

Sky's the Limit for Women Learning to Fly

emale pilots are the focus of a new documentary series being filmed in Redcliffe.

She Flys is an eight-part series which champions women with their eyes on the skies, and is currently filming at Redcliffe Aerodrome with the support of flying school Advanced Aviation Training (AAT).

Filmmaker and AAT flight instructor, Stephen Limkin, said the idea for the series came about when the chair of Recreational Aviation Australia, Michael Monck, asked him if he would be interested in a project promoting women in aviation.

"What started out as a small project has grown into a multipart series that is exploring the unique stories of women reaching for the sky," Stephen said.

"She Flys is about the soft barriers that face women in an extremely male-dominated role. There is nothing that major that stops women from flying, and yet statistics show that there is something, because the number of women flying is so low."

AAT's managing director and flight instructor Paul Reddish said Stephen and Michael approached him about supporting the project.



"I thought it was a fantastic way to get more women to take up the challenge and as such agreed to be a part of the series," Paul said.

She Flys is directed by Stephen and produced by Bridget May of Nora & RD Productions. It features women from different backgrounds as they pursue their dream to become pilots.

Television presenter Catriona Rowntree became involved after posting on social media that she wanted to learn to fly.

"A friend of hers connected her with Michael Monck and Recreational Aviation Australia and she became part of the series," Stephen said. "Catriona is a dedicated student pilot and...well, I guess you'll have to wait and see if she makes it to the end."

Stephen said he hoped people would support the production by making a donation through the Documentary Australia website.

"The money raised from the She Flys Documentary Australia website will go directly to the post-production, which is the most expensive and important part of the project," he said. "We want to make sure that it looks and sounds good."

She Flys is expected to be free to watch on YouTube next year. To donate go to documentaryaustralia.com.au/project/she-flys/

Local Little League Team Qualifies for World Series

2021

he Brisbane North Little League Division 1 baseball team is bound for the USA after claiming a place in the 2022 Little League Baseball World Series.

The team took home the gold medal at the 2022 Australian Little League Championships in June and will set off for the States this month.

Brisbane North Region (BNR) Little League manager and head coach Keith Land said he felt excited when the team won gold at the national championships.

"They have all put in hard work and were professional on and off the field, which is not easy for 11 and 12 year olds, but they were rewarded," Keith said.

The team triumphed over Sydney Little League team Hills 9-3 with player Khyden Wilson making the final catch, securing their berth in the World Series.

"We won the state title in April this year, which meant we went onto the national titles in June,

played in Sydney, which we won -- defeating teams from all over Australia," Keith said. "With this win, we booked a place in the Little League World Series to be played in the USA in mid-August."

"It now means we play in the series against the 10 best international and 10 best American teams in the world. Every year since 2015, the winner of the national titles goes to the World Series but BNR has never accomplished this, so it is an historical event."

The World Series takes place from Wednesday, 17 August to Sunday, 28 August at Williamsport in Pennsylvania. The team's first game will be against Canada on 17 August.

"Our games will be broadcast internationally on ESPN and the boys will play in front of crowds ranging from five to 10,000 people at the stadium," Keith said. "It is the 75th anniversary of the series and as such is a really big deal."

The BNR Little League team is drawn from players in the Redcliffe Padres, Pine Rivers Rapids and Narangba Demons.

Keith has been coaching BNR Representative teams for over 30 years in all age groups. He manages the team alongside assistant coaches Chris Clem from Narangba, Shane Wilson from Pine Rivers and executive officer Lyndon Clem.

ustralia's premier Pink Floyd concept show is coming to Redcliffe for the first time.

Echoes of Pink Floyd are bringing the sights and sounds of a Pink Floyd concert to the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre this month with their A Journey Through Time tour.

Lead vocalist Matt Goodluck said the concert would give fans the opportunity to hear a broad selection from the band's vast back catalogue.

