Market manager Mark Power said it was his first year bringing this event to Redcliffe and he was hoping it would be a beautiful evening out for locals.

"We'll have six bands performing and roving entertainment," he said. "The night will end with a fireworks show and, of course, we're really excited about that."

Redcliffe Farmers and Artisan Markets is an iconic seaside marketplace held on Sunday

each week. The twilight Christmas market will bring some Christmas flair and fun to a market-style event. It will also be a great place to pick up some gifts or spend time with family and friends.

"2020 has been, in a word, bizarre," Mark said. "We've all been cooped up a lot this year. We're trying to bring a little bit of fun to the local community."

"In reaching out to locate fantastic vendors, we feel we've found some unique experiences, passionate artisans and people who are creating a wide range of things not available from a shopping centre. It gives a really nice link to an old-world charm while being very family focused."

The Sunday markets have been continuing through the challenges of this year, and the Christmas market will continue in the same way. There'll be ample room to move around and no restrictions on entry numbers are likely.

"We have a 750-metre site, so there's plenty of space," Mark said. "But we will spread out a lot – widen it. We'll have more entries and exits, that kind of thing."

The event certainly ticks the box for families of all ages, with entertainment, food and stalls to suit everyone. And it's a great way to support local makers, artists and designers too.

"We're working with local set designers and making decorations," he said. "We're trying to work with as many local businesses as we can."

PENINSULA FOOTBALL ON SHOW

Peninsula Power Football Club (FC) is certainly kicking goals in the National Premier League (NPL) Qld. The club is set for a day of celebrating for its last home game fixture of the season.

Peninsula Power FC president Craig Feuerriegel said the game would be against one of its traditional rivals, Lions FC.

"We are both currently in the top four and anticipate this last home game will be a big one, as always is between the two of us," Craig said.

On the club's NPL squad is last year's leading goal scorer Andy Pengelly. Andy is on the radar of a number of Hyundai A-League coaches including head coach of the Brisbane Roar, Warren Moon. Warren is a former player and coach at Peninsula Power.

Craig said the club was going to celebrate National Indigenous Week as part of its celebration events on the day.

"The players are really excited to be wearing Indigenous playing strips," he said.

"They'll have their names across the back [of the jersey] and they'll get to keep them at the end."

The club will also hold a curtain-raiser match between Redcliffe and Margate starting at

5.30pm, to celebrate the history of Peninsula football. Redcliffe FC and Margate FC were amalgamated 20 years ago to form Peninsula Power FC.

The club hasn't looked back since, celebrating a stellar year in the Football Qld Premier League in 2018 by finishing the season undefeated. This resulted in the club being promoted to the NPL Qld last year.

"We had quite a good first year in the NPL, making the finals before finishing third after being knocked out in the semi's by eventual grand final winners Gold Coast Knights," Craig said.

The club will be in full operation mode with the canteen open for food and the bar serving refreshments.

Fans wanting to watch the game and celebrations on the day are advised to contact the club prior to check on the number of attendees allowed.

A BRIGHT IDEA FOR REDCLIFFE SPORTS

Lighting at sporting stadiums is an essential part of holding events and training into evenings, but for many clubs it's just way beyond their financial means.

A recently announced government funding initiative has made what was once thought to be an impossible dream a reality for three clubs on the Peninsula.

The big winner of the funding is the Redcliffe Dolphins stadium, which will receive \$2 million for the installation of broadcast standard lighting, enabling television coverage of games played there.

That's great news for the region, but two other grassroots clubs are also thrilled to have been included in the initiative: Redcliffe Leagues Softball Association for lighting at Talobilla Park in Kippa-Ring (\$369,000), and Peninsula Cricket Club for Filmer Park lighting (\$425,000).

The funding is a joint initiative of the State Government and Moreton Bay Regional Council.

Peninsula Cricket Club senior president Pete Johnson said, "We are a relatively small club and the idea of having four 30m lighting towers was an absolute pipe dream.

"We currently have some very basic lighting, which is only really suitable for some fielding practice or junior games, but this is a whole new ball game - pardon the pun.

"Our local Moreton Bay councillor Karl Winchester was keen to include us in the mix for the sporting grounds lighting grants and thankfully (and surprisingly), we were successful."

