lontarf's skies are once again set to fill with all the colour and cheer of Redcliffe KiteFest, which is one of South-East Queensland's biggest family-friendly events.

The festival is all about the art and spectacle of kite flying, but also brings a huge array of entertainment for all the family.

CEO, Moreton Bay Region Industry and Tourism (MBRIT), Shane Newcombe said the event was tagged as the 'Ultimate Kids Weekend' with two highly popular children's acts generating a lot of buzz.

"This year we are excited to announce that for the first-time ever we have two headlining children's shows performing – Bluey and Paw Patrol – live on the Sesame Lane main stage," Mr Newcombe said.

Mr Newcombe said that another event highlight was the Hot Wheels Stunt Team Fun Zone, featuring the latest Hot Wheels tracks and merchandise, but that the lineup of attractions did not stop there.

"Naturally, Redcliffe KiteFest features world-class international and national kite flyers, however

you've also got the children's shows, live music, carnival rides, aerobatic display, workshops and activities, markets and food stalls," he said.

According to Mr Newcombe, those coming from further afield or looking for a break from their regular routine would be able to easily plan an entire holiday around the event.

"Families can book a VIP Redcliffe KiteFest package, which includes accommodation, dinner, an exclusive meet and greet with Bluey or Paw Patrol, plus optional experiences such as Whale Watching, Putt Putt and more," Mr Newcombe said.

Those looking to fly their own apparatus would not be disappointed, with facilities set up to help both kites and spirits lift high into the horizon.

"Although the Ausbuild Kite Flying Arena is reserved for our professional kite flyers, we will have our public kite flying zone open for the entire weekend – where attendees can fly their own kite," Mr Newcombe said.

If you don't have a kite, you can build your own in our Kite Making Workshop or purchase one from a market stall.

Raise Your Steins to Oktoberfest

here will be so much food, beer and entertainment when Oktoberfest returns to Redcliffe at the end of this month, that organisers have extended the popular festival to three days.

Dress up in your best dirndls and lederhosen because Oktoberfest is back at the Redcliffe Showgrounds from Friday, 30 September to Sunday, 2 October, hosted by Beam Entertainment.

Event organiser Craig Miley said this year's festival would feature bigger and better facilities than before.

"We managed to get a one-day Oktoberfest in 2021, despite all of the Covid issues around events at that time," Craig said. "This year, we are going all-out, with a huge beer tent being added outside to complement the Webb Hall, and a greater selection of food, wine and entertainment for our patrons."

Inspired by the culture of traditional Bavarian celebrations, the over-18s event will see people raising their steins and saying 'prost!' (German for 'cheers!') with a choice of beers that includes Maisel Weisse, Kristall, Dunkel and Radler.

It wouldn't be Oktoberfest without food, which is why festival-goers can indulge in authentic German cuisine like pork knuckle, sauerkraut,

Hanchen-schnitzel, freshly baked pretzels, hot dogs with Bratwurst or Kranski.

Games host 'Karl the Wunderhost' will present games including fingerhakeln (finger wrestling), hammerschlagen (hammer striking), and stein holding, with prizes up for grabs like beer and wine vouchers. Attendees will also be keen to see who takes out the coveted titles of Mr and Ms Oktoberfest.

"Our Mr and Ms Oktoberfest contestants will be asked to parade in front of the crowd, with the patrons making the choice," Craig said. "Obviously dirndl and lederhosen will be essential, but personality usually decides the winners!"

Moreton Bay Regional Council Mayor Peter Flannery is set to appear on Saturday to perform the mayoral tradition of tapping the first beer barrel.

German party band Sneaky Schnitzel will also be back to entertain the crowd over the weekend.

"There is never a dull moment at Redcliffe Oktoberfest -- the ultimate fancy dress party with music, games and general frivolity across three days," Craig said. "This is becoming a destination event for our region."

ew things symbolize 'spring' more gloriously than I flowers - and when those flowers are orchids in a mass display, the result is simply spectacular!

Feast your eyes and fill your soul with joy as members of Redcliffe District Orchid Society bring their Spring Orchid Show featuring a diverse range of fascinating and beautiful orchids. There will be soft cane and native dendrobiums, cattleyas, cymbidiums and oncidiums to name a few. Soft cane dendrobiums normally steal the show as they come in a wide range of colours from whites to purples and an array of pastel shades.

Margie Beckett, President of Redcliffe District Orchid Society Inc, said that apart from having a wonderful display, there will be experts on hand to help people choose and care for the right orchid for their conditions.

"Many plants will be available for sale as well as all your potting requirements to keep your orchids looking their best.

"We will have experienced growers always attending the show to share their knowledge and offer advice in choosing the right orchid for your environment," said Margie.

