

## REDCLIFFE GUIDE CELEBRATES 10 YEARS AS COMMUNITY FAVOURITE

#### his year, the Redcliffe Guide marks a milestone that is quite a cause for celebration – the tenth anniversary of the publication.

Since its launch in 2014, the magazine has aimed to be an essential resource for residents and visitors to the area. The Redcliffe Guide was founded by husband and wife Dominic and Elise Alberth, who already owned and produced the Sandgate Guide and decided to extend their successful venture to the peninsula.

"We had several community members ask for a Redcliffe version of the Sandgate Guide, expressing that it was something they needed on the peninsula," Dominic said.

"Redcliffe Peninsula had its own feel and vibe. We wanted to give the Redcliffe area a guide like Sandgate as there are many similarities like seaside lifestyle and strong community spirit. But the Redcliffe area is diverse with community groups and activities which are unique to Redcliffe. We let the Guide grow organically into what it is now." Over the years, the Redcliffe Guide has covered numerous events in the community and shared the stories of many local faces. Elise said one of the major highlights during their time producing the magazine was the opening of Stage 2 of Bee Gees Way in 2015.

"It was an exciting time for Redcliffe, and the Guide covered the opening event," Elise said. "We were given the opportunity to meet Barry GIBB, so that was a very memorable moment." The Alberths said the Redcliffe Guide gave the community a voice.

"There was a need to get the word out about events and activities happening on the Peninsula," Elise said. "We think the Guide was integral to forming long-lasting community connections."

When Dominic and Elise decided to pursue new ventures in 2022, the Redcliffe and Sandgate Guides were taken on by current editor Jodie Morphett. Jodie said that from its conception 10 years ago, the Redcliffe Guide has remained the community's favourite way to read about local stories and discover local events.

"As we step into the next ten years, our commitment deepens as we continue to share the untold narratives and events that define the essence of the Peninsula," Jodie said.

# DOLPHINS GEAR UP FOR 2024 NRL SEASON

he Dolphins made a strong debut in the 2023 NRL season and as they gear up for their second season, the pressure is on to secure a spot in the top eight.

The 2024 NRL Telstra Premiership kicks off on 2 March, with the Dolphins playing their first game of the season against the Cowboys on Sunday, 10 March at Suncorp Stadium.

After being hit with injuries and suspensions in their debut campaign, this year sees the Dolphins fielding nine debutants. They are also adding representative talent to the roster, signing England international Herbie Farnworth and Maroons and Kangaroos prop Tom Flegler.

While veteran players like Mark Nicholls and Jarrod Wallace defied expectations last year, the Dolphins are developing the next generation of forwards. Tom Flegler is a star forward and 20-year-old prospects, Mason Teague and Oryn Keeley will be expected to step up at the NRL level.

This season will also mark the swan song for the coach, Wayne Bennett. After that, his assistant, Kristian Woolf, will take over as head coach. Bennett led the underdog team to a strong start last season and it is anticipated he will want to end his tenure on a high note.

Last year, the Dolphins attracted a strong following as they embarked on their debut campaign. Throughout the regular season, they boasted impressive home attendances, second only to their cross-town rivals, the Broncos.

The team also received significant support during away games. Their dedicated fan base will be eagerly awaiting to see if they can rise to the occasion and secure their spot in the finals this time around.

# A LEGACY OF LOVE

#### Redcliffe social worker Lisa Twigg has published a book aimed at celebrating her late father, Bob, as well as educating the community about a growing health problem.

More than 400,000 Australians live with dementia, and it is currently the second leading cause of death in the nation.

Lisa's book, titled 80 Years Without Dementia, was published last year and documents her family's journey with the disease.

"The motivation for writing the book was twofold; I wanted to leave a legacy for Dad and now that he has gone, I feel fantastic that we have that legacy there," Lisa said. "And secondly, I was trying to reframe dementia. When he was diagnosed, so many people said, 'Oh I'm so sorry, that's terrible', but he was still my Dad and I didn't feel any different about him.

"He was diagnosed at 81, so before that he didn't have dementia. I wanted to reframe the thinking around it – you can still have gratitude and hope."

Lisa added there was a "lot of fear" in the community around a dementia diagnosis.

