tep up and say no to violence against women and children at a breakfast with some special guest speakers.

Sue and Lloyd Clarke from Small Steps 4 Hannah will be speaking at a breakfast hosted by the Zonta Club of Redcliffe Inc this month.

Club president Marie Stewart said the event had been organised as part of the annual international campaign, 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence.

"It starts on 25 November, the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, and runs until 10 December, Human Rights Day," Marie said. "It was started by activists at the inaugural Women's Global Leadership Institute in 1991."

Small Steps 4 Hannah co-founder Lloyd Clarke said he and Sue would be at the breakfast to talk

about how the foundation started and what it does.

"The Small Steps 4 Hannah Foundation formed in memory of our daughter Hannah and her children, Aaliyah, Laianah and Trey, in February 2020 to start a movement for change, to HALT (Hannah, Aaliyah, Laianah, Trey) domestic violence and champion the introduction of coercive control legislation and education," Lloyd said.

"Through advocacy, education, funding and support service networks we are creating a safer, well-informed community that promotes respect and the confidence to act."

Lloyd said he and Sue would also be discussing the issue of coercive control.

"We want to get the message out about what healthy and positive relationships should look like," he said.


"We'll also be talking about our work with the Queensland Government's domestic violence taskforce, where we are lobbying to have coercive control recognised as a criminal offence. Importantly, as part of the foundation's ongoing education work, we will talk about some of the warning signs of coercive control, such as dictating what a person may wear, who they can see or where they are allowed to go. We'll talk about how to recognise these early signs in your partner, in your friends or even in yourself."

The breakfast is one of several projects the Zonta Club of Redcliffe Inc is organising as part of the campaign.

"It is important for individuals and businesses to support us by buying tickets to attend this breakfast to join with Zonta in Saying No to Violence against Women and Children," Marie said.



Clubhouse Reno Saves The Day

ummer at Suttons Beach is looking even more sensational thanks to a new clubhouse renovation and extension.

The iconic Redcliffe Peninsula Surf Life Saving Club (SLSC) has been given a well-earned facelift due to a \$650,000 Federal Government grant facilitated by the Hon Luke Howarth MP, Federal Member for Petrie.

Redcliffe Peninsula SLSC deputy president Kylie Robins said the upgrades would benefit the lifesavers and the community as a whole.

"The upgrades include a new training room, an equipment room for boards and Nipper gear, and a trailer room for our inflatable rescue boat," Kylie said.

The new facilities will come in handy as the award-winning club's membership grows.

"We were named the Sunshine Coast Junior & Youth Development Club of the Year for 2020/2021, and we recently received a special commendation for Queensland's Junior & Youth Development Club of the Year," Kylie said.

"All are welcome to come down to Suttons Beach on a Sunday morning during summer to check out the new clubhouse and find out what surf lifesaving has to offer."

Kylie said she was grateful for the support of Hon Luke Howarth MP as well as Brisbane-based builders Compass Homes and EnProCon.

Students Find Their Wings Building Planes

ver wondered what it would be like to build a plane from scratch? The Ediflyers are a self-funded home school group who are constructing a RV-12iS with some expert help at Redcliffe Aerodrome.

Flight Youth Engineering directors Paul Reddish and Ashley Miller established the program to mentor students to build and fly a plane, under the guidance and supervision of experts from different sectors of the aviation industry.

"The mentors are people the students usually wouldn't cross paths with, and they are really experienced at what they do," Paul said.

The Ediflyers group is a one-off project, but the Flight Youth Engineering program aims to expand into nearby schools. The first school-based program is underway at St Columban's College in Caboolture, where students are building a fully operational, industry certified Van's RV 12iS aircraft – a first for an Australian school.

"There would be more than 100 years of combined aviation experience provided by the engineering mentors in the aircraft workshop there each week," Ashley said.

Once built, the aircraft will be kept for a short period to give students experience in maintenance. They will then be sold into the Australian aviation market, with the sale of the aeroplane providing funding for the next project.

"Schools buy all their own aviation tooling and so when the first plane is sold, they are ready to go on to the next one," he said.

Although the program is designed to work with schools, Paul said the real advantage was that it sat outside the curriculum.

