

FLOWERS FOR MOTHER'S DAY: THE MESSAGES BEHIND YOUR CHOICES

lowers are a popular gift on Mother's Day, but do you know the significance of your choice of flowers? Those blooms are sending specific messages to your mother and/or caregiver, and you don't want to get it wrong!

The language of flowers has been part of our culture for centuries. Many myths, folklore and even the works of William Shakespeare are rich with floral symbolism as most sentiments can be expressed with flowers.

As a gift, beautiful flowers are appreciated as something women enjoy but rarely buy for themselves. But before you grab a display from the supermarket, order from the florist or pick out a budding houseplant, consider the message that each flower conveys.

What are those roses saying to Mum? Why are chrysanthemums popular at this time of year? Does it matter what colour flower you give?

Here are some flowers and their meanings. As you can see, yes, colour matters!

Let's start with roses as a classic choice.

- White: purity, reverence, a fresh start
- Red: love; I love you
- Deep, dark crimson: mourning
- Pink: gratitude, appreciation
- Yellow: jealousy, infidelity
- Orange: desire and enthusiasm
- Lavender: love at first sight

Chrysanthemums are the traditional Mother's Day flower in Australia because they end with the word 'mum'.

- Red: I love you
- White: truth
- Yellow: slighted love

Carnations are the official Mother's Day flower as a symbol of both beauty and the eternal love a mother has for their children.

- Pink: I'll never forget you
- Red: admiration
- White: pure love, gift of good luck to a woman

Lilies symbolise motherhood.

- White: purity
- Yellow: happiness
- Orange: hatred
- Tiger: wealth, pride
- Tulips bring elegance and sophistication.
- Red: love
- Pink: happiness
- Yellow: friendship, cheerfulness

Orchids represent love, beauty, and refinement.

Peonies signify a happy life, and a happy marriage.

Irises stand for faith, trust, and wisdom.

Meanings change with the colour but generally, pink, red and white are safer colour choices than yellow or orange. Use this little guide to help you give flowers that show Mum or your caregiver how much you love them.

omestic Violence (DV) Awareness Month will be observed this coming May, with the serious and sobering cause brought into the spotlight across Australia.

In our own Moreton Bay and the Northern Brisbane region, Encircle Community Services Ltd (Encircle) is planning two events during the month in order to raise community awareness of domestic and family violence (DFV) and to send a clear message that such violence will not be tolerated.

According to Robyn Rose, Acting CEO at Encircle, the organisation would host a Candle Lighting Ceremony as well as a Moreton Bay Says NO to Violence (MBSN2V) walk and speaking event.

"A Candle Lighting Ceremony will be held simultaneously at all three of our neighbourhood centres (Lawnton, Kallangur and Redcliffe) on Wednesday, 1 May, while our Moreton Bay Says No To Violence (MBSN2V) walk and speaking event will round out the month on Friday, 31 May," Ms Rose said.

"The Candle Lighting Ceremony is a free event that takes about 40 minutes, with light refreshments served afterwards," Ms Rose said.

"Different coloured candles are lit during the ceremony as symbols of healing, dignity, suffering, and hope, and a minute's silence is also held to remember those victims whose lives have been taken as a result of DFV."

The Moreton Bay Says NO to Violence (MBSN2V) walk and speaking event (also free to the public), includes a walk along the Redcliffe Esplanade that ends at the amphitheatre, where a speaking program will take place.

"The aim of the event is to unite with the Moreton Bay community – to stand up, speak out and walk together against family and domestic violence," Ms Rose said.



GARDENING COLUMN

IT'S A BEE-AUTIFUL TIME TO PLANT NATIVES

utumn is the perfect time to plant a few Australian natives. Cooling soil temperatures and mild conditions allow plants to establish strong root systems before the harsher climate of winter.

Why grow Australian natives in your organic garden?

As well as being low maintenance, our diverse flora is a treasure trove of beautiful plants that attract and sustain wildlife including birds and insects. Insects such as butterflies, bees and wasps provide an essential service to your garden – they transfer pollen from one flower to the next, facilitating fertilisation which results in fruits and seeds.

Land clearing, pesticide use, and urbanisation are causing a decline in insect populations. Establishing a bee-friendly garden will promote the survival of native bees and other pollinators. Select a variety of plants so you have blooms throughout the whole year.

Native plants to consider include

- trees e.g. flowering gums, lilly pillies
- large shrubs such as grevilleas, leptospermum, banksias, callistemons
- smaller shrubs e.g. westringia, dwarf forms of myrtle and banksia
- ground cover e.g. prostrate varieties of grevillea

Enjoy your gorgeous native plants and the critters they attract – and know that you are contributing to a happy and healthy ecosystem. Well done!

