For the past 5 years, Blackbird Clothing Exchange has been supporting the Redcliffe community by offering a clothing exchange service, along with clothes that you can buy for just \$1. Pru said her mission is to make clothes more economical and accessible for all.

"I started Blackbird Clothing Exchange because I just knew there was a need for it. My daughter had outgrown clothes that were recently bought," Pru said. "I knew that if I wanted a smarter and cheaper way to shop, other people would feel the same, so I started a clothing exchange myself."

Founded in 2017 in Pru's garage, she initially started with kid's clothing but very quickly expanded. She now prides herself on having something for everyone.

"We start all the way from infants, to adults. We carry as many sizes as we can, starting from 00000-20 and more. We have winter clothes, summer clothes, men's and women's wear, maternity clothing, and kid's clothing. We also provide free school uniforms." Pru said.

Earlier this year Blackbird Clothing Exchange was visited by Sunrise after Pru was nominated

for the Suburban Superstar award, where she received the greatest number of votes by anyone so far in the competition. She was gifted \$10,000 for her outstanding community contributions which she tells us will go towards securing a much bigger store.

"We pride ourselves on accessibility, however, we don't have good pram access, nor parking - we need to provide our customers with a better place to shop." Pru said.

When asked how the community can help, Pru said that shopping and spreading the word would help strengthen her mission.

"No matter if you're a man, woman, nonbinary, 82 years old or 20 years old - it doesn't matter. We really want to be a place where everyone, no matter age or gender, can come and shop.

"Even though we are a business and are here to make money, Blackbird is for the community, and we always will be."

And to make matters even better, they are celebrating their first birthday on Saturday, 7 May, with a bunch of wicked fun for everyone.

Owner, Becky Stone said the aim of the celebration is all about thanking and giving back to the local community.

"We just want to acknowledge the wonderful support we have had from the local community so far, and show newcomers what we are all about," Becky said.

This free event will offer a lovely rotation of live music from young, up and coming bands, stallholders, food trucks, drinks, a DJ, and even a music trivia game.

"We have invited a couple of vintage fashion marketeers, a couple of local food trucks, and a couple of music-focussed artists to set up on the day," Becky said.

Made up of The Boneyard Espresso and the Boneyard Records & Relics — The Boneyard Collective is a small family-owned business that wanted to bring their love of music and coffee together.

Becky and Leigh always loved the idea of a record store that was so much more than just that — they were both interested in filling a niche gap in the market.

"As people who had led lives surrounded by, involved with, and soundtracked by music...we wanted to make a place that people who loved music could gather and enjoy."

Becky's daughter, Ruby, was working at a coffee shop while finishing her university degree. "[So], when we found the premises that we loved, it had the perfect spot for an espresso bar," Becky said.

"Ruby was initially hesitant, but after some research and soul searching, decided she would go for it. Boneyard Espresso was created and what followed was a hectic four-week fit-out on a shoestring budget and many late nights."

But the blood, sweat, and tears were worth it for the Stone family as their first anniversary approaches — with continued support from the Redcliffe locals.

World-renowned Australian Medium Comes to Redcliffe

onoured as Queensland Psychic of the Year in 2008 and Australian Psychic of the Year three years earlier, Charmaine Wilson has dedicated her life to helping others.

In this intimate tour, Charmaine is coming to the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre on Tuesday, May 17, to connect to as many spirits as possible and help those in the audience feel that little bit lighter.

After briefly speaking to Charmaine, she said that these tours and workshops offer education and compassion to those who attend.

"In the two-hour event, I connect as many spirits to their family and friends in the audience as possible. At the end, I take some questions and talk about the spirit world in general," Charmaine said.

Charmaine first began her work back in 2002 after dealing with the death of her daughter, brother, and father. Through grief, she realised how important it was to connect with the spirit world and woke up to her gift by following the works of two great mediums.

"If it wasn't for Doris Stokes and John Edward, [I] may never have realised what [I] was, but thanks to their brave efforts of bringing mediumship into the open, [I] was able to work with [my] hidden talents."

