

HISTORY REDCLIFFE

IN SAD & **LOVING MEMORY**

f the 198 men resident in Redcliffe at the time of the First World War, 58 are named on the Humpybong roll of honour as having served their country. Not listed, of course, are the parents, wives, children and sweethearts who saw them off. Many of those soldiers came home to be reunited with their loved ones; some did not. The glimpses that history provides us of the ordinary lives of these lost boys and their families make their absence all the more poignant.

Private William Harold Turner was 24 and a labourer employed by the Redcliffe Shire Council when he enlisted in October 1916. His parents, William and Sarah, lived at Esplanade House, Redcliffe, which they had run as a boarding establishment since 1913. William also catered to the holiday trade by renting out tents and boats. Harold, as he was known, had a sister, Muriel, at whose wedding in 1914 (reception at Esplanade House) he had acted as best man.

Harold sailed for England in December 1916 but on disembarkation was hospitalised with mumps. Later, while in training, he was hospitalised again, this time with influenza. He finally crossed to France in July 1917 and saw action at Ypres and Passchendaele. He suffered a head wound on 14 October and died two days later.

Staff Sergeant William McNaughton never saw active service. He left Australia in July 1918 and, upon arrival in England, was stationed in Wiltshire. He fell ill with influenza and pneumonia in February 1919 and died, aged 31, on the 9th, three months after the Armistice. He was buried in a family grave in Scotland.

In civilian life, William had been a dental mechanic and had worked for Mr Finemore, a dentist, in Maryborough. His bereaved parents

were William and Jessie, who resided at Jetty View, Redcliffe. Someone else who mourned him was Miss Honor Edwards. A snippet in the Maryborough Chronicle of 22 February 1919 reports that she was travelling to Redcliffe "where she will be the guest of Mr and Mrs McNaughton." It is safe to assume that she was William's sweetheart, especially as in 1920, on the anniversary of his death, the following notice appeared in the Brisbane Courier: "In sad and loving memory of my dear friend, Sergt. W (Mac) McNaughton of the Dental Corps ... Sadly missed by his sorrowing friend, Honor (Maryborough)."

Real people, with real lives, suffering real loss and sadness: this is the true meaning of war.

VETERAN STORIES SHOWCASED IN WAR MEMORIAL EXHIBITION

touring exhibition from the Australian War Memorial has arrived at the Redcliffe Museum just in time for Anzac Day.

The Ink In the Lines exhibition explores the personal stories and experiences of Australian veterans, told through the medium of tattoos.

City of Moreton Bay Mayor Peter Flannery said more than 70 portraits vividly captured the essence of 21 Australian servicemen and servicewomen, revealing their identities, commemorations, traumas, bonds, and the unique experiences that shaped their lives.

"It is important for us to showcase travelling exhibitions of this calibre in our museum," Mayor Flannery said.

"Not only can we display these beautiful and intimate photographs but we're also able to share a deeper understanding of the lives and stories of Australia's modern war veterans."

In 2018, the Australian War Memorial invited servicemen and servicewomen with military-themed tattoos to share their stories through oral history interviews and portrait photography. Many of these stories and images now feature in the lnk In the Lines exhibition.

The tattoos chosen by these veterans serve as a means of self-expression, identity and belonging, and a way to commemorate relationships, process grief and honour lost friends. They are conversation starters and share a common purpose – to remember.

"Every tattoo has a story behind it, and in the Ink in the Lines exhibition, Australian veterans tell their own stories," Mayor Flannery said. "It's not just about why they got the tattoo, it's about what it means to them.

"One of the most impactful stories is told by Kylie from Woombye, who explains how her tattoos have helped her manage PTSD and move forward in her life."

The exhibition has already seen great success at Redcliffe Museum, attracting more than 130 visitors in its first week, including veterans and their families, tattoo enthusiasts, students, disability and aged care groups and RSL members from across South East Queensland.

To complement the exhibition on Anzac Day, the museum will be showing recorded interviews with several Moreton Bay veterans who served in the Vietnam War.

"For our younger visitors, we also have craft activities like poppy making, which can then be displayed on the museum wall," Mayor Flannery said.

The exhibition runs until Sunday, 12 May.

t's time to lace up for a good cause. The popular Reddy Fun Run/Walk is set to return in June, with all funds raised going towards the Redcliffe Hospital Auxiliary Inc to improve patient care.

Coordinator of Facility Services Redcliffe Hospital and Coordinator of REDDY Fun and Fitness, Rhonda Neal, said a team of hospital staff organised the community event each year.

