enopause the Musical is back and is set to have the audience flushing with excitement.

The musical parody turns 21 this year and to celebrate, the Australian production by SK Entertainment is returning to Redcliffe Entertainment Centre for four side-splitting shows.

Company director and producer at SK Entertainment, Sam Klingner said the musical shone a spotlight on the difficulties and struggles experienced by women during menopause and reminded them they were not alone.

"My favourite thing about Menopause the Musical is night after night hearing hundreds, if not thousands, of women all laughing along and celebrating 'the change' together," Sam said.

Menopause the Musical is set in a department store where four different women form a bond after discovering they have a few things in common – from hot flashes to mood swings, night sweats, memory loss and more. The show includes parody covers of hit songs by Aretha Franklin, Marvin Gaye, The Bee Gees and Dusty Springfield. Trish Dearness, who plays Earth Mother, said she had been a cast member of the show since the 2019 regional tour of Australia.

"This is an absolute gem of a role for me," Trish said. "The character is very playful and her main menopausal symptoms are insomnia, rapidly changing eyesight and vagueness. Earth Mother is a 1970s hippie who has been vegan long before it was fashionable.

"I always love listening to the audience respond to the show. Both women and men find the four characters relatable. We say we are four girlfriends on stage and the audience is girlfriend number five. It's a high-energy, quirky and very entertaining show."

The Australian production has many connections to the Peninsula. The first performance was at the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre in 2019. Sam has family connections to the area and currently lives in Rothwell, while director and choreographer Maureen Bowra is a Scarborough local. Trish was born and raised in Redcliffe.

"I lived overseas for many years and decided to move back to Redcliffe when our children were born," Trish said. "The regional tour has allowed me to visit many beautiful towns and cities across Australia, but there's no place like home."

V read that title correctly! Redcliffe State High School is brewing their own beer and they are the first Australian High School to do so! And the best part is - it's open to the public under the banner of '3 Eagles Brewing' to sample.

Officially opened in December 2019, the idea was the brainchild of Redcliffe High Principal, Shona McKinlay.

"Our Principal saw a skill gap in the growing brewing industry and asked us to find out how we could make a course in micro brewing happen," says Redcliffe High Teacher and Head of Department, David Christie. He along with Andrew Coady and Phil Morrison developed the course. Andrew Coady, Teenay Major

"Once we received training in micro brewing ourselves, we developed a curriculum for the students that would earn them a Certificate III in Food Processing (Micro brewing)," said David.

"The course covers a multitude of skills including canning and branding, while also earning their RSA so they can serve members of the public, who can also purchase food created by our students."

The course is for 16-18 yearolds, so although students aren't allowed to sample the beer they brew, they also make nonalcoholic ginger beer that can be enjoyed by all.

So, what do the parents think of this relatively new venture?

"The response has been great," said David. "Especially as we invite parents to come and sample the fruits of the student's labours".

Sounds like my kind of parent teacher evening!

If you're concerned that they're competing against local businesses, it's actually the

opposite. The 3 Eagles team works closely with a number of breweries to find out what skills they require so students are armed for their future careers.

And there seems to be no lack of innovation at Redcliffe High. When faced with the problem of what to do with leftover grains, David said, "Our students turn them into dog biscuits and donate them to Guide Dogs Australia, apparently they're a big hit."

If you'd like to try the beer on tap, grab a bite to eat and even take some home with you, stop by Wednesdays from 2:40 to 4:00pm and Fridays from 1:30 to 4:00pm.

resh air, beautiful scenery, and a chance to get her heartrate up are just a few reasons why Clontarf local, Lorraine Parker, loves getting out on the water with her stand up paddle board.

"I started paddling in 2017," Lorraine said. "I initially wanted to take my dog out with me and I tried her on a friend's board which she seemed to like. I bought my own board soon after and have been paddling in the area for five years now."

The Redcliffe Peninsula is a paddler's paradise as there are a variety of locations that suit different tide times and wind conditions.

"Scott's Point is perfect as it doesn't matter whether the tide is high or low and conditions are usually great in the morning," said Lorraine. "Bells Beach, Scarborough and across at Sandgate are also lovely depending on winds and tides."

Lorraine also loves seeing the plethora of marine life that the Moreton Bay area has to offer. "I just love that I often get to see wildlife such as turtles, dolphins, dugongs and rays," she said. "Seeing a dugong up close is quite a memorable experience." If you're curious about the sport, Lorraine recommends joining a local paddling group or taking a lesson to get started.

"There are so many different types of boards around so some expert advice would be beneficial," she said. "Lessons are also good in that they provide you with the right technique so you don't make hard work for yourself by standing the wrong way or holding the paddle incorrectly."

While Lorraine often heads out for solo paddles with her pups, she enjoys going out with organised groups when the timing works. "I have made some good friends through paddling," she said. "We sometimes go for breakfast or coffee after being on the water and we've also had a few trivia nights." As many people are happy to let others test drive their boards, Lorraine explained that getting out with a group is also a great way to try a few different models before buying your own.

