What happens when you combine vintage glamour, a live music line-up, good food and a great cause, all in a seaside setting? The Our House on the Hill fundraiser – an event that promises to be not only fabulous fun but also aims to raise awareness of organ donation and money for medical research.

Money raised will go to The Common Good, an initiative of The Prince Charles Hospital Foundation, which funds life-saving and life-changing health research.

Event co-organiser and Queensland Premier Pinup Event producer, Lulu Divine, said the fundraiser was inspired by one of the event's organisers, Kathy Allan, who recently had a life-saving lung transplant.

"Kathy wanted to figure out a way to give back," said Lulu. "It's something that's had an amazing impact in her life. That's why the event was created."

Held at the Bramble Bay Bowls Club at Woody Point, the event will feature a pinup competition, with the theme of 1950s vintage sports and leisure. Lulu said twelve finalists "who love to embody 1950s' fashion and styling" would compete on the day.

"They will come in their interpretation of 1950s' sports and leisure wear," said Lulu.

"It could be a cute vintage archery outfit, a swimming outfit, or golfing outfit. They'll strike some poses for the audience and really showcase their personality."

There will also be a full band line-up from morning until well into the evening. Lulu said that even though the overarching theme of the music was Rockabilly, there will be bands and performances for all musical tastes.

"We're trying to cater to everyone," she said.

"It's going to be really family-friendly, and a good community-oriented event."

As well as the pinup competition and live music, there will be a vintage car show, raffles, and food stalls. Guest speakers will also be aiming to raise awareness of the importance of organ donation and transplants.

EDIT Tattoo

Kelly Lojen has spent the past seven years painstakingly removing regretted tattoos from the skin of local residents.

"I started chatting to the newly-tattooed asking them what happens if they don't like them," Kelly said.

"Their response was 'I don't know', so I began a quest to find out how to remove them and what's involved."

A myriad of factors can influence the speed and success of removal, including the colours used,

placement on the body, the client's skin type and even their metabolism.

"Most tattoos take an average of eight treatments to remove, however some can take up to 15 treatments and some tattoos can never be fully removed," Kelly said.

"Other tattoos such as shading, amateur or old tattoos can take as little as one or two treatments."

Kelly has had many success stories as a professional laser tattoo removalist.

"I have had a lot of wins, such as an 86-year-old wanting to remove his old army tattoos that his wife always hated," Kelly said.

"When she passed, he decided to honour her by removing them."

Perhaps her biggest success story is a client named John, who phoned Kelly to explain his vicious cycle.

"*John had a rough life, had been in the wrong crowd and had some offensive facial tattoos... he explained it was a vicious cycle of being unable to change his life as he couldn't get a job and had to revert back to the old ways of making money," Kelly said.*

"He really wanted a normal job and normal life but couldn't afford to change his facial tattoos, therefore [he was] unable to break the cycle.

"We have successfully removed almost all of his facial tattoos [and] he has noticed how differently people treat him, how much friendlier they are towards him."

Kelly's has some advice for those considering a tattoo.

"Don't get a tattoo thinking it can be removed," Kelly said.

"As much as I love meeting you all, tattoo removal isn't easy, it hurts and it costs more than your tattoo."

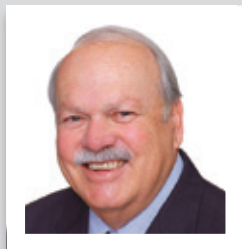

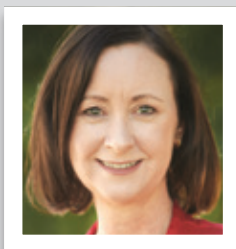
A review of the operating hours for Moreton Bay Region Libraries has been undertaken, which identified opportunities to better meet community demands outside of current opening hours.

As a result of the review, the new opening time for all libraries is now 8.30am Monday to Friday, with the closing time of the eight largest libraries now 6.00pm Monday to Friday. All libraries open late one night during the week. This change increases library access by nearly 48 hours per week to customers across the region.