The cricket club's junior president Darren Wheeler said, "I think it's very much a 'build it and they will come' scenario.

"There are around 3000 kids involved in cricket in the immediate Brisbane North area, so a facility like this will be great for the wider community as well, especially for shorter form cricket, like T20.

"Once the facility is in place we will be able look at hosting rep games, including things like women's cricket. Night cricket under lights is an essential part of the modern game now."

"The grant has made that all possible; \$400,000 is an awful lot of raffles, sponsor-seeking and sausage sizzles."

Kitesurfers Vie for Biggest High

Huge jumps and breathtaking crashes will entertain spectators as kite boarders compete at the Brissie Big Air Event at Queens Beach in November.

Event organiser Grant Hore said the event would attract thirty of Queensland's most exciting kite boarders all out to win the \$500 cash first prize.

"As the name suggests, it's all about going big," Grant said. "Last year's winner managed just under 17m.

"Riders will compete in timed heats with their jumps recorded on a Woo device mounted on each board.

"Queen's Beach North is a great location as the grass bank provides a good view of the action."

At least 20-knot winds are required, hence the holding period of three weekends. Riders and the public are updated on conditions via social media. The call to run the event is made 48 hours beforehand.

Grant will MC the event as the action unfolds. BBQ food will be available and music will add to the atmosphere. It will be windy, so bring something warm, something to sit on, and your camera, for a fun family day out.

It has been a turbulent and somewhat tragic year for live music, with concert and tour cancellations threatening the livelihoods of artists across the country.

But Redcliffe's annual rock show, Rockin' 4 The Homeless, has made the best of the situation by launching a CD in lieu of its annual show, which aims to raise funds and awareness for local community group The Breakfast Club.

The event's founder and director Dan Nebe said the 2020 event was cancelled due to the uncertainty around live music restrictions during COVID and the many risks involved.

"We had so much on the line with booking flights, production, and all the basic logistics involved in putting on a live concert," he said.

"I wasn't prepared to spend the sponsors money on a 'maybe', so we honestly had no choice but to cancel the event."

It was then that Dan had the idea to continue to raise much-needed funds through music, but instead through the form of a CD, rather than the usual live concert.

"I called my friend Dave Faulkner from the band Hoodoo Gurus to tell him my plan. He said we could have an unreleased track from the band, which was an Australian first," he said.

"I then called Sarah McLeod from The Superjesus and she gave us a track to use on the album as well, and it just went nuts from there.

"It is the best replacement for the live event, in my books."

With a release date set for 1 December the CD, Rockin' 4 The Homeless 2020 - Greatest Hitters, will feature Hoodoo Gurus, The Superjesus, Diana Anaïd, Billy Rad, Team Utopia, Salt & Steel, Abby Skye and 25 other acts.

"The CD celebrates local artists and raises money at the same time," Dan said.

"It's a great alternative to the event and we can still raise money this year to support the Breakfast Club.

"The buzz around it at the moment is amazing - the media and public can't believe we pulled a lineup like this together; it is quite surreal.

"It shows that no matter what is thrown at us, we can adapt, and our local community is good at that. We stick together and help each other out in times of need."