"We go all the way back to the band's beginnings in 1967 and touch on pivotal points in their career up to their final proper studio album in 1994," Matt said. "In the past we've never really delved into the band's earlier work so it's been fun for us to explore that a bit and it's gone down really well with audiences.

"This show has impressive lighting and we use custom video projections that relate to the music to give audiences a full audio visual experience."

The set list will include Pink Floyd's biggest hits like Money, Wish You Were Here and Another Brick in the Wall, as well as fan favourites from the Animals album from 1977.

"This time out we're playing two songs from that album that we've never done before along with a couple of tracks from the 80's and 90's that we've not previously covered," Matt said. "But you'll have to come along to the show to find out what they are!"

The Adelaide-based band was formed in 2009 by lead guitarist Daniel Hunter, who taught himself to play David Gilmour's iconic guitar solos. He met drummer Jason Miller and they began playing the local pub scene before moving onto regional theatres. Now a six-piece band, they tour theatres all over the country.

"This is our first time to Redcliffe so it'll be very exciting to come up and play there," Matt said. "It looks like a beautiful part of the country and we always love playing to new audiences and getting to see different parts of Australia.

"It's been quite a journey and we all feel it's such a huge privilege to play this amazing music for fans across the country."

70 YEARS OF DANCING IN REDCLIFFE

Redcliffe dance school has given thousands of students the gift of dance for an impressive seven decades.

This month the Sharon Alback Dance Centre (SADC) is inviting the community to celebrate this milestone at Disco Inferno, a special anniversary concert.

SADC manager Sharon Alback said the school was opened in 1952 by Sylvia Currie, a dance teacher from Melbourne, alongside Gladys Armstrong, Sharon's mother, as pianist.

"The school was known as the Sylvena School of Dancing," Sharon said. "I was an original student and worked as an assistant teacher.

"When Sylvia returned to Melbourne in 1958, I took over the management of the school." The school moved from Woody Point Memorial Hall into its present studio at the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre in 1982, where it became the Sharon Alback Dance Centre.

"Dance classes were very different to today," Sharon said. "Children attended class once or twice a week and lessons ranged across all genres. Today each genre has its own specific class and specific teacher.

"In the early days ballet attire was very hard to source and most mothers made their child's costumes for the annual recital. Today very few mums sew and most costumes are purchased from specialised outlets worldwide."

Over the years, the school has seen many highlights, including overseas trips with Redcliffe's Sister City Program.

"These trips broadened the students' concept of dance and many of these pupils are still working in the entertainment industry," Sharon said.

"There are so many pupils who have come through the studio to gain their diplomas and have become dance teachers with studios of their own.

"My personal highlights are becoming an examiner with Comdance and also an executive and life member of the society.

"The secret of success is possibly that I loved my work and would always put the studio first. Money came second to satisfaction and always has."

SADC director Diahann Maude, who is Sharon's daughter, said Disco Inferno would feature past and present pupils.

"We have special guests including Nicole Wheeler, who is currently touring with Menopause the Musical, and Jahn Jaksa, who is the lead singer of one of Sydney's top retro bands, Groovin Hard," Diahann said.

Journey through the pages of a book with Shorncliffe Reads Together

hether you read for relaxation, or flick through the pages of a book to go on a wild adventure, Shorncliffe Reads Together is back to take students, families, and teachers on a group voyage.

During the month of August, students at Shorncliffe State School are joining together for a whole school reading initiative. Held across three weeks, the event will see students read the same book, at the same time with their families, then return to school to discuss what happened in the book and to participate in interactive activities including daily trivia, static displays, and guest readers.

Louise Youngman, a teacher at Shorncliffe State School, said the idea was inspired by similar programs overseas and was born from a desire to connect the school community through the love of shared reading.

"The goal is to connect our school community through shared reading and discussion about one book," Louise said. "All participating families will receive a copy of the book and an information pack containing the reading schedule and suggested activities."

