LITTLE NELL TO TELL BIG SECRETS

ans of the The Rocky Horror Picture Show will remember 'Little' Nell Campbell in her scenestealing role as glittering 'groupie', Colombia.

On 4 March, Nell will appear live on stage at the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre in a one-woman 'confessional' produced by Christopher Wayne.

She will share photos from her personal collection and divulge behind-the-scenes stories about her infamous New York nightclub, Nell's, and of course, Rocky Horror.

"While we were rehearsing the show, the director, Jim Sharman, thought there should be a dance song in it, so he asked Richard (O'Brien) to write a song," Nell said. "I used to busk at the time in between shows and rehearsals, so he knew I tap danced. He went home and literally the next day came back with The Time Warp and he had the tap break for me – it was so novel at the time for someone to tap dance."

Nell said the greatest thing about Rocky Horror has been its profound effect on the LGBTQ+ community.

"That has been the most wonderful, unexpected delight of the whole thing – of the play, the show and the film," she said. "The film still seems to be of great benefit to young people, if it's their sexuality or if they want to cross-dress, it just brings people together."

Nell's nightclub opened in Manhattan in 1986, after successful restaurateurs Keith McNally and Lynn Wagenknecht asked Nell if she wanted to join them in their new enterprise.

"I said yeah, because I say yes to everything," Nell said.

Guests included Bob Dylan, Sting and Andy Warhol. According to Nell, the venue was designed to have an atmosphere like an oldfashioned, London gentleman's club.

"We only added a dance floor towards the end, because the hours were 10pm to 4am and I realised I wouldn't be able to stay awake that long without being able to dance," she said.

Nell credited the "two iconic aspects" in her life – Rocky Horror and Nell's – as being "pure luck".

"I was just extremely lucky that Jim Sharman saw me busking and he heard about me and he offered me that job," she said. "That was an opportunity that landed in my lap and the same for doing Nell's. Both of those opportunities had a lot to do with my personality, not necessarily my talent."

Nell's dazzling personality will have audience members captivated by every moment of the show.

"I really look forward to coming to Redcliffe and checking it out," she said.

R edcliffe Hockey Club player Annelyse Tevant is set to represent Australia at the 2023 FIH Indoor Hockey World Cup.

The 18-year-old has been selected for the Australian Women's Indoor Team for the tournament, which starts in South Africa on 5 February.

Annelyse said she was very excited to be part of the team and had been busy with training sessions. "It is an amazing opportunity to go out and play against the best in the world," she said.

Australia Women's Indoor Hockey Head Coach, Mark Sandhu said the quality and depth of the squad was the best it had ever been, which made the final stage of selection extremely tough.

"This is a strong team that combines experience with up-and-coming talent to give us the best chance of success at the World Cup," Mark said.

Annelyse said she hoped the team would come away with the gold medal.

"I am hoping to achieve a goal of lifting my game to that extra level and doing all I can to represent my country proudly – and making everyone who has supported me along the way proud," she said.

Annelyse, who has been playing hockey since she was six, said some of her major achievements included making the 2022 Hockey Australia Women's Futures (U18) Squad and being named as a shadow player for the Jillaroos (U21) Domestic Series.

She has played with the Redcliffe Hockey Club for the past three years.

"My experiences with Redcliffe Hockey have been very fun, enjoyable and exciting," she said. "They have been super supportive with the hours of travel I was required to do from Maryborough (my home town) to Redcliffe every Wednesday and Friday for training and games."

Last month, Annelyse represented Queensland at the Indoor Hockey Championships.

"I just love the excitement and thrill of hockey, the fact you can always find new and creative ways to score and play," she said. "I also love the community and the friendships you make along the way.

"My goals in the future are to progress with my skills and enthusiasm to play outdoor hockey at the highest level, like the Olympics and Commonwealth Games."

THE REAL-LIFE ANIMAL WHISPERER

ave you ever looked at your pet and wondered: what on earth are they thinking? Holistic Animal Health Coach Rommie Buhler has the answers to the questions on every pet owner's mind.

