Local Literary Advocate Honoured With Australia Day Award

riters write - that's the message Scarborough's Jim Higgins is passionate about conveying to emerging writers on the Peninsula and beyond.

So passionate, in fact, that he has been awarded the 2021 Australia Day Arts and Culture Award for Moreton Bay Region, in recognition of his contribution in encouraging writers to share their story and connect with each other and the community.

As the President of the Fellowship of Australia Writers Queensland (FAWQ), Jim was instrumental in bringing the inaugural Readers and Writers Festival to the Moreton Bay in June this year – a feat that promises to be a drawcard for the national and international literary community.

He also has an active role in the Redcliffe Writers Group, and hosts the Redcliffe Writers Open Mic, which gives writers an opportunity to network and share their writing with an audience.

Jim said he was surprised and humbled to receive the award.

"I am incredibly honoured," he said. "This award is recognition of the connections with



community made through the creative act of encouraging people to share their stories.

"The Redcliffe Writers Open Mic is an event built on the concept that writing is an art that connects – and connection builds community.

"This fostering of community is also reflected in the theme of our FAWQ Readers and Writers Festival – Stories Creating Connection – and that is exactly what I hope it achieves.

"It's an opportunity for everyone to share their stories openly, creatively and honestly. Sharing our story connects us because as humans we are simply the collection of thoughts and actions that reach back and project forward, to create our present reality."

The festival seeks to inspire, to be inclusive and accessible, to connect readers and writers, and to showcase South-East Queensland's emerging literary talent. Many local and interstate authors will present on topics of great value and interest to writers.

Fellow writer Renee Bugden, who nominated Jim for this award, said it was great to see the profile of writing being raised.

"With so many creative arts in the region, writing in Moreton Bay is overlooked," she said. "Jim makes an impact through both the Redcliffe Writers Open Mic and the upcoming Readers and Writers Festival."

Bob said the presentations offered at the expo aimed to show everyone a new skill, and he was impressed by the number of women and children that were showing interest in the event.



"All proceeds go to the charity, and generous donations come from local and online businesses."

As a cocktail-style event, women can expect a drink upon arrival to the Waters Edge, dinner, live entertainment, stalls, raffles, photo opportunities, and games that take place all night.

The event focuses on mental health, as it's something very important to Bec, and first started from a feeling of wanting a night out for herself.

"Contribution and connection fill my heart and make me feel really good, and I wanted other women to be a part of that feeling too," Bec said.

The charity of choice for the next event is Suicide Prevention Pathways (SPP), and donations will help support the staff, awareness resources, client support resources, and service delivery.

Also attending the event will be SPP CEO Shana Challenor, Women

With the impact of restrictions and lockdown back in early 2020, Bec said the feeling of continuing the event was as strong as ever, as she needed to continue for not only herself but the community,

WASTE WARRIORS CAMPAIGN FOR CLEAN

ar has been declared on the Peninsula
– and everyone is invited to join the
fight. The enemy is litter, and your
mission – should you choose to accept it – is to
help make the Redcliffe Peninsula Australia's
cleanest community.

A lofty goal, perhaps, but the Pristine Peninsula Community Group, which is leading the charge with Love Our Clontarf – a 100-day campaign that launched on 29 January to reduce litter – is confident of a win. Local residents and businesses are invited to join the battle.

Some of the campaign's initiatives include hotspot litter audits, litter warning signs, a community suburban litter collection trailer, and 'adopt a street' clean-ups.

The group's founder, Les Barkla, said the campaign was modelled on the successful Love Essex Campaign in the UK, which involved a combination of litter awareness and education about the consequences of litter, and enforcement warnings.

"The Essex Campaign reported a two-fifths reduction in fast food litter and a 41 per cent

reduction in litter overall," Les said. "We are aiming for similar or better litter reduction results during our campaign."

Some of the major stakeholders throwing their support behind the initiative are Cr Karl Winchester, state MP Yvette D'Ath, federal MP Luke Howarth, Moreton Bay Regional Council, Clontarf Beach State High School, McDonalds Clontarf, Citipointe Church, Woolworths Redcliffe and Margate, Redcycle, and Replas Recycled Plastic Products.

The Love our Clontarf Litter Campaign is targeting a two-kilometre radius of the Snook and King Streets intersection, Elizabeth Avenue, and Frawley Fields precinct.

