

ocal guitarist JayBird Byrne is a 12-year-old rockstar in the making.

The Narangba-based musician has been playing guitar since she was eight, and this month she will launch the first single from her forthcoming EP, Dog Tales, at a free concert.

JayBird, who is neurodivergent, said the single, Pups at Work was inspired by going to dog training and the challenge of expressing each dog's personality in an instrumental rock guitar song.

"What it is about the dog training experience is that dogs are really hectic," she said. "It's sort of like, 'what are they going to do next?' And I wanted to represent that unpredictability, that way that they go about, and sort of their method of living that I wanted to represent in this song.

"I've always loved dogs, I've had them since a young age. I think dogs have played a big part in shaping me and I wanted to represent them all and sort of give them, like, an award for being in my life and always being that consistent helpful energy."

JayBird said she uses music to express herself in ways she can't with words.

"Being autistic means I have extra-sensitive hearing, so sounds that don't bother other people can be really painful to me," she said. "For music though, this helps me hear all the notes, and sort of hear through the song, so I think it is what helps me play by ear. "Also being autistic I am a perfectionist and really good with details and I am able to hyperfocus on something I enjoy until I get it right, so that means I can practise for long periods of time until I perfect the sound I am looking for."

JayBird's first single, Convergence, won first prize with honours in the modern and contemporary category at the International Youth Music Competitions last year. She also took out best guitarist at RockFest.

Team Musicare founder and JayBird's manager, Dan Nebe said JayBird would be a household name in years to come.

"She is light-years ahead of kids her age," Dan said. "JayBird's stage presence is her main weapon. Her style and vibe is intoxicating."

On Friday, 7 July, JayBird will perform at Calling Out to the Masses, a concert hosted by Team Musicare, which will also feature Team Utopia, Dead Hand Blues and Briony Alice.

Looking to the future, JayBird said she'd like her music to be listened to by everyone and for "people to understand it in many ways".

"I want to create my own music and the reason I do that is that my music makes me very happy and I'd like that to happen to other people," she said.

MAX PLATH MAKES NRL DEBUT WITH DOLPHINS

ocal rugby league player, Max Plath has made his NRL debut after signing a three-year contract with the Dolphins.

The 21-year-old played Round 14 against the Warriors in Auckland, New Zealand last month after being promoted to the team's top 30 squad.

Max said signing with the Dolphins was an opportunity he couldn't turn down.

"To play in the NRL had been a lifelong goal of mine and the Dolphins gave me an opportunity

to join their full-time squad," he said.

"Making my debut was a dream come true and definitely came as a surprise in the lead up to the game. It was such a surreal experience to represent my family, friends and the Redcliffe Dolphins. Sadly, we couldn't get the win on the night but it's definitely a night I will remember."

While the Warriors may have triumphed, the match still saw Max making an impressive 33 tackles coming off the bench.

With the Dolphins losing several players to injuries this season, Max is set to supply the team with depth in key positions.

The former Wynnum Manly Seagull came to the attention of the Dolphins at the game between Redcliffe and the Seagulls in Round 4 of the Hostplus Cup, with the Dolphins website describing him as "a

clever utility who can play in the halves, at hooker or at lock."

The Plath name is well-known among local rugby league fans – Max's father, John Plath was a four-time premiership winner for the Brisbane Broncos. Max said it could be "challenging at times to be constantly compared to someone".

"But at the same time, it's a pretty cool experience to carry on my family name," he said. "Personally, I want to be the best version of myself and not worry about the comparisons."

For now, Max is focused on the immediate future.

"My current goal is to play consistent injuryfree footy for the rest of the season," he said. "And to hopefully get a couple more games in A-Grade before the season finishes."

Dolphins fans may get their chance to see Max runout against the Penrith Panthers at Kayo Stadium on 16 July.

oreton Bay Arts Council (MBAC) is celebrating twenty years in operation and looking keenly towards the future as a champion of the local creative community.

MBAC promotes the arts and culture in the Moreton Bay Region and beyond, allows for memberships, provides accessible and affordable arts activities and is a non-profit organisation run by volunteers.