"We enjoy making this a very successful and enjoyable event for everyone while raising money for our Auxiliary to make our patients' journey easier," Rhonda said.

Last year, the event raised more than \$20 thousand, which contributed to the purchase of a blanket warmer for the Rehabilitation Unit, an Oxford chair for bariatric patients on 6 West, a foetal monitor progress model for Maternity, and clothing and footwear for patients who require items on discharge.

Rhonda said the Auxiliary was hoping to fund the rejuvenation of two rooms in the palliative care unit to improve end-of-life care for patients and families.

"These rooms have not had a facelift for over

20 years and as you can imagine, the patient's families in these rooms are going through an extremely hard time and a fresher room would make such a difference," she said.

REDDY Fun Run participants can choose from a 21-kilometre run, 10-kilometre walk or run, or 5-kilometre walk or run.

The event attracts everyone from serious runners to fun runners/walkers and families taking their dogs for a walk.

Rhonda said the Moreton Bay Road Runners had become the event's biggest supporters, providing pacers and coordinating a couch-to-5k program for staff.


"Last year, the Man Walk donated and participated to raise awareness," she said. "We invited local businesses to enter their staff wearing their business logos to advertise and use the morning as a team building exercise."

The hospital staff are also active participants.

"We have created some very healthy competition within our units," Rhonda said. "Our Director of Orthopaedics has won the 21-kilometre male event for the last two years."

what differences exist between spring and autumn blooms.


"The flowers are a different shape and tend to last up to a month," Margie said. "This time of year, many spotted Cattleya bloom. They've got to be one of my most favourite."

hile locals are lucky to have Scarborough's Queens Beach north as a 'homing beacon' for turtle hatchlings, we have a responsibility to raise awareness for their care as a community – a duty that has only grown more acute in recent years.

According to Colin Scobie, Vice-president of Rotary Redcliffe Sunrise Inc and the Environmental Sustainability Rotary Action Group (ESRAG), that's exactly what his organisation has set out to do on an upcoming Family Turtle Expo Day.

The event is in support of turtle conservation and against single-use plastics (plastic breaks up but doesn't ever break down, and numerous plastic items are often retrieved from the biopsy of turtles), but it also has a critical backstory.

"In February 2010, hundreds of newborn turtles in the area hatched out to a high sand embankment and headed to the bright street lights instead of heading out to sea," Mr Scobie said.

A repeat of the incident should be carefully avoided, according to Mr Scobie, even if the disaster was largely averted when "many neighbours along Flinders Parade came out at 11pm and turned the baby hatchlings around towards the ocean."

"The hatchling's geocompass is set at this stage to eventually return as adults after they have travelled the EAC (East Australian Current) to South America and back," Mr Scobie said.

"When they get back to nest at Queens Beach North as adults is anyone's guess, but we do know they nest at nearby beaches."

Mr Scobie said that the Turtle Expo Day presented a major opportunity to learn key concepts and gain knowledge about the diverse range of biodiversity that is on our doorstep.

The free community event will include expert talks and presentations, an array of kidfriendly activities, and what might be the main attraction – a plastic turtle installation (made from single-use plastics that were collected from beaches all around the peninsula) on display for discussion.

Plenty of free car parking (with room for wheelchair access) will be available on the day.





here would communities be without volunteers? These incredible people give their time freely, as well as their hearts and souls for the greater good.

Bridge FM (BFM), aka 99.7FM, is a local radio station for the City of Moreton Bay and Northern Brisbane regions.

"We are a not-for-profit and everyone that works here does so on a voluntary basis," said Jon Twartz, President/Announcer at Moreton Media Group Inc. "We love what we do and value our community so much.

"It's our job to connect the community. We aim to do the best we can."

In late October 2022, BFM was advised to move from the water tower at Margate due to structural damage. They had to move their broadcasting antenna by May 2023. After some negotiation, an extension was granted for November 2023.

In finding a new home, BFM was diligent about

their new location. It had to handle the complexity of the installation.

"We were offered by Moreton Bay City Council to use the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre (REC) roof, which we gladly accepted," Jon said.

From here, they dismantled and reinstalled it to structurally suit the roof's requirements.

A cost of \$120,000 was expected and BFM raised:

\$89,000 — a grant from the Community Broadcast Foundation \$50,000 — loan from City of Moreton Bay Council \$60,000 — raised by BFM

Volunteers fundraising efforts
These funds paid for everything
involved; hiring engineers and other
structural specialists to dismantle
and install. The remaining funds
were allocated towards new studio
equipment.