Les said the campaign had been inspired by the band of "waste warriors" – local residents who currently do daily litter collections, including Sue and Phil Johnson, who fill a 240L council bin every week with litter in their local streets.

Les said the litter problem was highlighted by the recent summer rains that had washed litter onto Peninsula beaches and foreshores, and also by COVID-19 restrictions, which had created a large increase in takeaway packaging and mask litter.

"All this litter has to go somewhere; it doesn't just disappear," he said. "In heavy rain, the litter flows down gutters and drains into our waterways, potentially not breaking down for hundreds of years. We now have micro-plastics back in our food chain."

ity people who own herding-breed dogs as pets may find this all too familiar. Chasing cars, birds, rounding up other dogs at the park, and ignoring recall are most likely signs your dog is simply trying to herd.

Working dog breeds that are domestic pets who play in back yards, visit the local park, and have never seen a sheep, often transform in front of their owner's eyes in their first visit to trainer John Borg.

"The problem is we are trying to communicate with our dogs with human language, human instinct, and human emotion," John said.

"The issue is they are dogs, not humans, and we have to learn to talk to the dogs in their own language, which is body language."

John has always had an affinity with animals, and began training and competing at sheep-herding shows in 2012 with his first working dog, Bindi.

Born and raised in Redcliffe, John competes against farmers and sheep-station owners, and learned that by using sheep to train people's dogs, he could help city dog owners understand their pets.

"I tend to have a natural connection with dogs and they with me, so my training started evolving and I don't train like a lot of other guys; I'm more in tune to the animal and the dog," he said. John said he learned that it was not about domination, but respect.

"Because I'm surrounded by dogs all the time and have 14 of my own, I see the body language between them," he said. "My pack leader, the alpha, does not dominate the other dogs, they all show mutual respect.

"So that's what I try to convey to people now and that helps change the way they communicate with their pet, by understanding their body language."

With more than 200 city dogs a week coming to see John, he said the most rewarding part of his day was seeing the enjoyment the dogs got from doing something instinctive.

"I love the new dog when the light comes on and they realise what they have got to do; it's a moving thing," he said.

"Then when their humans see their city pet – never been on a sheep farm before – naturally work the sheep, they are just so happy and proud."

All types of sheep herding breeds can come to the farm, such as Border Collies, Kelpies, German Shepards, Samoyeds, Rottweilers, and even Corgis.

evival Green is a workshop space in Margate that is currently home to a gallery of artworks, an array of potted plants, and home-spun gifts like macrame wall-hangings.

With entry through Soul Harvest Wholefoods cafe, the studio has been designed by local artist Kate Cartwright of Lion Sword Designs, with a purpose that is incredibly close to her heart.

The concept is for art and community workshops to flourish here – Revival Green is to facilitate 'creative play'; to help people rediscover their creative gifts and how to use them.

"I want to encourage people to explore creatively, so that they can understand more about their purpose in life – not that they are defined by one thing," Kate said.

"People have so many gifts that they have no idea about – so much stored inside them that they can take out into the world to create change."

According to Kate, Revival Green is also about building a stronger sense of connection for the local populace.

"This is a great place – I want to build more of a community," she said.

Community gatherings and events that are still in development include workshops on creative painting, zero waste/sustainability ideas, and planting tutorials.

There's also the opportunity for people to host their own workshops in order to share their creative knowledge.

"I want people to come here and refill their cup and leave inspired," Kate said.

Revival Green is a space that's been specifically created to nurture the senses so creativity can flow.

"We all have an inner garden; if we don't tend to it becomes harder to look after. I want people to feel like they are supported," Kate said.

"It's about getting rid of old mindsets and default settings – I want people to find that freedom through that [creative] process."

For Kate, art has the ability to speak to people in a way that can bypass any preconceived notions.

"Dream big – I mean really big. Life in general is art," she said.





Each month I'll be sharing a snapshot of what's current and happening in real estate in the Redcliffe area.

ur property market ended on a high last year in light of the global pandemic. Australia has managed well against many overseas countries with local agents reporting the housing market as extremely busy. Why is this so, and what is driving this hive of activity?

According to Mary Di Marco from Waterfront Properties Redcliffe, "the market is being driven by the record low interest rates". She said this was driving a large volume of buyers and an increase in activity. "We expect much of the same in 2021," Mary said.

