



touring exhibition that has been capturing attention with its message about marine life conservation is about to make waves in Redcliffe.

Starting this month at the Redcliffe Museum, Beach Couture: A Haute Mess is a collection of wearable art made from rubbish collected from beaches and oceans by artivist, Marina DeBris.

Marina said she hoped her artwork would convey a sense of urgency to viewers about the ever-growing problem of beach and ocean pollution.

"Also, that they see the magnitude of it, realising I am just one person collecting in very specific locations," she said.

"Of course, the ultimate goal is that the public acts on this by changing habits and/or becoming involved with local groups, politicians, or starts their own grassroots section."

The exhibition features two photo series with American model and actress Hannah Kat Jones wearing some of Marina's outfits, which tell the story of society's addiction to plastics, particularly singleuse plastics.

There will also be a display called 'Artefacts from the Anthropocene', offering a glimpse into what a future archaeological dig could reveal.

Marina has been actively collecting waste from beaches since 1999 when she returned to the US from Bondi Beach. Most of the rubbish in Beach Couture: A Haute Mess was collected from Sydney's eastern suburbs beaches, with some earlier works using rubbish from Venice and Playa Del Rey beaches in Los Angeles.

Marina said she collected rubbish daily, which had given her a good grasp of the specific issues surrounding ocean pollution.

"I also am acutely aware of other environmental issues," she said. "I try to make pieces using those items specifically and often try to merge it with other issues, usually in the title.

"Pandemania was created during COVID when I was constantly picking up face masks – I still am! I also noted how the single-use coffee cups had expanded out of control, as well as the breeding of dogs. The piece is made up of over 900 face masks (I have many, many more), coffee cup lids and even a toy stuffed dog, all found on the beach."

To kick off the exhibition, Marina will give an opening floor talk on Saturday, 2 December from 10am to 11am. The exhibition runs until Sunday, 18 February.

on't miss the chance to secure tickets for Zepplin, the Australian Led Zeppelin Show, the perfect Christmas gift for any devoted Led Zeppelin fan.

Their world-first stage production, The Lives and Times of Led Zeppelin is all set to electrify the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre in February.

General manager of Livewire Touring Australia, Larry Attard, said the show was an interactive journey that showed both the humorous side of rock and the struggles faced by the band.

"It gives people a good insight into the real rock world," Larry said. "Great for young aspiring musicians to see, or just the inquisitive. It's a real education and we encourage people to take their families."

The two-hour show rockumentary combines rare footage, photos and previously untold stories with live performances by tribute band, Zepplin.

Larry said he got the idea for the show after he retired from performing in the ACDC tribute show, ACCA DACCA, and wanted a new project in a managerial role.

"I thought Led Zeppelin would be worth a try with the same recipe – that is, telling their stories and performing their songs," he said. "And boy, Led Zeppelin have got some stories as well as epic songs. The result gives you chills." Larry's son, Jesse Attard performs the vocals of frontman Robert Plant in Zepplin, alongside Dean Blackborough as Jimmy Page, bass player and Redcliffe local Ian 'Squirty' Graham as John Paul Jones, and Mick Bianco as drummer, John Bonham.

Larry said Zepplin's sound was so authentic that Facebook mistook their 60-second teaser for the real band

"Facebook promptly took it down citing copyright infringement because you can't use the real artist behind your ad," he said. "It took me a whole day of convincing that it was actually my band performing the song."

He added he was excited to return to the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre, where he previously performed the ACDC show.

"Redcliffe audiences hold their own as fantastic people to perform to," he said.

"Our promise to Redcliffe – you will leave the theatre at the end of the night elated and overwhelmed. Zepplin: The Lives and Times is like nothing you've ever seen or heard before."

