utdoor enthusiasts will find everything they need for their next adventure holiday at the Moreton Bay Expo and this year promises to be the largest one yet.

An extensive range of caravans, camper trailers and boating, fishing and outdoor gear will be on display when the major shopping event returns to the Redcliffe Showgrounds from Friday, 18 February to Sunday, 20 February.

Australian Events director Bob Carroll said the annual event was a unique showcase of thousands of products to get people outdoors.

"From new cars, to 4x4s and every conceivable option for off-road motoring, we also have over 50 major companies with the very latest in camper trailers, caravans, and all the nifty bits and pieces to go with them," Bob said.

"Over 170 exhibitors and thousands of products make this unique event the first on the annual must-do calendar."

This year the event precinct has been extended to meet demand and exhibiting companies have expanded their displays. Featured exhibitors include caravan and camper trailer manufacturer, Prime Campers Australia, personal watercraft dealership Brisbane Sea-Doo and Can-Am, 4x4 accessories megastore Opposite Lock, caravan dealership Caravan HQ, and many more to keep expo-goers busy during the three-day event.

Once again the expo will feature free daily entertainment. Ron 'Kingbrown' Wilson will be back to present Kingbrown Camp Oven Kitchen at three daily shows, where he will demonstrate how to make simple but delicious meals like lamb shanks and damper using camp ovens.

Owner and operator of 4WD Adventures and Training Australia, Michael Boyle, will also appear daily to share his love of the great outdoors with off-road demonstrations.

"The idea is to run expo participants through the basics of four-wheel driving on some man made obstacles," Michael said.

"We tend to find most people don't even know the basic things so it gives them a bit of an insight. They are shown techniques to recover from thick sand. They also learn what we call entry angle, ramp-over angle and exit angle, getting wheels off the ground, traction control, and electronic stability control and how that helps you when you're off-road."

Bob said he expected millions of dollars in sales would be transacted over the three days of the event and millions more in the following months.

The expo has attracted more than 40,000 patrons over the last two years.

Entry tickets are \$15 for a single day and \$18 for three days for adults, and \$12 for a single day and \$15 for three days for seniors. Children under 16 are free. For more event information and to get your tickets go to bayexpo.com.au

here's plenty of entertainment to lure the crowd at this year's Moreton Bay Expo with the return of a visually amazing fishing show.

The Berkley Supertank Fishing Show will appear several times daily during the three-day expo and the entertaining and educational experience is a must-see for keen anglers.

Supertank operator and seasoned angler Michael 'Cookie' Cooke will demonstrate lure and bait fishing techniques from on top of the enormous tank.

"The tank is 12 metres long and 3.8 metres high and it holds 14 thousand litres of water," Cookie said. "It is the biggest mobile fish tank in the southern hemisphere."

The show offers something for everyone, from beginners to the more experienced angler. Expo-goers will learn catch and release techniques and how to preserve their catch for the dinner table, as well as seeing first-hand how the fish respond to different lures. Kids will also enjoy watching the fish swim around inside the impressive tank.

"The show is for the whole family," Cookie said.

"Being a lure show and the tank having clear Perspex sides, the angler gets to see how the lures work and the action in the water. "The fish we use are trained barramundi. In most shows they will chase and bite the lures as in a real life situation. As with other years I have some of the newest and best lures to demonstrate to the audience. We don't use any hooks so as not to hurt the fish."

Cookie has more than 60 years fishing experience and has been presenting the Berkley Supertank Fishing Show for over 18 years. He said the tank had been at almost every major show or event in Australia including the Moreton Bay Expo.

"We've been at the Sydney Royal Easter Show and every major boat show including the Sydney Boat Show and Sanctuary Cove Boat Show, and every major field day, caravan and camping show, and hundreds of agricultural shows throughout Australia," he said.

"With two tanks we were doing up to 70 events a year before COVID."

Demonstrations go from 15 to 20 minutes with a short break in between.

Crooning Tribute to Bublé

ichael Bublé is one of the world's most recognisable voices. Emotion oozes from his lips as he croons his jazz-inspired songs from a past era that was introduced to him by his grandfather.

Rydian Lewis discovered his love of Bublé after hearing the song Everything on the radio, and transformed his life of hairdressing and gardening into a career of crooning Bublé's biggest hits with his trusty band The Residuals

- the longest running Bublé tribute show in Australia.