"With Dad, we were seeing not just memory loss, but his capacity for processing things had changed," she said.

"By the time he was diagnosed, it was a relief really and we knew what we were dealing with.

"I felt like I needed to find out what to expect, how to deal with it, and I had to educate Mum as well.

"I did a couple of courses at the University of Tasmania – Understanding Dementia and Preventing Dementia – and they were so helpful.

"I had to understand what the risk factors were for Dad, and what our trajectory as a family would be."

Lisa added the decision to put her father into full-time residential care was one of the hardest her family had ever made.

"It was a very difficult time, and I got through it by thinking if it was Mum with dementia, she would be saying to Dad, 'Just put me somewhere I can be looked after – and don't forget to visit'," she said.

Lisa and her family said their final farewells to Bob a few weeks before Christmas last year.

"We were able to bring Dad home and we had five days with him, and he passed away peacefully in his sleep, surrounded by his family," Lisa said.

"And we couldn't ask for more than that."

# MOUSETRAP THEATRE COMPANY FINDS TEMPORARY NEW HOME

#### here's some good news for Mousetrap Theatre Company, who have found a temporary new home at the Sutton Centre in Redcliffe.

The community theatre group's original building at Redcliffe Showgrounds was recently closed by the City of Moreton Bay due to structural issues.

Mousetrap Theatre Company president Karen Matthews said the interim location at the Sutton Centre had many benefits.

"Being central to the Redcliffe business district will give us a much more visible presence," Karen said. "The building is easy to find, with good parking and street access. There is (also) potential to form links with nearby businesses for joint promotion."

The decision to find a new home was made in mid-2022 following an assessment by Council, which found the required rectification works on the Redcliffe Showgrounds building to be too extensive and costly. This closure marked the end of an era for Mousetrap, who had been based there since 1967.

Karen said the experience was like moving out of the family home, or losing an old friend.

"Losing a theatre of over 60 years is obviously upsetting," she said. "We have members who have grown up at Mousetrap, who have brought along their children and grandchildren and performed on stage together."

The theatre company attended community council meetings and created a petition, receiving more than 1600 signatures online and more than 1000 on paper.

City of Moreton Bay announced late last year that they would lease part of the Sutton Centre at 157 Sutton Street to Mousetrap for a fiveyear period.

No timeline has been announced for the company's move to the Sutton Centre, with maintenance and upgrades required before the venue can accommodate performances. In the meantime, Mousetrap has been using the John Naumann Hall in Deception Bay for their performances.

"We will be moving the contents of our current building to The Sutton Centre for storage in the next month or two but we won't be open to the public for performances for several months, at least," Karen said.

"Our audiences have been very supportive and understanding of the circumstances, and our directors and casts have adapted their approach to make the venue work. It is in no way ideal, but we're managing and keeping our theatre alive. Theatre people are adaptable."

The IWD Empowerment Panel features three guest speakers who have pioneered the way for other women in sport. They are –

**ANNEMARIE WHITE OAM** – a trailblazer awarded for over 40 years in increasing the equality of women in sport, including being Media Manager at the Olympics, Paralympics, Commonwealth Games and World Championships. **BRITT MURRAY** – competitor and winner of surf sports including the Australian Open Ski Race, Female Surf Team relays and IronWoman events. Now the Head of Special Education Services with Queensland Education.

**MEG WARD** – NRLW champion rugby league player who is a Queensland and Australian representative and has won three premierships (so far!) with the Brisbane Broncos.

When asked what barriers female athletes face, all three panellists mentioned money.

"To play at an elite level you need to sacrifice a lot of time and effort for minimum wage," Meg Ward said.

"For women to do their absolute best in sport we need to be paid adequately. Until then we continue to juggle fulltime work, families and many hours of training every week."

AnneMarie White said we should be encouraged by the recent triumph of the Australian women's national soccer team.

"I witnessed the Matilda's proving girls' dreams do come true – even if they are paid less," AnneMarie said.

"Each one of us needs to use our strongest voice and to expect equality."

Britt Murray added that part of the solution is something we can all do – watch and support women playing sport.

"If there is an opportunity to view a sport where females are participating, have the whole family involved," Britt said.

