fit into a genre – a bit of blues, country, soul, rock'n'roll, rockabilly, jazz," Pete said.

Formerly of local Redcliffe band, the Daybridges, Pete's music career stalled, when the band split after six years together.

"The Daybridges had some success, but broke up in about 2006," Pete said.

"I didn't play for about five years and then by chance I met the guys from the SBS show Rockwiz and recorded my debut album, Tom Whisky Blues.

"At the moment we have Redcliffe local Damon Joel Syme (on drums), Rupert Jenner on lead guitar and Mick Luciw (Daybridges alumni) on bass.

"I really think the guys who play in The Hurt are world-class musicians and I am very fortunate to be in a band with them and more importantly to have them as mates."

Pete has recently launched his fifth album, High Tide, and is looking forward to travelling to Nashville next year to record some more music.

If you're keen to head out and catch Pete live, he has some upcoming dates.

"We have a cool Sunday afternoon show coming up at the Junk Bar in Ashgrove, on [Sunday] 8 December, and then we head to Tamworth Country Music Festival, where we are headlining the Americana Showcase," Pete said.

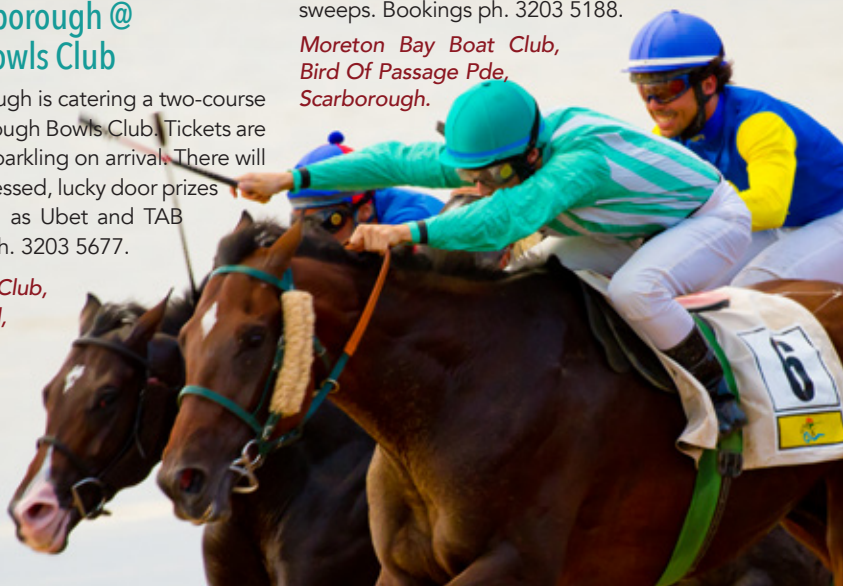

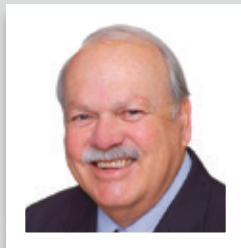

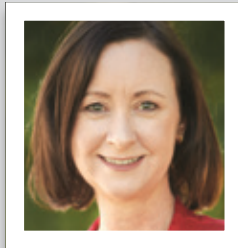
Technology is helping to do just that. Council has engaged a specialist aerial surveying team, to capture topographic and imagery data along public seawalls and beaches across the region. The data will help to map the condition of these assets and identify where future protective works might be required.

Drone technology is a far more environmentally friendly and efficient method of surveying our extensive coastlines, with high-resolution aerial images captured together with the survey levels.

The team will survey more than 38km of coastline, gathering data on our beaches and more than 200 seawalls around the region.

The drones will only operate over public land and are quieter and less invasive than other forms of aerial surveying.

Transforming Young Lives Through Music

The Salvation Army's 'Just Brass' program captured the nation's imagination earlier this year, thanks to a national TV program, and now it's taking the Peninsula by storm.

'Just Brass' featured in the ABC documentary series, *Don't Stop the Music*, which highlighted the transformative effects of teaching music in primary schools, and starred Guy Sebastian. Since the series aired, the Redcliffe Salvation Army obtained funding to run its own program.

Redcliffe Salvation Army ministry assistant, John Humbley, coordinates the local Just Brass outreach program, which currently provides 25 students with musical instruments and tuition.

"Just Brass provides access to a quality music education program for students, particularly those in primary schools, unable to resource or afford instrumental music teaching programs," John said.

"The program ensures they have opportunities to play a musical instrument, build social skills

and develop their capacity to work in a team – skills which provide a solid foundation for their transition to adult life."

John said the program was a perfect fit for the Salvation Army, which had a rich history and expertise in brass bands.

"Just Brass doesn't refer to only brass. Anyone can find a place within the band, including the percussion section!"