When asked what the most fulfilling part of being a psychic medium was, Charmaine explained that it's all about perspective.

"After having so much loss in my own life and knowing the mistakes I made because of my deep sadness, it gives me so much pleasure to give those newly bereaved a different perspective."

Although her tours and readings have slowed down a lot during the pandemic, Charmaine has taken to social media to further educate and help others who may be struggling with grief.

"I work on social media a lot and do little Tik Tok videos to help people understand grief and how to move through it. There are generally a lot of questions people have, and I am happy to help them via social media," Charmaine said.

Candle Lighting Ceremony for Domestic Violence

ay marks the month for Domestic and Family **Violence Prevention and a National Candle** Lighting Vigil is being held around the country to honour the victims whose lives were taken due to domestic violence.

Hosted by Encircle, the Candle Lighting Ceremony is taking place at Redcliffe's Encircle Neighbourhood Centre on 4 May and will offer a safe place for those who have been affected by domestic violence to come together as a community.

One in four women in Australia have experienced at least one incident of violence by a partner. On average, one woman is killed every week because of partner violence.

Counselling and Families Manager, Lisa Boyd, says the vigil is an important event in the community.

"In past years, approximately 80-100 people have gathered in Redcliffe including survivors of domestic and family violence and community members," Lisa said. "This event highlights the devastating impact of domestic violence and is a powerful opportunity for the community to gather in remembrance and stand against violence in our community."

This year, Encircle is encouraging community members to submit a photo of themselves or their family holding a candle, as a show of support for those impacted by domestic and family violence.

BRAD'S BUSINESS TIPS

Profit vs Cash: What's the difference?

evenue is vanity, profit is sanity, cash is reality." This is a simple saying that helps business owners keep things in perspective. But what does each term really mean and how are they different?

Revenue is the term that we use for the total amount of income that comes into a business for services provided to the market. In fact, the origin of the word comes from 'to return'. In other words, what comes back, returns, for what we provide to the market.

But the catch is, when listed on a profit and loss statement, which is where most business owners look, revenue is based on what has been invoiced, which is not the same as cash in your bank account.

An invoice is fundamentally a promise to pay (think in-voice), it's not actual cash.

Along the same lines, profit on a profit and loss statement is where a lot of business owners look to see how they are doing in business, i.e. are they making money. However, we can't eat profit, or use profit to pay for something.

At the end of the day, turning profit into cash is about two critical things.

Firstly, how quick we get paid once we invoice. Secondly, how quick we pay our suppliers.

Fundamentally to improve cash flow we must speed up, getting paid and within reason, slow down how quickly we pay.

Golf simulation company X-Golf launched Hey Caddy, an 18-hole indoor putt putt experience, at North Lakes in March.

Dr Mahler, a self-confessed 'golf tragic', said he had noticed a significant lack of places to practice his favourite sport within his local region.

"The feedback from guests so far is very much aligned with

this feeling, that our community was in serious need of a venue like this, and we're so happy to finally bring it to life," Dr Mahler said.

"This is the first ever Hey Caddy franchise in Australia and behind it are the experts at X-Golf, a global powerhouse in golf simulation technology."

Hey Caddy gives mini-golf enthusiasts the chance to practice their swing at destinationthemed locations including Coachella, Bora Bora, Cappadocia, Melbourne's Hosier Lane, Mars, the Great Wall of China, Nevada's Area 51, and Mexico's Day of the Dead.

"The murals have been created by Brisbane artist Lee 'LINZ' Harden, which are definitely a showstopper," Dr Mahler said. "No detail has been left to chance, with cocktails themed to suit each hole and delicious menu items suitable for a whole range of tastes and preferences. My favourite feature about Hey Caddy is that there's somewhere to put your drink on every hole – design genius."

Dr Mahler was a skin cancer doctor and

general practitioner at Clontarf Bridge Medical Centre until his retirement. He now dedicates his time to Hey Caddy, as well as supporting his wife, Olga with her project Help Us to Shelter Ukraine. The couple have recently spent time in Poland assisting blind refugees with food and accommodation and helping them relocate to nearby safe havens.



