

Education is the key to healing – that's the message from the organisers of the Heal Yourself Expo, which will take place this month.





vent organiser Wayne Pina-Roozemond said the idea for the festival started more than 10 years ago.

"Friends of mine went to a larger festival, based around mind and spirit, and they came away disheartened because it was all about sales," he said.

"So we decided to go for a different model – we wanted to assist home-based businesses, the smaller business run by passionate people looking to connect.

"For patrons, it's all about education. We want people to take charge of their healing. So many people are happy to hand over their healing to their doctor, or their naturopath and say, 'you fix this'.

"They don't want to take responsibility for their actions or take control. And taking control of that journey is what we really push at the Expo. Here, you will find people to help you."

Initially scheduled for July, the expo had been postponed due to COVID-19.

"We've spoken with the Department of Health numerous times and we have a COVID-safe plan," Wayne said.

"So things will look a bit different this year – fewer stall holders as we need to space people out; of course we have hand sanitiser and masks there for people who wish to wear masks.

"I think this is just something we have to get used to; it's the new reality.

"And this year in particular, local business really needs a leg up and these businesses here at the expo are local; they're run by local people and we're all about the local community."

Stall holders include natural therapists, psychics, tarot readers, healers and essential oil providers. Workshops will cover everything from connecting to spirit with local clairvoyants, to "awakening your sexual being".

"Truly something for everyone," Wayne said.



proposed transformation to Waters Edge Functions Venue in Scarborough promises to deliver a new experience for patrons to enjoy a beverage and meal while taking in the views of the marina. The brewery is a part of a masterplan to upgrade key locations on the Peninsula.

Developer and Waters Edge owner Jamie Larson said the application to council was for a brewery downstairs that will hold 180 people, with a new function area on the top floor.

Jamie said microbreweries had become incredibly popular over the last 10 to 15 years and the sunset views from the Harbour to Glasshouse Mountains was the perfect place to enjoy a craft beer that had been brewed in Scarborough.

"We will serve food and beverages on both levels and be respectful of the neighbours - any live music in the future will likely be unamplified soloists," he said. "The focus will be on the quality of the beers and the range of beers we will have on offer on site, with food that will match the ambience and style of the beverages we will be offering."

Open Architecture Studio director Michael Bailey said his firm was approached to design the brewery because of their involvement with the Moreton Maritime Strategic Plan, which is proposing upgrades to the key locations across the bay.

"This proposal ties in with the idea that Scarborough can be a fantastic, active and working harbour, and that it will become a part of the community and an asset for everyone – not just a place to store boats," Michael said. "We are really excited that this will really activate the harbour and pull people in."

He said the renovation would completely transform the existing building. Using a combination of Cort-ten steel and polycarbonate, the venue would have a fantastic glow at night – much like a lighthouse. A new façade would wrap around the building like a wave and would create a new seating and dining area, with a complete interior refurbishment showcasing a copper pizza oven and steel brewing tanks.

Planvista town planner Robert Stonadge said the timeframe for the council to make a decision would likely take 12 to 14 weeks and once consent had been given, it would be several more months before construction could begin.

"We are focussing on our local community," Jamie said. "But Redcliffe is such a fantastic destination for both Brisbanites and the greater South East Queensland community, we are also targeting the day-trippers that are looking for a great day out on the Peninsula."








he Jumping Goats Bar at Margate has scored a \$14,140 Play Local grant that enables it to continue providing live music to its patrons and creating paid opportunities for its regular acts. With restrictions easing in Queensland, the bar is welcoming back guests with open arms and providing the entertainment to take away their COVID blues.

Play Local is an Arts and Cultural Recovery Relief Package that was awarded to 52 live performance venues across Queensland to secure employment of artists and support audience access to live events. With many venues closing for months, recouping lost income does not allow for entertainment costs. This package has venues, performers and patrons gaining from the initiative.

Jumping Goats Bar owners Peta Thames and Nigel Scanes were "over the moon" to be granted the opportunity to continue to support their emerging artists and graduates from the Conservatorium of Music. They have 18 musicians booked to play until the end of the year and the grant has enabled the bar to have live acts three nights of the week.