# WOULD YOU LIKE A REMBRANDT OR TWO?

he rate and scope of the advances and innovation of Artificial Intelligence (AI) regularly shocks me, as what was once fantasy becomes reality. But my surprise knew no bounds when I read an article written by CNN's Oscar Holland. He writes that a newly-formed company named Lito Masters, with their new 3D printing techniques, can now accurately reproduce famous art masterpieces.



My initial reaction was, "So what! That's old hat!" as we all know about highly accurate photocopying. However, as I continued reading, I realised it wasn't 'old hat photocopying' at all. The laser scanning used is so advanced that it allows the accurate mapping of paint textures and colours, even down to reproducing the artist's original brush strokes, cracks in the canvas formed by age, and any other characteristics or

imperfections of the original painting.

This new technique has transformed how the world's galleries and museums can conserve paintings and it has opened up a massive new art market, as well.

"It's almost a clone," claims the company's co-founder. Using "advanced lithography" limited edition collectible masterpieces are copied with even experts having difficulty distinguishing them from the original.

But as Holland writes, "But even to the untrained eye, there is one major difference - the price!"

For example, a new technology canvas copy of Van Gogh's Bedroom in Arles is now available for under US \$4000, whereas the original sold at Sotheby's in 2018 for over US \$66 million.

Smaller-sized work on paper will sell for under US \$500. Even though they are reproductions, each work comes with a certificate of authenticity.

Apart from greater accessibility, there is another advantage to this advanced lithography - the safer touring of precious artworks. Expensive and potentially dangerous transportation of original masterpieces from their home galleries to other countries' galleries could now become a thing of the past with reproductions filling the void.

Oh, what an amazing time we live in!

# QUACK OR HUMANITARIAN?

Henry Ibberson Tubbs, 1905

# **HISTORY** REDCLIFFE

mong Redcliffe's first European settlers - the convict contingent of 1824 - was one Walter Scott, "civilian surgeon/storekeeper". When he, with the rest of the party, moved south to the Brisbane River the following year, any effective medical assistance went with him and it would be almost another hundred years before the peninsula could boast much in the way of health services.

Despite the Central Board of Health repeatedly urging the desirability of appointing a health officer for the division of Redcliffe, the Divisional Board did not consider it necessary and the closest doctor until well into the 20th century was at Sandgate.

Under these doctorless circumstances, then, the best that Redcliffe residents could hope for was advice from a pharmacist, midwife or some other supportive person. One such individual was Mr Henry Ibberson Tubbs, proprietor of the Orient House boarding establishment and, given the number of emergencies he was called to, something of an untutored expert on human health.

Mr Tubbs was, as Truth reported in 1911, "not a medical man in the strict sense of the term" but had for years "ministered to the ills" of the people of Redcliffe. In 1886, he assisted in the treatment of Miss Sutton, who had been attacked by a black snake. He, having "a good deal of experience in cases of snakebite", administered ammonia and the patient eventually recovered. In 1903, he was at hand to render first aid to a Mr Jenkins who suffered a broken leg when his horse rolled on him.

In 1909, Tubbs was called by a Mr Pearce whose wife was suffering a miscarriage. Mr Tubbs, "had regularly

attended [Pearce's] wife", treating her for a previous miscarriage as well as toothache. Sadly, despite the ministrations of Tubbs and Dr Davidson, who had been called from Sandgate, Mrs Pearce died. Despite this, Mr Pearce later praised Tubbs as "a wonderfully clever ... and humane man where anybody sick is concerned."

When, in 1911, Miss Cecilia Brown "dislocated her elbow", Tubbs was the first to be summoned. His treatment of her aroused the ire of a Dr Foley and the pharmacist, Mr Vaughan, who also arrived on the scene. An unseemly contretemps ensued resulting in legal action. Tubbs must have stepped on Dr Foley's professional toes once too often, Foley having previously told him "to stick to his boarding house and not to go in for doctoring." But Foley practised at Sandgate, and Redcliffe had no one else to rely on to render emergency assistance other than the redoubtable Mr Tubbs.





he North Brisbane Lapidary Club is a haven for those who are interested in adding to a treasure trove of cut gems, jewellery designs and similar handicrafts and participating in related activities.