Each council division will have a red bench installed to support the Red Rose Foundation's 'Red Bench' initiative, to raise public awareness of domestic violence that occurs in all communities. The benches will be installed prior to the Domestic and Family Violence Prevention month in May 2020.

As I will be retiring at the forth-coming election, this will be my last contribution to Redcliffe Guide. I would like to thank management and all readers for your support during my term of office and I wish you all the best for the future.

SEA SHANTY SINGALONG SESSIONS

Shantyman and Friends is a collective of musicians and performers who will be bringing their international repertoire of sea shanties and sea songs to the local area.

Multi-instrumentalist and singer, Brendan Williams, is one of the creators of the event and is looking forward to bringing the unique sessions to the Peninsula.

"We will be starting off with a repertoire of about 20 sea shanties and sea songs," Brendan said.

"Some of them we'll be doing acapella, some with accompaniment.

"We've got some people who have sung shanties for a long time and others who are new to it."

Audience participation is strongly encouraged during the sessions and the rotating lineup will involve members of different musical groups, who will be invited to come along and show off their individual and collective talents.

"People can come along and join in – either with just the choruses or they can try and lead the song," Brendan said.

To the uninitiated, a sea shanty is a work song sometimes used to boost sailors' morale or used in a practical way to assist the hauling of an anchor or sails on an older ship.

"When everything was mechanical, they had to haul ropes so you needed quite a few people to haul up anchors and pull the sails up," Brendan said.

"When they sang the chorus, they would all pull the ropes on certain words so all the sea shanties have great rhythm."

Born to an opera singer father, who also collected sea shanties, Brendan grew up in Ireland singing the songs of the sea.

He has preformed for audiences since the age of six, and he counts his career highlight as playing to a crowd of 15,000 at Woodford Folk Festival.

Threads of History Weave Fascinating Tales

Imagine being a modern teenager transported back through time, to ensure that specific historical events happen, and knowing that the fate of the world as you know it is in your hands.

That is the premise of Redcliffe author, Jodie Lane's popular 'Turning Points' series, which concludes with the final book 'The Heart and Stomach of a Queen' being launched this month.

Jodie said that she is inspired by history and travel, both of which she loves.

"The books are written for anyone who loves a bit of history and adventure, as well as queer people who don't often get to see themselves in a mainstream genre."

"I studied history at school and university, and I've travelled extensively to every continent except Antarctica."

"I don't need to make up the incredible events I write about - the stories are already there, just waiting to be told in a different way."

Jodie started writing seriously six years ago when a colleague asked whether she liked the idea of being a writer more than she liked writing.

"That embarrassed me into dedicating myself to a project, which became my first novel, 'The Siege of Masada,'" Jodie said.

The next books in this time travel adventure series were 'Transylvanian Knight', 'To Kill an Emperor' and 'Renaissance Woman', all centred around real historical events.

Avoiding plot holes was the hardest thing about writing a series, according to Jodie.

“I had to increase the challenges to my characters whilst obeying my own rules of time travel.”

"I'm going to miss the characters, but some of the most-loved will live on in short stories."

Jodie's advice to aspiring authors is to find people who give good feedback.

"Good feedback gives you direction to improve."

Jodie looks forward to sharing her writing journey at the book launch.

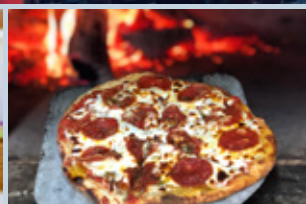

Increased Penalties for Distracted Drivers

From 1 February 2020, the penalty associated with illegally using a mobile phone when driving will increase to a \$1000 fine and four demerit points. This includes reading or sending texts, answering a phone with anything other than a legal hands-free device or changing music while driving.

In addition, if a person incurs a second infringement within a 12-month period, they will receive a second \$1000 fine and double demerit points.