"We were shut for 12 weeks during the pandemic," Peta said. "I squeaked when we found out we got the grant from the Queensland

Government. It was a joint effort between our musicians, patrons, and the local community to get our application through. Now our talented artists can keep providing fantastic music to our customers - while they enjoy a local boutique wine or craft beer

"We are so humbled by the community response we have had since reopening. It is great that we can keep our amazing artists performing and provide them with an audience each week - they deserve their talent to be heard."

While Jumping Goats Bar was shut down, Peta did not forget about her musicians, and using the business's online platform to create a "virtual bar" with the artists performing on Facebook live to 1700 followers.

Solo singer and guitarist Steve McLoughlin said the fans of live music were itching to get back out, hear some tunes and help the hospitality industry get back on its feet.

"The grant is getting the music industry working again," Steve said. "The venue doesn't have to stress about paying us after being shut for so long. It's so lucky they got it. The Goat is the best spot in Redcliffe. Doing the live on Facebook was amazing, but having an audience again is incredible. It's great to be back."

Moreton Bay Regional Council (MBRC) has unanimously endorsed a whole-of-community action plan to help get the region back on track from the coronavirus pandemic. The Moreton Bay Recovery Plan 2020-21 is a roadmap for the region to continue to respond and recover from

the economic and social impacts of COVID-19.

Immediate actions to be undertaken include: reviewing Council fees and charges to support red tape reduction, making it easier to do business in our region; improving the efficiency of development application assessments; continuing Council's free pre-lodgement advice service; and waiving another year's worth of food licence fees for small businesses.

Please also remember to 'SLOW DOWN' out there on our roads. This is the message that MBRC wants our residents to adhere to. We should be targeting zero, but in the last two months alone, Moreton Bay Region's road fatalities are nearly 50 per cent higher than the twelve months prior. Police will tell you there's no such thing as an accident, and driver error is always a contributing factor, including tailgating, running lights and speeding. Also, let's slow down for our precious wildlife.

As your local Member for Redcliffe, I am pleased with the strong stance being taken by the Queensland Government to crackdown on hoons. The crackdown is supported with significant investment in new high-tech

cameras for the police, including an expanded fleet of drones, giving police night vision capable cameras that can be deployed covertly, operated by an officer or deployed on the drone. The new camera technology would be especially valuable when police target mass gatherings of hoons. For example, if dozens of cars were hooning in a particular location, police would be able to use these new hi-tech cameras to capture images of all the vehicles.

The new technology will add to the existing network of thousands of traffic cameras across Queensland. Complementing the new camera technology, the government is looking to expand existing laws, including shifting the onus of proof onto the vehicle owner, meaning they would have to prove they weren't driving the car when the hooning occurred. These new measures will support the police in doing their job in cracking down on senseless hoons on our roads.



shooting Olympic, Commonwealth and **Paralympic** sporting event and is a pastime in which Russell Mark and his wife Lauryn offer expert knowledge. After all, he is a former Olympic gold medallist while she is also a Commonwealth gold medallist. Their business, Go Shooting, holds multiple clay shooting events across the east coast of Australia, including a regular 'Have a Go' clay shooting event right here at the Redcliffe City Clay Target Club.

Clay shooting is a popular pastime and is open to most people from age 12 to 99 of any ability or fitness level. Lauryn suggests that youngsters who spend their time on shooting video games sometimes have an advantage when learning to clay shoot.

'Have a Go' sessions run for around three hours, with all safety equipment and firearms supplied. The event can have a maximum of 24 people per session with one instructor for every eight participants. Lauryn said she hoped each participant "achieves hitting a target, [while] trying something a little different in a safe and nurturing environment".

The 'Have a Go' Saturday morning event has a short safety introduction at the beginning of the session and a 10-target warm-up, using a 12 gauge Beretta over and under firearm, followed by a fun 20-target competition with prizes for the winners.

Go Shooting has been running events in Queensland for eight years and opened on the Peninsula due to the high demand for clay shooting events.

"We have only been at Redcliffe City Clay Target Club for a year," Lauryn said. "[It is] a fantastic venue. We have a team of instructors that will ensure they provide great tuition with an emphasis on providing an entertaining experience for all."