"There are no assessments or assignments which can slow down progress and put pressure on students to compete. We engage and mentor students throughout the build and teach them that failing is okay. If they make a mistake, they need to repair it, but it's more important what they learn along the way," he said.

Local businesses can help fund these projects and have their logo displayed on the finished project – and, of course, feel a sense of pride in what they've helped achieve.

5. Conversations with a Killer: The Ted Bundy Tapes

America's most notorious serial killer, Ted Bundy went on a killing spree across the USA.

Once he was caught (spoiler) he wasn't shy about spilling the beans. He retells his story to the police, accompanied by accounts from the cops who were hot on his heels. Although he felt like he was "just a normal individual", I'm sure once you've heard his recordings, you'll disagree.

4. Heist

Bringing a lighter tone to the true crime genre, Heist features different stories and interviews from criminals who stole millions of dollars and got away scot-free (sort of). This show helps answer the question, "What do you do with all that cash?". Where can you hide, who can you trust and does money really buy you happiness?

3. The Staircase

If someone is awkward and unlikeable, does that make them a murderer?

The Staircase follows the trial of Michael Peterson, who may or may not have fatally pushed his wife down the stairs. Just when you think the truth is about to reveal itself and you've cracked the case, another layer of mystery is revealed.

2. Cocaine Cowboys: The Kings of Miami

There are some crims who just seem to keep getting away with it, such as Willy & Sal. The most prolific drug traffickers in US history, they sometimes handled more than 75 tonnes of cocaine – leading to the world's largest drug case. It's fascinating to watch how they elude their rivals and the police, especially when they're hiding in plain sight.

1. American Murder: The Family Next Door

Possibly one of the most confronting documentaries you'll ever watch. No narration, no re-enactments, just home videos, security camera footage, Facebook posts and text messages. When a husband comes home to find his pregnant wife Shanann Watts and her two children missing, it starts a series of events that makes you realise how evil some people can be and just how much of our lives are being documented.

"The sheer joy of opening your mouth and lungs and joining in with like-minded people overrides everything."

"Some of us read music but a lot don't, which is fine because Dale Lingwood, our very patient musical director, teaches us by learning to listen and then repeating," she said.

The choir often performs their own concerts at local venues with special guests. They also sing at festivals and events throughout Brisbane. One such event is Brisbane Sings, which features choirs and singing groups from all over the city, performing separately and together. Due to restrictions, it will take place in video form this year.

"Multitude has been participating for eight years and is the only choir from the Northern Moreton Bay region to do so. They have been filmed performing on the foreshore and the Redcliffe Jetty. The video will be widely distributed, showcasing our own beautiful area," Adele said.

If you've been thinking about joining a choir, Adele said now is a good time.

"The choir is gearing up for some fun Christmas performances and is starting to learn carols and Christmas songs."

The club gradually grew and the paddlers started taking part in Regattas across south east Queensland. From there, it grew, participating in regattas both interstate and overseas. Jane sadly lost her battle with breast cancer in 2016, and in Jayne's memory, the club members decided to make a garden outside the clubhouse and fill it with Snapdragon plants. In 2019 Jayne's garden was completely destroyed by vandals, so we are now in the process of revamping Javne's memorial with a unique art piece that represents our memory of her.

We welcome new members, both social and sports paddlers. If you would like to try dragon boating, you are welcome to come along for the first 3 paddles, no commitment. Anyone and everyone can enjoy Dragon Boating, whatever fitness level you may be and whatever age you are. New Police Hub Boosts Commuter Safety

new police hub at Kippa-Ring station aims to improve safety and security for commuters by reducing local crime.

The purpose-built facility opened last month to support the Queensland Police Service's railway squad and community-based officers in targeting crime and anti-social behaviour.

Drew Brock, Queensland Rail senior manager security and emergency preparedness, said customers valued seeing a highly visible police presence on the network.

"This initiative is designed to deliver exactly that," Drew said. "The safety of

our customers is our highest priority, but Queensland Rail also recognises the role we play in contributing to the broader safety of communities. This new facility will support regional police to deploy more effectively across the Moreton district.

"It's pleasing to see that both Police Railway Squad and regional police are using the facility to benefit both commuters and the local community."

