SAM UNITES WITH REDCLIFFE HOTELS IN FIGHT AGAINST CANCER

ustralian actor Samuel Johnson has spent the past decade fighting cancer through his charity, Love Your Sister.

Sam visited The Komo last month to discuss his latest initiative, Sam's 1000, and to mark another milestone in his ongoing partnership with Lewis Land Group, owners of The Komo and The Belvedere Hotel.

Lewis Land Group Queensland regional manager, Chris Allison said The Belvedere helped Sam reach a \$10 million goal at a fundraising event in 2019.

"We raised 23 thousand dollars and he was another 30 thousand short, so we made the decision to donate another \$54,484, which tipped him over the \$10 million mark," Chris said. "We wanted to claim that for the Peninsula. Sam really values the Redcliffe community. The support he receives from the local community whenever he is here, he really appreciates that community spirit."

Sam described it as a historical and memorable night.

"I was just short of \$10 million and they wrote a large cheque that night," Sam said. "Then you combine all of the other work that Lewis Land Group does in the community. They care about their district, and they care about their people, and they give back."

Sam's latest mission is to rally 1000 businesses to support the provision of precision medicine for all cancer patients. Precision medicine involves analysing tissue samples to determine the most effective treatment.

Sam said he had wanted the treatment for his sister, Connie, who died of cancer in 2017.

"It's currently not available as a standard of care, but it's happening now," he said. "Precision medicine offers the tantalising prospect of putting our cancer patients on the right medication the first time, every time, saving squillions on false lines of treatment, and saving the lives of people like my sister."

Sam's 1000 'champions' are divided into three categories: Heavyweight, Middleweight, and Welterweight. Lewis Land Group is supporting Sam's cause as a Heavyweight Champion, pledging \$1000 a month from each of its four hotels.

"That's the most we expect from a company," Sam said. "Heavyweights like The Komo are doing the heavy lifting and small businesses are helping out as well. It's gone beyond all my hopes and expectations."

Once he reaches 1000 businesses, Sam plans to meet with the Federal Minister for Health, Mark Butler to discuss expanding access to precision medicine. Until then, he urged more individuals and businesses to join the cause.

THE INSPIRING WOMEN OF THE HAYES FAMILY

HISTORY REDCLIFFE

hen William Hayes died on 8 June 1910, the Brisbane Courier lauded him as "a prominent and popular resident" of Redcliffe. He had been chairman of the Humpybong Steamship Company, a member of the Redcliffe Divisional Board and a shire councillor. He was also active in the Church of England, being a lay member of the Synod, church warden and a member of the parish council of St Mary's and St Mark's churches. His home, Ellerslie, was one of the grand residences of Redcliffe.

Mr Hayes left a widow, Lydia, two daughters and three sons. The older girl, Florence, and the three sons, Frederick, Percy and William, married and moved away while Mrs Hayes and Miss Lucy Hayes continued to reside at Ellerslie.

Mrs Hayes and Lucy were active in the community, especially in support of St Mary's Church and the Red Cross Society. They presided over fundraising fetes and garden parties, often held in the grounds of Ellerslie. Lucy was, for 25 years, superintendent of the Sunday school, and organised an annual Christmas tree laden with gifts, "which gladdened the hearts of the little ones".

Two of her nieces, Doreen and Daisy, were sent to live at Ellerslie when they were children. Daisy

featured in several entertainments put on by her grandmother and aunt, performing in a children's concert in 1913 (children trained by Miss Hayes), presenting a bouquet to the patron of the fete in 1916 and running a bookstall at another fete in 1922.

Doreen reported on life in the house with her grandparents and "strict maiden aunt". The girls attended church three times on Sundays, as well as Sunday school (inescapable, perhaps, with Aunt Lucy as superintendent), and each Saturday were given a dose of castor oil. They were, though, also taken fishing, swimming in "neck to knee black costumes", and for outings to the pictures and the circus. Doreen was given a pony, which she rode to the Humpybong school.

