DOMESTIC VIOLENCE FITNESS PROGRAM CONNECTS WOMEN

omen in the local community who are experiencing domestic and family violence (DFV) now have the opportunity to attend a free, physical fitness program in a safe environment.

The Rise Up, Be Yourself (RUBY) Program is for women who are, have been, or are likely to be experiencing DFV, and it is commencing at PCYC Redcliffe this month.

A/Sgt Kris Parker, the Youth and Community Program Manager for PCYC Redcliffe said RUBY was developed due to a recognised need in the community.

"Violence against women is recognised as a serious and widespread problem in Australia, with enormous individual and community impacts and social costs," Kris said.

"RUBY is designed to empower women by improving physical health and wellbeing,

emotional resilience, selfesteem and confidence through physical exercise and companionship in a safe environment. RUBY is a safe place for women to come and exercise, meet other women who have had similar experiences and to seek referrals or advice from QPS officers "

RUBY is delivered on an ongoing, weekly basis and is supported by a female fitness instructor and female police officer. It is currently running at PCYC Deception Bay, PCYC Caboolture and at a number of other PCYCs across the state.

Kris said they were hoping to source funding and

partnerships to support the local program, which would help them to engage a female fitness instructor and provide snacks for participants after sessions. Any money raised would also go towards essential items like gym towels, workout clothing, shoes and water bottles to better equip the participants to undertake a physical fitness program.

"Understandably some women have come away with very little and have little in the way of personal effects, putting the needs of their children first and not having something special just for themselves," Kris said.

Kris has been involved with RUBY programs at other PCYC clubs for more than five years. She said she had seen how the program helped participants reengage within the community.

"It provides them with greater confidence and connectedness with other women who have travelled the same road and understand their situations," she said. "They gain strength from each other."

Women who have experienced DFV can self-refer or be referred to attend the RUBY sessions. Those interested in attending can contact Kris for a confidential discussion on 0429 644 663.

f quirky literature is your thing, and if you're young or young at heart, Batrisha and the Creepy Caretaker is likely to be right up your spooky and spine-tingling alley.

The short graphic novel, which was released early last year by Margate Beach publisher Nat Kamichael (under the imprint of Comicoz), is aimed at ages eight and up and has been nominated for the Australian Shadow Award, open to Australian writers of dark fiction.

The story and illustrations by Ballaratbased Dillon Naylor feature a ghastly groundskeeper and a pale, dark-haired young girl and her two-tailed cat.

"Batrisha Belfry is a comic character I created for a monthly section in K-Zone Magazine in 2001 and it ran for about 14 years. I wanted

to do something more with her beyond the comic strips and had an idea of a kind of an all-age storybook using old-style illustrations and poetry," Mr Naylor said.

Publisher Nat Karmichael said that Dillon was very deserving of the nomination, the results of which are to be announced later this year.

"He's been writing and drawing comics for over twenty years and it's his best work yet," Mr Karmichael said.

Sleepbus rolls into Redcliffe

he problem of people sleeping rough in Australia is an issue that Simon Rowe, founder of Sleepbus, is working to alleviate by thinking in terms of four wheels, rather than just four walls.

Now, Redcliffe is set to soon have its own Sleepbus, which, simply put, is a bus operating as a mobile homeless shelter.

Mr Rowe said the 'roll-out' was likely to happen sometime toward the end of winter and would most likely be located in the carpark of the Redcliffe Breakfast Club when it arrives and begins service.

"It's been a hard slog and we've only just got the bus in now, but we'll keep everybody updated," Mr Rowe said.

Mr Rowe was working as a business consultant when, after his own experience of falling through the cracks as a teenager, he had a life-changing encounter with a homeless person, instigating the development of a novel homeless shelter solution.

"It's not safe to sleep at night, you have to keep your wits about you, it's much safer to sleep during the day on a busy footpath and let people like you walk over me" — these are the words of the homeless person to Mr Rowe, pointing out the many risks of sleeping exposed at night.

