Of course, we also bring you an array of delectable dining and entertainment options that will make those Christmas get-togethers extra special.



ay goodbye to 2020 in style, with Redcliffe Farmers and Artisan Markets New Year's Eve Twilight Market. This family-friendly celebration overlooking the bay is set to be one big party, boasting live entertainment, a sideshow alley, and of course, two spectacular fireworks displays.

Redcliffe Farmers and Artisan Markets market co-ordinator Mark Power said that although this year had been hard for many, the markets were bigger and better than ever. He said it had been really rewarding being able to extend the market due to the post-COVID community support of local businesses.

He said the event was guaranteed to entertain and feed all, as organisers had ensured there was something enjoyable for every member of the family.

"We will have all of the usual things you would expect at one of our events," Mark said. "Amazing gourmet street eats, lots of great food vendors, and plenty of in-market entertainment including fire entertainers, DJs, musicians and stilt walkers. It will be a really vibrant, upbeat party vibe."

The event will be a foodies delight with way too many decadent treats to list. But with wood-fired pizzas, artisan doughnuts and melt-in-your mouth calamari, you are sure to keep your belly satisfied.

The fireworks displays are at 7.30pm for the littlies and the adults can enjoy the 9.30pm event while the kiddies sleep – if they can close their eyes after the excitement of the night.

Mark said the markets would give people an opportunity to purchase homemade artisan goods and entertainment on the three main stages would have guests dancing in the street as the live music takes flight, with solo acts and DJs to carry you into 2021.

"It might have been a fizzer of a year, but this is our chance to bid it farewell with a bang and to set the right tone for 2021, which should be about all of us coming together and celebrating," Mark said.

The stadium will sparkle with Christmas lights when it transforms into a winter wonderland to host the 2020 Redcliffe Christmas Carols.

Moreton Bay Region Industry and Tourism (MBRIT) and Moreton Bay Regional Council are creating the event in the new location to help with contact tracing requirements. In true 2020 style, there are new safety measures in place to ensure the enjoyment of all attendees that align with a COVID-safe event.

MBRIT CEO Shane Newcombe said the family-friendly event would look slightly different this year but they were thrilled to be able to deliver the 2020 Christmas carols program after such a difficult year for the community.

Moreton Bay Regional Council Mayor Peter Flannery said it was important to help the community celebrate the road to recovery after a turbulent start to the year.

"The fact that we're able to celebrate like this is a testament to the hard work of every local in keeping us safe from the coronavirus, so we deserve this," he said. "I'm proud that that we've been able to roll out this program of Christmas

events for our local community, with just a few changes to ensure that we keep everyone safe."

The changes to this year's carols include a walkthrough Santa experience, which is a mock North Pole, instead of the usual rides and Santa's village.

It will also provide plenty of stage entertainment – with the performers still to be announced – singing all your favourite festive carols, and the finale will showcase an incredible fireworks display.

Although the event is still free family fun, preregistering online is required in order to obtain your ticket. There will be no tickets available on the day.

"Christmas is such a wonderful time and I think families will welcome the festive cheer more than ever this year," Cr Flannery said.

edcliffe's much-loved Bee Gees Way is set to reopen for the Christmas school holidays after being closed for upgrades since October. Moreton Bay Regional Council has been revamping the audio, visual and lighting infrastructure of the attraction to ensure longevity.

Mayor Peter Flannery said the technology installed over five years ago had stood the test of time well outdoors considering it had been exposed to salty sea breezes and the elements.

He said the delivery of the \$244,000 contract would be completed before the annual Christmas rush to allow tourists and locals to enjoy the tribute to the once-local band.

"There's no questioning the immortality of this major tourism drawcard on the Peninsula, but these works are essential to ensure no one questions How Deep Is Our Love for the Bee Gees." he said.

Councillor for Division 6 Karl Winchester said he was thrilled to be able to continue the legacy the Bee Gees had left to this unique part of the Moreton Bay Region.