Festive fun at Suttons Beach

HISTORY REDCLIFFE

hristmas is again upon us, with Christmas stories and Christmas cards. Christmas merrymaking and Christmas boxes, Christmas gladness and Christmas goodwill." So wrote the Brisbane Courier on Christmas Day in 1886, which shows that, in its essentials, Christmas never really changes. Although today on the Redcliffe Peninsula we celebrate a little differently - Christmas lights, Christmas twilight markets and public carol concerts the sentiments remain the same.

The biggest difference between now and then, though, is population. A sleepy little place for most of the year - the population in 1895 was about 700, increasing to only a little over 1100 by 1912 - during the summer holiday season, Redcliffe attracted thousands of visitors. Not the most vibrant spot for most of the year - the Queensland Figaro going so far as to say in 1882 that "Redcliffe would soon disappear from the face of the map" were it not for its popularity as a summer watering place – during the Christmas and New Year period, it throbbed with life.

Crowds flocked in, by steamer from Brisbane the boats made several trips a day during high season - or by train and "motor launch" via Sandgate. Later, those with stamina undertook the journey by car, a very long trip before the

advent of the Hornibrook Highway in 1932. Many of those who came by boat were "day trippers" but others, having got to Redcliffe, wanted to make a vacation of it, leading to the eternal high season dilemma: where were they to stay?

Every newspaper report about the summer holiday period for the first 50 or so years of Redcliffe's settlement remarked on the dearth of accommodation. There were some boarding houses, a few hotels and the odd private home for rent but the lack of available lodgings meant that most of the visitors camped. Indeed, in 1891 there were so many "camping parties" that "Humpybong earned itself the name of canvas town".

Notwithstanding weather and mosquitos (other perennial summer newspaper topics) these tent-dwellers celebrated enthusiastically. With bonfires, parties, festive decorations "of evergreens and bunting" (yes, even in tents) and fireworks, they "appeared to enjoy themselves right merrily". Even so, as the Moreton Mail related in 1889, "with all the pleasure-making of Boxing Day, there was not a single case of intoxication to be seen" - another significant point of difference between Christmas then and Christmas now.

Whatever form festive merrymaking takes this Christmas, let us hope that Redcliffe is a haven of "Christmas gladness and Christmas goodwill".

or those who have wanted to try croquet, there's perhaps no better moment than the present to delve into this game and all it has to offer - at a well-appointed and well-known local location.

The Eildon Croquet Club in Woody Point welcomes both casual players and those who prefer a more intense gameplay, bringing together people from all walks of life to enjoy a uniquely strategic pastime.

According to Wade Hart, the Eildon Croquet Club's publicity representative, croquet combines elements of many people's favourite pastimes and, unexpectedly for such a relaxed activity, delivers an exhilarating rush.

"It's got the ball-whacking action of golf, the lawn-lounging vibe of bowls, the manicured lawn of tennis, and the tactical twists of chess," Mr Hart said.

Mr Hart said that croquet has a wide appeal, regardless of whether a person was a childhood cricket player or prefers mahjong and bridge, with players ranging from those aged in their twenties to active 75-year-olds.

"The club celebrates life's simple pleasures – the sound of shared laughter, the taste of good food, and the communal joy," Mr Hart said.

The Eildon Croquet Club is a budget-friendly option for a unique celebratory venue, with catering being BYO and the club providing entertainment – in the form of croquet fun, of course.

According to Mr Hart, getting started in croquet requires only comfortable flat shoes, a hat, and a smile.

Newcomers are invited to attend on Tuesdays at 3pm to receive a friendly introduction to gameplay basics.

ragon boating and breast cancer may seem like unrelated subjects, but a local association has linked this sport and leisure activity with being able to offer support to breast cancer survivors.

The Redcliffe Pink Snapdragons are a boating group that regularly paddles out from Talobilla Park, behind the PCYC in the Redcliffe region.

According to team member Sonia Anger, the founder, Jayne Coe, got the inspiration for the endeavour after reading a magazine article about the advantages of paddling for those affected by breast cancer.