Rommie works as an Animal Communicator through intuition and has written a book that transforms real-life, practical advice into a variety of entertaining stories with fictional stories and characters based on real-world problems. Writer of Animals Speak and Holistic Animal Health Coach Rommie Buhler said that she wants people to understand their animals better to understand how they can provide support around anxiety, nutrition, disease, pain and sadness.

"As an Animal Communicator, I sit as the conduit between the animal and their person. I ask their animals that never-ending list of questions that arise with their animals' health, strange behaviour, nutritional disorders, emotional problems, etc and I work to find a solution for them," she said.

"There are a number of problems I see show up time and time again and I have selected some of these to share in story form—from the perspective of the animal, the animal's person or that of the animal communicator."

Rommie is based in the Redcliffe Peninsula and has noticed how many people in the area have pets. 69% of households have pets there are 29 million pets in Australia.

"That is a lot of animals needing better care and that is a lot of people that need help when they flounder with what to do with their sick, naughty, anxious, aggressive animals," she said.

"This book has been written based on not just the thousands of clients I've had over the years but also my own "bad pet parenting" through lack of knowledge and understanding. The stories and characters themselves may be fictional, but they are based on real problems I see."

The highlight of Rommie's job is watching the relationship transform between animals and their people after they can understand what their pets are saying for the first time.

"I am on a mission to educate, inspire and motivate people that have animals in their life to uplevel their relationship with them, to be more present with them, to communicate with them so you both understand each other and to love them into living a long, happy, engaged and meaningful life."

Why is sorry so hard to say?

s a therapist, I have seen people withdraw from others, often for years, because they feel an apology is due because of

another's words or an event that occurred. However, while waiting for the apology, close connections can erode and bitterness can set in.

Apologising occurs when we become aware that we may have, intentionally or not, hurt someone. At the end of the day, it becomes more than who was wrong or right, it's about a reconnection of a

relationship. Sometimes we need to apologise because it's time to drop the struggle.

Here are four tips for apologising:

1. At the most basic, what you are doing is taking responsibility for your actions and/or their impact on another. This can often be hard but remember your apologising because you offended the other person not necessarily for your point of view.

2. Be sincere. Let the other person see you are genuine, and that you regret the situation and the impact it has caused.

3. Know that it can feel uncomfortable to say sorry and put yourself out there.

4. You do not own what the person does with your apology. Some people will accept your apology and you can move forward together, other people may not.

Keep the apology simple and start with I. You might choose to say something like - I am sorry that my words hurt you, that was never my intention.

An apology alone might not fix the conflict, but it can go a long way in soothing the injury that our actions or words have caused another and isn't that worth the risk?



R edcliffe local Dr Natalia Balo, an Australian citizen who migrated from the Ukraine in 1995, is an acknowledged world renowned avian artist.

She recently achieved further fame with her bestselling pictorial book Bird Anatomy for Artists being featured in the CSRIO's prestigious book Feather and Brush - A History of Australian Bird Art by Dr Penny Olsen.

Notwithstanding her artistic success, being a native Ukrainian, Natalia has witnessed the destruction of her native Ukraine with a sense of increasing alarm. For this reason, she was determined to assist the Ukrainian refugees fleeing from their war torn homeland to Australia, in any way she could.

So she volunteered to serve as an interpreter with the Australian Translators and Interpreters Service, who provides much needed language interpretation assistance to newly arrived refugees from all over the world. She completed an interpreting course with the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology.

"In doing this work, I have heard so many horrible stories from these homeless refugees. They relate stories of the depravity, the cruelty and the barbarism meted out to them by Russian soldiers. Watching the destruction of their homes and wondering whether they will ever return, breaks my heart," says Natalia.

"However, all are extremely grateful to the Australian community for their generous support and help."

Whilst she prays that this terrible war will end soon, she is determined to carry on with her interpreter's work for as long as it's needed.