For Lorraine, there's nothing more beautiful than paddling out in the early morning and watching the sun come up. "It's so peaceful being out on the water," she said. "Mentally, it is just great to be out on the bay."

anice Charlish is a familiar face in the Redcliffe Community. Her contributions as President of both the Redcliffe Art Society and the Moreton Bay Arts Council, ensure her days are consumed with matters involving art on both the Peninsula and the wider Moreton Bay region.

Born and bred on the Redcliffe Peninsula, she was the second child in a family of eight born to the late Redcliffe Mayor Ray Frawley and his wife Molly.

HISTORY REDCLIFFE A POLICEMAN'S LOT IS NOT A HAPPY ONE

HISTORY WITH PATTIE TANCRED

ith the abandonment of the short-lived penal colony of 1824-25 - Queensland's first jail - Redcliffe reverted once again to being free (as far as we know) of criminals and without regular policing. It was not until 1886, with the construction and staffing of a new police station, that the law returned to Redcliffe in the person of Constable WH Wade, the Peninsula's first resident police officer.

The police station was a low-set building comprising quarters for the constable and a cell for 'guests' of the law. It stood "about midway between Redcliffe and Reef Points", fronting the beach. This proximity to the sea perhaps accounts for the damage when, in February 1893, as reported by Senior Constable George Perry – the station's fourth incumbent – "a violent hurricane passed over Humpybong", badly damaging the police station and its outbuildings and the constable's own furniture.

Officer Perry's woes were not confined to the ill-effects of bad weather. In 1892 he had

been forced to defend himself against smears published in the Moreton Mail that he failed to protect the populace against the doings of a "lot of young fellows" who "having their brains in the seat of their pants, go about at night ... doing mischief". Among the reprehensible activities the constable was supposed not to have policed were a theft of oars, fishing nets destroyed and, curiously, "playing cricket naked on the beach". Perry, in a long report to his superiors, refuted these claims (especially, he had "never seen any person naked on the beach").

More successful in thwarting crime was Acting Sergeant James Rafter, who followed Perry at Redcliffe. In 1898, Rafter distinguished himself by arresting one Henry St John Somerset, a Treasury official, accused of embezzling over £6,000. Poor Rafter did not accrue much kudos as a result of this triumph. Only two years later, an official report on the station at Redcliffe commented, "The work at this station is very light. Acting Sgt Rafter is an old man, slow and suitable only for a station such as this", which also seems to indicate that, Somerset's presence notwithstanding, Redcliffe was no hotbed of crime.

In the face of the challenges they face, today's police officers probably sigh for a time when, for the most part, the worst a single Redcliffe officer had to deal with was cattle theft, public drunkenness and petty pilfering from bathing sheds (a common summer crime in the 1920s), not to mention complaints of naked cricket on the beach.







ery few Redcliffe residents know that the late notorious ex-criminal Mark `Chopper` Read was so taken with the Peninsula that he came close to settling here.

Staying with his bodyguard, Mark `Hammer` Dixon in Scarborough, Read approached me about organising an art exhibition for his latest works in Redcliffe. He had already established himself as a painter of note, with his previous sellout four exhibitions in Melbourne and Sydney.

He had caught the art bug through his friendship with the 2000 Archibald prize winner Adam



Cullen who is rated among the 10 most collectible artists in Australia. Cullen took Read to his own art exhibition in Melbourne, during which time he told Read he'd just sold two of his works to Elton John for \$50,000.

An amazed Read exclaimed "How long has this `s..t` been going on?"

Read's first 45 work exhibition in Melbourne was an opening night sell-out. This was duplicated in Sydney with the same result. On being asked to describe Read's art, Cullen said "It's post -modernist neo surrealist rubbish, but it looks good on the wall".

Read never claimed to be an outstanding artist. "I sell because of my notoriety!" he told me. He was also the author of six adult books and one for children.

On Saturday evening 9 June 2012, Chopper Read's first Queensland exhibition opened as a joint exhibition with Scarborough's renowned portrait painter Kelvin Hawley, called Black and White in Redcliffe's Seaside Artists Gallery in Comino's Arcade.

The exhibition was a sell-out, again on the first night of the week-long exhibition. This further enhanced Redcliffe's reputation with Read. But shortly thereafter, Mark 'Chopper' Read was diagnosed with inoperable cancer. He passed away in Melbourne on 9 October 2013 aged 58 years, leaving a wife Margaret and a son, Roy.

I bought a couple of his paintings. Unhappy about the price I paid for one, he painted on the back: To Richard, for the highly rude asking price of 500 smackaroos for this Kelly in his pink period! I was happy though.

CUT IT OUT & STICK 'EM UP! A LOOK INTO THE HISTORY OF COLLAGE

t Art So Lively, we are currently deep in the process of 'cutting it out' and 'sticking it on' as we collage to create interesting, unique and sometimes humorous images around the theme of the human figure.

> The term 'collage' stems from the French word 'coller' meaning to paste and describes a work of art created using paper and/or everyday items glued to a surface. Around 1912 the term was coined by

the early Modernists George Braque and Pablo Picasso. Paper fragments of popular songs, photographs, newspapers, wallpaper, old tram tickets and other ephemera started appearing in their work. The Cubists using such experimental materials thoroughly broke with established artistic conventions.

