

Moreton Bay Regional Council Mayor Peter Flannery said he wanted Moreton Bay to be a place where everyone felt accepted and included for who they are.





Miss Amy is Having a Baby incorporates Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) outcomes "to help children navigate the changes in relationship that can occur when their favourite educator is expecting their own bundle of joy".

Ms U'Prichard's objective with the book extends to giving children a sense of responsibility and involvement when someone they interact with is pregnant, as informed by her own experience.

"I loved running around with the kids, doing running races outside and dancing with them, helping them burn off energy, as well as having them run up and jump on me for big cuddles.

But all of a sudden I had a little baby growing in me, which I had to be mindful of," Kate said.

The author said that she expected the book would be helpful for pregnant mums or aunts — those who need to help their own toddlers or nieces and

WATER, WATER EVERYWHERE?

re you thirsty? Just pop into the kitchen and fetch a glass of water; we do it every day without thinking about its origin or uses. This was not the case for the Ningy Ningy people, the original inhabitants of what is now the Redcliffe Peninsula. For them, water was more than just a drink. It was a source of stories, of connection to their ancestral spirits and the Dreaming; it was important for ceremonial purposes; and it helped to define boundaries and clan groups.

An 1883 map of Redcliffe depicts extensive lagoons associated with areas of Aboriginal encampment. In addition to these water sources, several freshwater creeks flowed into the sea between present-day Scarborough and Woody Point. Despite having provided spiritual and physical sustenance for millennia, though, these water sources proved inadequate to sustain the first European settlement, the 1824 penal colony situated on Humpybong Creek, not far from the lagoons. Within a year, that first settlement was abandoned, partly because of an unsatisfactory water supply.

The Peninsula was not to remain in its natural state for long. Agricultural land sales were underway by the 1860s, and by the 1880s

there was extensive residential development requiring, of course, a reliable water supply, a matter that would exercise civic leaders well into the next century. Initially, the only feasible water sources were natural waterholes, streams or wells.

With gradual urbanisation, Redcliffe residents relied on rainwater tanks or public wells. There were several of the latter, one – said to be the oldest – at the intersection of Joseph Street and Oxley Avenue and others at Scarborough, Scotts Point and Woody Point. Water was piped from the wells to council water carts which would then deliver it to householders to replenish their tanks. By the 1930s, Redcliffe's rapidly growing population and increasing popularity as a holiday destination rendered a water supply relying on tanks and wells insufficient, and sourcing water from elsewhere – for both drinking and sanitation purposes – became a pressing issue.

Discussions on the matter began in council as early as the 1920s but it was not until 1938 that work commenced on a scheme for piping water, bought from the Brisbane City Council, from Sandgate to a newly constructed reservoir in Duffield Road. Mains water came to Redcliffe in 1940. It had taken more than a hundred years to provide Redcliffe with a consistent and permanent water supply, something our Ningy Ningy predecessors had enjoyed since the Dreaming.



A SINGULAR CRIME MOVIE REVIEW

don't know about you but I'm a sucker for a movie claiming to be 'Based on a true story' and 'A Singular Crime' (Un crimen Argentino) is just that. Set in Argentina during 1980, the story kicks off with the disappearance of a prominent businessman, but soon evolves into something even more sinister. What heightens this kidnapping even more is that it's set against the backdrop of an Argentinian dictatorship which makes tracking down the criminals and ultimately the hostage even harder.

The investigation is led by two young clerks of an examining court who are running out of time to solve the case before the hostage turns up at the bottom of a river and before one of the clerks has to emigrate. As you can imagine for an 80's crime drama there's plenty of corrupt cops and politicians for our heroes to navigate their way around. Having to negotiate and bend the law to find the truth behind this mystery and uncover how high up the chain the lies go.

The pace is slow and steady, which is important

when dealing with a story that has so many intersecting parts. You'll definitely need to pay attention if Spanish isn't your native tongue as the dialogue can come thick and fast at times and names are thrown around like tomatoes at the La Tomatina festival.

The performances are good, with the cast fully committing to their roles and delivering the kind of passion and intensity you'd expect from a Spanish language film. There's even a love story added to the mix but I wouldn't call this a romantic movie. You can clearly see they've spent some time trying to make the costumes and settings look as authentic as possible. With classic cars, dodgy moustaches and constantly referencing the recent death of John Lennon to remind you of what year you're in.

If you're after an action-packed Fast and the Furious style shoot out with explosions and car chases, then this may not be for you. However, if you like your dramas more on the political side, with a South American flare then this is worth your time.

SEAN GORDON

riginally from the Snowy Mountains in NSW, Sean Gordon moved to various country towns as a school principal before arriving in Brisbane in 2003. Married to Redcliffe local Jo-Anne, they share the parenting of four adult



children. He is a keen cyclist and member of the Redcliffe Bay Bikers.

In 1997 Sean was the on-site leader of the SES team at the Thredbo landslide hearing the voice of Stuart Diver when he was discovered

below the rubble and playing a part in the subsequent rescue. Prior to that he was on the Gundagai Rescue Squad where road rescue was the major task.

In 1999, Sean founded SchoolAid a national charity "empowering young philanthropists" that uses "giving" as a tool to combat the rising incidence of youth suicide, depression and anxiety. By November 2021 SchoolAid had involved some 60% of Australian schools and raised over \$6 million for causes here and around the world.

In 2019, Sean was awarded the Order of Australia Medal for service to education and the community through various organisations.

By 2021 Sean's volunteer work included 22 years as Founder of SchoolAid, 14 years as a Director of the Its Time Foundation, 20 years on five separate Parish Pastoral Councils (Vice- Chair at Holy Cross Redcliffe), two years on NSW CFA and 10 years on NSW SES.

t appears that the Moreton Bay Regional Council's assurances of saving the Mousetrap Theatre by refurbishing the iconic old building, which was recently condemned by Council engineers, will not be happening. Now it appears that plans are afoot to demolish the old building.

The latest Council alternative proposal is that a new theatre will be built adjacent to



the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre, which will house both the activities of the Mousetrap Theatre and the ROAR group, who are currently housed and lease a large tin shed at 102 Anzac Ave Redcliffe, adjacent to the Redcliffe Hospital. It is understood that both the parties, when they were

approached, were willing to share the new theatre premises, should it eventuate!

Sadly the same positive message cannot be said for Pender, the Peninsula Developmental Riding Centre. Established in 2008, the Centre has provided much needed equestrian activities for children with disabilities. The Centre has had the support of the Redcliffe Show Society, who have allowed it to use stabling facilities at the Showgrounds to house the horses, feed and tack and to use part of the grounds for riding purposes.

But this stabling facility has now been decommissioned by the Moreton Bay Regional Council, on safety issue grounds. Unfortunately, the Council have not offered the volunteer run Centre alternative accommodation in which to house the horses or to conduct their activities. However they have said they will give consideration to other alternatives. Sadly, the Centre is running out of time and will have to close unless an alternative stabling and riding facility can be found.

Centre President and Coach Jane Sayer said, "We now have nowhere to store the feed or to stable the horses properly. I understand that Bunnings will consider generously offering to donate a shed for this purpose, but that needs Council approval, so we are hopeful that Council will agree."