The Club has existed since 1966 as a not-for-profit organisation offering a space to learn new skills, connect with like-minded people, and gain a broader knowledge of minerals and gemstones.

North Brisbane Lapidary Club Chair, Lewis Shotter, said that a membership also affords the opportunity to take part in exciting fossicking trips and enhanced social activities.

"Activities include faceting, cabbing, silver work, gold work, wire wrapping, enamelling, lost wax casting and fossicking," Mr Shotter said.

Slightly tucked away near the entrance to Albert Bishop Park in Nundah, this 'candy store for jewellery makers' is complete with a display of gemmological and geological materials to rival any museum's collection. Upon a chat with Mr Gatfield, one is illuminated to the fact that 'lapidary' is, in fact, a very interesting Latin term, "used to refer to the practice of shaping stone, minerals, or gemstones for ornamental purposes, with the ornamental element distinguishing it from related skill sets such as stone masonry."

The club operates from Monday to Saturday and often incorporates new courses for the various activities over the weekend, with joining and annual fees kept to a minimum.

The folks at North Brisbane Lapidary Club are also gearing up for the next annual gem show scheduled for early March, which is set to feature live demonstrations (such as faceting and silversmithing) with displays and sales of gemstones, jewellery, crystals and much more.

## HOW TO CONTROL GARDEN PESTS WITHOUT NASTY POISONS

hile many plants have flourished in all the heat and rain, many garden pests have too.

From snails and caterpillars to fungal plant diseases, these can be controlled without resorting to toxic chemicals. Pesticides can damage the entire ecosystem of your garden by killing beneficial species such as ladybugs, butterflies and bees. Cherish your garden a favour and keep family and pets safe via –

Prevention – a healthy plant is less likely to be attacked than a weaker one. Add organic compost to boost your plants. Add coffee grounds to soil as a barrier against many plant diseases.

Companion planting – some plants deter pests from the plants near them. Nasturtiums, marigolds and petunias attract pollinators and repel pests.

Home-made remedies - make your own inexpensive and natural sprays to protect plants. Repel insects with a combination of garlic, eucalyptus oil, salt, chilli or citric oil. Strong coffee kills slugs and snails. Fungal diseases can be deterred by spraying plants with milk.

Chickens – hens love to eat all types of beetles and grubs. In their search for yummy treats, they scratch around your garden, thereby turning your soil, and provide natural compost.

We will explore these options further in the next months' columns.

# KERRI-ANNE DOOLEY

Rerri-Anne Dooley passionately believes in community advocacy. Apart from the near dozen or so local volunteer community organisations she has or still does hold founder or membership status of, she operates her own private nursing service. Named My Care Enterprises, it provides a unique community service by supporting people who at the end of their lives, wish to die at home. She heads a professional team of nursing staff which services the North Brisbane and Moreton Bay region.

Born at the Redcliffe Hospital shortly after it opened in the mid 1960's, she attended Humpybong State School and graduated from Redcliffe State High School, not before she had been elected aged 16, as first Deputy Youth Mayor of the then Redcliffe City Youth Council. Her first part-time job was with Red Rooster, but her passion for caring soon led her to study a Bachelor of Nursing, which subsequently led her to becoming a Registered Nurse at the Redcliffe Hospital.

In between becoming a loving mother of four children, she gained a postgraduate qualification in health science, which led her to ultimately work

as a clinician, educator, researcher and latterly as Director of Nursing, predominately in palliative and dementia care. Among the peak positions she has previously held are Vice President Palliative Care Queensland, First Clinical Head of Hummingbird House, Queensland's only children's hospice and tutor at the Australian Catholic University in the school of Nursing, Midwifery and Paramedicine.

Although unsuccessful in state politics as the LNP candidate for Redcliffe, she holds no bitterness for the experience, saying that it was a worthwhile learning exercise. Her Labor opponent was and is the current Member for Redcliffe Yvette D'Ath, who was a schoolmate of hers at Redcliffe State High School.

major exhibition has arrived in Brisbane, offering audiences an opportunity to explore the timeless world of fairy tales through contemporary art, design and film.