Taking Steps to Save Suttons Beach Pavilion

group of community members are campaigning to try and save Suttons Beach Pavilion.

The Suttons Beach Pavilion Preservation Group (SBPPG) formed after an announcement earlier this year that Moreton Bay Regional Council had safety concerns about the condition of the buildings.

SBPPG president Jodie Starr said a petition was the first step the group took to stop the Pavilion from being demolished, which received over 23,000 signatures.

"The petition showed the Council how important this piece of history is to the people," Jodie said. "Without this petition, we are sure the building would have been demolished by now. However, the Council have agreed to take this on board and are now working with the committee to look at ideas around restoring or rebuilding a replica design."

The SBPPG has recently had their application approved by the Queensland Office of Fair Trading to become an incorporated, not-forprofit group.

"This was really important for us to show the community and the Council that we are in this for the long haul," Jodie said.

To support the cause, the SBPPG will be holding a peaceful walk and family fun day on Saturday, 29 May. There will be a free sausage sizzle, activities and games including face painting and a colouring competition for the kids, raffles, live entertainment and guest speakers.

"We encourage everyone to come along, so we can band together as the great community we know we are and continue to show the Council how important the building and its history still is to all of us," Jodie said.

"We would love everyone to wear their Save the Pavilion shirts, or simply blue, red and white. We will also be selling our amazing shirts on the day.

"We want everyone to bring positive vibes of support for our cause. This is a family event, so we would love to have loads of smiling kids running around."

Jodie said they are trying to get Council to put money aside in the budget for the Pavilion.

"We have been regularly staying connected with the Council and our dealing with them has been very positive," she said.

f you have always wanted to be a part of a flash mob, now is your chance! The streets of Redcliffe are set to come alive with the Anywhere Festival popping up in parks, community halls and urban spaces across Moreton Bay.

Running from 14 May to 5 June, this year's program, which includes free and ticketed performances, has been designed to activate places and spaces right around the region and encourages locals and visitors to explore areas they might not have been to before.

Acting Mayor Jodie Shipway said the monthlong event would bring life, joy and colour to the region after some very challenging times.

"These last few weeks after the devastating floods have been really hard on our community and getting out to watch some amazing performances is something we could all use right now." Cr Shipway said.

She continues to say it is important that we come together in our communities to support our talented performing artists who've had a tough couple of years.

"Anywhere Festival is all about seeing live performances anywhere other than a traditional theatre venue, so people can revel in the buzz of live performances close to home and in a COVID-safe environment." Cr Shipway said.

This year's program is proudly showcasing talented local performers from Moreton Bay and beyond. Starting on May 14, the public can expect a two-day performance extravaganza with events popping up around Redcliffe, Scarborough and Woody Point before moving to the next location. Some of the main events include a flash mob in Bee Gees Way, ABBA k-roke with Moreton Bay Big Band and a Pooch Parade where people are encouraged to bring along their furry friends.

HISTORY REDCLIFFE

A lifetime goal-scorer

ew sports can boast all-female parentage but that was the case for hockey on the Redcliffe Peninsula, and its prime progenitor was Mary Nairn (nee Brown). Mary was always athletic, having played tennis and golf and been involved with sailing, but when the National Fitness Council approached her in 1931 about launching hockey on the Peninsula, she found her sporting niche.

A meeting in September that year garnered an enthusiastic response and the Redcliffe Hockey Club was born. Little further could be done, though, until they found somewhere to play. Mary approached the Humpybong Agricultural, Horticultural and Industrial Association which, in March 1932, approved her request "for part of the showgrounds to be used as a playing field".

Then the hard work began. What had been "standing scrub" had to be cleared and a playing surface prepared. Mary and the other players, wielding hand mowers, provided much of the labour. Even so, according to The Telegraph, preparation of the field cost £23.