Mrs Hayes died in 1928, aged 80. Her obituary in the Humpybong Weekly and Advertiser reported she "took a keen interest in the social life of the town", and was an "ardent church worker" known for her "kindness of heart and sweet nature". She was interred in Redcliffe Cemetery alongside William. Lucy died in 1941 and is buried near her parents, all three equally deserving of the accolade "prominent and popular" residents of Redcliffe.



RECOGNITION OF A TRUE OLD HEROINE

Redcliffe community have sadly watched the gradual disintegration of a 19th century once proud Queensland and Australian warship at the base of the Woody Point cliffs.

The ship is the H.M.Q.S. Gayundah that gave its name to the nearby Arboretum and to the esplanade that runs alongside it. Two not for profit groups, The Redcliffe Naval Association and The Gayundah Preservation Society Inc. have dedicated their efforts over the last number of years to ensure that the ship's proud Queensland and Australian maritime history will be properly recognised and maintained for present and future generations.

With Moreton Bay City Council assistance, the Redcliffe Naval Association have commenced the process by constructing a memorial in the Gayundah Arboretum above the final resting place of the ship. Geoff O' Mara, Secretary of the Redcliffe Naval Association said "The Gayundah Memorial will not be officially dedicated until November, but it will be accessible to the public shortly". Meanwhile The Gayundah Preservation Society Inc are about to commence a fundraising drive to raise funds for the construction of a 5 metre long metal scale model of H.M.Q.S. Gayundah, which will be located on the foreground of the soon to be erected multi-storey unit accommodation building on Gayundah

Esplanade, which will sit directly opposite the Naval Association's memorial.

H.M.Q.S. Gayundah had an auspicious beginning. Along with her sister ship H.M.Q.S. Paluma, she was commissioned in 1884 by the Queensland Colonial Government to form a defence force against an Imperial Russian naval fleet that threatened an invasion of Queensland. In 1885,the 360 ton gunboat Gayundah, considered the most heavily armed warship of its type in the world, succeeded in forcing the Russian fleet to leave the Queensland coast, never to return.

On becoming the flagship of the Queensland Maritime Defence Force, her irascible Captain Henry Townley Wright caused the Queensland Government a problem by demanding a years holiday with full pay. The government refused, so the Captain sailed the Gayundah up the Brisbane River threatening to fire on Parliament. He was arrested and replaced as captain. In 1903 the Gayundah became the first Australian ship to transmit a ship to shore message. At the start of World War 1, she became H.M.A.S. Gayundah, also for a time serving as H.M.S. Gayundah. At the end of the war, she was sold to a private company who converted her to a sand and gravel barge on the Brisbane River for the next 40 years. She was sold to the Redcliffe Town Council in 1958 for 400 pounds and has spent her last 65 years as a wave-break at Woody Point.

EDIBLE GARDENS MADE EASY

www ith the cost of living rising and environmental issues front and centre, there is perhaps no better time to discover ways to grow your own edible garden.

Susanne Englehard, the creator behind the Easy Edible Garden Approach, will be discussing this subject at Deception Bay Library, teaching the five common mistakes people make when starting an edible garden and what to do instead.

No green thumbs are required, in Ms. Englehard's view, because it can be relatively simple to grow food year-round in your own

backyard.

"I believe that if people are given access to information about the basics of growing food, then anybody can do it. Yet, without a few basics, what should be simple and easy for all becomes a hard task that seems out of reach for many people," Ms Englehard said.

She said that it is no longer customary for us to see our parents and neighbours grow food, saying that this means "we miss the opportunity to learn naturally through imitation of others, and then through our own lived experience."

In her talks, Ms. Englehard encourages individuals to produce even a small amount of produce in their backyards to obtain more nutrient-dense food than is generally offered in stores, while also saving money on groceries.

She said the Moreton Bay Library's What's On program provided a valuable service, and she felt honoured to be asked to speak at the upcoming Deception Bay event, as well as at a series of talks to be held

across several Moreton Bay libraries.