Margie added that orchids love fresh airflow around them, so choosing a good open potting mix is essential. "It's important to remember the substrate is nothing more than an anchor system for the plant. We use a mix of bark, perlite and charcoal for most orchids."

Orchids flower better in a brightly lit area, but not full sun. In the winter months they tend to go dormant, so watering is kept to a minimum then. A weekly water will have your orchid thanking you with some lovely blooms for spring.

Margie said she has been an admirer of orchids for about 40 years, but seriously for 25 years.

"It really does become an addiction after a while. You can always find one more that captures your heart."

As well as plants and supplies for sale, crafts from CWA Clontarf will be on offer, a raffle held and refreshments available. Admission is only \$2 for adults, children free.

Come along and let the abundant beauty and colours of orchids put a spring in your step.



RECYCLING AND REVELATIONS

entimento in painting, "is the presence...of earlier images...that have been painted over".

At present deep in Cominos Arcade, Redcliffe, the Art So Lively students are painting

up a storm on canvas. For some, it is their 'maiden voyage' on canvas and they are very excited!!

On examining the clean white

canvas, one student exclaimed
"Hey look what's underneath! A
figure!"

As they held it up to the light, there it was. Recycling is in my blood, so discarded canvases are routinely painted over so that budding artists can experiment and practice with ease. If it doesn't work, just paint over it, is our mantra. In my personal art practice I have done this many times, re-using good (and costly) paper and canvas.

Sometimes the painting underneath becomes an integral and beautiful part of the new work. Most artists I know do the same. Waste not, want not. And we are not alone in the history of art

Recently in Scotland, an exciting discovery was made of a hidden self portrait of the famous 19th Century Impressionist, Vincent Van Gogh. It had been painted earlier on the back of another painting known as Head of a Peasant Woman. Sophisticated infra-red x-ray technology made this possible.

The impoverished Van Gogh economised by recycling canvases, cardboard and other surfaces either by painting on the back or on top of the earlier image. Interestingly, one early owner of this work was the father of lan Fleming, the creator of James Bond. Ian Fleming's dad sold it unaware he had two measures in one!

Vincent Van Gogh was not the first or only early recycler. In 2011, a hidden self-portrait by Rembrandt was discovered on the reverse side of his masterpiece Old Man with a Beard. Italian artist, Amedeo Modigliani also sketched drawings on the reverse side of his 1908 canvas Nude with a Hat.

Although such discoveries are relatively rare, other famous 'canvas recyclers' include Edgar Degas and Pablo Picasso. In the 1890's Degas painting Portrait of a Woman was found to contain the portrait of yet another woman, hidden beneath the latter work. That research was conducted in Australia in 1997.

Picasso's popular painting The Blue Room depicting a woman bathing, hides beneath its layers of blue oil paint, the portrait of a bearded man complete with bow-tie. Recycling continues among contemporary artists and especially those at Art So Lively, following in the footsteps of the now famous. Is it worth contemplating therefore, how many potential masterpieces are hiding in our recycled canvases just waiting to be revealed......sometime?



Finishing the dining on a high note is the Barbecued Moreton Bay bug dish resplendent with miso dressing and garnished with pearls of native finger limes from Lisa's Little Farm. Sensational!

Queensland Murri Carnival (QMC) organising committee representative Ian Lacey said there would be 80 teams, making it one of the biggest carnivals since COVID-19.

"It's good to be back at the Dolphins, it's a firstclass facility, it's a venue that's purpose-built for a carnival of our size," lan said. "There's going to be plenty of family fun activities, community stalls, NRL personalities and Deadly Choices Ambassadors. We are going to create an awesome atmosphere, so hopefully the South East community gets behind it and comes out in their numbers."

Since 2011 the Murri Carnival has been bringing teams together across Queensland. The event is sanctioned by the Queensland Rugby League and is run by the ABF in partnership with the Institute for Urban Indigenous Health, Health and Wellbeing Queensland and the Deadly Choices program. This year, players will compete in divisions including Senior - Open Men & Women, Junior Boys - Under 14, 16 and 18 and Junior Girls - Under 15 and 17.

The QMC encourages health, education and employment outcomes through sport, with all participants required to complete a health assessment. The event is also the biggest smoking, drug, alcohol and sugar-free event in Australia. Junior players must demonstrate 90% school attendance in terms one and two leading into the carnival.

lan said the carnival created opportunities for young Indigenous players.

"Some Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander players come from communities that aren't necessarily seen by NRL clubs," he said. "So they get some exposure and we can identify their talent and harness the raw skills and ability they've got and start to transition them into the NRL elite pathway system.

"QLD Cup clubs have representatives come and watch our carnival and have a look at the players. Also, with the female game expanding at the rate that it is, our carnival will become the perfect breeding ground for increased participation of the female league."