He will be bringing his show to Redcliffe Entertainment Centre on 01 March.

Rhydian said the Peninsula held a very special place in his heart.

"Jeff from the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre was the first person that ever booked me to play a show in the whole of Australia," he said. "It's one of my favourite venues and I really like Redcliffe and its history.

"I kind of followed in the Bee Gees' footsteps as they lived in Manchester, before moving here, and I did the same thing."

Rhydian said he worked with some of the best musicians in Australia and all have performed with some of the finest artists around the country. They also have a Spotify profile where users can listen to some of the band's originals and covers of Bublé and other jazz stars.

"I really think that Michael brings something magical," Rhydian said. "It's retaining the old ways of performing and the old music from the old American Songbook and jazz. He's obviously the forefront performer in this genre and I am lucky that I can get up on stage and continue that legacy.

"I really enjoy singing the very emotional songs, the ones that are really special to Michael. My two favourites would be Home and Lost. There's a lot of history behind those songs and they're guite integral to the whole show."

Rhydian said he didn't impersonate Bublé but took the audience on a journey through his life and what motivated his songs while singing them true to the style of the jazz star.

rapped within the confines of my home due to COVID-19 exposure, and with nothing better to do, I decided to sort through a variety of books that had similarly lain captive in boxes in my garage for many years.

As I did so, the title of a slim volume caught my eye - Women and Work on the Redcliffe Peninsula. It turned out to be the result of a community project sponsored by the Redcliffe City Council in 1997, produced by Lesley Jenkins and 12 volunteer researchers.

They had documented the lives of 31 Redcliffe women covering activities including pioneering, mothering, domesticity, war effort, volunteering and business. Their efforts proved both illuminating and interesting.

On 7 December 1866, Mary Jull Ham became the first woman to purchase land on the Redcliffe Peninsula. It was a 37-acre block on what is now the seaward side of Clontarf's Maine Road, Married to Thomas Ham. who engraved postage stamps for colonial Queensland, they later established a 73-acre sugarcane plantation at Clontarf Point.

In the 1940's, Heather Bradford started work in a clothing factory on Maine Road, Clontarf. Owned by the Agnew family, it produced christening gowns and children's clothing. At age 14, she worked a 44-hour week!

For English-born 40-year-old Betty Palmer, Redcliffe proved to be a culture shock. Arriving here as a 'Ten-Pound Pom', she was horrified to see Redcliffe children going to school wearing no shoes, "This must be a poor country!" she observed.

Erica Juster became a pharmacist at age 21. With a partner, Mary Grant, she opened a pharmacy at Scott's Point in 1953. Another followed in 1960. She became President of the Queensland Women's Pharmacists in 1967 and was still able to raise three children and serve on several local committees.

While Redcliffe's history has been well publicised, women's contributions, though bountiful, are less so. Perhaps it's time for a change!

Redcliffe's **Centenarian:** Marion White and Her **Fulfilling Life**

t's not every day you hear of someone turning 100 years old, but our little suburb of Redcliffe has a story of its own.

Marion (Meg) Elizabeth White, born 17 January 1922 at Waverly in NSW, turned 100 last month with lots to celebrate about her long and fulfilling life.

Long before her move to Redcliffe, Meg trained as an accountant and joined the Royal Australian Airforce doing clerical duties from 1939 to 1945.

Speaking with her eldest granddaughter, Lynette Young, she said Meg moved around before finding her forever home in Redcliffe in 1969.

"From her marriage [to RAAF flight engineer, Elvan Francis Leslie White] onwards, they lived on banana plantations in northern NSW and then moved to Toowoomba. They moved to Redcliffe in 1969 and lived in several places, but especially in Victoria Avenue, Redcliffe," Lynette said.

Not only did Meg find her home in Redcliffe, but her family became an active part of the community.

"They owned the Sutton Street Ice Cream Parlour for several years, where she diligently worked to look after her family. She worked in a lot of services as a volunteer and helped lots of people on the Redcliffe Peninsula."

Meg has lived by herself since the 80s and found herself living in Margate before transferring to the Azure Blue Nursing Home at 96 years old, where she has happily resided for the past four years.

Some of her favourite hobbies include crocheting, knitting, and dressmaking, and Lynette said she hasn't lost sight of these activities in her later years.