"My hope is that people will leave my talk feeling inspired and confident to start their own vegetable patch at their place", she said.

In addition to presenting talks, Ms Englehard also coordinates her initiative Growing Made Simple, which includes community gardens, such as Millen Farm in Samford Valley and holiday activities for children.

"Growing Made Simple is my heart project, with a goal of 'profit with purpose' in order to establish more community gardens across Moreton Bay," she said.



Strange Decisions

uring my near three-year management of Sir Joh Bjelke-Petersen's post-political, commercial career in the 1980s, I found the ex-Queensland Premier to be an amenable, yet sometimes puzzling individual to deal with. My primary responsibility was to generate business for him. However, two potentially lucrative transactions were examples of mixed messages he gave me.

I received a phone call from chairman and chief executive of News Ltd Ken Cowley. We discussed the possibility of Sir Joh ghostwriting a column for the Murdoch press. He invited us to Sydney to discuss a contract. The offer was an attractive one. A weekly column written by a senior journalist with editorial and content direction coming from Sir Joh. The fee would be \$2000 per column and the contract renewable after a year. I recommended Sir Joh accept the deal. Near the end of the visit, Rupert Murdoch walked in. He chatted about the forthcoming Queensland state election, enguiring of Sir Joh what the outcome would be. As Sir Joh's archenemy Premier Mike Ahern had recently been dethroned by his own National Party, he gleefully responded saying, "Rupert, mark my words, it will be our new leader Russell Cooper leading the Nationals who will win!" Turning to me, Murdoch asked whether I shared Sir Joh's prediction. I said the Labor Party under Wayne Goss would be the victors, which turned out to be correct. On our return to Brisbane, Sir Joh contacted me to say he met with his family. The consensus was a column bearing his name in the papers would be inappropriate. He would say no to the deal. No amount of coaxing from me would change his mind. Later, an advertising agency representing pharmaceutical firm Nicholas Ltd, makers of Aspro, wanted Sir Joh to appear in two advertisements saying words to the effect: "You think you have problems. Well I have them too. But I take Aspro to fix mine!" The fee was spectacular. I forwarded the ad copy to Sir Joh. After hearing nothing for two weeks, I finally got hold of him. He said his family thought the ads would denigrate his image in the public's eyes. He would not perform in the commercials. I was amazed. Two contracts worth over \$130,000 (in today's money \$350,000), tossed aside by a man who had no government superannuation. A few months later, with the Fitzgerald Enguiry in full swing and Sir Joh's lawyers' bills mounting, he asked me whether the two offers were still available. They were not! Sadly no one wanted him any longer.

ARE YOU BUSHFIRE READY?

B ushfire season is upon us, which means it's time to make sure you have a plan in place to protect your home and family.

Moreton Bay City Council are calling on residents to get ready for bushfire season after three years of El Nino weather patterns and drier than normal conditions.

Mayor Peter Flannery urged each household to prepare an emergency and evacuation plan, clear properties of high-risk fuel loads and have emergency kits ready to go.

"Our message is simple – Plan. Prepare. Survive," Mayor Flannery said. "Planning means knowing what you will do in the event of a bushfire by creating an emergency and evacuation plan for your household – including your pets and any livestock.

"Prepare by getting your property ready before bushfire strikes by clearing out your gutters and debris from the yard; and creating an emergency kit full of essential supplies that you'll need when disaster strikes. Remember, if you own the fuel, you own the risk!

"And survive by executing your plan and deciding early whether to leave or stay to protect your property."

A Bushfire Survival Plan can be made at the Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QFES) website and includes ideas for leaving your property well-prepared to withstand a bushfire. This means trimming low-lying branches and native shrubs, keeping grass mowed and removing rubbish, leaf litter, firewood and fuel containers.

An emergency kit should have enough supplies for everyone in the household, including long-sleeve shirts and pants, boots, hats, safety glasses, drinking water, a batteryoperated radio, batteries, mobile phone and charger, blankets, medications and important documents.