"The Bee Gees hold a special place in the hearts of many in Redcliffe and it is a priority of Council

aterfront hotel Mon Komo is having a \$3 million makeover, with the new look set to be revealed in February 2021.

The popular bayside venue has been purchased by Belvedere Hotel owners Lewis Land Group.

Lewis Land Group Queensland Regional Leisure Manager Chris Allison said Mon Komo would keep its name and the renovation project, titled Seabrae, will be mostly cosmetic to modernise the existing structure.

"We are returning to a traditional public bar-style operation," Chris said. "The main dining area is receiving a really nice, modern facelift with the focus being on food and beverage service. There will be lots of booth seating and we will be redoing the terrace area as well to make it more comfortable with a gazebo style structure out the front that will protect from the elements."

Chris said the terrace would have garden spaces for events of up to 30 people, with the big outdoor space being able to be split into sections, much like the Belvedere. The current gardens were being lowered so patrons could enjoy the waterfront view while enjoying their meal and drinks.

"We are focusing on casual celebrations," he said. "We will be doing a lot of nice cocktails and are putting in a food concept, which is a charcoal rotisserie. It will be great. We will be able to do the best chicken and chips you've ever had, we'll have a modern take on kebabs, and some zesty, summery seaside flavours to enjoy.

"Like the Belvedere, we want to become a destination venue for the Peninsula. We expect a synergy between the two venues, but they're not going to be exactly the same. We want Mon Komo to be the sort of place where a broader cross-section of people can come."

Chris said the gaming room was also getting a revamp to include socially distanced games machines to create a more professional and comfortable gaming experience.

"Mon Komo will be a place people know they can enjoy good food and drinks and have a flutter in the gaming room, or go to the traditional public bar and have a nice cold beer as well," he said.

"We are not big nightclub and entertainment operators, so the night club component will not be returning."

"We love to support the local gallery network and are thrilled to be part of this prestigious event," Eleanor said.



KYRON'S PITCH PERFECT DOCUMENTARY

ighteen-year-old Kyron (Ky) Lovell has a very rare musical gift – he has perfect pitch.

The multi-instrumentalist from Redcliffe is conquering stereotypes about disabilities by showing off his natural musical talents in a documentary.

The complicated pieces he can play led to a documentary showcasing his abilities being

submitted into the Focus on Ability Film Festival. Ky's film was nominated as one of the top five finalists for the NOVA Choice award, with entrants from over 26 countries around the world.

The Focus on Ability Film Festival films are available to view on their website.

Ky was diagnosed at birth with Noonan Syndrome. He had epilepsy until he was eight and is on the autistic spectrum. Ky's intellectual and physical disabilities create a daily challenge for the talented musician.

Ky's mother Tahlia said she decided in the hospital she was going to ensure him every opportunity. By not excluding her son and following his cues, a passion for music was developed and has left everyone in awe of Ky's "wild" talents.

As soon as Tahlia could prop Ky up he would start drumming with any item he could get his hands on – tins, sticks, pens – and although he is mostly non-verbal, he can name every musical instrument.

"Music is his world," Tahlia said. "He plays music from the time he wakes up to when he sleeps. His music therapist discovered he has perfect pitch. It's such a rare thing to have. He has always had this crazy ability to play what he can hear, but we didn't realise it had a label."

This talent saw him be immediately accepted into the Queensland College of Music after they witnessed his skills on a marimba, an instrument Ky had never played before.

"He could see a marimba and got very excited, saying marimba over and over," Tahlia said.

"They gave him some mallets and he started playing. They were blown away."

"People with significant disabilities can do magnificent things; if they don't get opportunities nothing happens," Tahlia said. "It's the freaks of nature that inspire us – and it's amazing that Ky's talent is being highlighted."

ant to learn something new while sitting in traffic? It's as easy as downloading the 'Stuff You Should Know' podcast.

Hosts Josh and Chuck have done their research into a broad range of topics over the last 12 years – and I mean really broad. From Chaos Theory, to LSD, and how diabetes works.