Mr Rowe realised that the mobility and affordability of a bus (especially one equipped with overnight caretakers, personal lockers and climate controlled pods with a bed and toilet), presented a clear win over bricks and mortar building models, with the success of the project spreading across Australia to reach our local region.

"The community has rallied and a bunch of organisations got together and fundraised for the Redcliffe Sleepbus. These relationships will be coming along with us for the journey, obviously the main one being The Breakfast Club and the Council has been very supportive as well," Mr Rowe said.

According to Mr Rowe, it costs about six dollars to provide somebody with a 'safe sleep', with sponsorship from local businesses is needed to keep the fundraising going.

THE TEMPEST, REDCLIFFE STYLE

hile the meteorological names Steve, Debbie and Yasi would have meant nothing to our forebears on the Redcliffe peninsula, the phenomenon they represent was all too familiar.

We do not know how the area's Indigenous inhabitants protected themselves from severe tropical storms, but their lack of built infrastructure at least saved them from the damage and losses incurred by early European settlers. In 1879, as reported by The Queenslander, "the police barrack at Redcliffe was blown down" in a heavy storm. So severe was the damage that "the building now lies a complete wreck", the officer in charge barely having had time to make a life-saving leap from the veranda.

A ferocious storm struck Woody Point in March 1890, "the waves washing the jetty from end to end", forcing the steamer Garnet to return to Brisbane without landing passengers and causing considerable damage to property including washing bathing huts out to sea, damaging jetties and tearing roofs off houses.

In "Black February", 1893, when cyclonic weather brought devastating flooding to Brisbane and surrounding regions, Senior

Constable Perry at Redcliffe reported that a "violent hurricane passed over Humpybong". The police station was, again, badly damaged with the doors blown open, glass smashed, Perry's furniture broken and the police stables being unroofed.

Worse was the damage to Klangur, the house of Mrs Harriet Bell at Woody Point, which was "blown off the stumps and smashed into atoms". Fortunately, Mrs Bell and other occupants of the house escaped with only "severe bruises" but the loss of Klangur was a terrible blow. Mrs Bell had built the "truly charming marine villa" in 1882 and, surrounded by gardens and fruit trees, it was a "decided ornament" to the southern part of the peninsula.

Also caught up in the wild weather was the schooner Lorna Doon, which had been anchored at the Redcliffe jetty. In the high wind, the boat was nearly washed ashore, whereupon the captain decided to make a run for Cabbage Tree Creek. On the way, the boat was struck by the cyclone, "the rain pouring in torrents" and the mast "snapped off about 9ft from the deck". They "put in an awful night" but eventually made it to the creek.

Redcliffe has witnessed many such "bursts of horrid weather, such groans of roaring wind and rain", and will no doubt see more. With cyclone season upon us, keep a weather eye out and stay safe.



Local Woodwork Artist Creating Beautiful Marquetry Art

or the past 6 years, self-taught woodwork artist
Dagmar Maini has been creating unique and
beautiful Marquetry art. The fine wood art
involves applying pieces of veneer to a structure to
form decorative patterns, designs or pictures.

Being a self-taught artist has allowed Dagmar to explore and fine-tune her skills, working with different mediums including wooden veneers, stone veneer, Mother of Pearl, and brass.

Dagmar explains that each piece starts with a simple sketch and says that the choice of shapes and colours is an emotional decision.

"All my artworks start with a sketch. The rough sketch is often just a shape that begins to develop step by step as I intuitively apply different techniques to create specific effects and shapes," Dagmar said. "Creating art is a "felt" process; sometimes, the aim is to explore, and sometimes to express.

"I really enjoy pursuing the challenging pathway to abstraction. I believe that abstract art engages you at another level. You have to stop trying to understand it and just feel it."

Dagmar finds the material for her art from mills and woodyards, and uses a combination of wooden veneers and plywood to create her art, with each piece taking anywhere from two days to two weeks to create.

Dagmar grew up in the former Czechoslovakia and moved to Australia 24 years ago. She now lives in Brisbane and creates her art from her home studio. Dagmar attributes her creativity to growing up surrounded by creative people.