Sessions cost \$125 for children 12 to 17 years old, and \$149 for adults. For more information, or to book a 'Have A Go' session visit goshooting.com.au or call 1800 746 684.

PENINSULA PIMPERNEL

ate on a Saturday evening in February 1961, a Peninsula icon closed its doors, ostensibly for the last time. For the second time, Scarborough's Bay Theatre had run its course. It had just shown the classic movie Beloved Infidel starring Deborah Kerr and Gregory Peck.

The old movie house had opened with a flourish in the early 1950s, capitalising on the Peninsula's popularity as the holiday destination for Brisbanites who, anxious for sand and sea, flocked to the Bay Theatre at Scarborough to watch the latest movies from Hollywood.

But with the advent of television and the growing popularity of the Gold Coast as the Queensland holiday destination, Redcliffe lost its lustre and with it the Bay Cinema closed its doors for the first time. But with a never say die attitude, two locals, Messrs Londy and Kallos, built a new Bay Theatre in Scarborough. It was opened on 2 December 1954 by the Redcliffe Mayor Alderman Cecil Kroll. The main feature was Paramount Pictures Knock on Wood starring Danny Kaye, and local moviegoers were overjoyed, paying only \$1 admission fee.

The theatre was to live for seven years, until falling audiences forced its closure in 1961. For the next 33 years, the old theatre stood boarded up, briefly resurrected as a church and then back to 'lock-up' time again.

In 1994, local artist Rodd Sherwin had been searching for premises in which to exhibit his art, but with little success. By chance he found the boarded up Bay Cinema, by now up for sale. He was unimpressed with the 'down at heel' appearance of the exterior of the building, but was amazed at how its interior had withstood the rigours of time. Sherwin, a visionary, saw the building as a potential art gallery. So he leased the building and, with a few artist friends and some paint, created a fully functioning art gallery that he christened The Scarborough Fair Art Gallery. The gallery became so popular, it attracted a following of over 80 exhibiting artists at its height in the 1990s. It was even awarded an Australia Day Cultural Award.

But by 2004, with rising costs and a lack of new volunteers to run the gallery, Rodd Sherwin, with great sadness, finally closed the old building.



Store owner Michelle Morrison said the idea for the store was born from her love of yarn and the vintage era. She also wanted to create a space for yarn enthusiasts to meet and create.

"It became increasingly hard to find places for our small craft group to go where we could stay for long periods and feel welcome," Michelle said. "So I decided to open my own place where everyone can come and stay as long as they like."

The store opened in September and sells yarn and craft supplies and hosts workshops, but a major highlight is the free Friday night Giggle and Yarn social events. Held weekly, crafters can

come along with friends or make new ones with the option to BYO food and/or drinks - although Michelle said, "We are not responsible for what you create under the influence."

With lockdowns and social distancing now the norm, Michelle believes this year hasn't been all bad for craft.

"I have heard many people returning to knitting and crochet after long absences, and a surge in people wanting to learn," she said. "The lockdowns have been a little more bearable when you have a craft. It gives us the chance to finish projects we never got around to finishing or start that new project we didn't think we would have time for."

If you're not a yarn-crafter yet, but you'd like to be, there's something for you here too. The store offers classes for beginners, which will teach the basics needed to get started, allowing you to work at your own pace with guidance from the experts.

"It's never too late to learn, and it's addictive," Michelle said. "Come and learn one of the last handmade crafts that have been around for centuries."



ith over 50 years of experience in the music industry, Scarboroughbased jazz guitarist and vocalist Julian Jones is still wowing audiences with his smooth tunes and passion for performing.

The veteran muso started singing in the mid 1960s and at just 14 years old, joined a band and took off to Melbourne to be their lead vocalist. Julian said he married young and decided it was time to take his talents more seriously by also learning guitar. Julian said he then worked the Brisbane club scene for about 15 years and set up a recording studio at Milton and did a lot of backing tracks. He also toured with the Doobie Brothers and Joe Cocker. While COVID has slowed down many of his live gigs, he is looking forward to performing at private functions and venues again soon.

"When I reached retirement age, I decided to be a little more self-indulgent and nowadays I just focus mainly on my jazz stuff," he said. "My style is café jazz and Latin with a classical influence. I enjoy playing a variety of styles including pop, rhythm and blues."