According to Janice Charlish, the organisation's current president, what's involved in MBAC membership has changed over time.

"There is now a broader spread across the regions, including studio and gallery owners, poets and writers. This year, we are completing our videography training. This will be an asset for our members with a YouTube channel that members can use for their own marketing," Ms Charlish said.

Ms Charlish said the peak body first came to be back in 2009, when President John Robinson first set up a group named the Redcliffe and Districts Arts Council, which inevitably evolved into MBAC as we know it today.

"The next President was Richard Lancaster, who successfully promoted the group via his position with the Redcliffe Herald and advertising art events, musical shows and so forth."

According to Ms. Charlish, the next president, Ian Brown, orchestrated a sizable musical theatre and arts festival.

Current MBAC Treasurer Elizabeth Blomberg said that other significant events have been included over the years, such as the Arts and Crafters Market — a popular, regular fixture at the Redcliffe Old Fire Station, held in March, July and November.

The Creative Voices Forums, which were started in 2016 and were able to develop direct dialogue between the Moreton Bay Regional Council and the creative community, were hailed by Ms Blomberg as a significant initiative enacted by Janice Charlish.

To celebrate the twenty year anniversary of MBAC, there will be memorabilia at the next Arts and Crafters market in November. However, the main celebration will be next year at the organisation's twenty-first birthday party.

"At this, we hope to get the 'key to the door' of our own MBAC meeting and display location," Ms Charlish said.

ORGANIC GARDENING

Snip Snip, Clip Clip!

t's cold now but set your sights on preparing your garden for abundant fresh growth in spring.

Snip snip, clip clip! Prune your hedges, roses (except old-fashioned varieties), frangipanis, citrus and summer-flowering shrubs like plumbago and crepe myrtle for compact foliage and healthy blooms later. Leave the spring-flowering climbers and shrubs e.g., azaleas, jasmine and Brunfelsia until after they have bloomed.

Finish those projects you began in June before the Ekka winds of August take the fun out of being outdoors. Speaking of which – check your lawn for bindii and eradicate those carrottop rosettes BEFORE they turn prickly. Dig them out by hand, or if prolific, try a natural weed killer like Earthfood Maintain or Slasher. Your feet will thank you later.

Cold, wet soils and the long shadows of winter reducing life-giving sun make July less than ideal for planting vegetable seeds. Empty vegetable beds, particularly those earmarked for growing peas and beans in summer, will benefit from application of organic lime to sweeten the soil. Dig lime into top 10 to 15cms of soil where it will leach over time and raise the pH.

If you want to plant something try beetroot, silverbeet, cabbages, peas, lettuce and carrots.

HISTORY REDCLIFFE

"A CHARMING MARINE RETREAT"

ne thing that has remained constant since the European settlement of Redcliffe is its attractiveness to its neighbours. It took a few decades after its abandonment as a convict settlement (the one contingent, it seems, that remained impervious to Redcliffe's charms) for the peninsula to take off, which it did, at first as an agricultural district, in the 1860s and then, in the 1880s, as a seaside holiday destination.

With this popularity came a boom in land sales, and one of Redcliffe's earliest investors and major landholders was Dr William Hobbs, a distinguished Brisbane medical man and member of the Legislative Assembly, who acquired extensive property at Scarborough in the early 1870s. The Brisbane Courier recorded in 1872 "near the beach ... a block of fine land belonging to Dr Hobbs", and it was here that he developed what, according to all accounts, was "a splendid marine property".

This land, "upon an elevated site, commanding an uninterrupted view of the grandest scenery in Moreton Bay" was of variable quality, comprising arable areas suitable for growing cotton and sugarcane, as well as attractive seaside land; but there were also areas plagued by "swarms of mosquitoes" and "the faint odours" indicative of swampland. The estate also boasted a spring with "valuable mineral water", which Dr Hobbs considered marketing because of its medicinal properties.


Notwithstanding the swamps and mosquitos, the estate was sufficiently appealing to attract a visit, in 1878, by Governor Kennedy and a party of distinguished guests who, according to The Queenslander, after luncheon at the Scarborough Hotel, "entered the grounds of the honorable Dr Hobbs, whose manager showed them over the place."