"I grew up in an artistic family; my dad is a cartoonist, a graphic designer and a woodworker and my sister is a ceramic artist with her own gallery. Creativity is in my blood. The love of handmade crafts was always valued in my family," Dagmar said. "Marquetry taught me to slow down and enjoy the process. Each piece is a reminder of the close relationship between Mother Earth and us."

Dagmar's art has been internationally recognised with one of her pieces being picked for a juried group exhibition by New York-based art writer and critic, Phyllis Tuchman for Site: Brooklyn Gallery in New York.

Dagmar's work can be viewed at Redcliffe Art Society, exhibition titled "Taste of Synesthesia".

A new life for the Sutton's Beach Pavilion?

When the Moreton Bay Regional Council unexpectantly announced, that due to structural problems, the over 80-year-old Sutton's Beach Pavilion was to be demolished, community anger against the demolition was manifested principally by a hastily formed Sutton's Beach Pavilion Preservation Group [SBPPG] headed by a Redcliffe resident Jodie Starr.



WITH RICHARD LANCASTER The group, supported by other public groups such as The National Trust and National Seniors, presented a publicly endorsed petition which attracted many thousands of signatures. The preservation group also organised a peaceful rally at the Sutton's Beach site and commenced a Go Fund Me campaign designed to raise \$20,000 to cover an on-going

campaign. The Council, mindful of the strong community resentment halted their demolition plans and the building now remains closed to the public, surrounded by scaffolding. Latest speculation reports that Council are considering a refurbishment cost to the building are more than \$10 million.

However, not waiting for the dust to settle, two local residents Colin Scobie and Mark Forbes have already prepared a novel plan for a new life for the historic building. As the Sutton's Beach Pavilion is located within the Moreton Bay Marine Park, which in turn is an extension of the Great Barrier Reef, the Pavilion would be a perfect venue for a newly established Sutton's Beach Marine, Education and Recreational Centre.

Under this plan, the centre would become a multipurpose building, to be used as a marine learning centre perhaps attached to a University. It could be linked to the underutilized Redcliffe CBD's Sutton Centre, which combined together, would create a First World Marine based hub.

After completing an MBA and with his involvement with the University of Queensland's Marine Society, Colin Scobie has a passionate interest in the protection of our local seaways and the creatures which live in them. He believes that as the Moreton Bay region will be on show in 2032, it is vital to start restorative practices now.

We can listen to their concerns and support them by finding the answers that sit best with them rather than telling them what to do or why their thoughts/feelings are not important. We can ensure we teach by example with good problem-solving skills about how to resolve issues with honest communication rather than anger or violence. We can support them when we see or they tell us they need help, or they are not feeling or thinking well within themselves. We can do this by assisting them to find a resource that is right for them.

Clean Up Australia Day 2023

reate, or join a Community, Business, School, or Youth clean up in your area in the week beginning 27 February 2023, culminating in numerous annual clean up events near you on Sunday 5 March, 2023 https://www. cleanupaustraliaday.org.au/join-a-clean-up

At the time of writing, there are at least 10 clean up sites planned on Redcliffe Peninsula, with many across the country.....that's very special for the local animals and the environment... thank you:)

Redcliffe Peninsula is a unique area, surrounded 80% by sensitive waterways with important natural ecosystems. So, it is important to join a cleanup near you and help keep litter out of our marine and terrestrial environments.

The 2021 National CUA Litter Report showed 33% of the litter collected was from roadsides and along footpaths, with 37.2% of reported plastics found in our waterways (rivers + beach/coastal areas + dive sites).

The Pristine Peninsula 2021 Love our Clontarf 100 Day Litter Campaign Waste Warriors collected 15706 items, equating to an average of 157 litter items dropped every day over the litter campaign over the 12 audit sites over 12 weeks. This is equivalent to 62,000+ litter items per annum in a 2km radius in the Suburb of Clontarf. We collected 5264 plastic items, 4691 cigarette butts, 2667 fast food packaging and paper based items, with a further 10578 cigarette butts collected across four other sites since the campaign. Cigarette butts are the number one litter item worldwide.