"It was set up in 2005 by Jayne (who was going through breast cancer treatment at the time and unfortunately had a recurrence and passed away in 2016) to provide support, friendship, compassion and inspiration to other survivors," Ms Anger said.

According to teammate Fran Heales, age and fitness levels are no barrier to getting involved as a part of the dragon boating team, with the social component coming first.

"After paddling we go to breakfast and share stories – whether it is about a breast cancer journey or what a member has on his or her mind and we enjoy a good laugh," Ms Heales said. However, for those who are more competitively minded, there are plenty of

opportunities to race at regional, national, and international regattas.

"This year some of us competed in New Zealand and the next international regatta is in France in 2026," Ms Anger said.

Both team members expressed an appreciation for the peaceful ambience of Moreton Bay's waterways.

According to Ms Heales, the reverent aspect of being out on the water does, at times, involve paying respect to paddlers who have passed away.

"We scatter flower petals on the water followed by a minute of silence, then paddle in a circle while doing a tap drill," she said.

"Participating in this ceremony with fellow paddlers gives us all a special connection that we cherish to this day."

Mann visits Redcliffe to perform a special acoustic
tribute to the legendary singer-songwriter.

The show, titled Celebrating the Music of Billy Joel, will take place at the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre on Friday, 9 February.

Jimmy said he was 19 when he first saw Billy Joel sing Just the Way You Are on television.

"It was such an amazing song and performance from this guy," Jimmy said. "Incredible songwriter, singer, artist, musician, great piano player – all that stuff really changed my musical life.

"He has a way of writing that draws you close

to your own personal experiences, as many songwriters do, but for me, Billy's music just captured it all."

Jimmy began playing the piano accordion at the age of eight, later transitioning to the piano and studying classical, blues and jazz fusion. He took professional singing lessons in his twenties and has since performed in many shows, including the Elton John/Billy Joel tribute show Rocket Man v Piano Man.

For this performance, he will be playing the grand piano alongside his good friend, Andrew Williams on acoustic guitar and backing vocals.

"I have added the acoustic guitar because I love the fullness and rhythmic value it adds to the sound, while still keeping everything in

the acoustic domain," Jimmy said.

The audience can expect to hear renditions of classics like Scenes from an Italian Restaurant, New York State of Mind and You May Be Right.

Jimmy said he also added a few songs he hadn't performed live before, including And So It Goes, Vienna, and Don't Ask Me Why.

"I have always wanted to portray them in a more free, open fashion, bringing a new kind of meaning to these particular songs," he said. "They really lend themselves to this acoustic format."

Celebrating the Music of Billy Joel will also feature visual elements, including pictures and videos projected onto the theatre screen.

Jimmy said he and Andrew were both looking forward to performing in Redcliffe.

"I have family that live in the area and most of my grandkids have grown up here so it will be great to have all the family along," he said.

What kept me listening was the motivation. Yes, hundreds of people were defrauded of money totalling around \$1,500,000 but there's a strange, unsettling aspect to the story. The lengths that the fraudster went to manipulate people and tear apart their lives are excessive and bizarre.

weekly free morning tea that's so much more, Bluewater Square's regular community events at Bluewater Gardens bring great company, connection and creativity in a beautiful shared space.

The Redcliffe-based shopping complex opened Bluewater Gardens in August, which has functioned as both a spot for small events and a shopper's sanctuary, complete with a 'boutique library' (shoppers are encouraged to bring a book and take a book in order to replenish the shelves).

According to Bluewater Square Centre Manager, Katherine Hann, introducing some free and low-cost events has proven to be a great way to bring people together through shared experiences.

"Overall, we can see interactive activities like trivia, cupcake decorating and painting or craft activities are the most popular," Ms Hann said.

"The best thing is when we see people doing something they've never done before, for example, older gents rolling up their sleeves and decorating cakes, young children dancing around to music, or people painting a scene they might never have thought they'd be able to do so well."