Soon the new Redcliffe team was challenging Brisbane teams, usually giving a good account of itself, although not always. The Humpybong Weekly felt compelled in June 1932 to comment on the team's "scrappy and disappointing display", claiming that "the forwards wandered aimlessly around" and "the halfbacks hit at everything but the ball".

The club was, from the start, prominent during Queensland hockey's annual Country Week Carnival, often hosting country teams at home. In 1938, Redcliffe hosted a team from the USA, sadly being defeated nine-nil. During the war, a combined Redcliffe and Brisbane women's team was challenged to a game by army personnel, then stationed at the Redcliffe Showgrounds. The ladies acquitted themselves well, losing by only one goal.

Mary Nairn was prominent as a player but it was in coaching that she excelled, giving both women and men the benefit of her expertise. During the war, she coached a number of soldiers teams and, post-war, she took on coaching newly emerging boys teams. She earned praise not only for their sporting success but also, as one admirer put it in a letter to her, "for training them to be gentleman" – not an accolade earned by many sporting coaches.

Redcliffe hockey's home ground, for which Mary lobbied, over which she laboured, and on which she played, is named the Mary Nairn Hockey Fields, a fitting tribute to the mother of Redcliffe hockey.

uilding your dream home for a tenth of the price of a standard home, whilst creating sustainable living and a much smaller environmental footprint, may sound like an impossible dream. Yet thousands of Australians are now 'going tiny,' building homes to their desires and lifestyle needs, and it's becoming very big business.

Australian Tiny Homes Expo organiser, Phae Barrett said that COVID-19, lockdowns and the subsequent housing crisis had seen the interest in buying and selling of tiny homes grow by more than ten-fold. Miss Barrett went from having just 37 possible builders in 2018, to more than 350 across Australia in 2022.

"People have re-evaluated, and spent more time working at home. They stopped to look at their lifestyles and dreams. Living remotely, off grid, growing your own food, and living independently, are strong calling cards to the tiny home movement.

"When people first see them, they are cute and pretty. However, it soon becomes apparent they are a practical and realistic way to design a life around what you really need, which essentially is quite basic," she said.

The reasons for going tiny and off grid are endless. It could be to downsize and live with less clutter, to house a relative, rent out, or extend your home and workspace. However there are lots of factors to be considered when choosing to 'go tiny.'

"Getting used to less space is a journey. You simply can not cull your belongings and get used

to it in an instant, so ongoing lifestyle choices are required. Finding land was certainly a sticky point, however this is being solved with new platforms to help people live tiny.

"The biggest con would be the stress of red tape. With the majority of councils leaving tiny homes as undefined dwellings that fall under 'caravan', it can be very off-putting. Dealing with councils and wading through zoning and building laws can be overwhelming," she said.

The Tiny Home Expo will showcase the quintessential tiny homes on wheels which range from 5m to 9.5m long. There will also be modulars, shipping container homes, glamping domes, cabins and expandable homes on display.

Miss Barrett said the Expo would be beneficial for people wanting to research a tiny home life. "For some people it has been utterly life-changing. Others may prefer to just get a few ideas on designs to build their own, and there are people that are interested in the advocacy and movement with tiny villages, addressing homeless solutions and social issues.

"Discovering the world of tiny homes opens a long list of possibilities that can enrich your life journey altogether."

We saw a large variety of birds, including a majestic egret. The kids spotted quite a few magnificent orb spiders in their webs, and we saw many meat ants. Make sure you wear enclosed shoes!

Thanks to the recent rain, part of the path was under water but we managed to sneak around some puddles to continue our exploring, before hitting a dead end. But what we did get to investigate was more than enough for our fun afternoon adventure.

Hays Inlet Eco Path is located off Silcock Street in Clontarf. Currently, it is a 200m long concrete path that is wheelchair accessible. Once the project is complete, the plan is for the path to continue 650m, and end with a boardwalk that overlooks Hays Inlet. We can't wait!