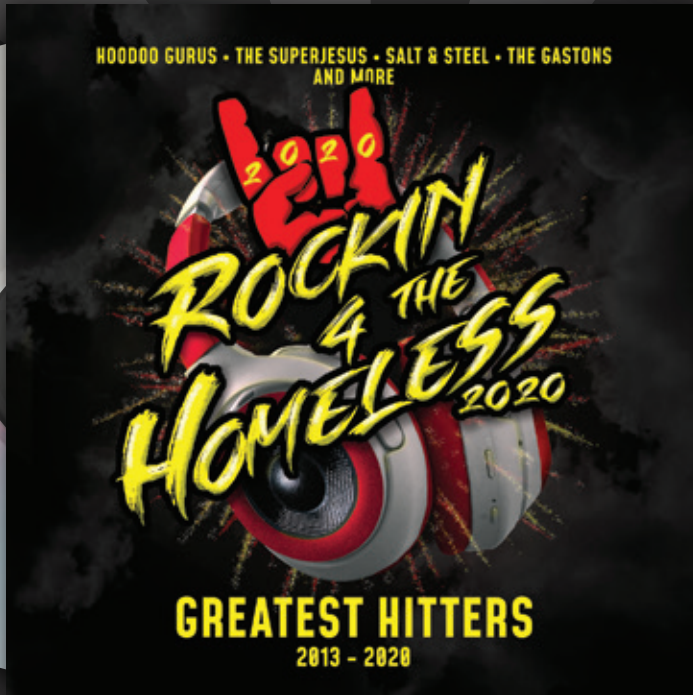

"I've lived in Redcliffe for 17 years. I was born and bred in Brisbane but I spent a couple of years when I was a teenager down in Victoria. I moved here when I was about 16 or 17. I like the lifestyle here – the relaxed parks and beaches. It's still like a quiet town; it hasn't really got too busy yet.

I've been a painter for about the same time I've lived here, and I've had my own business for 12 years. I'm the owner of Zoch Painting, and I do mainly government work – hospitals, community health centres – but I also do private residential and commercial work.

COVID has had a big up-tick on the business. You'd think it would go the opposite way, but the infrastructure within the hospitals has obviously meant things have had to be built. Also, residential work has picked up.

I play guitar and ride motorbikes as well. I'm self-taught [on the guitar] and I play at home just

for my own pleasure. I mainly like classic rock, but I do like heavy metal as well. I don't have a motorbike at the moment, but I'm shopping for one.

I started getting tattooed pretty late, at 26. Nearly all my tattoos are animals, because I'm a real animal person. I grew up with cats and dogs and birds. But I don't have time [for a pet now] and also, I live in an apartment.

I go to the gym, I do yoga, and I like to run. I gave up smoking about three years ago; when I stopped, I had to fill the void. I had a lot more energy, but I had to keep my hands busy. I've always exercised, but I wouldn't run, because I'd run out of puff. So I got really firm with myself [when I stopped smoking] and made a concerted effort. I go to the gym probably three times a week.

Yoga gives you a great chill pill to the brain. It's also great for bringing awareness to the body. There's something about that synergy of brain and body, where you're in flow and in unison. It's good."

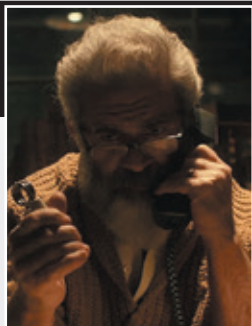

PENINSULA PIMPERNEL



200 Years Settled

In September 2024, Redcliffe will celebrate its 200th birthday. The celebration will no doubt be very different to the low-key celebration when 1700 or so Redcliffe citizens celebrated its centenary on 24 September 1924.

The Centenary celebrations started with the hoisting of the Union Jack by then Mayor Alderman J. B. Dunn at the site where the first Europeans landed in 1824. Commemorative medals were presented to the 300 assembled school children and speeches were made by several dignitaries.

In the afternoon, 38 trees were planted in a new park, located near the landing site, which was named Centenary Park. Subsequently a program of luncheons, dinners and sporting events were held, prior to gala ball being conducted at a local picture theatre.

That 1824 party, the forerunner of the Redcliffe Peninsula's current population of over 60,000, consisted of Lt. Henry Miller and his family, John Oxley, Lt. Butler, Robert Hoddle, Alan Cunningham together with several servants.

Thirteen soldiers and their wives, and 30 convicts made up the party of less than 60 souls. Although planned as a penal colony, these were the first European settlers to live on the Peninsula. However, their stay only lasted around five months before they moved to Brisbane.

But their temporary stay allowed Redcliffe to claim the title of the first white settlement in, what was to become, Queensland.

Publicist for Redcliffe Art Society (RAS) Kathryn Collier said the event was one of the first installations of the new art hub, situated across from the Redcliffe RSL.

"It will showcase an extraordinary collection of works by members of RAS, with categories including land and streetscape, sea and waterscape, portraiture and figure, still life and interior, as well as abstract and contemporary," Kathryn said.

RAS will be celebrating its 60th birthday next year and will host many more exhibitions that showcase the excellence of the Redcliffe community.

FISH OF THE MONTH

Jetty Fishing

How lucky are we? Three fantastic, well maintained Jetties or Piers in our local area – Redcliffe Jetty, Woody Point Jetty and Shorncliffe Pier. Then there is the specialised fishing platform on the Hornibrook Bridge on the mouth of the mighty Pine River, and the beginning of the old bridge at Clontarf, which was left on purpose for posterity and fishing.