Not all of Dr Hobbs's memories of his Scarborough acreage would have been so pleasant, though. Later in the same year as the governor's visit, one of Dr Hobbs's sons, 19-yearold Alfred, was killed in a riding accident on the property. This, sadly, occurred very close to the spot where Alfred's younger brother Edward had been killed by a falling tree four years earlier.

The Hobbs estate, "295 magnificent allotments", was sold in 1886, no doubt assisted by the usual real estate encomiums: "The prettiest watering-place within easy reach of the city"; "splendid boating, fishing, shooting, etc"; with "picturesque scenery and richness of soil". Dr Hobbs did not long survive to enjoy the fruits of his Scarborough land speculation, dying in 1890, leaving behind a reputation as a well-loved doctor and respected politician and, no doubt, a considerable fortune.

Tasered

he recent tasering of a 95 year old woman in a New South Wales nursing home is a most disturbing event. It is alleged that the policeman who tasered her, did so because she was

armed with a knife and appeared to be menacing him. It appears that after the woman was tasered, she fell to the ground hitting her head, which could have contributed to her death. All of these events are traumatic both for the woman's relatives and for the policeman, who now faces charges associated with her death.

Like others, I have concerns about these happenings, from a community standpoint. Certainly the tasering of a 95 year old woman is of great concern, but why were the police called to the nursing home in the first place? Surely the staff should have been able to disarm the woman, without police involvement? After all, she was 95 years old, a small statured woman and relied on a mobility walker to move around.

Being a person of advanced years, suggestions have been made that in time I should consider moving from my home and taking up residence in a nursing home, where my day to day chores can be adequately taken care of. Unfortunately in the recent past I have heard too many accounts of very ordinary services dispensed to nursing home residents by unqualified, poorly trained and underpaid staff.

The care of the elderly demands a specialised skill, requiring properly trained and empathetic staff. This almost certainly may conflict with the profit driven need by management of these nursing home facilities. Until the care industry puts in place mandatory community acceptable standards of training for staff and nursing home management accept that responsibility and the community and government may well have to accept higher inmate fees, we will continue to suffer from the sad events witnessed at the Cooma nursing home.





DIVISION 5 & 6 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

n 16 June, the Moreton Bay Regional Council issued media releases highlighting the investments being made in the region with the release of the 2023-24 budget.

Division 5 highlights include a \$500,000 revitalisation of Cross Street Park in Deception Bay, repairs to land slips in Scarborough, and upgrades to shared paths along Scarborough Road.

The budget also includes \$150,000 for a bike track upgrade at the PCYC facility in Deception Bay and a surface renewal for the hydrotherapy pool at Deception Bay Aquatic and Fitness Centre.

To promote an active lifestyle, the budget includes over 47 free and low-cost community events throughout the year, including Movies in the Park and the Redcliffe Peninsula Christmas Carols.

Infrastructure improvements are also a key focus, with funding for road surface rejuvenation and footpath improvements across the division.

Division 6 highlights includes a \$5 million allocation towards the construction of a new Redcliffe Pensioners Hall, which will support individuals experiencing homelessness on the Redcliffe Peninsula. The hall will include a commercial-grade kitchen, amenities, storage, and office space.

Other notable investments in the budget include the \$1.25 million planning for the revitalisation of Suttons Beach Park, the \$1.725 million refurbishment of the Redcliffe Library, and ongoing seawall restoration at Charlish Park to safeguard the foreshore from erosion and inundation.

There will be a focus on overhauling the netball courts at KR Benson Park and playground upgrades at Bellevue Park, Redcliffe.

The budget also includes investments in road and footpath improvements and traffic and parking improvements around Scarborough State School.



erforming is in the blood of soon to be 90-yearold Rothwell resident Michael Pitcher. It came about when, as a young boy, he watched his professional musician parents perform on stage, in wartime England. At school he enjoyed acting in plays and at sixteen he was offered a place in Britain's oldest working theatre, the Old Vic, the birthplace of many of the United Kingdom's finest actors. After careers in the merchant navy and the British police force, he and his family immigrated to Australia finally making the Redcliffe Peninsula their home.