Because the events have been so popular, the team behind Bluewater Gardens has been

> "We're establishing a 'Read, Watch, Listen' club to meet monthly on a Tuesday, a knitting club, and a game day — to name just a few," Ms Hann said.

According to Ms Hann, that's in addition to Bluewater Garden's regular Friday morning tea trivia and a series of regular low-cost and free craft-type activities that occur throughout the year.

"Over the school holidays we'll work with our friends at Pinot and Picasso to offer

low-cost craft and interactive workshops for adults, but also children (who may enjoy making shadow boxes, slime and more)," she said.

Ms Hann said that because the events are so popular, registrations are recommended but that organisers do try to accommodate walk-ins where thev can.

here are no two foster families or children exactly alike, and local out-of-home-care provider Life Without Barriers plays a crucial role in providing a variety of placement options to suit the individual requirements of children in care.

The organisation exists to deliver key services that enable people to embrace choice and control over the services they need, with one of those services being kinship and foster care for children who, for whatever reason, cannot live at home.

According to Amy Donnelly, Carer Recruitment and Engagement Coordinator for the Brisbane/ Moreton Bay region, there is a growing need for locally-based foster carers who are able to provide stable living arrangements for children and young people in need.

"This would ensure children who are from this region coming into care do not need to leave their local support networks and community," Amy said.

One half of a local foster caregiving couple, whose identity is withheld to protect their privacy, said that giving a child a stable home (in this case, a person with a life-long disability)

is one of the most fulfilling aspects of the responsibility.

"This child has taught us so much about patience and unconditional love, and it has been so amazing being there through all his accomplishments," she said.

Having had their own children and wanting to offer other children the same opportunity to have a loving home, this individual and her partner are grateful that they made the initial decision to reach out to Life Without Barriers.

"We were guided through the process of becoming foster carers, and were required to complete specialised training that was designed to help develop skills to look after a child who had experienced trauma," she said.

"Life Without Barriers also offers a 24-hour after-hours support service that we can access if needed."

The organisation is actively seeking all types of foster carers in the Brisbane/Moreton Bay region.

FIREWORKS

long, dangerous summer appears to be on our weather horizon. Early bushfires in rural Queensland have destroyed thousands of hectares of bush and grassland, at least 50 dwellings and a similar number of outbuildings and sheds. Two deaths resulted from the fires. This does not include countless livestock and native

wildlife that perished.

Bans on the use of potentially fire-causing equipment and open fires were enacted in various jurisdictions, but strangely no such ban on the use of fireworks. We are still merrily firing off rockets and other forms of fireworks with little consideration for the firecreating potential this brief

and expensive form of entertainment brings. And now the Christmas and New Year season is fast approaching, with fireworks featuring prominently.

In the United States, an estimated 20,000 fires resulted from the use of fireworks in 2018. These fires caused several deaths and nearly 50 serious injuries as well as property damage worth over US\$100 million. In 2018, the Northern Territory sanctioned the ignition of 370 tonnes of fireworks so that 40 years of self-government could be celebrated. The result of this fireworks fiasco was over 700 emergency phone calls, some of which reported numerous grass fires causing property damage and 27 injuries. In New Zealand, the then Prime Minister Jacinta Ardern expressed concern in 2018 over two major fires caused by firework displays. Queensland's Explosives Act 1999 bans the unauthorised use of fireworks, with heavy penalties of fines of over \$50,000 and six months imprisonment imposed on unlicensed users. Nevertheless, many pet owners and zoos remain unhappy about events which include noisy fireworks. Animals or birds, wild or tame, become petrified at the sound of fireworks. Some countries are now using silent fireworks. Germany has banned individual New Year's Eve fireworks displays after pressure from animal liberationists and

Scarborough Boat Harbour Draft Master Plan Open for Consultation

ommunity and stakeholder consultation has officially begun for the Scarborough Boat Harbour Draft Master Plan.