Queensland Rail invested \$30,000 to create the new police hub, which is part of an existing train crew depot.

Member for Redcliffe Yvette D'ath said the hub would make the area safer, and help commuters feel more comfortable using the rail network.

"Equipped with workplaces for two police officers, the hub provides direct access to Queensland Rail's station CCTV network of more than 12,000 cameras, and has facilities to process alleged offenders," she said.

Horses Helping Humans

orses Helping Humans is an equine communications program in the Moreton Bay region that helps people gain confidence, understand body language and overcome personality barriers by utilising horses mirroring human behaviours.

Certified facilitator and Herd Together president Katrina Nichol said Horses Helping Humans showcases the positive impact horses can have on humans' day-to-day communication skills.

With the challenges of lockdowns and modern technology, many children were struggling to understand body language and how to communicate effectively with peers, family members and future employers, she said.

"The program is designed to be effective with families, domestic violence victims, at-risk youth and those with mental health struggles, and aims to build confidence and self-esteem. develop emotional awareness, control and self-discipline," Katrina said.

"It also aims to apply anger management and impulse control while developing healthy relationship skills and respect for others and self "

Horses Helping Humans founder Sue Spence said the program is trademarked and licensed and has been providing outcome-based courses in Australia and New Zealand for over 12 years.

"Our reputation for students re-engaging back into school or study and helping disadvantaged youth and domestic violence families learn new communication skills to move forward in life has been recognised with awards, university partnerships and community support." Sue said.

Katrina said the program introduced students to techniques to help them focus and turn anger or anxiety into calm assertiveness, and offered practical ways to apply effective



communication - skills which were easily transferable to interpersonal (human to human) communication.

"The program uses the basic principles of professional natural horsemanship groundwork - no riding - which is about building rapport, using gentle communication and respectful methods that are grounded in encouraging connection and natural cooperation, "Katrina said.

"We also run the program in a presentation format for corporate businesses and services so teams can enhance their performance and teamwork skills.

"Sue has a great motto for the program, 'There should never be any intimidation or fear in communication. There should only be respect and trust'."

The charity is looking for volunteers and sponsors to help more people access the program.

edcliffe Peninsula Game and Sportfish Club (RPGSC) will host their annual sportfish competition from Friday, 12 November to Sunday, 14 November at the Moreton Bay Boat Club.

RPGSC Chairman Noel Day said the competition was designed to cater for all types of fishing.

"It's a friendly competition," Noel said. "Everybody loves to go out and have a fish and it adds a bit to your fishing if you've got a challenge and can go and participate in something like this.

"The competition is open to the public, but if they are not a member of ANSA or QGFA, which are the two fishing bodies in Queensland, we can give them a temporary membership into ANSA for the weekend."

Anglers keen to compete can head along to a meet and greet at Moreton Bay Boat Club on Friday night.

"We've got a briefing to explain the rules and go through the categories," Noel said. "We hand out some cards, which have the tournament code for the weekend, so they have to take a photo of their fish on a brag mat, which is a measuring mat, with their card in it.'

Entrants can take part in one or more of three different challenges.

"For the beach (land-based) challenge, people can fish off the beach, jetty, wharf, or bank," Noel said. "It's a combined total length of their five best fish.

"The bay challenge is for bays, lakes, estuaries, canals and rivers within South East Queensland, so they can fish at Somerset Dam, Pine River, Caboolture, Brisbane River or Moreton Bay. Once again, that's the combined length of their five best fish.

"The bluewater (offshore) challenge is outside a line from Combyora Point on Moreton Island to Skirmish Point on Bribie Island, which is outside of Moreton."

A barbecue will be held at the boat club from 3:30pm on Sunday, followed by a presentation where prizes will be awarded for the longest overall fish, as well as a \$200 mystery prize.

Entry costs are \$25 for senior members of ANSA or QGFA. Accompanying junior members are free. Non-members can pay \$10 for temporary membership. For more information go to rpgsc.com.au

The event is a visual feast for spectators, with the beach transformed into a riot of colourful kites and characters


"The action is only a stone's throw away so the spectators get a great view," Grant said.