Banana and Blueberry Pastries

hese pastries are nothing short of delicious. Think crispy, flaky pastry and fruity caramelised filling, there isn't much to dislike about them. They are cheap to make, a good way to use up fruit which is starting to turn, and you can easily make eight at a time to feed a group of people. For these pastries I have used bananas and blueberries, but you could also use peaches, strawberries, raspberries, blackberries. Whatever is

in season, and whatever is easy on the pocket.

I'm featuring this recipe after getting inspiration from visiting Skippy's Market Fresh in Rothwell.

Opening late in 2022, these guys are relatively new kids on the block, but they sure have made their mark on the fresh produce scene in Redcliffe. Their fruit aisles are nothing short of works of art, with perfectly placed fruit and vegetables, creating a rainbow as you walk down the aisle, and they don't just sell fresh produce, they also sell fresh eggs, pantry staples, and there is even a butcher. The quality of the produce is almost as good as the prices.

Banana and Blueberry Pastries

INGREDIENTS

2 sheets of puff pastry 1/4 cup of sugar 1-2 bananas 1 punnet of blueberries 1 egg lightly beaten Custard and icing sugar to serve (optional)

Toss your chosen fruit in sugar so that it is lightly coated and set to one side. Thaw your puff pastry so it is pliable and cut each square into four. You will end up with 8 smaller squares. Roll up each side of the squares to make a raised border. You might have to pinch the side a bit. Don't be afraid to make the edges higher, this is what prevents the fruit juices from spilling out. Place your fruit in the center of each square, spreading it out as much as you can so each piece of fruit has the chance to caramelise. Lightly beat the egg, then brush over the edge of the pastry. Place on a baking paper lined tray and bake at 185 for 15-17 minutes or until golden. Voila!

Dust with icing sugar and serve vanilla bean custard.

ith the support of the Queensland Police Service, The Forgotten Women is hosting an afternoon tea to raise awareness, as well as funds, for the fastest growing homeless population in Australia. Women over 55.

Established in 2018, The Forgotten Women Project was initiated by Mangrove Group, whose mission is to secure housing for women who are homeless, or at risk of homelessness.

There are more than 40,000 Queensland women over the age of 55 who are doing it tough and suffering financial hardship. Across the Greater Brisbane area, there are over 600 homeless women over 55.

Teresa Reed, CEO of Mangrove Housing, and founder of The Forgotten Women said that this project is vital to ensure women have the chance to live with dignity. "There is an increasing growth in the number of single women over 55 years experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness. awareness and much needed funds, to support homeless women.

"QPS are proud to partner with The Forgotten Women, to raise awareness around the significant increase in older women finding themselves homeless for various different reasons. ichelle Gilchrist has always been involved in helping the less fortunate in the community. Recently, as Chairperson/Manager of Redcliffe's Breakfast Club she was presented with the prestigious Community Spirit Award by the Moreton Bay Regional Council. This award recognised her eight years of selfless work at the Club as well as her earlier work with another charity, Circle of Hope, which distributed food to the homeless out of Redcliffe's Surf Lifesaving Club

Asked what motivated her to become involved with helping the homeless Michelle simply replied, "I get great enjoyment from helping people in need." What made her join the Breakfast Club? "The Circle of Hope charity had closed and my friend Helen Bambling, winner of the Westfield Local Hero Award, knowing of my interest, suggested I join the Breakfast Club, which I did!"

She and other volunteers who subsequently joined were following in the footsteps of the Breakfast Club's co-founder Ros Thomsen, who started the Club in 2003. After serving the Club for 16 years, Ros retired in 2019.

The Club currently serves over 1000 meals every month, breakfast and dinner, at the centre on the corner of Portwood Street and Oxley Avenue Redcliffe. Their guests are the homeless, those on low incomes and renters who are finding it difficult to find money for food. Guest ages range from toddlers to those in their eighties. The Club's activities are funded by donations from local businesses, churches and other volunteer groups.