These are some of the best places to catch a feed as they are essentially artificial reefs, giving shelter for baitfish and providing solid structure for barnacles and corals to grow. They are also a perfect spot for teaching kids, they have disabled access, and are great for the novice fisherman as there are usually other people there to watch and learn from too.

Our local tackle shops are also a great source of information for which species are being caught and how to catch them, so make sure you see them before you go.

My best tips for fishing off any pier or jetty would be to fish straight down as most of the fish are underneath, even the big ones. Use a fine berley mix to attract the bait; get them feeding and the bigger fish will come in too.

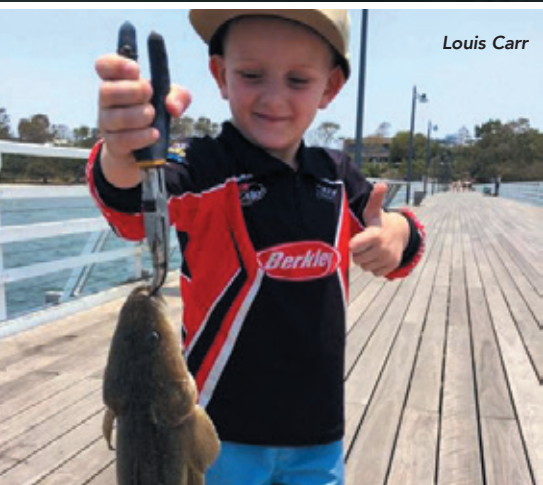
Species that can be caught locally, starting with baitfish like herring, yellowtail pike, yakkas, and garfish, are all good fun and quite easy to catch. Then there are the larger species like bream, whiting, flathead, snapper, mackerel, jewfish, cobia, sharks, squid and so many more.

I love going for a walk sometimes just to see what people are catching. I have also dropped cameras down and posted videos on YouTube of the amazing underwater life at Woody Point and Shorncliffe. It's quite incredible to see the amount of diverse life right under our feet.

CONVOY FOR KIDS CANCELLED FOR 2020

The annual Brisbane Convoy for Kids, usually held in early November every year, has been cancelled for 2020. Convoy for Kids has raised funds for charities like Hummingbird House since 1991.

In a written statement on its website and social media, the Brisbane Convoy for Kids committee stated, "This is because of the uncertainty of COVID-19 restrictions and the difficulties in having a COVID-19 Safe Plan approved. The well-being of our volunteers, convoy participants and the many supporters that help make the day a success is our number one priority."

It was confirmed that next year's Convoy for Kids would be held on the 6 November 2021. You can find the committee's official statement on its website – brisbaneconvoyforkids.com.au – as well as alternative ways to support the organisation.

THE FRIENDLY GROCERS MOVE INTO ROTHWELL STORE

Rothwell locals were excited when new store Friendly Grocers Rothwell, opened in the location of the former Rothwell IGA. Many residents were pleased not to have to travel to Redcliffe

or Kippa-Ring to do their shopping. One social media user said, "Thank goodness! I've really missed just being able to shoot down to the end of the street for something." Some people who had visited the store offered compliments about store's customer service as well.

SWOOPING SEASON

We have entered swooping bird season for magpies, plovers, butcherbirds, crows, noisy miners, peewees and noisy friarbirds. Spring is the most common and active time for these birds, protecting and defending their young by swooping. However, it is possible for the swooping season to start in late-winter and last until late-summer. Moreton Bay Regional Council has released a fact sheet on the best ways to protect yourself from swooping birds, as well as advice about when to contact the council to handle a swooping bird situation. For the full fact sheet, go to the council website: www.moretonbay.qld.gov.au and type 'swooping birds' into the search bar.