Lee-Anne has a strong passion for bringing dance to the community, and reached out to Toni Marie Dance Company at Clontarf to see if they would be interested in participating in her first Redcliffe flash mob.

"When I spoke to Toni, she jumped through the phone and said she would love to be involved," Lee-Anne said. "She put together a dance and kept it secret from all the parents, I then contacted the Redcliffe Markets and they also jumped at the idea of us doing the flash mob there."

Lee-Anne said the support from the markets was incredible – they set up the music in several locations with the children scattered throughout the foreshore, before wowing market goers with a surprise choreographed performance in the street.

Toni Marie Dance Company owner Toni Evans started her dance studio six years ago, after 40 years as a dancer. She created a studio with low costs so more people can afford to dance.

"Participating in the flash mob was an incredible experience for myself and the kids," Toni said. "Especially this year as we haven't had many opportunities to perform due to COVID – so it was great to get the kids out there again."



ometimes known as sea cows, dugongs inhabit the northern coastal waters of Australia, with Moreton Bay their most southern range on the east coast.

Dugongs are not small animals – they can grow to about four metres long, and can weigh over 250kg. A plaque on Woody Point Jetty says:

"Historical records state that a herd of dugong was sighted in 1891, 8 kilometres long and 300 metres wide off Woody Point."

As seagrass is their staple diet, we are lucky to see them on this side of the bay at all at the moment, especially since the 2011 floods killed off large quantities of the seagrass growing around the Redcliffe Peninsula, Bramble Bay and Deception Bay.

Now, ten years later, the seagrass is recovering so we may see more. I do still see the occasional dugong around Redcliffe and Clontarf.

On the eastern side of Moreton Bay, however, it's a different story. Along the Moreton Island and Stradbroke Island sand banks and weed beds, they are quite plentiful. We see them regularly on our fishing and day trips over to the islands.

Fun Fact - the dugong is more closely related to elephants than to whales or dolphins.

PENINSULA PIMPERNEL

n 13 September, 1824, Lieutenant Henry Miller and his party of 14 soldiers, their families and a motley group of 29 convicts landed at Redcliffe to establish what was to become the first European settlement in Queensland.

Initially pitching tents as temporary accommodation, various parties would have been dispatched to find water and to assess suitable sites for the buildings to house both the guards and the guarded, as well as clear the bush to establish locations to grow food for the settlement.

As their exploratory endeavours progressed, they would have encountered the Kabi Kabi and Ningy Ningy, part of the Undambi people, who had called the Peninsula home for thousands of years. They would also have encountered animals they had never seen before - kangaroos, wallabies, koalas, possums, wombats and a large variety of birds.

We will never know for certain what happened during those early days, as Miller's diary has been lost. However, it's possible that at Redcliffe and their more permanent settlement in what is now Brisbane, they came into contact with a mysterious native animal known by its indigenous name as the yarri – the Queensland tiger.

Sightings of the yarri have been rare. The earliest documented European encounter dates back to 1871, but of course indigenous traditions go back a lot further. Reports from the late 1800s into this century have come from all over Queensland. Ten News carried a story in 2017 of the Smith family of Shailer Park on Brisbane's southern outskirts, who said they had seen an animal answering the description of the tiger in the adjacent bush.

The animal is described as a dog-sized feline with stripes and a long tail, prominent front teeth and a savage temperament. It has also been likened to a large, striped marsupial cat.

The last known Tasmanian tiger, or thylacine, died in captivity in 1936. The 1965 book Furred Animals of Australia suggested the Queensland tiger was a variant of its cousin from Tasmania. Have you ever seen one?

he busy season is fast approaching so now is the perfect time to build your freezer stash of quick meals. This recipe is perfect for when you want to cook ahead with something that is versatile enough to be used multiple ways and that also

I also couldn't resist buying a huge jar of Moroccan caperberries which go perfectly on the side. All the vegetables have been selected fresh from the Redcliffe Markets.

Spring Tomato Pasta

1 bottle of passata

1 medium onion

2-3 cloves of garlic (more if you're a lover of garlic)

2 medium carrots

2 stalks of celery

1 large eggplant

1 red or green capsicum

2 medium zucchinis

Water to cover

Chop onion and garlic and sauté in olive oil for 3-4 minutes.