With the shift to working from home, buyers are seeking properties that offer options. Detached properties, homes with separate areas such as a granny flat or a separate office area have proven popular. This has resulted in a reduction of demand for apartments and units.

Redcliffe has always been popular with families and those wanting a sea change. Its casual more relaxed lifestyle makes it easy to go for a swim after work, walk along the beach, or grab some fish and chips while watching the sunset. Recreational water activities are popular as are the weekend markets. Redcliffe is spoiled for choice in casual seaside dining as well as great upmarket options too. Transport infrastructure has been upgraded with the Brisbane CBD around 1 hour via train from Kippa-Ring. There are many suburban shopping centres with the majors, discount stores and friendly local shops providing an eclectic choice for shopping Westfield North Lakes being close completes the picture. Housing options are just as varied, providing a mixed choice.

The housing market is moving upwards quickly, illustrated in one recent example from Mary: a contract that didn't proceed in October, due to finance, sold in November for an additional \$40,000 more than the original offer. Both seller and buyer were ecstatic with the sale price.

Currently the median house price for Redcliffe is \$451,000, a 1.3 per cent growth increase in the last 12 months and a capital growth of 4.88 per cent in the last five years. (Source: CommBank property app 14/1/21).



HISTORY

Henry Tubbs
- Famous and
Infamous in
Redcliffe History

enry Ibberson Tubbs was a man of many hats – boarding house owner, coach service provider, returning officer, councillor, preacher, deacon, doctor, and a pharmacist, and it is the last two hats that made him infamous on the Redcliffe Peninsula.

Born in England in March 1846, Henry arrived in Redcliffe in early 1881. He purchased a block of land on the corner of Marine Parade and Sydney Street, and constructed a large cottage that he named Orient House. This was only the third building to be built in Redcliffe, after John Sutton's Hurley House and O'Leary's Redcliffe Hotel.

When the coach service from Redcliffe to Brisbane closed, Henry saw an opportunity and revived the service.

Bushfires in late 1881 destroyed Henry's home, despite his valiant efforts to save it by throwing buckets of water on it. His coach and assorted furniture were saved from the blaze, but the house was lost. Not to be beaten, he rebuilt – a two-storey boarding house, which would eventually accommodate 150 beds, also named Orient House.

Henry was active in local affairs, lobbying for a dam to provide a permanent water supply for the town, which was rejected, and for better public transport and a school, which were successful. In 1888, the Redcliffe division was proclaimed and Henry became the returning officer for the district. Elections were held annually then. In 1890 at the age of 43, he married Emily Parkinson. They had no children.

Elected to Council in 1891, he served until 1908. For a time, he was also acting chairman.

Due to a lack of medical personnel and facilities on the Humpybong Peninsula, Henry often treated locals, acting as doctor, with medicines he created in his 'chemist shop'. He was in high demand.

In 1909, the newspapers reported one of the most infamous scandals in Redcliffe history. A woman that Henry had been treating, Emma Pearce, died after suffering a miscarriage and subsequently acute peritonitis. Tubbs prescribed opium and rye, and later, strychnine and morphine. The doctor from Sandgate was summoned, but it was too late and Mrs Pearce could not be saved.

Police were called in. Tubbs admitted to practising medicine without a licence, among other things, but he was so popular that even Mrs Pearce's husband strongly supported him at the inquest. He was exonerated.

Henry's sister, Gertrude Cohen, took over the boarding house in 1913 and he eventually left the Peninsula in 1916. He died in Sydney on 23 August, 1919 following treatment for carcinomas.



believe Australia's premier sportfish is this "Red Dog". Sought after by many sports fishers, the mangrove jack is great at busting you up in the rocks and snags.

It takes lures and live baits and seem to be more plentiful in the hot summer months and stormy days, so this a great time to get out there and chase it.

The mangrove jack can grow to well over a metre long, with most of the huge fish found out on the reef. A 60cm fish in the rivers or bay in South East Queensland is a great catch, but not uncommon, where most fish I see are below 50cm.

Found from around Sydney north and right around the top end to Geraldton in WA, they are 5-star for eating quality, although a lot of avid anglers now practise catch and release.

My favourite method to target these brutes is drifting live bait such as herring or mullet a few feet below a float along rock walls, rock bars, mangrove lines, and bridge pylons.

These amazing fish can also make great pets, although due to their aggression and appetite, they are not compatible with many other species in an aquarium.


