



Redcliffe High School student Daniel Black is making his mark on the pitch - just make sure you call it football, not soccer.

Daniel has been selected for a two-week UK development tour with English Premier League Football club, West Ham United, and the Year 7 student said he couldn't be happier.

"I felt pretty excited (to be chosen), this will be my first time in the UK," he said.

"I will be training with the West Ham academy team and two other clubs from the big six, we're just not sure which ones yet." For those not in the know, the "big six" are Arsenal, Chelsea, Liverpool, Manchester City, Manchester United, and Tottenham.

Daniel said although he was excited to be training with West Ham – where Matildas goalkeeper Mackenzie Arnold is captain of the women's team – he remained an Arsenal fan.

"Hopefully I could play for them one day, or even in Spain in La Liga for Real Madrid," he said.

Mum Corrinne said the training tour was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.

"To be chosen, Daniel went to a two-day trial at Redcliffe run by George Cowie Football and was chosen from there to go to a four-day trial on the Gold Coast," she said.

"I think there were about 600 kids there at the Gold Coast, and they just played a lot of football and had fitness testing as well."

Daniel currently plays for Redcliffe-based club Peninsula Power but has also had success in Little Athletics, futsal, cross country, and touch football.

"He's only been playing for three years with Pen Power, and he plays all different positions, wherever the coach needs him to go," Corinne said.

"He's played striker, midfield, even filled in as keeper when the keeper is away – he's just got that natural talent."

Daniel and Corinne will travel to the UK at the end of November for the tour, which also includes tickets to some Premier League and Championship games and a behind-the-scenes look at some of England's most famous football stadiums.

"Just getting tickets to some of these Premier League games is such a convoluted process, you've got to go into a ballot," Corrine said.

"But this is all organised for us as part of the tour with George Cowie Football and the West Ham United Foundation.

"It's going to be amazing."

HISTORY REDCLIFFE

By 1881, Redcliffe was becoming an attractive prospect for land speculators. Advertisements promised investors land "fronting to and commanding Magnificent Views of THE PACIFIC OCEAN ... lying open to the invigorating easterly breezes of summer", which was all very well but those views and breezes were a long way from Brisbane with transport options limited and uncomfortable. When the alternatives were horseback or Mr Pollard's coach service - "Scarborough now within three and a half hour's drive of the metropolis" - other solutions had to be found.

Lack of a "proper means of landing on the shores" rendered travel by boat difficult and sometimes dangerous, not to mention awkward for lady passengers, who had to be carried ashore by the boatmen. Humpybong landowners, eager for the peninsula to become accessible for holidaymakers and potential land buyers, began to agitate for the construction of a jetty to accommodate the steamboats that would ply between Redcliffe and Sandgate, where the railway was to open in 1882.

Local and state governments were petitioned, the area around Woody Point was surveyed, loans were taken out and eventually construction of the jetty commenced in October 1881. It was completed the following year.

Criticism was not long in coming. Captain William Collin of the SS Norseman complained that the water was too shallow, which would limit the boats that could use it, and that the jetty was too far from Redcliffe and Scarborough. Notwithstanding these objections, the ferry trip between Sandgate and Woody Point became a popular outing.

The journey was not always without incident. In 1883, passengers from Woody Point were forced to spend a "most uncomfortable night" aboard the SS Redcliffe when the boat broke down and could not get to shore. In 1885, the SS Garnet ran into a cyclone-like storm and was damaged. Unable to land its passengers at Woody Point, and after spending a torrid time trying to ride out the weather, the Garnet had to return to Brisbane.

In 1889, the jetty was "reconditioned" and extended, and the trolley tracks used to transport goods along the two sections of the jetty were standardised. These improvements kept the old jetty going until 1921 when a new jetty was constructed. It was officially opened in March 1922 by the governor, armed with a "pair of silver scissors" while "a body of school children sang appropriate songs". The ceremony was followed by an official luncheon served at the Harrington Café. They certainly knew how to party in those days.