Understanding that weeknights can be a busy time in a family household, Louise has created a reading schedule to help families keep on track. She has timed how long it takes to read each chapter and then has broken each night's reading into 10-15 minutes.

Reading is a vital skill for any child and with endless benefits, it's easy to see why this event is so popular amongst the 200 families who are taking part. Reading enriches vocabulary, stimulates the brain, and can help with writing skills. It also inspires curiosity, takes a form of entertainment and relaxation, and can reduce stress. Not to mention it fosters connection within the family home.

Louise said there are many benefits to reading as a family.

"Studies show that even after children can read for themselves, reading out loud can show them what proficient reading sounds like, with pacing, intonation and expression," Louise said.

"Listening to you read more challenging books exposes your child to more complex stories and advanced vocabulary."

ocal luminary and Redcliffe Guide contributor Richard Lancaster is set to launch two of his latest books titled 'Not Quite a Dozen' and 'Love, Dugongs and a Ship'.

According to Mr Lancaster, he has also drawn inspiration from the history and beauty of the local area and this includes the story of the HMQS Gayundah, which he studied in great detail.

"I moved to Redcliffe in 1998 and I have loved it ever since. It's the most beautiful place and we're very lucky here," he said.

Thus, this affection for his 'own backyard' and Mr Lancaster's appreciation for fine literary art forms are successfully intertwined.

Prize winning author and award winning journalist Matthew Condon OAM recently said in part "The art of the short story is an endangered species, but in Richard's hands it returns to a type of glory."

Both of Mr Lancaster's new books have been printed by local publishers, with the upcoming book launch scheduled to take place at the iconic 'The Old Fire Station Art Gallery' in Redcliffe.

onstruction of a controversial \$19 million overpass at Elizabeth Avenue Clontarf will commence as part of the Covid-19 economic recovery. Queensland Transport and Main Roads have said there were no other options for the road safety program.

Plans first came to my attention in March this year and I still have not seen the safety data being put forward to justify such a large expense. I stated in the first consultation meeting on April 26 with concerned residents, the State member and the Departments of Transport and Education that I failed to understand how no one had raised this intersection as an area of safety concern to me before. Hercules Road, Kippa Ring is more of a concern in my opinion, but I was told it does not qualify for this safety funding because it is not a split campus. The fully-enclosed pedestrian overpass will link Clontarf Beach State High School's eastern and western campuses, with lockable access to the school.

The community is not behind this project and a petition with over 500 signatures opposing the construction has been signed.

Whilst living in Redcliffe with his parents, Colin attended Humpybong State School, the Gibb brothers also attended the school two years later. It was here that Colin developed an interest in music, drumming in particular and was tutored by a master drumming teacher Harry Lebler. It was also during this time he met the legendary jazz drummer Gene Krupa.

After leaving school, Colin ioined a local band. Steve and the Board. While on a trip to Sydney with the band, he met up with Maurice Gibb who told him that on seeing the movie Smiley in a cold Manchester cinema, the Gibb family were motivated to emigrate to Australia as `ten pound poms`. This meeting blossomed into a firm friendship between the two. Aged 20, he moved to England where he met up with the Gibb brothers, who recruited him as the Bee Gees drummer and as well as a business partner.

Colin featured on some of the Bee Gees classic discography such as Massachusetts, To Love Somebody, I Started

a Joke, New York Mining Disaster, Words and many more. He then branched out on his own, first into the management of a number of up and coming musicians and then forming his own band which he called Humpy Bong, after his old school in Redcliffe. He achieved some success with a debut single and appeared on BBC Television's Top of the Pops. More recently he shared screentime with the Bee Gees in the group's nostalgic biopic How Can You Mend a Broken Heart, which was nominated for six Emmy Awards.

His show, The Best of the Bee Gees features highlights of the group's music as well as personal anecdotes and stories from his time with the Bee Gees.

uring a children's portraiture class at Art So Lively Academy recently, a troubled expression on a little boy's face caught my eye. When asked about it, he said earnestly, "my drawing doesn't look like yours Miss Gabi...I'm rubbish at faces!!"