The Scarborough Boat Harbour plays a significant role in the social, cultural, and economic landscape of the Redcliffe Peninsula and Moreton Bay.

The finalised master plan will serve as a decision-making and implementation tool to guide and protect future developments at the harbour.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads conducted a detailed and collaborative master planning project in 2021, which included contributions from various community and stakeholder groups.

These early engagements have provided insights that have been utilised in the creation of the draft master plan.

Transport and Main Roads Minister Mark Bailey said the Scarborough Boat Harbour Draft Master Plan would help establish a long-term vision for the harbour.

"In doing so, it will provide safe and efficient access to Queensland waters, promote activities that are commercially and

environmentally sustainable, support the maritime industry, generate local employment and tourism, and improve the harbour's appeal for the community and visitors," Mr Bailey said.

"I strongly encourage community members and stakeholder groups to provide feedback on the draft plan.

"This will help inform the final master plan and ensure a variety of voices are heard."

Member for Redcliffe Yvette D'Ath also welcomed the consultation on the Scarborough Boat Harbour Draft Master Plan.

"This is an important step in planning for the future of the Redcliffe Peninsula and I look forward to working through the feedback," she said.

The public consultation period opened last month and will remain open until 11 December 2023.

15-25g butter 1 teaspoon of grated orange rind 5-10g caster sugar

METHOD

With an electric mixer, beat the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add the egg and beat well.

Next add the orange juice and grated rind. Lastly add the sifted flour.

Put the mixture in a greased and lined 20cm cake tin. Bake for 15 minutes.

Turn out of tin and immediately spread butter on top of the cake and then sprinkle with a mixture of sugar and grated orange rind.

an Rugby cause an uproar?

'Uproar' is set during South Africa's tumultuous rugby tour of New Zealand in 1981. Why should a rugby tour be a problem? Well, with thirteen years left to go before apartheid ends, protests were still underway across the world against racial segregation in South Africa - most prominently in New Zealand.

In this semi-autobiographical story of co-writer and director Paul Middleditch's life, a young Māori named Josh discovers his passion for acting. With a white English Mum and Māori father, Josh, played by Julian Dennison is torn between these two worlds, never feeling like he belongs in either. Not only feeling out of place as the only non-white boy in school, but also longing to perform on stage when his family wants him to perform on the rugby pitch.

This is a political film, but not in a preachy way. Similarities are clearly made between

apartheid and the Māori struggle with racism and their loss of land. The divide is showcased by the way the characters are treated and the restrictions imposed on them, rather than a lecture about how racism is obviously a bad thing.

Despite the sensitive topics on display there's plenty of laughs to lighten the mood, with Minnie Driver's dry, yet witty performance as Josh's single parent mother and Rhys Darby playing his loveable teacher - who owns every scene he's in.

Like any period piece, authenticity is key, and Uproar feels like a time capsule.

From the authentic (and awesome) 80's clothing to the toe tapping soundtrack, it will transport us older moviegoers to our youth. The story however is timeless, as unfortunately, similar problems that are still evident today.

It's an insightful and thought provoking film that offers an interesting perspective on our recent history, through the eyes of Josh. Making you wonder what he's willing to risk to help his family, his community and start his own journey. If you're a sucker for a true story with political undertones, a dash of humour and a lot of heart, then Uproar is for you.



local artist has been commissioned to paint a homage to the tragic deaths of two young police officers and the subsequent symbolic blue lighting of Brisbane's Story Bridge.

In December last year, two Queensland Police Service constables, Rachel McCrow and Matthew Arnold, were ambushed and murdered while investigating a routine missing persons enquiry at Wieambilla, a small community in the Western Downs, 270 kilometres north west of Brisbane.

For Judy Lawrence, who had once worked as a nurse in a hospital located near Wieambilla, this incident affected her deeply, and she was motivated to search for an artist in the Redcliffe area who could paint a picture of the bridge in memory of the police officers.