Julian regularly performs with Leena Salim, but also enjoys his solo performances from the Great American Songbook.

ow to sell a Haunted House – with episode titles like this, you know it's not going to be your average true crime podcast. Host Phoebe Judge and her team not only interview those who've been affected by crime, but the criminals who commit them. The crimes vary in severity from poaching Venus Fly Traps, counterfeiting money, all the way through to murder, but always with a common thread... they're bloody fascinating and often bizarre.

One of the most interesting elements is the way each criminal or victim tells their story. A crim may show no remorse, offering tips on committing crimes in one episode, and in the next, a victim will explain how they got their revenge on a scammer.

This podcast mostly focusses on more obscure and unheard-of cases, although occasionally offers new takes on more famous murders from new angles such as "An owl did it".

Some of the interviews may be five years old but the topics and emotions they evoke are still fresh and evergreen.

The timbre of Judge's voice gives a soft storyteller feel to each tale and with episodes running at around 30 minutes a piece, it makes for very bingeable listening.

The focus of the group is on body positivity, women, their health and achieving these tenets through regular body movement.


The group is open to all kinds of expression of movement; walking, running, dancing, hiking, pole dancing or roller skating, to name a few.





ike, yellowtail - whatever you call them, they are a great live bait, accounting for many Estuary Cod, Longtail Tuna, Kingfish, and many more species found in Moreton Bay. They make great flesh/strip baits as well for Bream and Snapper. Found around the many reefs, wharves and structure in the bay, they are great fun to catch from any of the local jetties using a set of bait jigs or a paternoster rig with a small hook and a piece of red or yellow wool jigged up and down.

I have never bothered eating them as they are very oily with a soft flesh, but have been told they were quite good if prepared correctly. I finally decided to catch a few, did some in the smoker, took them to a mate's place where he fried some in oil and I must say they were quite good, certainly not bad. Three out of five stars for me. Locals I've talked to who are catching them on the jetties say they're very good for fish cakes too.



HISTORY

A TRIBUTE TO THE LIFE OF Sammy Boama

here is much we don't know about Sammy Boama, the Aboriginal man regarded as "the last of his tribe" in Redcliffe. His birth date and origins are unclear. Arriving from further north, he made his home on the Peninsula, mostly in an area known as Bell's Paddock, Woody Point.

Only a small handful of the older Aboriginal people stayed on after the land was sold and settled. They lived a largely traditional life of hunting and living off the land, while also performing odd jobs.

After the shattering loss of his wife Nellie in 1887 and his daughter soon after, Sammy floundered for a while. Local resident Harriet Bell wanted to help him regain his previous vitality. He was already camped on her property so he began carrying out chores and assisting with her children. It was at this time that he became known as Sammy Bell. Renowned for a cheeky streak and a sense of fun, he would spell that out loud - SAMMY B-E-HELL.

Not inclined to accept offers of transport, he preferred to walk everywhere. Each year he would set off for the Brisbane Exhibition at Bowen Hills and would walk as far as the Bunya Mountains to feast on Bunya Nuts.

Sammy was well known at the jetty where he would meet the visiting steamer, the Emerald, selling oysters and crabs he had caught to the day-trippers from Brisbane.

He would dance a corroboree for them, sometimes singing Pop Goes the Weasel as he performed. Visitors would applaud and throw coins. On one occasion he dived in the water to retrieve a coin that had escaped him, resurfacing with it gleaming between his teeth.

Sammy was very much respected not only by Mrs Bell but by the larger community as well. He died in February 1913 and was buried at the Redcliffe Cemetery. A stone memorial was erected in the shape of a tree trunk with its branches cut short, symbolic of him being the last of his tribe.

The grave is still easy to find, located under a large shady tree, and decorated with many adornments. Standing beside it, you can reflect on the life of a man that straddled two extremely different cultures.

However, a really tight rental market is not good for people who have to rent, and there are many of us. We need to encourage landlords to buy to improve the supply of properties.

At the moment, rental returns are strong with interest rates at all-time lows. Rents are firm, vacancy rates extremely low and rental arrears not at worrying levels.

Even the banks are lending again to those with the ability to service their loan. All told, it appears to be a great time to buy an investment home.