Such a heartbreaking thing to hear. This statement prompted me to bring out a self-portrait I did when I was ten years old, one of a few drawings surviving my childhood. It brought a broad smile to the disheartened boy. "I have done a lot of practising since then and now I'm pretty confident about drawing faces," I told him.

It's not unusual for artists to feel discouraged at some time when making art. It's part of the journey. The secret though, is to persevere and keep trying. That day in class reminds me of a similar incident involving none other than Pablo Picasso who developed the ability to produce remarkable work in a few minutes.

Picasso was walking through a market when a woman approached him. She tore a piece of paper from a notebook and said, "Mr Picasso, I am a fan of yours. Could you please draw a picture for me?" Picasso obliged and drew her a small picture. As he handed it back, he jokingly said, "That will be a million dollars please!"

Amazed, the woman said, "It only took you 30 seconds to produce this little masterpiece!"

Picasso replied, "My dear, it took me 30 years to draw that masterpiece in 30 seconds!"

Exceptionally prolific throughout his 92 year life, he achieved universal acclaim together with a huge fortune for his revolutionary artistic accomplishments, becoming one of the best known artists of the 20th Century.

The lesson to be learned here is that few people with talent rarely produce incredible work without decades of practice. In other words, Practice makes Perfect......Well almost!

HISTORY REDCLIFFE

THE STREET WHERE YOU LIVE

et's think about our streets and roads. In the days of early settlement, there were very few and those few were pretty sad little dirt tracks in very poor repair. A report of 1864 claimed that the roads were so bad that farmers could not take their produce to market. Scroll forward 160-odd years and it is a different story; today the Redcliffe Peninsula is totally criss-crossed by some hundreds of thoroughfares, large and small, each with its own name and story attached. There are the obvious ones like Oxley Avenue and Flinders Parade. Everyone knows something about the history behind these famous names. But what about the many other streets that bear the names of ordinary people otherwise forgotten?

Take Pikett Street in Clontarf. The Pikett family – husband Fountain, wife Alice and three little daughters - arrived in Queensland on the Chyebassa in 1883 and straightaway travelled by dray to the Peninsula. Their first home was a farm out towards the end of present-day Anzac Avenue. In a few years, they moved to a shack near the cemetery from which their children, eventually numbering 10, walked to the Humpybong school. In 1909, one of the Pikett girls, Sarah, married Robert Kirkwood.

Which brings us to Kirkwood Street in Margate. Robert was born in Ireland and came to Brisbane as a child. In 1893, he moved to Redcliffe to work in the building trade with his uncle. They were instrumental in building the first Redcliffe town council chambers.

Other streets that recall old Redcliffe families are Adams Street, Scarborough and Boardman Road, Kippa-Ring. The Adams and Boardman families became connected in 1899, when Joseph

Adams married Mary Elizabeth Boardman; later, probably the following year, John Boardman married Emma Adams. John and Emma were the first couple to marry in St Marks at Woody Point.

Emma's and Joseph's parents, Eliza and John Adams came to Brisbane in 1866, having survived a shipwreck on King Island in Bass Strait along the way. John Adams was the first to run a passenger boat from Woody Point to Sandgate.

John and Emma Boardman had a farm where, now, Anzac Highway and Boardman Road meet. As well as farming, John was a teamster, driving horses between Petrie and Redcliffe and carting much of the timber for the jetty at Woody Point.

Check out your street's name; chances are, it evokes someone who lived not far away, although long ago and in another time.



On the Airwaves with Amateur Radio

early 50 years old, the Redcliffe and Districts Radio Club, located in McFarlane Park, Kippa-Ring caters for amateur radio enthusiasts on the Peninsula.

Jeff Lord, a member of the Club, said amateur radio as a hobby started in the early 20th Century, with the introduction of wireless radio communication.