But the acting bug was still in his veins. He joined Redcliffe's iconic Mousetrap Theatre Company, acting in many of the group's productions. His role in the wartime stage enactment of Dad's Army brought back old memories for him. He subsequently won a Mousetrap Best Supporting Actor's award for his many performances. During the last decade Michael also acted in several locally produced mockumentary movies, the last of which was The Third Commandant, a comic portrayal of the life of the infamous Captain Patrick Logan, commandant of the Brisbane penal colony.

But performing is not Michael Pitcher's only passion. In late 2022, he as the Very Worshipful Brother Michael Pitcher PDGDC was installed into the Worshipful Master's Chair of King Solomon at Masonry's Redcliffe 1st Settlement Lodge in Scarborough. At an earlier installation at the same lodge, Michael's son Simon was installed as Worshipful Master of the Redcliffe Lodge. During that installation he wore the 121-year-old Masons apron which had belonged to Simon's great grandfather who was a mason in the Royal Sussex Lodge in Bath in the United Kingdom.

Michael Pitcher now enjoys a well-earned retirement by collating a book on his active life.

ARTFULLY REDCLIFFE

A Spanish Arts Magician

reating any work of art requires a set of skills gained through practice and possibly tuition. Portrait painting is no exception, requiring very particular expertise in creating a likeness of the sitter as well as the personality.

During a conversation with one of my adult students, she mentioned she'd come across illustrations of the work of the contemporary

at this artist's ability and on seeing his work, so was I. He takes portraiture to another incredible level.

Spanish painter Sergi Cardenas. She was astounded

Born in 1972 into a family that had a three centuries old ironworks foundry business named Ferris d'Art Cardenas in the Spanish city of Girona,

at age 15 Sergi commenced working in the family business and by the age of 20 he was managing it.

But at the age of 30, without any formal tutelage, he started painting portraits. He experimented with many different techniques, one such technique involved dual images, which he remembered seeing as a young boy. He knew them as flip images and decided to use this technique in a most sophisticated way in his portrait painting. The results are both unique and visually unbelievable.

The more he experimented with this kinetic technique, the more his portraits improved. It has come to be recognised as the lenticular style of painting which means that as the viewer's eyes move across the painting, the image changes from one image to another, quite different, image. Thus in the case of the Cardenas' portraits, his paintings have as if by magic, two different portraits in the one work. Nowadays, while still painting portraits in his studio for national and international art exhibitions, he is recognised as a master artisan and continues to manage the family foundry business, which is acknowledged as an important part of the Girona's cultural and architectural history.

According to Ms Swajed, people were especially happy with the range of fresh produce and other items on offer, with some customers telling her that it's "better than the big businesses'".


"Alongside the fruit and vegetables, we have a selection of really good quality specialty foods like gourmet cheeses, antipasto, continental goods, coffee and more."

Locked In with Ian Bick - Podcast Review

ow much do you know about prison life? Not the stuff you see on screen but what it's really like being locked away for years on end.

Host lan Bick is a convicted felon. At 18 he was a nightclub owner, at 19 he was a convicted criminal. He may have even avoided prison if he hadn't decided to jump bail and head off to a casino. Even though he only did around 3 years, he spent enough time inside to make a few friends, inviting his ex-convict buddies to tell their stories on his podcast 'Locked In with Ian Bick'. Discussing what landed them in jail, what life was like in jail and how they adapted to life on the outside.

Even though he's often face to face with known killers, he's not afraid to ask some probing personal questions about their lives. The level of skill, planning and ingenuity that goes into some of their crimes is often astounding. Bick also speaks with the people on the other side of the bars, interviewing prison staff. No topic is taboo, as they share stories of finding love in most unlikely places and no I don't mean the shower-quards falling for inmates.

I was surprised to hear the amount of remorse his guests have, not for getting caught but the harm they've caused other people. You could be inspired and maybe even motivated by some of these life altering stories, although hopefully not inspired to rob a bank.