Chop veggies and add to pot with the passata and stir.



Add water so the vegetables are submerged, season with salt and pepper and cover with a

Cook on medium for 1 ½ hours.

If you are a vegetable lover, cook for less time to keep them al dente but if you are trying to hide them from little ones (or yourself), cut them as small as you like and cook for the full amount of time

Note: you can put in any vegetables you want. Depending on what I have in my fridge, sometimes I will add mushrooms, spinach, or frozen peas.

Myrtle Troyahn

Myrtle Troyahn -A Woman of Many Words

hen local lady of letters Myrtle Troyahn's grandfather, Thomas Sanger, arrived from the UK in the late 1800s, it soon became obvious that the golden opportunities promoted at home were not as they were portrayed. He moved to Queensland where he worked as a surveyor's assistant in the early settlement in Humpybong.

His daughter Ethel married Joseph Burgess and had 13 children. Myrtle was the eleventh. She was close to her grandfather, and in his declining years would read the newspapers to him - but he insisted she only read happy news.

Despite her many chores on the family farm, Myrtle completed her education and was offered a scholarship to a teachers' college. Ill health meant she had to withdraw and forget her dream of becoming a teacher.

As she recuperated, she began to write – newspaper articles, short stories, household hints. Her articles began to appear in the New Idea, Bulletin, Women's Weekly and other magazines. She was paid well for them, but preserved her anonymity by writing under the pseudonym MAT.

Myrtle met her husband Ernest Troyahn when his parents visited the family farm and he came to drive them home. They married on 11 November 1939, and honeymooned in Redcliffe. They had three children. During the war years, they ran the family orchard in Applethorpe, with the help of two Italian prisoners of war, due to Ernest's ongoing health issues.

In 1946, due to Ernest's ill health, they moved to Clontarf and bought a mobile library. Myrtle's prolific writing supplemented the family income – not a hardship for someone who loved reading and writing so much.

Eventually selling the library when it became too hard for Ernest to carry the heavy suitcases of books, they built a general store on the corner of Dan Street and Elizabeth Avenue. After Ernest's death in 1954, Myrtle tried to continue the business, but sold it a year later, buying a library in Fortitude Valley. She worked there for many years, taking public transport six days a week.

In 1963, Myrtle became manager/librarian at the Redcliffe Municipal library, run in those days by civic-minded locals. She knew all the borrowers by their membership numbers, and worked there until her retirement at the age of 65.

With Myrtle's passing in 2002, the Peninsula lost a unique individual whose love of reading and writing touched many people.

Support for Families at Local Health Hub

edcliffe families with young children have been finding support and guidance at a free local health and wellbeing hub.

The hub, at Hercules Road State School in Kippa-Ring, is an initiative of eight Peninsula primary schools.

Health and wellbeing hub project officer Gayle Wetzel Fitzgerald said the hub offered specialist support services to improve educational outcomes for students.

"It started as a way to identify health and developmental needs before young kids start school," Gayle said. "So you are starting that process of identifying any issues around things like speech a bit earlier, to make the journey a bit easier once they get to school."

The hub is open from 8.30am to 12pm every Wednesday and welcomes all young families on the Peninsula as drop-ins or by appointment.

"Some people don't like going to a doctor's surgery, but being in a familiar environment they find it more relaxing to come to the hub and have a chat, and we can lead them on the correct pathway," Gayle said.

"The hub has been running with the health nurses for the last 12 months and now we have got the health nurse once a fortnight, the early intervention clinic, and the GP who will be seeing people purely for the developmental side of things."

A health nurse is on-site to support families with children aged between birth and six years old who want to discuss concerns with breastfeeding, nutrition, normal growth and development, sleep problems, and hard to settle babies.

Families with children under the age of eight can access the early intervention clinic to receive guidance in relation to the parent-child relationship, understanding and responding to challenging behaviour, adjusting to parenthood and postnatal depression, coping with anxiety and stress, and parenting confidence.

Gayle said she hoped the hub would receive ongoing funding so it could continue to provide services to the Redcliffe community.

"By the end of the year the funding might run out, which is unfortunate because we have gotten it this far and we would love to see it continue, as it is an invaluable service," she said.