DEATH OF A PRINCESS

he tragic death of Princess Diana, her friend Dodi al Fayed and their driver Henri Paul in a Paris tunnel on 31 August 1997, stunned the world.

With the recent 25th anniversary passing of Diana's death, has come a flurry of new conspiracy theories surrounding the mysterious event. One, a much-publicised documentary calls into question the investigative procedures and reporting accuracy of both the British and French police.

John Morgan, a Redcliffe based investigative journalist became interested in the deaths and spent the last decade of his life investigating the events surrounding the Paris tunnel crash.

He studied all the police reports and the official Paget Report. He examined over 10,000 files relating to the deaths as well.

His conclusion was that it was not an accident but premeditated. The result of his investigations was the writing and publication of a massive bestselling 10 volume collection of books. His last book 'Corruption at Scotland Yard' remained unfinished at his death.

Today, John Morgan's contribution to the truth surrounding the death of Princess Diana remains as the definitive work and is considered paramount to current and future investigations.



REDCLIFFE'S FIRST RESIDENTS

hen Boama, also known as Sammy Bell, died on 2 February 1913, his friends erected a tombstone to mark his grave in the Redcliffe cemetery. On the stone is written "The last of his tribe". If he was indeed that, then Boama's death brought to a close his people's millennialong occupancy of their homeland, what is now the Redcliffe Peninsula.

Boama was a member of the Ningi Ningi people. The Ningi Ningi (meaning 'oysters') occupied a territory stretching from the Peninsula north to what is now Toorbul Point and they moved seasonally back and forth between the two. As the shell and bone middens found along the coast attest, the area was abundant in food sources.

The people gathered shellfish and caught and ate dugong and fish as well as land animals such as goannas and kangaroos. In 1799, when Matthew Flinders landed near what is now Clontarf, he found, in an Aboriginal dwelling, a large fishing net and some fish traps. He removed the fishing net, apparently leaving a hatchet in exchange.

The next Europeans that we know of to interact with the original inhabitants of the Peninsula were three castaway convicts who, in 1823, after being marooned on Moreton Island, made their way to the mainland and north, meeting and living with various groups of coastal Indigenous people before being rescued by John Oxley. They told Oxley that they had been well treated and their survival for seven months is testament to that.

Oxley returned the following year to set up a penal settlement at Redcliffe. The settlement did not flourish and the colonists departed in 1825, after which the site of the failed colony was named

Humpybong by the Ningi Ningi, a word derived from their language signifying deserted shelters.

The next phase of Indigenous/European relations on the Peninsula was the advent of missionaries in 1842, followed not long after by settlers. Redcliffe was surveyed, and the first land sold for farming, in 1864. Despite a period of cohabitation, with pioneering families farming and fishing in places still frequented by the Ningi Ningi for hunting, fishing and ceremonial activities, this effectively spelt the end of their traditional way of life.

Sadly, there is not much left on the Peninsula that Boama would recognise, only possibly some remnants of his language: Humpy Bong, Talobilla, perhaps the first word of Kippa-Ring and his own name, memorialised in Boama Park.







"She's an amazing advocate for the cause," Teresa said. "Over 700 women over 55 are homeless in Brisbane. These are the women who fought to have equal pay,



Losing our History

The terrible truth is that little remains of Redcliffe's historic First European Settlement, excepting a couple of leg-irons in the Redcliffe Museum. Equally sadly, Redcliffe's indigenous history has suffered the same fate.

And if we look to our contemporary history, to be frank, that's not looking too good either. The Scarborough Hotel and the Seabrae Hotel, both built in 1879, were victims of the demolisher's dozers. More recently was the proposal to demolish the Suttons Beach Pavilion. The project is paused, but its fate is still undecided.



It's an old rickety building that some may say should have been demolished years ago. But let's not forget that those rickety walls hold the memories of wonderful storytelling, of outstanding performances and performance festivals and most of all has provided our local community with many enjoyable evenings of entertainment over its 50-year existence as a theatre.

The Mousetrap Theatre Company started life in 1952 as the Redcliffe Music and Arts Society with a musical production entitled 'Wanted a Maid', and performed at the Woody Point Memorial Hall. Performances continued at this venue and at the RSL Hall throughout the 1950's and early 60's. In 1967, a momentous decision saw the Company purchase a building on the Redcliffe Showgrounds Reserve from the Redcliffe Leagues Club, who had been using it as a club room. The building itself had been part of the historic 1897 built Moreton Bay Hotel.

They named the building in honour of Agatha Christies `The Mousetrap`, the longest running play in the world. Since then stages have been built, extensions constructed and a major fit out completed in 1997. Many of these fundraised by the dedicated volunteer members of Mousetrap.

Is all this creativity worth nothing in our increasingly materialistic world, which under values artistic creation and prefers to destroy the past for a very questionable present and future?