WIDENING OF DECEPTION BAY ROAD PROJECT

The Department of Transport and Main Roads has given the green light to a project to widen Deception Bay Road to a total of four lanes. The project will add a second northbound lane and

a second southbound lane between the Anzac Avenue and Morris Road intersections. The State Government has provided \$7 million for the completion of this project, which commenced in February this year and is scheduled to be completed by late 2020. Many local Deception Bay residents have a positive response to the project, with some saying the improvement was long overdue. Other residents were concerned about the local wildlife and tree life along the stretch of road, with one social media user commenting, "Hopefully something to keep the wildlife safe as well. I'd imagine a huge chunk of the national park and bush will be going for the upgrade." There were also residents calling for more road repairs and improvements in other areas of Deception Bay, and calls for the speed limit to be lifted from its current 70km/h limit to 80km/h.

A FISHY COMMERCIAL SHOT IN MARGATE BY DOMINO'S

Locals were buzzing this month when a Domino's Pizza ad appeared on television. The ad shows a car with computer-generated fish driving it, heading down Duffield Road towards the ocean. As residents discussed the commercial, one user stated that it was being shown in New Zealand. Some locals claimed to have seen the film crew also shooting at Domino's Clontarf. Social media users mentioned there had been a few other companies that had shot ads on and around the Peninsula, including an old Subway commercial filmed at the basketball courts near the lagoon, as well as ads for a car brand and an insurance company.

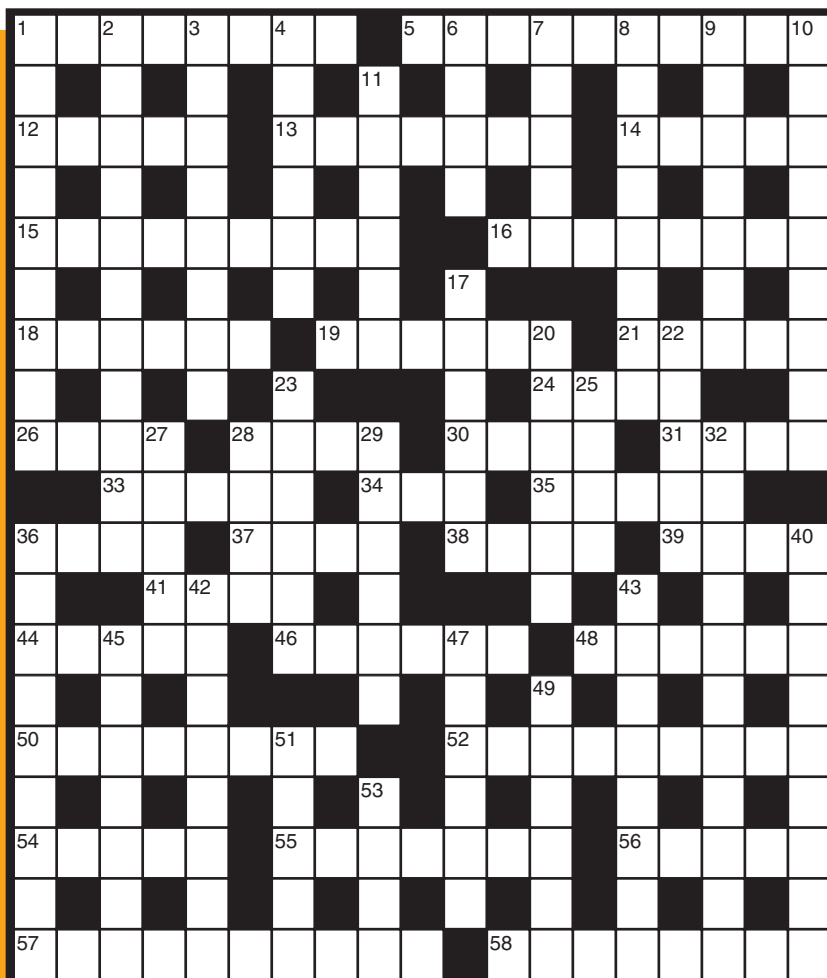

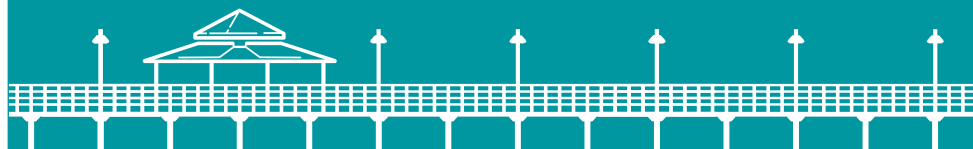

CAMBRIDGE HOUSE AND THE BELOVED FRANGIPANI TREE

For much of its earlier days, the Redcliffe Peninsula was popular as a destination for day-trippers and holidaymakers. Visitors from Brisbane would arrive by steamship and accommodation soon sprung up beside the piers at Woody Point and Redcliffe.