FAMILY MATTERS: THE OTHER SUTTONS

ow many Redcliffe place names commemorate the Rev. John Sutton? A few spring to mind: Suttons Beach, Sutton Street, Sutton House. The Sutton name, though, equally attaches to John's wife, Fanny, and his children, about whom less is written. Fanny, baptised Frances, was the daughter of Ralph Edward Godschall Johnson, a widower, who came to Queensland in 1854 with his two eldest sons, Ralph Cholmondeley and Charles, leaving his remaining family behind. In 1860, Johnson, having been appointed Assistant Clerk to the Legislative Assembly at a salary of 300 pounds, was in a position to reunite his family. He sent for his remaining children, Ellen, Frances, William and Frank, who sailed from London on the Vimiera, arriving in Brisbane in early September.

Also on the Vimiera was a party of bachelor clergymen destined for the Anglican ministry in Queensland. Among these gentlemen was the Rev John Sutton, then aged 42. Evidently over the long months of the voyage something warmer than an acquaintanceship developed between the 18-year-old Fanny and the Rev John because soon after they disembarked in Brisbane he visited Fanny's father to seek approval for an engagement. They were married in February 1861 and moved to Gladstone where John was tasked with establishing an Anglican parish. In 1863 they were back in Brisbane where John served as rector at St John's, William Street. In 1882, the family moved to Redcliffe where John had considerable land holdings and where they had built a small holiday house.

Fanny and John had 11 children, of whom three died in infancy. Their eldest daughter, Violet, died in 1888. After the move to Redcliffe, the younger children attended the newly-established Humpybong school. First to enrol was 11-yearold John Francis Cholmondeley (no doubt named after his maternal uncle). He was one of several Humpybong old boys who served in the First World War.


John and Fanny built a grand family home, called Hurley House (later Sutton House), to replace their original cottage. The house became a social focal point, with daughter Florence reported in 1894 as hosting a "little Assembly ball ... productive of much amusement". In 1901, Florence celebrated her marriage to the Rev Herbert Beasley there.

John died in 1897 but Fanny continued to live at Hurley House with Florence and Herbert for a number of years. She died in 1909, fondly remembered as "Granny Sutton" and beloved by family and friends.





Food Art!

ood and art - two of life's great pleasures but also necessities for a full life. One being nourishment to keep the body and brain ticking over. The other provides sustenance for the heart and soul. What a grim and short existence it would be without them. Recently, at Art So Lively Art Academy, we recognized a strong link between food and art reaching back to earliest times.

Stone Age artists used food to depict food. Using animal blood and fat to bind plant pigments, they depicted the animals they hunted. Perhaps the purpose was to bring the image to life as food.

Egyptian artists wove spiritual expression with artistic expression ensuring all the foods needed for a good life after death were represented in an important person's tomb. Roman artists helped society truly celebrate food and wine with Bacchus, God of Wine and Ceres, Goddess of Grain featuring alongside culinary delicacies in many household frescoes.

Illustrations in medieval manuscripts provide detailed snapshots of this era's food culture - both preparation and consumption. Often there was a biblical moral attached, such as gluttony is a sin.

In Renaissance times, food continued to be a significant subject for artists. The standout for me is 16th century Italian painter, Guiseppe Arcimboldo, with his portraits of the Emperors composed of fruits and vegetables, perhaps saying this ruler was creating an era of abundance.



Echoing ancient cave artists, Filippo Marinetti in the early 1900's created art from food itself. His 'Futurist' movement promoted cooking and dining as the centrepiece of this new art form. Following this, Food Art entered the artistic expressions of feminist ideology. Food Art launched new restaurants as art projects. Specially themed food preparation was carried out in art galleries and exotic sculptures were created using food, to name just a few ways art and food have collided during the last one hundred years.

It seems food and art remain firm friends, continuing to feed our imaginations.

reported some safety issues. They will now fund the repairs which are expected to take up to 2 years.

Included in the repairs will be replacing timber work due to termite damage, resolving foundation issues, upgrading the aging electrical system, and updating the fire safety to current standards.

President of Mousetrap Theatre, Karen Matthews, said that while the repairs are necessary, nothing compares to performing in your home theatre.