Are talk show hosts really funny?

hile most of them are sharp and witty, they are also often backed up by a team of around 20 writers, researchers and fact checkers. So, when the writer's strike in the US hit, they were left without a show or a job. Instead of wallowing in self-pity, watching TV and eating cereal all day, five late night hosts decided to start a podcast - John Oliver, Seth Meyers, Stephen Colbert, Jimmy Kimmel and Jimmy Fallon. While it won't win any points for diversity, it is for good cause, as all money raised from the podcast, advertising and merchandising goes to support the writers.

The question is, when you have too many cooks, who is actually going to make the meal? Well, they tend to take it in turns to host/talk over each other, with varying degrees of success.

Now that the strike is done (kind of) they've packed it in and returned to their day (night) jobs leaving us with 12 episodes of banter between mates to enjoy. The last episode also features some of the more interesting material, focusing on their trepidation of returning back to work.

PENINSULA PIMPERNEL

ART and ANTIQUE THEFT.

was recently intrigued on reading an article on art and antiquities theft. The FBI recently estimated the value of worldwide art theft at between US\$4 and \$6 billion annually. As an example, in 1990 thieves stole 13 extremely valuable art works valued at over \$300



million from a Boston Museum. All works still remain missing and they included works by Rembrandt and Vermeer.

This story led me to an organisation named The Art Loss Register. Located in Black Friars Lane in London, it has an unbelievably 700,000 missing items on its database, including 65,000 missing items

from museums around the world. Recently the British Museum conducted an audit of their vast collection and found that over 2000 valuable items were missing. Each year the Art Loss Register receives an equally amazing 450,000 searches from individuals and experts from around the world, checking for lost or stolen items as well as the provenance of items about to be purchased or sold.

Thankfully there are successes as well, although not as plentiful as one would like! More often stolen artwork and antiques are never recovered, they are kept under lock and key by crooked collectors of art. In 1981, seven 18th Century pure gold snuff boxes were stolen from an English stately home. An eagle eyed investigator discovered them in an auction over 40 years after they had been stolen. They are now back at the stately home.

Similarly four ancient bronze tortoises were stolen in 1992. Again they were detected in an auction and returned to the original owner. Yet another theft was solved through the medium of an auction. A valuable early 20th Century painting by Robert Hutchinson entitled Children Wading was stolen along with other items from a Glasgow Museum in 1989. The thieves gained entry by deactivating the alarm system. However, the painting was recovered, after being located in a recent auction, over 30 years later.

And what about the thieves who hope to become rich on the sale of their ill-gotten gains? The black market price for stolen art work ranges from between 7 to 10 percent of the work's value. Still 10% of \$300 million is not to be sneezed at!

Determination and Belief

here once lived an artist whose life was short and full of pain-filled challenges and tragic circumstances. Yet despite the countless hurdles placed before her, she persevered with her dream to live as an artist, no matter what. Little did she realise that her passion and determination would live on and inspire a multitude of people for generations to come. Her name was Frida Kahlo.

One young girl at Art So Lively was inspired by Frida's amazing persona. Recently, after borrowing a book about Frida from our library, Havana decided she was going to be Frida for a school day - during Book Week. With the loving support of her family, she wore an amazingly inspiring and accurate costume!

Frida Kahlo was born in 1907 in a village outside Mexico City. Her early home life was very sad, with sickly parents existing in a "loveless marriage". At six years old, she contracted polio and consequently suffered severe bullying at school. On top of this, she was sexually abused by a female teacher. These experiences made her reclusive, yet Frida found great comfort in her father's love. He surrounded her with a knowledge of literature and photography and a love of nature. His support and Frida's inner strength enabled her to perform well at school and pursue a career as a physician.