"She is an avid Scrabble player and is very aware of what is going on around her. She also loves having people visit her, gets actively involved in activities at the nursing home, and loves being taken out on the Peninsula to spend time with her great-grandchildren."

For her birthday in January, Azure Blue held a party in her honour while friends, family, and residents celebrated with her.

To Meg's surprise, she was also commemorated with a golden-framed certificate from the Redcliffe RSL to honour her for being an inspirational member.

So, if I was Prime Minister or President of the world for a day, here is the number one law I would put in place; you will not be issued a license to have a business (but you must have it to trade), unless you have a base level of understanding of what the financials in business are and how to use them to run a better business

I believe the number one reason businesses. fail is due to the lack of understanding of numbers and financials. The tragic thing is that what you need to really know is not hard. The benefit of understanding the basics of your financials is that most business owners will make more money, either through improved confidence and/or making better decisions.

So, in theory, what do you need to get this license? Know how to read a profit and loss (income) statement, a business scoresheet, and what it is telling you about how you are playing the game of business; Know how to read a balance sheet, a business snapshot of what you owe and what you own, and what it is telling you; and; Know how to read a cash summary statement, where cash has come from and where it has gone.





"I live in Clontarf. I've lived in the area for six years, but I'm from Central Queensland, west of Rockhampton.

"I've got eight kids (aged from four-year-old twins to 30). I'm a single mum. I'm hoping when it's time for me to move on to the Dreamtime, I won't be alone.

"I used to paint before life got busy. Just for myself and my family. It's for healing, really. It's good for my mental health. Recently I took it back up. There's a need for it now – our culture is more recognised, more celebrated.

"I'm Baradah-Gabalburra – my Nanna's Baradah and my Grandfather is Gabalburra. For me to live down here I had to follow protocol and had to search out a traditional owner and just let them know that I'm here and what I'm doing. That's just cultural protocol. My kids all know that too.

"I work as an Indigenous health worker. I've been with Queensland Health for 11 years. I'm also studying nursing, and I want to specialise in aged care.

"We have totems, and my totem is the eagle. When we go on road trips (back to Country), the closer I get to home we see eagles. Because my mum passed away I know that's her guiding me, and that's a sign from our ancestors that they're still around us.

"I'm very blessed – I think it stems from my grandmother and grandfather. They were exempt from the (Aborigines Protection) Act, which means they weren't sent away, and they were able to embrace culture, and able to raise their kids on traditional homeland. I know that not a lot of our people are able to do that, so I feel very blessed.

"(I'm involved in) the Bramble Bay Runners and Walkers [RAW]. We meet at Sandgate Parkrun at Arthur Davis Park three times a week. We're a pretty strong group. It's not just for Indigenous people, it's all-inclusive, so everybody is welcome to join us, and we love that. That's our contribution to reconciliation.

"And I really believe in reconciliation, because we're all one community, and that's what I love about the group. We're all walking this journey together. That's what my mum taught me. We all walk together on the same planet, the same Country."



Redcliffe Business Owner Wins Fight to Free Aboriginal Flag

edcliffe resident Michael Connolly is celebrating a win after his work with Free the Flag, a campaign to free the Aboriginal Flag from the restrictions of copyright.

On 25 January, the Australian Government announced a \$20m deal securing the copyright license from Luritja artist and flag designer Harold Thomas.

Michael, who uses the artist name Munda-gutta Kulliwari, is a Muruwari and Kullilli man. He owns Dreamtime Kullilli Art in Scarborough with his wife and family.

Michael joined with Gunditjmara woman, Laura Thompson, co-founder and CEO of Clothing the Gaps in Victoria, to create the Free the Flag campaign. "It went from there to another level when they started on the AFL," Michael said. "Nova Peris, being an Olympian, jumped on it and she rang me, so her and I and Laura linked together and flew to Canberra in 2019.

"We spent three days trying to have meetings with the Liberal National Party and the Australian Labor Party and we had two meetings with the Minister for Indigenous Australians, Ken Wyatt."

The Free the Flag campaign gained momentum in 2020 and led to a Senate Inquiry as well as more than 165,000 signatures in an online petition.

Michael said he didn't know a decision had been made by the government until Nova contacted him late the night before.

Copyright has now been transferred to the Commonwealth, meaning the Aboriginal Flag will follow the same protocols as the Australian National Flag.