"The building is our home. While we will be continuing to present productions in other venues while our building is closed, there is nothing like using your own theatre. We have all our sets and props there and the building has been adapted to suit what we do. It is very much "our space".

- Seal window and door gaps to the exterior to stop hot air drafts;
- Close doors to rooms not in use;
- Shade windows exposed to the sun;
- Dry clothes in the sun or limit the use of clothes dryers;
- Ensure hot water system is on off-peak tariff and temperature is checked;
- Limit time of showers to reduce hot water usage;
- Turn off standby power, where possible, saving up to 10% of power use.

RECIPES ON PAPER *Nuoc Cham Dipping Sauce*

RECIPE JULIA LEWIS

f you are a lover of Asian recipes and flavours, then you would be no stranger to this sauce. However if you are new to it, this is your answer to most Asian salads you will cook and eat in your kitchen.

It's sweet and fresh, and the delicate flavours will have you wondering why you have never tried it before. The great thing about this dressing is how versatile it is. You can use it in Vietnamese salads, as a dipping sauce for spring rolls and dumplings, and of course you can drizzle it in rice paper rolls. I have even seen it used as a marinade, and it goes beautifully with white fleshed fish.

I'm sharing this recipe with you after the inspiration came from recently finding Lek's Asian Market in Redcliffe. Before now, I had to venture into the city to buy my Asian grocery staples, but I can now shop locally. It has everything you need from bulk rice and grains to kitchenware and ramen. You can find them on Ashmole Road in Redcliffe.



INGREDIENTS 6 tbsp water 2 tbsp raw sugar 1.5 tbsp freshly squeezed lemon (or lime) juice 2 tbsp fish sauce 1/2 clove minced garlic 1 long chilli deseeded ½ small carrot grated A few drops of sesame oil (optional)

This recipe can be tailored to your taste buds. Some people don't like a strong fish sauce taste, so just add a little at a time. Taste as you go to learn the flavours you like.

Start by mixing the water and sugar until the sugar dissolves. Depending on what sugar you have used (you can use caster, raw or palm sugar), you may need to heat the water a little so the sugar granules dissolve. Then add the lemon or lime juice. This is where the freshness and zing come from so I suggest putting all of it in, but you could add it a little at a time and keep tasting.

Then add the garlic, chilli, grated carrot and if you are using it, add the sesame oil. This isn't traditional, but it gives it a beautiful savoury flavour. Mix everything together and serve! www.recipesonpaper.com.au



SEA MULLET - MUGIL CEPHALUS

n the cooler months of the year sea mullet will turn up in Moreton Bay in massive numbers to spawn. These are the silver fish you see jumping most of the time around a foot long on the flats in front of Sandgate, up the rivers and along the beach at Redcliffe. Found all around the Australian coastline they grow to over 70cm with most I see around 40cm.

They are targeted by the cast netters you see on the jetties, as well as the commercial netters on the beach. It is rare you will catch one on a fishing line due to their main feeding method of sand sifting and also feeding on algae and detritus on the seafloor. I have managed a few on worms and bread while fishing for other species.

Some people are not fond of eating 'mullet' but being mainly a coastal and ocean going fish these local specimens are very clean and tasty and a great buy at your local seafood outlet when in season. I like fillets just rolled in flour on the BBQ hotplate.

ave you ever had that magical musical experience when a tune or a song keeps coming back to you? The experts sometimes call it `sticky music` because it `sticks` in your memory bank.



But teaching this leftie was no deterrent to Keryn. In our first session, she was able to have this elderly, dinosauric-like, lefthanded, large fingered man pluck and sing Marion Sinclair's 1932 classic song Kookaburra.

As I left the Henderson residence, I heard Keryn's gentle voice reminding me "Don't forget to exercise your fingers properly and practice for 10 minutes each day".

She wisely emailed me a series of notes and instructions, which I then promised my heaven resting Dad I would study carefully. But I also let him know that emulating the ukulele playing maestro George Formby may be a long way off yet!