Major Funding Boost Helps Local PCYC Support the Community

CYC Qld has supported the Redcliffe Peninsula community and surrounding areas since 1966. Working with the Queensland Police Service, Moreton Bay Regional Council and local community partners, PCYC Redcliffe aims to provide a fun, safe and healthy sport and recreation environment along with a range of youth programs. And now, the valuable work they do has been given a major funding boost.

In partnership with the Federal Government and Moreton Bay Regional Council, PCYC Redcliffe is about to undergo a multimillion dollar renovation. Phase one of the redevelopment, a \$1.25 million refurbishment, has already improved accessibility and increased PCYC's capacity to support the local community.

PCYC Redcliffe Youth Club manager, Angela Barnes, said staff and volunteers have been working alongside the Queensland Police Service for 73 years to meet local youth and community needs.

"PCYC Redcliffe currently serves over 2,200 weekly visitors and 72 schools through various sporting, recreational, educational and social purpose activities.

"We also provide youth development and crime prevention support to the local community through our Braking the Cycle, Bike Education and Project Booyah programs. Encouraging healthy lifestyles through employment, volunteer opportunities, skill development, leadership programs and sport and recreational opportunities, PCYC Queensland is helping to change the stories of young Queenslanders who are vulnerable and at risk.

"Together, we are building safer, healthier communities through youth development, and the more youth development programs we can deploy, the bigger effect we can have on crime prevention, enhancing communities and establishing the leaders of tomorrow.

"These programs give young people purpose, focus, motivation, skills and opportunities. However, PCYC Queensland recognises our work in supporting communities and addressing the issues many young people face is far from done. More support is needed," she said.

As a not-for-profit organisation, almost 90% of PCYC's work is funded through donations and fee-for-services. Any surplus revenue goes back into programs, facilities and the community.

Redcliffe: What's in a name?

ith China definitely acknowledged as a major world power, the Peninsula Pimpernel delved into Chinese history to see whether the name Redcliffe had had any connection with China. Amazingly it had!

In 208 AD just before the time of the three Chinese kingdoms, there occurred a battle of epic significance in Chinese

> history. It was named the Battle of Red Cliffs and it was the largest naval battle in Chinese history, in terms of numbers involved.

The main action involved a Chinese dictator and warlord named Cao Cao, whose navy

and an 800,000 strong army were stationed on one bank of the Yangtze River. He was considered a ruthless hero who attempted to unite China under his control, but he was thwarted by Liu Bei and Sun Quan, who defeated his navy and army at Red Cliffs, now known as Chibi.

Liu Bei was also a warlord, who had the unfortunate reputation of betraying his enemies and allies alike. His partner on this occasion was Sun Quan, who was also known as Emperor Da of Wu. Their victory ensured their survival and gave them control of the great Yangtze River. This provided an excellent line of defence and later, the creation of two southern Chinese states, Shu Han and Eastern Wu.

Purists may say Pimpernel is drawing a long bow in attaching Redcliffe to the Chinese battle of Red Cliffs. Well not really, as the first European explorer to step onto our shoreline in 1799 was Matthew Flinders and he named it `Red Cliff Point'!



ow, I know what you're thinking.







ewfish, or Mulloway as they are also known, are a local fish that tastes better the bigger they are, with smaller ones tasting 'soapie' which they are sometimes called. However with a 75cm minimum size limit in Queensland this isn't an issue.

While I have never really targeted them specifically, they have often turned up while chasing other species and are a very welcome catch as they are 4/5 stars eating quality for me. Taking large live baits and lures, some fisherman spend many hours hunting these fish from surf beaches, around wharves, local reefs and around river mouths especially after rain events. Growing to at least two meters long and over 40kg they can certainly test your fishing tackle to the limit.

Sometimes in the surf they are caught on beach worms and some people believe that these fish can pull beachworms from the sand like a fisherman does, but only just using their mouth. I find that hard enough using my hands!

Recently some nice legal Jewfish have been caught from Woody Point Jetty. A couple years ago I managed to film a school of 'Jewies' under Shorncliffe Jetty. See my Youtube page for the video.