Some of the topics are fascinating and some can fall a bit flat, but I guess it all depends on what you're into. That's why I don't recommend listening to the show chronologically. Instead, I suggest scrolling through and finding a topic that floats your boat, like the episode "Why is it so hard to say 'Toy Boat' 3 times" (try it).

The durations vary as much as the topics with bite-size 10-minute snippets to hour-long chunky shows.

They don't just pick themes out of thin air; they cover current topics such as COVID and the US election.

Subjects are put in simple terms without ever being condescending, plus one of the hosts sounds similar to comedian John C. Reilly, which makes it all the more entertaining.

Overall, it should make it easier for you to contribute to conversations in a meaningful way, or at least sound smart down at the pub.





MEDALLION LAUNCH

ack in 2014, History Redcliffe, the historical society for the Redcliffe Peninsula, embarked on a project to create a limitededition series of 10 collectible medallions to be produced and released each year from 2014 to 2024.

The sixth medallion, Hornibrook Bridge Portal 1935, was released on 11 November, to coincide with the bridge's 85th anniversary celebrated this year. It was the construction of the Hornibrook Bridge, making the Peninsula accessible by car, which enticed new residents, businesses and visitors, leading to a massive period of growth.

"The society wanted to raise awareness of the significance of Redcliffe as the site of the first European settlement in Queensland, and identify some of the icons of the area," secretary Rae Frawley said.

"These medallions were to be designed and produced to reflect the character, history and environs of the Peninsula and provide an opportunity for people to acquire a special and valuable collection in the lead up to the 200th anniversary of the first European settlement, in

community consultation resulted in 10 icons being chosen that are representative of the rich cultural history of

this region. Medallions numbers one to five depicted; The Brig Amity 1824; The Red Cliffs 1799; Redcliffe Jetty 1922; SS Koopa 1911; and Redcliffe Anzac Memorial Avenue 1925.

"Our project is on target to culminate with the release of our tenth and final medallion in 2024," Rae said. "At that time, History Redcliffe intends releasing a limited number of full sets (10 medallions) for auction. These items make lovely gifts and come in an individual presentation box. Many of our customers order each new edition as they build their own complete collection."






The Bramble Bay Bowls Club will be hosting a rock 'n' roll sesh with Cool Coda in the middle of the month.

Of course, it wouldn't feel like Christmas without a tree, so if you're on the hunt for a



I often write stuff down after I've done a gig. I record my gigs on my phone. You're always in good form after a gig and that is a good time to think of stuff.

What do you enjoy about performing in smaller venues in comparison to your **Comedy Festival venues?**

Any venues would be good in 2020. I always do all types of venues. Pubs, clubs, bars, sales, theatres, toilets - you name it, I'll do it.

What can the audience expect from your show?

A good laugh and that's it. You will be none the wiser at the end of the show. I don't have any strong opinions on anything, other than I have the right to not have a strong opinion on anything. I have the right to squander my freedom of speech on nothing and say nothing of any importance.

After 30 years in the industry, do you ever get nervous in front of a crowd?

Yes, I do. If I haven't done a gig for a long time, I am in a right state of panic. And I haven't done a gig for guite a long time, such has been the nature of 2020.

ustralia is home to about 90 species of mistletoe – not the kind that is part of the European Christmas tradition (although Aussies have been known to improvise), but our very own distinctive and equally attractive ones.

Unusual and often misunderstood plants, Australian mistletoes come in many shapes and sizes. Flowering results in a dramatic show of yellow, orange or red. They are semi-parasitic, growing on the branches of natives such as eucalypts, casuarinas, and callistemons, relying on their host for water and support.

The Redcliffe Cemetery has some beautiful specimens growing on the bottlebrushes that have been planted there. Sometimes, it is their tubular orange flowers fallen to the ground that will alert you to their presence. Many of the eucalypts along Hornibrook Esplanade at Woody Point are heavy with them, some trees having multiple clumps.