Radio Station Rescue

he story is a familiar one in many communities throughout South East Queensland. A number of people get together and voluntarily donate their time and effort to support a worthy cause, which assists their community in some way or other.

For 30 years volunteers at the Redcliffe community radio station Bridge FM operating on the 99.7FM frequency have provided our local community with free information, music and entertainment. The broadcasters and support staff are all volunteers and the station relies on small sponsorships from local business, to help cover the operating costs.

Recently Bridge FM received advice from the owners of Margate water tower, on which the radio station's broadcast antenna is located, that the antenna must be removed so that repair work can be done on the tower. Little assistance accompanied the message. Without the antenna, the station cannot broadcast.

The estimated cost of the antenna's removal and relocation is \$110,000, a sum that the station would have difficulty raising. Further, to find a new location for the antenna would also prove difficult, at short notice.

However, assistance could be close at hand. Moreton Bay Regional Council Mayor Peter Flannery and Division 6 Councillor Karl Winchester hearing of the radio station's plight, are proposing to use Council's not inconsiderable resources to help solve the station's problems.

The new location for the station's antenna could be atop the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre in Downs Street Redcliffe and station management are confident that the relocation costs will be met from a variety of supportive sources. Let's hope that's the case.

In a period whereby good news seems difficult to come by, Bridge FM has just been granted charitable status. This means that individuals and companies can now donate to the radio station, and receive a tax deduction.

"This charitable status has come at the right time," said station manager Ray Kerr. "The station's equipment is badly outdated and is in desperate need of replacement and we need money to replace it."

Support - Let them know you care for them. Support them to explore options about who or what could be of help to them.

Follow up – Reach out again in a few days after your conversation and check in on how they are traveling. They may not have done anything yet and that is okay. Just let them know you are there and ready to chat again should they need that.

ave you ever loved a film that you were certain you'd hate? Well, I walked into 'The Flash' ready for yet another disappointing DC movie, that was going to be all flash and no bang (pun not actually intended but I'm keeping it).

Firstly, I've never been a fan of Ezra Miller - who dons the spandex as The Flash, even before he started throwing chairs at women in Karaoke bars (in real life, not in the movie... that would be even weirder).

Then imagine my delight when I heard the plot of this movie... The Flash travels back in time to save his Mum where he teams up with Batman, Supergirl and a younger version of himself – yay two Ezra Millers.

I couldn't have been more wrong and even as I'm writing this, I'm still surprised with the amount of joy this film brought me, even before Batman appeared.

I grew up with Michael Keaton as Batman and when he swooped back on to the big screen

it was like he'd never left, as this feels like an extension of his previous movies, falling back into the character so effortlessly.

The new girl on the block was Supergirl and despite having very little to say, was a welcome addition, bringing a stoic strength that female leads aren't often allowed. The film is peppered with cameos and they all seem to be done with purpose, rather than being thrown in because an actor had a spare 5 minutes to kill or was fulfilling a contractual obligation.

There's plenty of heart here and it manages to evoke just the right amount of emotion without dwelling too long and I'll even admit to tearing up a bit towards the end.

One thing that comic book movies (in fact most movies) often fail at is humour, yet somehow I had more laughs than I've had in a while. I think it might be because it feels more grounded in reality, so when something bizarre happens, it hits the mark.

Yellowfin Tripod Fish, Tripodichthys angustifrons

uite a common catch in Moreton Bay, around the foreshores and from the jetties at Redcliffe and Sandgate this little fish puts up quite a fight if caught when fishing for whiting or other small species. Not rated as an eating fish and even though apparently harmless, being closely related to Pufferfish which are poisonous, I certainly wouldn't be trving them.

The Tripod fish is so named due to the single Dorsal and two Pelvic fin bones forming a tripod sort of set of spikes that enable it to defend itself and also sit on the ocean floor. They have small mouths, eat worms and other small crustaceans and grow only to around 20 cm in length. Try not to get spiked either, as even though they are not poisonous, they are coated in a slime that will make a laceration quite painful and possibly leave a nasty infection.