ARTFULLY REDCLIFFE

his Redcliffe is such a wonderful place to live. My daily routine gets me out early walking, enjoying what my local area offers in abundance. I'm also fortunate enough to be able to walk to work.

My route takes me along the banks of Redcliffe's Humpybong Creek which is alive with a variety of bird and animal life. Ducks, some wild and some discarded domestic ones, brighten my days with their adorable antics. However, my favourite is the wonderful lbis, hated and demonised by many, but whose close relative was worshipped by the ancient Egyptians. I also see an occasional eel, dragonflies zig-zagging and many tortoises sunning and swimming. All of this makes my daily walks rich and memorable.

My love and respect for these creatures reminded me of an article I read recently in the Smithsonian magazine. The article by Amy Crawford tells of an early 20th-century German artist named Franz Marc, whose love of animals was great. He passionately painted animals of every kind, using vibrant colours. He visited zoos and roamed fields and byways in search of fauna. His works featuring domestic dogs and cats followed by foxes, deer and even exotic tigers became popular.

Born in Munich in 1880, the son of a landscape artist, he studied art at Munich University. He co-founded The Blue Rider, a journal whose name became synonymous with a group of influential German artists. He lived in a time of great upheaval, struggles and social change. His interpretation of "man's wickedness" proved disastrously accurate. He was drafted into the German army and sadly was killed in 1916 at the Battle of Verdun. The art world is

the poorer for his untimely, unnecessary death.

In recent years, his paintings have attracted large sums, in particular The Foxes, which fetched a record 42,654,500 pounds (nearly A\$82 million).

HISTORY REDCLIFFE

THE AMITY BABIES

STORY PATTIE TANCRED

f the 70-odd people resident at the Moreton Bay penal colony at Redcliffe between its foundation in September 1824 and its demise in June 1825, you would think that the least likely to survive that unpromising, primitive, unhygienic place would be the youngest. Yet the very youngest of them, the three babies born there, all flourished and went on to lead long and prosperous lives.

The first, Amity Moreton Thompson – named after the ship the colonists arrived on – was born just nine days into the settlement's short life, the daughter of Corporal Robert Thompson and his wife, Mary. Robert, like all the soldiers of the colony, was a member of the 40th Foot Regiment. The second baby, Charles Moreton Miller, born 5 November, was the son of the colony's commandant, Lieutenant Henry Miller and his wife, Jane. Mary Cox, the last baby born at the Moreton Bay colony, arrived on 1 March 1825, the first child of Private William Cox and his wife, Hannah.

With the abandonment of the Redcliffe colony, the families deployed with the rest of the contingent to the new settlement at Brisbane Town where they lived for about four months before they were recalled to Sydney. All three babies were christened there, at St Phillip's Church, in October 1825.

In 1827, now Sergeant Thompson and his family moved to Hobart with the regiment. At the end of 1828, they sailed for India where Robert, after more than four years of service there, died in 1833. Mary and the children returned to England. Amity subsequently married a Mr John Wright. In 1889, she wrote to the Secretary of Public Lands in Brisbane regarding a claim to 500 acres of land that she said had been granted to her at the time of her birth in recognition of her "being the first European born in that settlement." Sadly, the response was, "There is no record in the survey office of any land being granted." We know no more about her life but she is thought to have lived until about 1900.

Like the Thompsons, the Miller family returned to Sydney with most of the 40th Foot Regiment and then deployed to Van Diemen's Land in 1826. When the regiment was ordered to India in 1828, Henry and Jane sailed for Bombay. It seems, though, that they left their three sons, Henry (later known as "Money" Miller and reputed to be, at the time of his death, Victoria's richest man), Mars and little Charles, behind in Hobart. After service in India and back in England, now Captain Miller retired from the army and he and Jane returned to Hobart and their boys in 1835.

At the age of 15, Charles took up employment in the colonial bureaucracy, being appointed to a clerkship in the Principal Superintendent's office, remaining there for two years until resigning in 1841 to become a farmer. He married Ellen Mulholland and they moved to Port Phillip. They had six sons and three daughters. Charles died in 1897, aged 72. His widow, Ellen, survived him by 26 years, dying aged 96 in 1923.

The family of the youngest "Amity baby", Mary Cox, followed the others attached to the 40th Foot to Sydney and then to Van Diemen's Land, where they landed in 1827. They, too, were then dispatched to India, arriving in Bombay in 1829. When her father, now promoted to corporal, was ordered to return to England in 1838, Mary did not accompany her parents and siblings because, at the age of 13 years and eight months, she married a young soldier of the 40th, Private William Maud. They remained in India for seven years during which time Mary gave birth to two sons, the first of whom died in infancy. The second boy, Samuel, was born in about 1844. Life in India for a very young army wife was hard but Mary was apparently up to the challenge, travelling to Delhi and Lahore and reportedly learning to speak Hindustani.