Mayor Flannery also encouraged residents to sign up to Council's Moreton Alert system to get real-time weather warnings.

"In the event of an emergency, Council's Disaster Dashboard will have all the key information you'll need to stay informed, from fire danger ratings and current bushfires to road conditions and power outages, evacuation centres and so much more," he said.

"It's important that we all start planning and preparing for bushfire now because dry conditions are expected to continue for roughly three years, and while September-November is typically bushfire season in Moreton Bay, it can extend all the way to March depending on the conditions."

RUBY GILLMAN, TEENAGE KRAKEN MOVIE REVIEW

igh School can be hard, especially when you're a sea monster.

As the title suggests, this film is about a teenager named Ruby, who happens to be a Kraken.

Ruby Gillman, Teenage Kraken is the latest animated feature from Dreamworks, who are responsible for classics such as Shrek, Kung Fu Panda and How to Train your Dragon. With a lineage like that you may have high expectations, I know I did. Although it doesn't reach the heights of its predecessors, it's a fun kids' movie with slapstick humour, action and some nice messaging.

I'm hesitant to spoil too much with a lengthy explanation of what you can expect, so here's the gist. Ruby is struggling with most of the trials and tribulations of your average teenager, such as prom, young love and being a creature of the deep. Although Ruby and her Kraken family live in a present day human world, their disguises work on the same principle as Superman in a pair of glasses, no one can figure out their secret identity when they put on a hat or a pair of sunnies - hiding in plain sight. When Ruby discovers that she has more secrets to keep than she thought, her world is turned upside down and who to ask to the dance becomes the least of her worries.

Aside from Oscar winner Jane Fonda and our very own Toni Collette, there's not much star power to speak of, with

a voice cast of relative unknowns. The acting can be a bit over the top at times but it's a kids' movie, so why not revel in it?

Unlike a lot of modern animated kids' movies there's usually something for adults, a sly joke or a cheeky nod that should swoop over the heads of the younger audience. Unfortunately, there's nothing along those lines here but my enjoyment usually comes from seeing how much fun the kids have. Young teens may be able to relate to some of the themes here, the awkwardness of growing up and the struggles of trying to fit in, whether it's at high school or within your own family.

o you struggle to put fitted sheets on your mattress? You are not alone! Necessity became the mother of invention for Scarborough resident, Jae Blain, who underwent surgery on her forearm for Melanoma in 2018. Unable to make her bed using a conventional fitted sheet, Jae used her own sewing machine and a large dose of perseverance to create a user-friendly fitted sheet called, 'The 4th Corner.'

"I was frustrated that I could not put the fitted sheet on our mattress using only one hand. Everyone complains about fitted sheets, but no one had done anything about it. I wasn't giving up until I found a solution." Jae said.

Jae believes the innovative design sets a new standard in fitted sheets, effectively putting an end to wrangling ill-fitting bedlinen while promoting greater independence for seniors and those with physical limitations, or a disability, who would normally require assistance to change their sheets.

"I did not want the elderly sleeping in soiled bed sheets because it was too difficult for them to make the bed," Jae said. "The design of the fitted sheet went from frustrating to exciting and back again. I'd create a prototype and test it, only to find that I had to go back to the drawing board. The major challenge was to find a factory to manufacture them."

Featuring a hidden cotton and elastane panel with enough stretch to glide effortlessly over the mattress corners and remain in place, no matter how much a person moves around during sleep, Jae says the 400 Thread Count sheets are made from durable, long-lasting Australian and American organic cotton that becomes softer with every wash.

Jae's advice for aspiring inventors is, "Believe in yourself and your product! Inventions take time and you wonder why you are doing it, but it will be worth it in the end. If you have tested your product with your target market and they love it, then go for it!"

True to her word, Jae is working with husband Steve on the next invention, a mechanical golfing aid due for release in November.



Home mentors still required.