However, a teenage Frida nearly died in a bus crash, suffering serious injuries. This put an

end to her medical studies and caused endless pain, amputations, miscarriages, respiratory issues and ongoing treatment all her short life. Using her mighty spirit at this difficult juncture, she embraced art, teaching herself everything while an invalid. Politics, activism and the Communist Party also featured heavily during this tumultuous period. Then 1929 ushered in the enduring love of her life, Diego Rivera, a wealthy, respected artist 21 years her senior. Like the Civil War, their marriage was a torrid yet interesting union. She divorced him in 1939 only to remarry

him in 1940. During this time, health problems beset Freda again, yet she produced around 200 artworks in her lifetime, many being self-portraits reflecting her painful emotions relating to her turbulent marriage with Rivera and her physical limitations. Yet Rivera was a great encourager of Frida's work. Her first self-portrait entitled Self-Portrait in a Velvet Dress, painted in 1926 when she was 19, was the forerunner of many more self-portraits documenting her difficult but rich life.

Her last drawing was of a black angel, which some have interpreted as the angel of death. She died in hospital aged 47. In 2021 her work, Diego and I, sold for US\$34.9 million at a Sotheby's auction - a testament to her being a titan of twentieth-century art.

What an inspiration this artist is!



Recognising and Responding to Elder Abuse

Let abuse is a serious and hidden problem that affects as many as one in six older Australians. It is often caused by a family member or someone close to the person. It can damage the older person's physical, mental and emotional health and make them feel isolated, fearful and depressed.

Abuse in an older person will often show itself as anxiety, depression, fear of people and/or physical



injuries they are reluctant to discuss.

Elder abuse can take many forms, such as:

• Psychological or emotional abuse: This includes insults, threats, humiliation, disrespect, or controlling behaviours that cause emotional pain or injury to the older person.

• Financial abuse: This involves

the misuse or theft of the older person's money or assets, such as selling or transferring their property without their consent or knowledge.

• Physical abuse: This refers to any act that causes physical pain or injury to the older person, such as hitting, pushing, or kicking.

• Sexual abuse: This covers any sexualised behaviour that is performed without the older person's consent or around them, making them feel uncomfortable, threatened, or hurt.

• Social abuse: This means forcing the older person to become isolated and preventing them from accessing other people or services. This is done to hide the abuse from others.

• Neglect: This occurs when the carer or other responsible person fails to meet the older person's basic needs, such as food, water, medication, medical care, or safe and clean housing.

If you are concerned about elder abuse, you can call the Elder Abuse Helpline for free, anonymous and confidential assistance. The helpline is available from 9am to 5pm, Monday to Friday. The phone number is 1300 651 192.

Elder abuse is not acceptable and can be stopped. You are not alone and there is good help available.



THE OLD OAK Movie Review

s the pub important? For some it's just a place to buy a pint, but for many, it's a second home.

Where friends can meet and discuss the events of the day and share their stories. Which is why director Ken Loach has chosen this location as the backdrop for his latest film 'The Old Oak'.

Before we go any further with this review it's worth noting that Loach's movies tend to be on the bleaker side of storytelling.

No car chases, no Hollywood A-Listers and rarely even a love story in sight. What he does excel at is creating thought-provoking films that often feel so real, you may feel voyeuristic... and The Old Oak is no exception.

Set in a working class town in the North of England, times are tough, and the people are even tougher. The one place that remains constant is The Old Oak public house, standing the test of time through the closures of the mines and its dwindling population.

Tensions rise further when their village starts to house Syrian refugees, who receive less than a warm welcome.

Delving deep into human emotions, exploring themes of resilience, redemption, and the power

of community. The masterful storytelling and the exceptional performances by the cast make it an insightful and realistic journey. It's not all doom and gloom, with the occasional heartwarming moment to elevate the bleakness.

One of the film's strengths is its ability to tackle social issues without being preachy, allowing the audience to draw their own conclusions.