Radicchio and **Fennel Salad**

with pear, honey-grilled haloumi and slivered almonds

pring has sprung and while animals are coming out of hibernation, local farmers at the Redcliffe Markets are busy harvesting their spring crops.

Today we are showcasing radicchio and fennel in this simple yet punchy salad. Colourful enough to make even the bleakest of days look bright, it's quick to throw together and the complex flavours will impress even the toughest of dinner guests. This salad will soon become your go-to meal when you want a meat-free option but still want something that is 'meaty' enough to be a main meal.

The radicchio is bitter. Some people love it, some people hate it. Here I have paired it with slices of pear and honey-drizzled haloumi to try and balance out some of that bitterness. What makes this salad versatile is that it lends itself beautifully to whatever nuts or cheese you have in your pantry. I have used haloumi, however if you're among the few people who can't handle its 'squeakiness', it is just as delicious with blue cheese, shaved parmesan, or even good old cheddar.

Radicchio

Radicchio is often mistaken for red cabbage or purple lettuce however along with Escarole and Endive, it is part of the chicory family. It's recognised by its red, veiny leaves and like most vegetables in the chicory family, it often gets a bad rap because of its bitter taste. If cooked right (grilled or roasted), this bitterness can be mellowed out, making it the perfect exotic salad leaf for your salad. A spring vegetable, Radicchio is best sown in March, April and May, and is ready to be harvested July through to October. It is sometimes referred to as 'Italian Chicory' because of its prominent usage in Italian cooking (soups, risotto, pasta and pizza) however to capture the unique flavour, it is best used raw. But fair warning - it's bitter!

Fennel

While fennel is a common vegetable in many Australian households, most people may not know how to use the whole vegetable. Known for its unique liquorice flavour, each part of the vegetable has a different texture and can be used in different ways, making it the perfect vegetable to use in a zero-waste kitchen. Fennel seeds are most commonly used in curries, stews and sauerkraut, however they are gaining popularity with bakers who are using them in artisan bread and fancy sausage rolls. Fennel Stems are delicious grilled alongside fish, meat and poultry, but are equally as nice served raw in

Fennel Fronds are an edible decoration. in the culinary world, often used as a garnish for delicate meals, however can be added to pickles, and olives and are great with white-fleshed fish. Fennel Bulbs can be eaten raw however are delicious roasted with oil and salt and served warm in a salad.

Radicchio and Fennel Salad

INGREDIENTS

1/2 a medium radicchio 1/2 fennel bulb 1-2 pears 180g haloumi

2 tbsp honey 1/4 cup slivered almonds Balsamic vinegar and extra virgin olive oil for the dressing

Peel off the outer leaves on the radicchio. discard and then chop into quarters (you will only be using ½ of the radicchio). At this stage, you can either char the quarters on a preheated grill (this will remove some of the bitterness) or put them aside to use raw in the salad.


Take your fennel, rinse under water to remove any dirt, gently pinch off the fronds and put to one side to garnish at the end. Cut off the stems so you are just left with the bulb, then cut into quarters. Take a mandoline and carefully slice the fennel into thin strips. If you don't have a mandoline, simply slice with a sharp knife.

To prepare the pear, cut into thin wedges and drizzle with olive oil, salt and pepper. Do the same with the haloumi. Preheat a grill pan on high (make sure you don't add oil to the pan it will smoke!). Once your pan is hot, place the oiled pear and haloumi on the grill, making sure you don't move it once you lay it down. To check that they are done, gently peel back one side and if it comes away without sticking (and you can see the desired char marks), then it is ready. Before removing the haloumi, drizzle with honey and move around the grill so that the haloumi gets coated in hot, sticky honey.

To serve the salad, arrange the radicchio leaves first, then place the fennel slices, pears and haloumi around the plate. Sprinkle with slivered almonds and drizzle with aged balsamic and extra virgin olive oil.

Voila!

LIONFISH PTEROIS VOLITANS

his strikingly beautiful fish is quite prolific in Moreton Bay and can also be found from south-western Western Australia, around the tropical north of the country and south to the southern coast of New South Wales. Other common names are Butterfly cod, Firefish, Scorpion cod, Turkeyfish and Zebrafish. It is a relative of the Stonefish and has the same 13 venomous dorsal spines that can inflict major pain if stung. The pelvic fin spine and three anal fin spines are also venomous. They grow to around 40cm, eat mainly live food and are an extremely rare catch by fishing line. They are quite sought after for the aquarium trade, quite easily becoming tame and taking food from your hand. Also very easy to catch when diving as they are not scared of humans.

The common Lionfish is a highly invasive pest species on the East Coast of the United States and in the Caribbean, and is having a devastating effect on reef fish populations. It is quite tasty as an edible species and is now targeted by spearfishing and on the menu in some American restaurants.