In a public statement on the 9 December 2019, the Queensland Transport Minister, Mark Bailey, said that the Queensland government would trial the use of mobile detection cameras on Queensland roads.

Mr Bailey said, "Penalties go hand in hand with enforcement and under the new action plan the Department of Transport and Main Roads will work with Queensland Police to trial cameras which detect drivers using mobile phones."

The Turning On of Redcliffe

Nowadays, when we switch on a light, the stove, the TV or the radio, we give no thought of how electricity first came to Redcliffe. But one thing is certain, it did not come easily. In his illuminating book 'Redcliffe's 160 Years', published in 1959, Leslie Slaughter tells of the difficulties early Redcliffe faced in getting 'turned on'. The first suggestion to light up Redcliffe with electricity was made by E T Mickelwright, who, on 8th May 1916, offered to provide the Redcliffe Shire Council with electricity to light up 20 street lights, from sunset to 10.30pm at the rate of a pound a night. But the shire council would have none of it. At the time households in Redcliffe relied on candle and kerosene lamp power for lighting. A year later, the electrification of Redcliffe was raised again, but it was deferred to the next year, after council elections.

But it took another seven years for some real action to come about. A special council meeting, in June 1924, decided to go ahead to start the process of the town's electrification. A Mr Bridge presented a 'how to' plan and council approved it. The Queensland government approved a loan of £18,000 to the council, provided it could guarantee a minimum of 400 consumers. At the 1921 census Redcliffe had a population of 1631, who lived in 432 private

dwellings. A significant number of these were listed as 'renters'. Council now had difficulty gaining the loan. Bridge's scheme was thrown out for the time being.

In 1927, council successfully negotiated a deal with the City Electric Company whereby they would obtain electricity supplies from its mains at Saltwater Creek, with a loan of £12,000. But the matter of electricity did not sit well with council. An ever present fear of losing electricity supply because of Redcliffe's small population, forced council to enact a levy of one penny in the pound.

The power line to Redcliffe was completed in June 1928, and the first electric lights were turned on in July 1928.

On top of the busy schedule of her musical career, Lynelle also teaches at her own school, The Hills Music Centre.

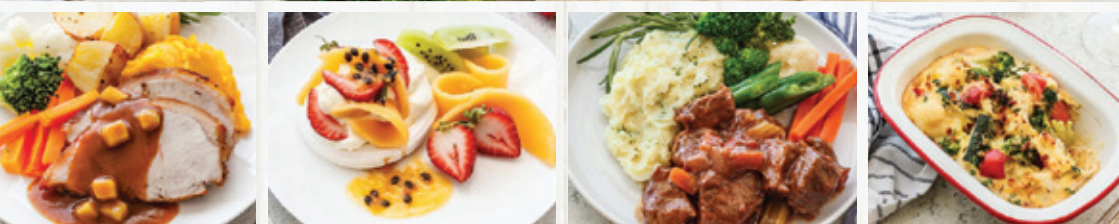

HISTORY

Scarborough - A Potted History

Prior to white settlement, the traditional owners of the land, the Ningi Ningi clan of the Undanbi tribe, whose name means oyster, called the Redcliffe Peninsula home.

In 1862, the Peninsula became part of the Redcliffe Agricultural Reserve, and in mid-1864 the Scarborough area was surveyed for farming blocks by surveyor, Martin Lavelle. The survey also allowed for the future development of roads in the district, including what are now Oxley Ave, Scarborough Rd and Griffith Rd.

The first parcels of land in Scarborough were purchased in March of 1865, when James Mitchell purchased 88 acres and Joseph Borrie purchased 80 acres. These parcels of farming land lay east of Oxley Ave. In the same year, John Warburton purchased all the land north of Fifth Ave.

By 1870, these farmlands had been extended considerably. Dr William Hobbs purchased land between Klingner Rd and Sunnyside St, west of Scarborough Rd, and English clergyman, Thomas Jones, bought all the land bounded by Oxley, Griffith, Scarborough and Eversleigh Roads.