However, it seems that collage is not as modern as I once thought. The earliest form is evidenced in Iron Age tombs of the nomadic people of Siberia. Remnants of felt have been found, suggesting it was used as decoration. Then in 200BC China, with the invention of paper, artists saw creative potential in the way it could be torn, cut and pasted to silk and it became very popular in 10th Century Japan with calligraphers and poets.

Medieval European artists embellished the images in cathedrals applying gold leaf, gemstones and precious metals. Each decade has produced outstanding artists using collage, assemblages and installations to express their perspective on society. To discover intriguing images created using collage, Google some of the following names: Martha Rosler, Richard Hamilton, Joseph Cornell, Kurt Schwitters, Wangechi Mutu, Deborah Roberts and Australia's own Sally Smart.

DUSKY FLATHEAD PLATYCEPHALUS FUSCUS

t has been incredible fishing locally the last few months with big Bream, Tailor, Snapper, Sea Mullet, Whiting and Flathead all in good numbers. Flatheads are probably my favourite estuary species to target and eat! All the way along our foreshores they can be caught land based. From Shorncliffe to anywhere around the Hornibrook Bridge, the local jetties, fishing platforms and around to Scarborough is perfect for catching this tasty fish. Identified easily by a single black dot on the end of the tail, they are often confused with other species such as Sand and Bar-tailed Flathead. Growing to over a metre long and quite the predator at this size, you can only take them between 40cm and 75cm in Queensland as the larger breeding fish are crucial to replenish natural stocks. All larger fish are female as they are born male and change to female around 35-45cm in length.

My favourite way to catch them is with a light rod, braided line and a soft plastic lure that is bounced on and off the bottom as you wind in, but they will take many lures and drifting in a boat with bait live or dead works well too. They love the warm shallow weedy edges of sand banks, creek mouths and rivers in the last few hours of the outgoing tide where they wait to ambush their prey. Walking the sandbanks and casting lures at this time is ideal.

Japanese friends of mine tell me Flathead is the best sashimi they have tried in Australia, I still like mine steamed, baked whole or fillets on the BBQ though thanks!

If you ever hear a fisherman say I caught a huge "lizard" this is what they are talking about.





ou may well wonder at the concept of Boot Art – described as a hybridised artist-run initiative and six month public art strategy based at The Bone Yard Collective in Redcliffe – that in more layman's terms features (at least, in part) art installations emerging from car boots.

Whilst it's still in Beta Mode, Boot Art @ Bone Yard Collective is certainly wondrous in person a fantastic collaboration where experimental public art meets great coffee with inner city vibes.

The next launch, which marks Boot Art Test Run 3, is scheduled for October 28 and is expected to bring with it a carnival-like atmosphere.

"If you come along you'll meet emerging, mid-career and experienced artists working through their ideas and concepts out of the boots of their cars, vans, utes and wagons," Ms Hurst said.

Ms Hurst is quick to point out that the launch and all exhibits are in fact, not a boot sale and although artists may have works or souvenirs of ideas for sale the project was far more encompassing.

"This project is about a joyous creative coming together of people who believe in the power of the arts to enrich lives and communities," she said.

The art installations are numerous and incredibly eye-catching but

according to Ms Hurst it's not only about looking at the art, but rather an open invitation for the community to jump in and enjoy a personal level of experimentation.

THE MELBOURNE CUP AND THEY'RE OFF AND RACING!

ockeys are gearing up and ladies are dusting off their fascinators, as people around the country prepare for the race that 'Stops the Nation'.

The Melbourne Cup is Australia's biggest and most famous horse race and considered to be one of the world's most prestigious. Held annually on the first Tuesday in November, the Melbourne Cup had humble beginnings. On November 7, 1861, the Victorian Turf Club introduced the Melbourne Cup in an attempt to trump the success of another competing club. About 4000 people gathered to witness John Cutts ride his mount, Archer, to victory that day, and won a gold watch for his efforts.

These days, prize money is in the millions, crowds are well in excess of 100,000 and the Melbourne Cup Trophies alone are worth around \$250,000.

While racing purists attend the Melbourne Cup to hedge their bets, and to either celebrate or commiserate over a few beers, another important event takes place on the day. Fashions on the Field was introduced in 1962 in the hope that it would bolster the number of female racegoers. This year marks the 60th Fashions on the Field, and with many categories for people to enter, including a category for the kids, anyone who wishes to show off their unique or lavish outfit is welcome to enter. It is also an opportunity for the fashion industry to showcase designers of both fashion and millinery.

The real stars of the day are the 24 Thoroughbred horses who battle head-to-head around 3200 meters of racetrack, in an effort to cross the finish line first. The record holder for the fastest race is the 1990 winner, Kingston Rule, with a race time of 3 minutes and 16 seconds, and the horse with most wins in the history of the race is Makybe Diva, who took out the cup in 2003, 2004, 2005.

With millions in prize money and trophies, 16,000 rose bushes adorning the track, champagne flowing, countless hats and fascinators and with all the fashion and glamour of the racing carnival, the Melbourne Cup is anything but modest.