"Back then radio experimenters built their own equipment to communicate with other like-minded radio enthusiasts. The hobby was born and very shortly after, Australians formed the first Amateur Radio Association in the world – the Wireless Institute of Australia," Jeff said.

Today in Australia there are around 13,000 licensed operators who form part of a global community of hundreds of thousands of radio enthusiasts. Amateur radio operators still build equipment and com-municate with each other, but in place of the Morse Code, scratchy voices and glowing vacuum tubes of last Century, operators use a whole range of communication means from voice to digital to video with sophisticated modern equipment. Yes, there are some who still use Morse!

Redcliffe and Districts Radio Club not only socialise, talk radio, and solve the world's problems, but each year they also support the scouting movement with Jamboree of the Air. They set up and run portable radio stations for the cubs and scouts to communicate globally with other scouts.

"There are many different avenues in the hobby," Jeff said. "We also communicate worldwide, bounce signals off the moon, talk to the International Space Station as it passes over head, and build antennas, radios and accessories for our hobby.

"For enthusiasts who like the outdoors, the Club regularly goes bush, setting up stations in the bush with portable radios and antennas using battery and generators for power for a 24-hour competition.

"We welcome men and women from all walks of life. We have a retired medical specialist, computer programmers, commercial sales reps, and even a military Chaplain. You don't need a university degree to play with radios, only the desire to learn about technology. We can teach you the rest and have you on the air building friendships and feeding your technical interests in no time."





MOVIE REVIEW

'SO DAMN EASY GOING'

s if being a teenager wasn't hard enough, 18-year-old Joanna is dealing with the loss of her mother, being broke and trying to find herself. Sounds pretty bleak right, and at times it is, but there's plenty of joyful and comedic moments to lift the otherwise sombre tone.

What sets this adaptation of the critically acclaimed novel by Swedish author Jenny Jägerfeld apart from other coming of age stories is that Joanna suffers from ADHD. It doesn't just throw this angle in for the sake of it, it offers a real insightful look into how people often struggle with a condition that so many of us still don't

understand. What heightens the situation is that she's forced to take extreme measures to secure her medication when her pills run out and can't afford her next dose.

This is Director Christoffer Sandler's first feature film having only worked in TV, but he's created a visually interesting movie that offers a unique look at Gothenburg, Sweden. Using interesting camera work and innovative lighting techniques. Such as manifesting the lead character's ADHD in the form of flashing fairy lights, subtly at first but then becoming more prominent as her condition worsens through lack of medication.

The performances are solid, with the lead actresses Nikki Hanseblad and Melina Benett Paukkonen delivering a convincing and interesting relationship. Their burgeoning and often tumultuous affair is a bitter sweet reminder of just how hard growing up can be. Hansebald as Joanna does take the lion's share of the screentime with a believable portrayal of the escalating complexities of her character's struggles, whether they're social, sexual or medical.

Although I may not be able to relate to being a teenage girl and the trials faced by the characters there's still plenty here to enjoy. So Damn Easy Going is a funny, sweet coming-of-age drama

about love and daring to be yourself.



hen people mention Tailor the first thing that usually comes to mind is beach fishing Fraser Island (K'gari). This time of year though quite good numbers are caught around Redcliffe, Shorncliffe and from our local fishing platforms and jetties. It has been a really good season so far this year too.

A fast growing fish with a 35cm size limit, most fish locally are 30-50cm but they do grow in excess of a metre long. Being pack hunters, schooling up and eating just about anything that moves, most anglers nearly always catch a few at a time. They are a great sportsfish that will take lures and live baits but with their razor sharp teeth will also easily bite through most lines. Care must also be taken as the larger fish can do major damage to fingers.

A great tasting species that is best dispatched, bled and iced immediately. My favourite cooking method is just filleted, rolled in flour and fried on a BBQ or hotplate. They are also one of my favourite fish to do in a smoker as their flesh is moist and oily. Due to the abundance of them around at the moment they're also a great buy at your local seafood market.