John said they were already seeing a significant improvement in students' ability to work as part of a team.

"We have also seen friendships formed and grow, not just between students, but also between some of our Just Brass parents and families. It's definitely growing a lovely community.

"We have also seen confidence grow, along with a willingness to try new and more challenging things, such as playing a solo or sight-reading a new piece of music."

The Just Brass band hosted its first concert on 19 September, with a second one planned for 12 December. The concerts are free to attend, with a small afternoon tea following the performance.

The Lost Art of Nursery Rhymes

Parents are now being encouraged to read to their children, in the hope of improving the falling literacy rate in the younger generation. A now age-old remedy, which helped encourage the literary ability of children of earlier generations, has been discarded and forgotten. Up until the 1950s, the parental practice of reciting and singing nursery rhymes to children was relatively common. But nursery rhymes, such as Humpty Dumpty, Jack and Jill, The Owl and the Pussy Cat and Hickory Dickory Dock have been shelved as being irrelevant to modern-day living. Consistent surveys, among parents, point to a significant majority not even knowing of the existence of nursery rhymes, let alone knowing the words to the most common ones. "After all, many of the old nursery rhymes have their origins in 16th century Britain and are irrelevant," argue modernist educators.

"Pat-a-Cake, Pat-a-Cake, Baker's Man was first published in 1698," they conclude.

However, speech psychologists point out that reciting or singing nursery rhymes to young children can help speed up the development of a child's communication, memory, language and, ultimately, their reading skills. "It is an entertaining way of interacting with your toddler and is an important way for the child's recognition and learning of phonic sounds," one said. A study by a UK-based education institute concluded that children, whose parents sang nursery rhymes and read to them, were better prepared to make progress at school.

A decade or so ago, in response to a question raised on the relevance of the old nursery rhymes to modern-day living, a UK-based children's poet challenged his readers to compose nursery rhymes with a modern theme. Among the subjects chosen were the September 11 terrorist attacks, Prince Charles and Camilla's wedding and Reality TV.

CHAMBER CHAT

with Brad Flynn



What is the most important data in your business?

At the Redcliffe Peninsula Chamber of Commerce's last event, Victor Nicholls, from Macro GIS, explained how to distill all of the data in your business and hone in on what you want, in a marketing context.

He explained that there are three key areas when it comes to marketing: demographic (age, gender, occupation etc.); geographic (addresses and suburbs) and psychographic (beliefs, values and identities). The first two are easy to decipher; the third takes a bit more digging.

Victor told us psychographics was about knowing what motivates people to take action, and the areas of their life that are most important to them. It also involves the things that are causing people troubles in those areas. For instance, if you have back pain and it is affecting the time you have with your family (which could be of the highest value), you will act quickly to get rid of the pain, by seeing a doctor or physiotherapist, so that your quality of life improves and you can enjoy the time with your family.

Sitting down and collating data around psychographic, demographic and geographic data, allows you to form an avatar (of your ideal customer). In terms of creating a marketing plan or piece, it is then simply a matter of holding your avatar in mind (even better, give them a name), and then shaping the plan or piece, with that avatar specifically in mind. It's like you are having a conversation with them.

Business Tip: How to find and keep great staff – Two Parts

1. Hire on attitude

Hiring on attitude first, and skill-level second, is vital. Take the mindset of 'prove to me why I should hire you' and only hire outstanding candidates. For this to be effective, you must always be recruiting, as the worst time to recruit is when you have to.

Past performance is the best predictor of future performance, so your interview questions must reflect this. Eg., "Tell me about a time you had a difficult customer."

2. High quality induction and career path

Invest time, up front, to explain the expectations of the role and what is not acceptable. This is crucial in the induction process. This should be a well thought out and documented process, which you can improve after each new employee, with the lessons from the last induction.

You will also help retention, by ensuring that the staff member can see a brightness of future, if they stay in the position. The number one reason people change jobs is dissatisfaction with the boss. Sometimes, as a boss, this is where we need to start.

"Music is the language of us all, and so is kindness. There is an incredible amount of loneliness amongst the residents. To see them light up when they see the children, when the children interact with them, and when they hear the music is absolutely amazing," Joanna said.

Joanna, or one of her staff, conduct all of the intergenerational music classes.

"All of my staff either have experience or qualifications with performing, education or working with children. They could be teachers, musicians, dancers, actors or early learning educators," Joanna said.

The local intergenerational music classes are held three to four times a month across Redcliffe and Brighton, with classes planned into 2020. Initial interest in these classes has been so positive that there is a good chance of growth as the program moves forward.