The film sheds light on the harsh realities faced by working-class communities, exploring themes of unemployment, poverty, and the loss of traditional values. Loach's direction is impeccable, capturing the essence of the town's desolation and the despair that sticks to the locals like glue.

It can feel slow, and reducing the time spent on certain scenes would have helped with some of the pacing issues.

Overall, it's a powerful and emotional film, featuring compelling performances and thoughtprovoking themes. Loach's ability to capture the essence of working-class struggles and the power of acceptance and community make The Old Oak worth a watch.



Summer Whiting - Sillago ciliata

Summer Whiting, sometimes known as Beach, Sand or Blue Nose Whiting are in my list of top five fish to eat. Luckily we have an abundance of these tasty fish right on our doorstep and you don't even need a boat to get a feed.

Blood worms or beach worms are a favourite bait of most whiting fishermen locally but I have been finding earthworms are just as effective. Small peeled prawns, pipis and freshly pumped yabbies are great bait too. Using a number 4 long shank hook, about 30cm of leader, a swivel and a small running sinker with light line they are great fun to catch.

Most of the Whiting I catch are only in very shallow water, mainly knee deep to waist deep so our local beaches and sand flats are perfect. The sandy flats at Scarborough, the little beaches all the way along Redcliffe waterfront, Clontarf beaches, Brighton and Sandgate foreshores are all excellent spots at certain times of the tide. I like an incoming tide over the flats, not a lot of wind and using two rods as they usually seem to turn up a few at a time as they are cruising around looking for food.

A size limit of 23cm and a bag limit of 30 in Queensland lets you take home quite a feed. They grow to just over 50cm but a 30cm fish is considered quite the catch.

ime to Get Waterwise!

With predictions of an El Nino weather system, we can't count on normal summer rains this year. And if the dry persists, councils will likely bring in water restrictions.

Regardless, a waterwise garden will serve you, and the environment, very well.

Let's start with the choice of plants. Cacti and succulents are wonderful, and many natives, especially from arid zones, are water efficient and drought tolerant.

Organic matter helps soil hold water more effectively. Dig in natural composts eg animal manure, worm castings or mushroom compost. For a no-dig garden or pot plant top up, use a thick layer of organic matter covered by mulch.

Mulch itself reduces water evaporation by up to 70%. Sugarcane mulch is cheap and easy to use but for pots consider more attractive solutions such as glass pebbles.

Re-wetting agents can reduce your watering by up to 50% by allowing water to soak into soil instead of running off the surface.

Water crystals added to soil or potting mix form a clear water holding jelly that waters plants over a period.

Lastly, healthy plants are more drought tolerant so keep up the organic fertiliser eg liquid seaweed.

Now enjoy your waterwise garden!

'DEBBIE'S CHOCOLATE PUDDING'

hope you enjoy 'Debbie's Chocolate Pudding', which comes from my mother's recipe book. Debbie was a friend of my mother's, and that is how she recorded all her hand written recipes. It is a family favorite, served mainly for dessert following Sunday lunches, when all the family would attend.

This month's recipe is courtesy of Kerrie, Secretary of the Clontarf CWA Branch.

INGREDIENTS

FOR BODY OF PUDDING

60g butter 1 egg ½ cup sugar ½ cup milk 1 cup SR flour 2 dessert spoons cocoa For the sauce

1/2 cup sugar 2 dessert spoons cocoa 1 &1/2 cups boiling water

METHOD

Cream the butter and sugar until colour changes from yellow to creamy white, the add the egg and beat it in.

Sift all the dry ingredients and then add them with the milk, alternately. When combined, transfer to a moderately large Pyrex dish.

Mix sugar and cocoa together and sprinkle over the batter. Pour boiling water over the back of a dessert spoon. This will help to avoid putting holes in the batter.

Bake for 35-40 minutes in a moderate oven (350F or 180 C)

When slightly cooled, serve warm with custard, ice cream or cream.