There were many health and safety measures which required attention, too.

"Moving and installing our antenna came with many legal regulations we had to abide by," Jon said. "Because the antenna sits lower at REC than it did at the water tower, the radio signal has to be lower. This resolves all radiation concerns."

Rest assured, BFM is dedicated to the best possible outcome for the long term.

"It's been a lot of work just for this one move," Jon said. "With securing a new location, we'll have to do it all again. Another \$120,000 or so will be needed."

The Board and Management of BFM are grateful to City of Moreton Bay, REC and Brisbane City Council for everything.

BFM are also very aware that this has taken its toll on their listeners and sponsors alike.

"We're so very grateful for everyone's continued support and patience," Jon said.

housands of cyclists are preparing to pedal through Brisbane this month for the fifth annual Tour de Brisbane.

Sponsored by Transurban, the charity ride aims to raise funds for transplant research supported by The Common Good, an initiative of The Prince Charles Hospital Foundation.

Race director Mike Crawley said Brisbane was fast becoming well-known as Australia's cycling capital. "With considerable investment in cycling infrastructure and a dedicated local cycling cohort, it is exciting to see this event complement the future growth of the sport in Queensland," Mr Crawley said.

The Tour de Brisbane will take participants through landmarks such as the Story Bridge, Inner CBD, Centenary Motorway, Kingsford Smith Drive and Mount Coot-Tha. Riders can choose between a 50-kilometre short ride, an 80-kilometre medium ride or a 100-kilometre long ride. For the first time this year, the Tour de Brisbane will include the Big Family Ride, a free 10-kilometre bike ride for families with children aged 8 and over. The ride will start and finish at the Brisbane Showgrounds via the Story Bridge, Customs House and the Northern Busways. Every participant will receive a finisher's medal.

This year, there will also be a sprint duathlon taking place, which involves a 1.5-kilometre run,

26-kilometre ride and 5-kilometre run. The event is not only about cycling but also about giving back to the community. Before the Tour de Brisbane, the Cycle of Giving charity event was held to raise awareness about organ and tissue donation and raise funds for transplant research at The Prince Charles Hospital.

Since 2019, the Tour de Brisbane has continued that legacy. This year, the ride is seeking to raise \$70,000 to support close to 1500 hours of life-saving medical research and help people for whom transplant is their only option.

"We are very proud to raise valuable funds for this important local cause to assist with medical research that has an impact around the world," Mr Crawley said. "We urge and encourage our riders to support this worthy by either fundraising as part of their entry or can donate via www. thecommongood.org.au."

Participants can register to ride online and share their fundraising page on social media, via email and with family and friends to support The Common Good.

INGREDIENTS

3 egg whites (large) ½ cup of caster sugar 1 cup of plain flour 1 cup of almonds (blanched)

METHOD

- Beat the egg whites until stiff.
- Gradually add the sugar and beat until dissolved.
 - Fold in sifted flour and whole almonds.
 - Pour into a lightly greased 19x19cm loaf tin.
 - Bake in a moderate oven for 30-40 minutes.
 - Stand in the tin until cold.
- Turn out, wrap in foil and put aside for two days.
- With a very sharp knife, cut into wafer thin slices.
 - Place on a baking tray and allow to dry out in a slow oven.
 - Store in an air-tight jar.
 - Serve with coffee or with ice-cream.

Acceptance: Acknowledge and accept unwanted thoughts, emotions, and sensations. Rather than struggling against them, learn to coexist with discomfort while moving toward your goals. Embrace Your Demons: Happiness is not about avoiding pain, it's about embracing it. Acceptance allows you to live a rich, full life despite inevitable difficulties.

Working with a Clinical Counsellor, like me, we can explore how happiness isn't the absence of pain,

it's the ability to navigate life's ups and downs with resilience and purpose. Together we can delve deeper into ACT concepts and give you practical tools for living a more fulfilling life.







few species of Pufferfish inhabit Moreton Bay. The most prolific is the common Toadfish where almost any trip down to the local waterfront or jetties will see you find them quite easily feeding on the water's edge.

They can blow themselves up like a balloon when threatened to appear larger and they often bury themselves in the sand with only their eyes exposed.

Growing to about 15cm they are usually caught when fishing for smallmouth fish like whiting and baitfish and when in large schools can be a real issue taking bait meant for other species.

This fish is very poisonous and cannot be eaten and although it can be handled quite safely, with four large teeth fused together like rabbits the larger fish can also leave a nasty bite.