Prisbane Seniors Online has been operating in the Greater Brisbane area for over 20 years including the Redcliffe and adjoining areas. The Peninsula hub of Brisbane Seniors Online is one of 9 hubs across the home training area and has an extensive area of 17 suburbs from the centralised Redcliffe area to North Lakes, Petrie, Kippa-Ring, Rothwell, Mango Hill and Kallangur. Tutoring is available for seniors and over 50s.

With the closing down of banks and other shopfronts, more financial and business activity needs to be done online through the internet. During the pandemic and since, there has been a prolific increase in fraudulent activity which has cost computer and internet users across Australia millions of dollars.

Losses from scams have reached record levels. ACCC data shows Australians lost a total of \$3.1 billion to scams in 2022 - an 80 per cent increase over 2021.

"Australians lost more money to scams than ever before in 2022, but the true cost of scams is much more than a dollar figure as they also cause emotional distress to victims, their families and businesses," Ms Lowe from the ACCC said.

Brisbane Seniors Online can assist seniors and over 50s on how to recognise scams, minimise risk and use the internet safely and confidently. Whilst tuition is normally offered to learners in their own home using their own device, currently there is a shortage of active mentors in the area necessitating some tutoring to be carried out by mentors remotely.

Home tutoring is more conducive to more confident and quicker learning providing home mentors are available. Mentors need to be empathetic and can be male or female.

More volunteer mentors are sought to carry out this valuable work that involves visiting the homes of over 50s and providing tutoring on their own device and at a pace that suits them. The average age of Brisbane Seniors Online learners is about 74.

Mentors need to be able to confidently relate to learners of a similar age. STRAWBERRY CAKE

he recipe this month comes from the Clontarf QCWA incoming treasurer Heide. It is adapted from fika, by Anna Brones and Johanna Kindvall and makes one 8-inch cake.

This cake originally called for blackberries and almond extract, but it is infinitely adaptable to whatever fruit you have, and I chose to add vanilla with strawberries this time. It's quick and easy to pull together for a last minute cake for morning tea or afternoon coffee.

INGREDIENTS

85g unsalted butter 2 eggs 148g natural cane sugar 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract 142g all-purpose flour About 1 cup sliced or quartered strawberries

METHOD

Preheat the oven to 200C (180C fan forced). Grease and flour a 20cm round baking pan. In a small saucepan, melt the butter. Remove from heat and set aside to cool.

In a large bowl, whisk together the eggs, sugar, and vanilla until frothy. Pour in the slightly cooled butter and stir until well blended. Sift in the flour and mix until the batter is smooth and creamy.

Pour the batter into the baking pan. Scatter the strawberries evenly over the top. You don't need to press the berries into the cake; their weight makes them sink in a bit during baking.

Bake for 20-25 minutes, until golden brown on top. The cake is done when a toothpick or knife inserted into the center comes out clean. Remove the cake and let cool before serving.

Australian Native Aquarium Fish

id you know that some of the world's most beautiful fish are swimming in your own backyard?

Few people realise that Australia has its own native aquarium fish. Rainbowfish, Pacific Blueeyes, Gudgeons, and Hardyheads are some common native fish in the Brisbane area.

Many of the same native aquarium fish will have

a distinctively different colour pattern that is unique to each waterway.

Native fish species from your local area are also the best choice for your backyard frog ponds, water features and mosquito control.

Most of the fish found in Australian aquariums come from overseas. You're probably familiar with fish like angelfish, guppies, swordtails, platys, goldfish, tetras, and cichlids. These fish look great in an aquarium, but they don't belong in our creeks and rivers. Unfortunately, some people release these fish into our local creeks where they out-compete our local fish for food and even eat them or destroy nesting sites.

We need to maintain the condition of our creeks and rivers and prevent the release of feral fish into those waterways if our native fish species are to survive and thrive. If you need to get rid of fish in your aquarium the local aquarium shop will usually take them or you can contact me and I will find a suitable home.