Sessions are free to attend but bookings are essential. You don't need to bring anything special with you to the class, but your love of music. Each class lasts 45 minutes and basic percussion instruments and puppets are provided for use.

Damaged Fig Tree Removed

■ A small-leaved fig tree was recently removed from Marine Parade at Redcliffe because of damage it sustained during ex-tropical cyclone Debbie in 2017.

The fig (*ficus obliqua*) experienced extensive decay as a result of insect infestation in large wounds to the canopy and crown of the tree, leading council to remove the tree to protect public safety.

The decision to remove the tree was made following specialist arborist advice and ongoing monitoring and efforts to save the tree, since 2017. The tree is being replaced with a fig of the same species.

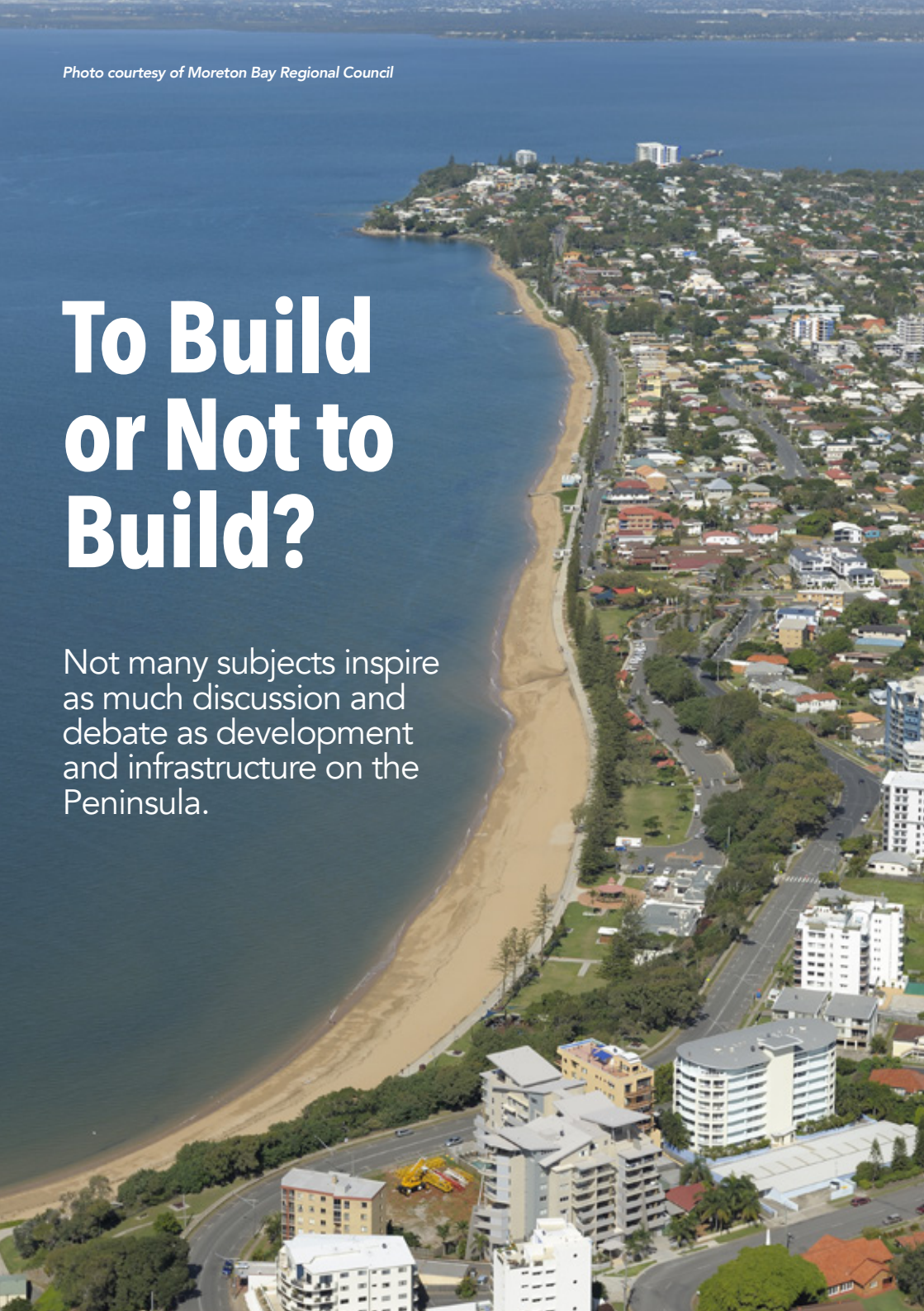

To Build or Not to Build?

Not many subjects inspire as much discussion and debate as development and infrastructure on the Peninsula.