The Fairy Tales exhibition is currently open to the public at Brisbane's Gallery of Modern Art (GOMA) and will run until Sunday, 28 April.

QAGOMA Director Chris Saines said Fairy Tales featured more than 100 works of art encompassing sculpture, installation, painting, photography, printmaking, papercuts, animation, video art, augmented reality, film, props and costumes.

"While fairy tales have changed form through different eras and societies, their themes have remained universally resonant," Mr Saines said. "This exhibition transports visitors into the faraway land of magical stories that cast an enduring spell on adults and children alike."

The exhibition is divided into three chapters, starting with Into the Woods, which explores metamorphosis, unpredictability and danger. The second chapter, Through the Looking Glass, taps into childhood imagination with puppets, toys, clocks, twirling mushrooms and flying houses. Ever After, the final chapter examines love and relationships in fairy tales.

Exhibition highlights include Brazilian artist Henrique Oliveira's Corupira, where visitors can become immersed in a twisted forest made from tree branches and salvaged timber, and Timothy Horn's Mother-Load, a stagecoach crafted from crystallised rock sugar.

To make the experience even more special, a Valentine's Day event called Ever After will take place within the exhibition this month. Couples and friends are invited to take part in creative workshops, photo booths, bars and a three-course dinner on Wednesday, 14 February.

For those who appreciate the magic of classic cinema, the Fairy Tales Cinema will screen the black and white silent film, Claire, on Sunday, 3 March accompanied by a live performance from organist David Bailey. Jim Henson's television series The Storyteller also screens daily as part of the exhibition.

On Friday, 15 March and Saturday, 16 March, the Fairy Tales Up Late all-ages event will feature a lineup of live music that includes Methyl Ethel, Tjaka, ZZADE, Elizabeth and more.

A spokesperson for Meanjin/Brisbane-based band Tjaka said supporting Methyl Ethel had been a dream of band member Felix for a long while.

"Plus the Up Late stuff is always gorgeous in QAGOMA," the spokesperson added.

## **BRAD'S** BUSINESS TIPS

# The worst question to ask is...

hen it comes to solving challenges in your business and life, it's never the answer that is the hard thing to find, it's the questions you ask that determine the speed at which you get to the answer.



Starting a question with 'why' or 'how' can kill potential solutions thus defeating the purpose of the question. Unless you get the sequence of questions and level of trust right.

WITH BRAD Flynn

Asking a 'why' question (e.g. why did you do that?)

immediately challenges someone's values and requires a high level of rapport so they feel safe to answer honestly. Otherwise they are likely to defend themselves with excuses and justifications, thus no solution.

Asking a 'how' question (e.g. how will you fix this?) too soon in a conversation before a person has thought things through, can leave a person lost and confused and unable to propose a solution.

Solving problems with the right sequence of questions is a lot like those charity funnels you put a coin into at shopping centres. The coin rolls around the funnel and speeds up as the funnel narrows until eventually dropping into the bottom.

At the top of the question funnel, use mostly what, where and when questions. Then as you get closer to the bottom of the funnel (the solution) ask future based why and how questions to lead to the best possible solution.

## SARATOGA SCLEROPAGES LEICHARDTI

#### e have two species of Saratoga in Australia, the Gulf Saratoga (Scleropages jardinii) and the Queensland Saratoga (Scleropages leichardti).

They are spectacular jumping fighters, which are in my opinion one of the better sportsfish we can catch locally thanks to stocking groups and the SIPS fishing permit scheme. Being freshwater fish, our local dams North Pine and Lake Kurwongbah are now some of the best places to chase these fish in Australia.

Top water lures such as poppers, fake frogs and shallow divers are mainly used, although I have caught them with live shrimp under a float too. Sharp hooks are a must as these fish have very bony mouths and throw hooks easily. Growing to nearly a metre long, most fish I have seen are up to about 60cm.

This prehistoric-looking fish that hasn't changed for millions of years is also a mouth brooder with the female holding the eggs in her mouth and the young staying very close, retreating inside when threatened.

It is also a very valued aquarium fish that takes a lot of room and care, with prices beginning at over \$120 each. They are not generally regarded as a table fish.