"This story struck a chord with me, as the two officers sent to this location had not been in the police force for very long," Ms Lawrence said.

"With more experience in an urban setting, the outcome may have been different."

According to Joel Vanderduys, the artist behind Art by Joel, he found the content of the text he initially received from Ms Lawrence to be "an interesting and touching request." "I'm an acrylic artist who focuses mainly on pet portraits," he said.

"However, this was a painting that I felt needed to be made. I gave Judy a quote and she sent a photo of the Story Bridge lit up in blue for the police officers who tragically lost their lives that day, and I got to work."

Now that the painting is finished, Ms Lawrence is intent on "not only showcasing a local artist's work, but also to help to keep the memory of these two young officers alive."

Mr Vanderduys reiterates this point, emphasising his focus on "using my art to really make an impact and help someone who needs it."

Several of the artist's other pieces are able to be viewed at local Moreton Bay hospitality establishments The Drowned Rat Cafe and Brew Buggy Cafe.



iscover Brisbane's criminal past with an entertaining and informative historical storytelling experience through the CBD.

Crime Tours Australia offers regular walking tours of the city centre, making them a popular choice for Christmas get-togethers and a unique experience for family and friends visiting over the holiday season.

Director of Crime Tours Australia and Historic Australia, Jack Sim, said the Bloody Brisbane CBD Crime Tour focused on some of the most dreadful crimes in the River City.

"Myself and my guides tell you the facts surrounding these infamous crimes and complement our stories with historic photos and images," Jack said.

"My aim is to reveal forgotten or lost information you will not find in a Google search. My research is largely from documents, newspaper articles, archives and real people connected to the cases.

"On the Bloody Brisbane CBD Tour, we explain Brisbane's convict origins - 200 years ago next year, which is a surprise to most people. Brisbane is older than Melbourne. People are fascinated by the disappearance of Marjorie Norval in 1938 and become guite willing to offer up their theories. Customers are horrified that an execution was carried out on Queen

Jack, who was born and grew up in Brisbane, said he had always been fascinated with tragedies, crime and storytelling.

"The Whiskey Au Go Go nightclub bombing in Fortitude Valley was an event which changed Brisbane and I grew up in the era of that crime and those involved in it making daily headlines," he said. "I decided that I wanted to share Brisbane's criminal history with locals and visitors and Brisbane Crime Tours/Crime Tours Australia was the result."

Crime Tours Australia also offers the Bloody Brisbane Coach Crime Tour, which takes visitors to suburban crime scenes, and Brisbane Ghost Tours, which lets them explore the city's haunted locations.

There is also the Moonlight State Fortitude Valley Crime tour, which runs on Saturdays at 4.30pm, and visits the site of the Whiskey Au Go Go.

"It is very popular as it reveals the sordid underbelly of this part of Brisbane in the 1970s and 1980s," Jack said.

The Bloody Brisbane CBD Crime Tour runs Tuesday to Saturday nights at 7.30pm. Private tours are also available.

Australian SU 1853 Lungfish Neoceratodus forsteri

While this amazing fish is listed as a protected and vulnerable species, I see them quite often while fishing North Pine Dam and the upper reaches of the Brisbane River. They are called lungfish due to their ability to breathe air using a single lung when the water is very low or devoid of oxygen.

Brown to green and an orange belly, with large scales, a flat head, flipper-like fins and a broad eel-like tail they are quite an unusual looking Aussie native. Found only in south east and central Queensland lungfish can grow to more than 1.5 metres and weigh up to 40 kilograms.

Fossil records indicate that the Queensland lungfish has existed in Australia for at least 100 million years, making it a living fossil and one of the oldest living vertebrate genera on the planet.

Around this time of year if you sit quietly when it's calm in the morning at Bullockys Rest on North Pine Dam, you can see them breaking the surface and when they come to the surface for a breath, you can hear the intake and exhalation of air.