The regiment returned to England in 1846 and not long after their return, Mary gave birth to a daughter, Hannah. After several regimental moves in England, the 40th was dispatched to Ireland. It was there, in 1849, that William Maud died, leaving Mary, aged 24, a widow with two children. Her widowhood, however, did not last long; she remarried within two years, to another soldier of the 40th, William West.

In 1852, the 40th Foot was ordered abroad once more – to Australia. With them went Mary West, returning to the land of her birth, and Hannah, Samuel remaining behind in England. The family lived in Richmond, Melbourne and in 1853 Mary gave birth to her last child, Emily. After William was discharged from the army, the family moved to Sunbury. After a peripatetic and adventurous life, Mary died, aged 84, in 1909, survived by her daughters and 21 grandchildren.

Far from suffering any lasting ill effects from the privations surrounding their births and earliest years, these first three children of the Queensland settlement went on to interesting and productive lives. We could perhaps attribute their longevity and successes to the beneficial climate of their first home.

ans of the legendary David Bowie are in for a treat next month as the Ashes to Ashes David Bowie Experience makes its way to Redcliffe.

The Adelaide tribute band, led by frontman Paul Matthews, will be taking the stage at the Redcliffe Entertainment Centre on Saturday, 1 June.

Paul described David Bowie as "completely unpredictable" and an extraordinary artist who approached everything he did with absolute conviction.

et in Switzerland during the Second World War, Lubo follows the journey of a humble nomadic street performer who is happy with his lot in life - friends, family and the open road. That is until he's reluctantly called up to join the Swiss army to defend the border with Austria from a potential German invasion. Forced to abandon his family, it's not long before tragedy hits and the authorities take his three young children away. Fueled by his love for his kids and hatred of those who've taken them, he's determined to have his family back, but where to starT?

Although this is a story of one man doing anything (and I mean anything) to be reunited with his family, you'll soon realise that the story has a deeper and far more sinister mystery lurking beneath the surface. After Lubo, played expertly by Franz Rogowski, deserts the army the biggest motivations of my life.

Thanks to Director Giorgio Diritti and his incredible cast and crew, you won't doubt for a second that this isn't the 1930s and that Hitler isn't a stone's throw away. The locations look amazing, the costumes look authentic and the cars look brand new.

As I'm sure you can imagine from what you've read so far, this isn't a light-hearted jaunt through the Swiss Alps. However, what it lacks in laughs, it makes up for in heart and mystery, as at any moment he could be discovered.

Make sure you purchase a large popcorn and drink (preferably a stein of beer) and get comfortable because Lubo has a three-hour run time. Don't be daunted by this, think of it more as value for money.

COPPERBAND BUTTERFLYFISH -CHELMON ROSTRATUS

he Copperband Butterflyfish also known as the Beaked Coral Fish is one of the prettiest fish found in Moreton Bay and inhabits the warmer areas of both the Pacific and Indian Oceans.

A reef fish that feeds mainly on tiny stinging anemones, coral polyps, worms and tiny shrimp hiding in the reef, I have seen them picking at the growths on the pylons of our local jetties. Growing to around 20cm they are usually found by themselves or swimming in pairs and are very territorial.

While diving once, I witnessed them swim away from me and I realised the black dots on their side resembled eyes looking back at me, that seems like a great way to fool a predator. Also a very sought after, peaceful and stunning fish for reef aquariums, they can fetch prices of around \$50 to \$100.



edcliffe has always had its fair share of business entrepreneurs. Steve Hart is certainly a member of that club. However, in a successful continuing business career spanning some 40 years, he has retired several times.

Born in Maryborough in 1952, he was named after Ned Kelly's notorious cross-dressing outlaw mate, Steve Hart. Steve and his family moved to Redcliffe when he was 13, and attended Redcliffe State High School. At 18, he and a mate embarked on a surfing safari around Australia in a split-screen Kombi van. 





How to keep hearing aids sounding new?

Hearing aids are usually sitting inside the ear canals, probably for 10 hours a day or more, where sebaceous glands and apocrine glands produce oil and sweat. The body temperature can also warm up the hearing aids. They are also exposed to dust, dead skin and interference from the hairs inside the ears. All these factors result in hearing aids becoming weak and muffled. Therefore, it is very important to keep your hearing aids clean. Follow these steps below to keep your hearing aids in tip-top condition.

- 1. Wipe the hearing aids with cleaning wipes.
- 2. If your hearing aids are fitted with wax filters, replace them regularly.
- 3. Some hearing aids and ear moulds are fitted with air vents. The vent size is usually small and can be easily blocked. Inserting a cleaning wire or using an air blower will unblock the air vent.
- 4. Purchase a D-Dryer device equipped with a UV light to kill the germs on your hearing aid's surface and to remove moisture.