Remarkably, they appear to mimic the growth form of the tree they are living on, producing foliage practically identical to their host, sometimes making them hard to see. This

resemblance is believed to be a product of evolution. One species that lives on casuarinas, forming long needle-like leaves, can be seen growing in Nathan Road Reserve.

Parasitic plants and animals have famously bad reputations, yet they form an important part of the ecosystems in which they live. Mistletoes provide a valuable source of food with their nectar-filled flowers and fleshy berries. Possums, insects, and birds feed on them and find shelter within their dense foliage.

One tiny bird, amongst Australia's smallest, has developed a strong relationship with them. The Australian mistletoebird feeds almost exclusively on the little berries, acting as one of the main distributors of the seeds. It takes less than 30 minutes for a seed to pass through its short digestive system, to be then excreted in a sticky mound on the branch of a tree, ready for the next generation of mistletoes to grow.

The mistletoebird is not so easy to see. Small and fast, a sighting may require some patience. It is only the male that has a red chest; females are dullish grey, making identification tricky.

School holidays are approaching, so make a point of getting out into nature with the kids and marvel at all the intricate relationships.





nder a recent election promise, the State Government will invest \$6 million towards planning for a major expansion of the Redcliffe Hospital.

The investment will go towards planning for the proposed expansion, which would see an increase in capacity to deliver more inpatient beds, additional surgery capacity, and expanded services for the local community.

"The Redcliffe Hospital's catchment population is projected to grow significantly across all age groupings, with the largest growth expected for people aged 70 years and older," Ms D'Ath said.

These plans follow the announcement of a new MRI machine, which has been installed at the hospital and due to be optional this month.

ermentation is a natural process that has occurred for millennia, however, the advent of distilling required human intervention in the form of alchemy. Owner and master distiller of the Brisbane Distillery Company at West End Jon Atherton said, "I think COVID has really made people look to local with fresh eyes. Not only are we starting to reassess our holiday options but there's also more of a shift to buying local and supporting local, which I think is really fantastic."

Jon uses all natural, local ingredients to create some of his acclaimed gins, which include Game of Eucalyptus, Brisbane Dry and Phat Chai. The Brisbane Distillery Company also operates a Gin School, offering guests the opportunity to create and take home their own unique gin blend, using botanicals that cover citrus, floral or herbal flavour profiles.

Jon has seen a wide range of people keen to enrol in Gin School.

"I think the recent uptake in arts and crafts has now extended to activities like this, with people from all walks of life embracing activities including baking, preserving, renovating, and of course, distilling," he said. "With the help of our gin coaches anybody can master the art – and with over a trillion combinations with the botanicals we have on hand, you will certainly have something unique."

There are also other distilleries around South-East Queensland that offer a great place to visit and sample some great gin, vodka, and rum, all made right here.

ost people starting out fishing in our local area will head to the beach, our famous jetties, the Hornibrook Bridge or the Pine River. The most common catches will be bream, whiting, snapper, flathead and smaller species such as garfish and pike. Of these, whiting would be my favourite to eat, although flathead comes very close second.

To catch flathead, a 6-7 foot light rod with 12-15lb line will suffice. You can even buy little tackle boxes with the right size hooks and sinkers for the species you want to target. Baits can vary but the old staples like prawns and beach or blood worms work, as well as small pilchards and live baits or lures. Our local tackle shops are the best place for a bit more advice and the fishing gear that will fit your budget.

Late afternoon and early morning are prime times and even night fishing places like Sandgate and Brighton waterfronts or Suttons Beach on high tide under the lights produce some great fish.

The fish species you will encounter in these areas have size and possession limits, so without listing them all, I would recommend using the search function or download a fishing app on your phone. Even I confess to using these sometimes, as it is the most up-to-date way of ensuring you are not breaking the law.

There are a lot of flathead around at the moment so it pays to go for a walk at low tide and look for the lays or impressions they leave in the sand when waiting for food to pass by, then come back at high tide and have a go at catching them. A tip: the lays are the same shape as the fish.

Tight lines!