But there are welcome changes afoot for the club. TAfter over four decades of existence, the Club's current centre at the Pensioner Hall is to be demolished and a new building housing the Club, will be built during this next year.

The Breakfast Club volunteers all believe their services to their quests will only get better.

Art & Craft Funding

s a visual artist and an arts teacher it has saddened me to see how poorly our arts and crafts communities are supported in funding, while sport attracts huge dollops of cash in sponsorships and grants, from both the public and private sectors.

However, I can understand why this happens. Sporting events attract large sections of the wider community, so logically both government and business put their money and ours into where the people are!

So, when I recently read that the Federal government had launched Revive, a new cultural policy aimed at helping the arts to the tune of \$286 million over four years, my heart skipped a beat.

Whilst this is good news, I believe that this initiative has not gone far enough. The millions would appear to be largely going to modernising massive art organisations like the Australia Council for the Arts into a new body called Creative Australia. However, the thousands of suburban artists and crafts people and their unpaid volunteer run societies and groups appear to have missed out. Now a valuable lesson for all politicians and business leaders- it's the grass roots that need your support and urgently.

Sport learned this valuable lesson. The various sports leaders had paid far too much attention to what they saw as the main game-the NRL's, the AFL's, International Cricket and Tennis to the exclusion of their sports grassroots- the juniors, the local clubs and the like. They changed and their main sporting events and the players statures grew substantially.

Again, many parents will historically encourage their children to join the local footie or netball club, not even considering an art or a craft club as an alternative. Why? Simply because there aren't any alternatives. There are no junior arts or crafts clubs for their children to join. And funding is absent from this important sector.

Is Australia still to be considered only as a brilliant sporting nation? Or can we tread that now overgrown arts and crafts path and blossom into the creative wonderland that can be ours. St Kieran's Primary School





ongtom, Crocodile Gar and Needlefish are a few common names given to this ferocious ■ looking fish. They are much like the long and slender Garfish but have opposing jaws like a crocodile and razor sharp teeth to match. They are quite the sports-fish growing to well over a metre long and like to be very acrobatic, jumping around and tail walking when hooked. They will readily take lures and small live baits and are seen quite regularly rounding up bait fish around the local jettys.

Beware though, they are guite happy to bite through light fishing lines and I have seen some expensive lures lost to them while targeting other species.

There are three species I know of locally with one occurring in freshwater. I have never tried eating them but am told they are quite tasty although full of bones. As with most fish even though they are a predator they also make good bait for large species such as spanish mackerel and Yellowtail Kingfish.

hen an experiment doesn't go to plan, the entire 'Ant-Fam' is shrunk down so small that they're transported to "The Quantum Realm, a reality where all concepts of time and space become irrelevant as they shrink for all eternity". However, don't get too hung up on the premise, they're basically stuck in a different dimension and have to escape before a time travelling conquerer destroys them and alternate timelines across the universe.

This is the start of a new phase for Marvel and it takes quite a novel approach, setting pretty much the entire film in 'The Quantum Realm'. I was fully immersed in this colourful world of strange creatures and unknown possibilities, introducing new characters who are fun with not much time wasted on giving them intricate backstories. Instead, they are provided with little quirks and foibles to make them more endearing when they take on the bad guys.

Paul Rudd and Evangeline Lilly are great as the titular Antman and Wasp, being their

typical lovable selves, not really pushing any emotional range or busting their acting chops. But for me it's the other female leads, Michelle Pfeiffer and Kathryn Newton who are more interesting to watch. They have a bigger role to play and are given some of the better lines and action sequences to play with.

Jonathan Majors is the villain of the piece as Kang, bringing a great subtlety to his bad guy role, with restraint that isn't often seen in action movies. Although sometimes he plays it so cool, you almost wish he would come out on top.

Like the majority of Marvel movies it's pretty special effects heavy but it's done in a way that really adds to the world building. You don't need to have to have seen the previous Ant-Man films but it will make the story that much richer. Overall, this is a fun family film about interdimensional time travel that should keep both kids and big kids entertained. Make sure to stay around for the two extra end credit scenes.