As agriculture developed in the area, the Ningi Ningi weren't able to hunt as widely as they once had. However, Dr Hobbs developed an excellent rapport with them and had no issue in letting them continue to hunt on his land. This mutual respect was evident when Dr Hobbs' son was killed in a riding accident and clan members shared in his grief.

Urbanisation of the area began in 1880. In 1878, the first hotel in the district was built, named the Bay View Hotel, which was later known as the Scarborough Hotel.

Land developers began buying up farming land and subdividing it for residential lots. A small township grew around the hotel. The Peninsula became a place for weekend holidaymakers, who came to camp or to stay in rented cottages, and enjoy the seaside activities.

Children, who lived in the area, began their schooling by attending the Humpybong Provisional School. It was quite a trek to get to school each day. In 1888, the Redcliffe Provisional School opened, shortening the travelling time for the youngsters. The Redcliffe hospital now stands on the original site of this school.

Dr Hobbs had probably the last major beach-front holding and this was sold off in 1886. It was subdivided into 295 residential blocks, beginning the start of Scarborough as we know it today.

Les Helps Local Eateries Reduce Landfill by Composting

Redcliffe local, Les Barkla, has a “not-so-trivial” question for you. “Do you know how much food waste restaurants and industrial companies dispose of every year?” The answer... “2.2 million tonnes.”

“That’s more than 40% of food purchased as stock. Add to that, each year the food content of the average householder’s bin, which is 35%. With food waste causing a staggering 8% of greenhouse gases heating the planet, these are sobering statistics.”

Les and his Pristine Peninsula Community Group decided to do something about it. In late 2018, they started a sustainable eateries food composting project with Pilpel Restaurant and Café Diversity.

“The aim was to reduce this landfill and it’s proved to be a success. In a 12-week trial, a total of 6.2 tonnes of compostable food waste was diverted to commercial composting. That’s around the size of an average bedroom, totally full of compostable food,” Les said. “Both restaurants are so happy with the results, they are continuing with the project.”

“Then, more good news! In late 2019, Sea Salt & Vine joined the project, with the results on their 3-month trial due soon. We’re getting great results for these three local eateries, with support from our local award-winning Flock Eatery.

Les has an environmental sustainability background and said, “This is just the beginning. Our goal is to eventually divert all our local eateries compostable food waste from landfill into reusable compost. I’m looking for more local eateries to get involved. It’s really easy to get started with positive results for your business and the planet.”

“Many businesses on the Peninsula are adopting sustainability practices, including using compostable plates and cutlery, containers 4 change drink containers, cardboard recycling, paper plates and straws, BYO containers for leftovers and keep cups.

“For example, Pilpel saves water by using compostable plates, reducing daily dishwasher use to three to four hours and detergent by 50%. That means less power use, a smaller carbon footprint and less harm to the environment.

FISH OF THE MONTH

Yellowfin Bream

Acanthopagrus australis

One of our favoured local “bread and butter” species, the humble Yellowfin Bream, is actually quite easy to catch on bread! I like to berley with bread, sand and water mixed up to lure them in and then use prawns on a light rod to catch them. Worms, yabbies, mullet gut, chicken breast, flour dough and fish fillets are also good for bait.

The Sandgate/Brighton foreshore, at high tide, is a great place to try and there are plenty of whiting and flathead too. With new lighting, this is an excellent safe spot for night fishing.

Woody Point Jetty, Redcliffe Jetty, Shorncliffe Pier and Hornibrook fishing platforms all hold loads of bream too, as does almost any jetty or bridge in Moreton Bay. The secret for jetties is to berley on high or low tide and don't throw out, just drop your bait straight down as most times they are sheltering and feeding under your feet.

With a minimum size limit of 25cm, I find many are easily over that size and they are great pan-fried whole, baked or smoked. One decent bream each with a nice salad and beer or wine is a perfect Sunday lunch for us.