Cambridge House was built at Woody Point in 1891 by Mary and William Edds. Mary had already operated a boarding house in Edward Street, Brisbane, and brought with her a beautifully crafted red cedar wardrobe, quite a talking point amongst early guests. Her niece Florence, who she raised as a daughter from the age of nine, assisted her in the daily operations.

For over 40 years, Mary, Florence, and the next generation, Lucy and Ena, ran the guesthouse. Due to the untimely deaths of their husbands, it was mainly the women who kept the place going.

A convivial atmosphere pervaded the rooms with music, laughter and chatter in the background. At some stage a frangipani tree was planted, becoming a symbol of the happiness and goodwill of Cambridge House. Throughout the years, the flowers of this much-loved tree

were gathered and sometimes used in wedding bouquets. The guesthouse was later divided into four flats, maintaining the grand old dining room, which, over the years, had served as a community hub and venue for church services too.

In 1971 the building was scheduled for demolition, with Point Plaza being built on the site soon after. A farewell reunion of relatives and friends was organised. For 80 years this place had held people together, and the moment prompted Lucy to write a poem, the first and final stanzas of which read:

*The sigh of the wind in the Frangipani Tree,
Sounds of the waves of the nearby sea
Memories linger of happy days gone by,
The home so treasured by you and I.*

*Farewell to the past – a new era to face
We honour the old - enter Cambridge Place.
Tides do not wait but come and go by the sea
And the winds still sigh through the Frangipani Tree.*

Daphne Gibbs, daughter of Lucy (Whitehouse) and now in her eighties, made cuttings of the original frangipani tree, and one of these was recently planted beside the Redcliffe Museum. History lives on.

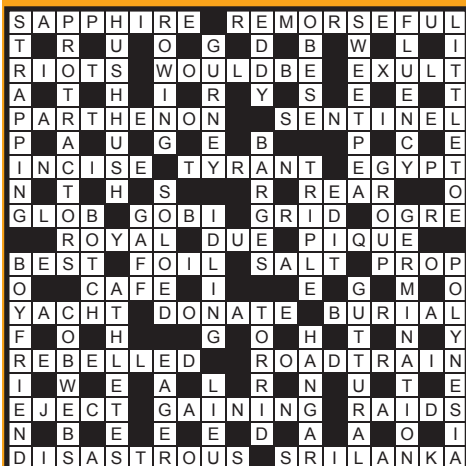

Kay sees a pattern in the reasons that people are choosing a farm-stay experience. "We get a lot of people who have a strong desire to know, and for their kids to learn, where their food is coming from, and also people who want to reconnect with their family history of the farming lifestyle."

"If people want a working farm experience, with a real country authenticity, then that's what they will get with us," Kay said.

A different style of farm-stay can be found at Wild Duck Farm or Wittacork Dairy Cottages near Maleny, where luxury is the focus. Visitors are still welcome to help out with chores such as feeding the animals or collecting eggs, but relaxing and unwinding is the most important job for guests to do.

There are many more farm-stays within a short drive of Brisbane, from the Sunshine Coast Hinterland to Northern NSW, so why not get online and book a real country experience for you and your family, down on the farm.

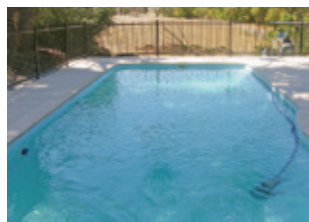

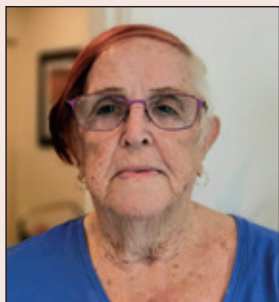

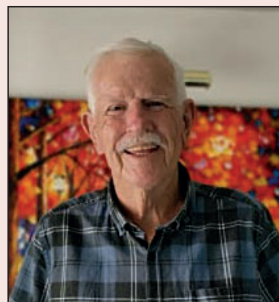