Community opinion is split between those who support development for its contribution to the local economy and others, who are concerned about Redcliffe losing its character and enviable lifestyle.

Councillor for Division 6, Koliana Winchester, agrees that achieving balance is important to maintain the Peninsula's identity.

"Redcliffe has come a long way from being the sleepy seaside village that Brisbane families loved visiting decades ago," Cr Winchester said.

“But the growth and development that the Peninsula has enjoyed hasn't changed our character and we mustn't let it change our character, because it's our village charm that keeps families coming back.”

Cr Winchester said it was important for planners to take the Peninsula's culture and history into account as we look to the future.

"Certainly I see it as my job to advocate for these intangible things – like character, ambience and lifestyle – as we work through the planning approvals for the tangible things like buildings."

Development on the peninsula is regulated by Moreton Bay Regional Council's planning scheme that has differing requirements for each zone.

Council spokesman for Planning and Development, Cr Mick Gillam, said council aimed to promote economic activity and local employment by allowing retail, commercial and community uses, in the right location.

"Over the next 10-15 years, some residential parts of the Peninsula are expected to experience very little change as a result of the land's zoning," Cr Gillam said.

"Other areas (which are typically well-served by infrastructure, public transport, and near to services) will most likely change and develop over this same time to cater for the expected population growth and capitalise on the Peninsula's high valued location.

"In these areas, the planning scheme seeks to provide a mix of residential uses to promote housing choice and affordability, ageing in place and meet diverse community needs."

Redcliffe Peninsula Chamber of Commerce president, Brad Flynn, said development was important for stimulating the local economy, but the chamber did not want the area "overrun with inappropriate and uncoordinated developments".

"The chamber supports increasing development due to the flow on effects for all local businesses and the economy in general, and as part of the solution to improving some of the socio-economic challenges we face," Mr Flynn said.

Three years ago the chamber set a long term vision for the area to become "Queensland's No.1 place to combine lifestyle and business" and is working with the community and government to help achieve that.

Mr Flynn said key focuses should be on increasing short term accommodation and hosting multi-day sporting or other events and conferences to encourage spending with local businesses.

Tips for saving money on purchasing hearing aids

1. Get the facts - Don't buy a hearing aid if you do not need one.

Make sure you are not being over-prescribed.

If you do need a hearing aid, should you get one aid or two? The price for two aids is usually twice the price of one. The nature of the hearing loss eg conductive hearing loss, does not require the most advanced hearing aid features, so choosing high-end technology level hearing aids is a waste of your money, if you don't need it. Very often, a free hearing test does not give you the full picture about your hearing loss. Getting an accurate hearing test is more important than saving money on the hearing test so you do not end up paying more on the hearing aid price.

2. Match to your needs, not what the clinician wants:

ACCC has noticed some clinicians seem to favour the high-end products putting stress and pressure on their clients to respond to their recommendations. Choose an ethical audiologist who gives you options that match your hearing needs. Don't be afraid to seek a second opinion. For example, a 90 year-old man living in a nursing home, hardly able to walk without a walker, does not need a pair of expensive waterproof hearing aids designed for swimming, water sports and outdoor activities. It's a waste of money to buy features which you do not need.

3. Get hearing aids that actually work

Choosing the correct brand and technology level, selecting the correct hearing aid features and style, carefully programming the hearing aid settings, determining the sound quality and ensuring successful outcomes are more important in a hearing aid than how expensive it is. A higher technology hearing aid does not always perform better than a lower technology hearing aid.

4. Are you getting an older model?

As an unsuspecting client, are you purchasing an older model hearing aid? Ask questions. You should not invest in an older hearing aid if a newer, better performing model has already been released.

5. Pricing

ACCC encourages clients to research the price. Don't assume a bigger hearing aid retailer always offers the lowest price. Some hearing clinics quote 30-40% higher for the same products than the prices offered at Sandgate Hearing.

6. Used hearing aids

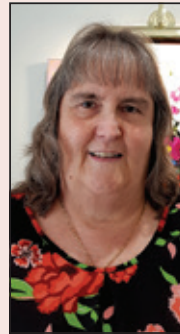
Don't purchase used hearing aids online or wear a deceased family member's or friend's hearing aid. They won't match your hearing levels and it may even harm your hearing. Hearing aids are medical devices. You need to see a professional.

7. Reputations

Choose a trusted clinic with a high customer satisfaction rate. You will get better value products and services.



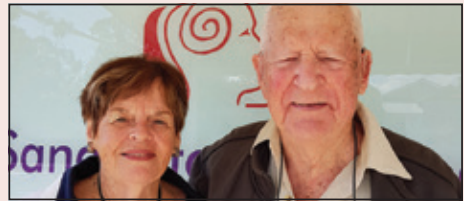