"I feel over the moon," Michael said. "It's the best feeling that our people have now got our flag back and can do whatever we want to do with it.'

Snorkeling **Woody Point**


t first glance you could be mistaken to think, "What a beautiful spot snorkelling on our Great Barrier Reef!" but this picture is taken at Scotts Point in the 'Green (no fishing) Zone' on the Redcliffe Peninsula not far off Suttons Beach.

You could easily forget where you are when snorkelling here as there is so much to see. Sea life is abundant amongst these rocky reefs with soft and hard corals, tubeworms, crabs, starfish, wobbegong sharks and even seahorses on the weed beds! This piece of paradise is even worth a low tide walk around.

The diversity of fish species is amazing. You could spot snapper, tuskfish, squid, cod, butterflyfish, wrasse and various baitfish just to name a few. Unfortunately the weather and tides play a big part in water clarity here with the best times for visibility being the middle of winter, which is great if you have a wetsuit. Sometimes after smaller tides and little wind, the water is calm enough in the warmer months for the visibility to be good.

If the conditions are right it's a great shallow shore dive or snorkelling spot. I know some people will ask about sharks so local advice is to not go into the water at sunrise or dusk, and don't swim in dirty water or when baitfish are abundant.

Co-Owner of the Jetty Lounge, Rini Fritiani said she and partner, Craig Whitehead knew it would be a challenge opening a new business in the current economic climate, with hospitality being hit hard during the COVID-19 situation.

"After four years in Darwin, where I ran a fine-dining restaurant, Craig and I have spent two years dreaming of opening up our own restaurant."

So we want to move away from the costly, fine-dining experience to hopefully create a more affordable and relaxed experience for our diners." Ms Fritiani said.

With a modern, affordable and classic cafe style menu, the Jetty Lounge is family friendly including both children's breakfast and lunch menus and even catering to take away meals.

Ms Fritiani said they hoped to open the sprawling rear patio up as a play area with a weekend kids' club with staff to supervise children while their parents enjoyed a social meal.



ust as grit in an oyster creates a pearl, a local initiative is finding that a little elbow grease can turn environmental issues into regenerative solutions.

The Moreton Bay Marine Park (MBMP) oyster reef restoration project safely returns oyster shells collected by the community from commercial and other outlets to our local waterways.

Colin Scobie, Rotary vice president of Redcliffe Sunrise and Environmental Sustainability Rotary Action Group (ESRAG), said the process was making an important difference, especially given that 96 per cent of oyster reefs had disappeared.

"After a four to six month process to eradicate any bio adverse hazards, the used oyster shells are washed and placed into Robust Oyster Baskets and eventually placed in the MBMP to enhance the fish stock." Colin said.

"Not only are they diverted from landfill, but as the oysters grow they also clean the bay."

The project was built on the Pumicestone Passage oyster reef restoration project (via Dr Ben Diggles at the Ningi Waste transfer station), and now involves several other organisations including Moreton Bay Regional Council, OzFish, Healthy Land and Water, The Moreton Bay Foundation and regional universities.

The initiative's success is also due to the amazing qualities of oysters themselves, which are referred to as 'the kidneys of the waterways'.

"Each adult oyster can filter up to 180 litres of water per day and provides a habitat not only for fish, but also plankton and marine microorganisms," Colin said.

Research shows that for every hectare of oyster reefs, 2.5 tons of fish are generated every year, with a huge increase in diversity.

Colin encourages local residents to get involved by collecting shells and lending a hand in future restorative projects.

"This community is one of a number of custodians of the Moreton Bay region's marine environment. I am wanting to make it a better place for our children's children and invite you all to join me," he said.

othing screams Australian summer like prawns and mangoes and while we aren't 'throwing another shrimp on the barbie', we are celebrating the incredible produce that we have available on the Redcliffe Peninsula.

This salad is fresh, treat-filled and will make you feel like you are sticking to your New Year's resolution to eat better. It's packed full of fresh herbs, plump, pink prawns, and sweet mango flesh. While you might be used to a vermicelli salad with BBQ pork and deep-fried spring rolls, this is the healthier, better-looking cousin.

If you haven't visited Morgan's Seafood yet, it is an absolute must! They have the most exquisite range of seafood from lobster to flathead, to hand picked crab meat and fresh oysters. It really is like walking into an underwater oasis (so you can see why I couldn't resist these gorgeous tiger prawns!). The mangoes and vegetables are all from the Redcliffe Markets. Kensington Pride mangoes are a favourite in this house!

Prawn Salad with Charred Mango, Vermicelli Noodle and a Zingy Sesame and Lime Dressing

INGREDIENTS

4-5 prawns per person (I have used medium tiger prawns)
1 mango
1 small cucumber
1 carrot
1/2 small purple cabbage
1/2 red capsicum
1 lime
1/2 small red onion
mint
coriander

vermicelli noodles chilli (optional)

SESAME & LIME DRESSING

3 tablespoons lime juice 1 shallot finely diced 2 tablespoons fish sauce 1 tablespoon sesame oil 1-2 cm knob fresh ginger grated 2 stalks of coriander

finely diced

Follow the instructions on the packet to reconstitute the vermicelli noodles then put to one side.

Cut off both mango cheeks, leaving the skin intact. Fire up your BBQ and place your mango cheeks flesh side down making sure not to move them once you have laid them down (you don't



Prepare your vegetables by washing and cutting them to your liking. I have plated the vegetables inspired by a Vietnamese salad, but you could toss them all in a salad bowl and it will still taste just as good.

For the dressing, combine all ingredients in a bowl (adjust to your taste) and stir to combine.

Combine all ingredients in a serving bowl and drizzle over dressing. Enjoy.



As it transpired, Jeannie would be doing her bit to carry on the family tradition.



edcliffe's first overseas visitors did not stay long. The penal settlement at Humpybong, established in 1824, was abandoned the following year because the site was thought to be unhealthy. Although, only 40 years later, the desirability of what we now call Redcliffe was becoming obvious to land speculators and settlers. Within a few short years it had become a destination for visitors from Brisbane seeking health-giving sea air and relaxation.

Travellers require accommodation, and hotels were among the earliest buildings to be erected. One of the first was O'Leary's, built in 1880. Mr O'Leary claimed it was built on the original Humpybong settlement. To support his claim, Mr O'Leary showed a correspondent of The Redcliffe Herald extensive relics of the 1824 stockade, some of which were incorporated into the new hotel's construction.

By the 1890s O'Leary's was under new management and had been renamed the Redcliffe Hotel. One visitor, in 1893, recorded "Everything was ... 'nice'. The cookery nice, the beds nice, the attendance and civility on a par with the rest." In 1902, a patron noted approvingly of the then licensee, Mr Thomas Moxley, "Tom is in great demand with the ladies as a teacher of swimming."

By the 1920s, there were six hotels and 28 boarding establishments and the Redcliffe Hotel,

now trading as the Ambassadors Hotel, was offering its clients all modern conveniences, including "up-to-date lavatories, a hot water system and a septic tank system" together with "electric light throughout" and a parking station for 100 cars.

Another hotel with a long history was the Palace at Woody Point. Built in 1909, it replaced the Great Western, which burnt down in the early 1900s. The Palace, a "magnificent, palatial residence" and "a superb hostelry" offered 22 "lofty and spacious apartments" and "a lovely view of Bramble Bay" as well as a bathroom on every floor.

The heyday of the Palace occurred after 1927, when it was taken over by the Filmer family and underwent considerable renovation. Mavis Filmer, the Palace's proprietor in the 1950s, joined the ranks of notable Redcliffe publicans by providing an early performance venue for the Bee Gees, who performed there in 1959, each receiving a bottle of Coca Cola in recompense.

The glories of the great hostelries of the past may be gone but Redcliffe is still, as early advertisers proclaimed, the "queen of watering places" "where you can ... thrill with delight to be alive".

or Queensland's fourth oldest town, the community of Nanango in the South Burnett region is far from sleepy, small, or quiet.

Nanango is the second-largest town in the South Burnett and home to about 4,500 people. The farming community not only boasts the monthly markets, but several bush-inspired events throughout the year.

Coming up in 2022 The Nanango Show Society is hosting the annual CampDraft event in May, Heritage Music and Country Muster in September, and Rock and Roll/Classic Car festival weekend in October.

Henry said all of these shows and events supported the local community and economy for Nanango and they welcomed everyone to come experience a piece of Aussie country lifestyle.


